5 SERMONS

Bound volume - Most of the pages are in Bishop Paterson's very distinctive, mature hand. Some towards the end of the volume are in a neater hand, possibly written when Paterson was a student.

p 5: list of first communicants, Tombae, 1803.

p 1 marked "11.24".

6 "DE ACTIBUS HUMANIS" I.

Bound volume, "11-14" inside front cover, begun 1788, completed 1789. The writing is not recognisably Paterson's but might have been written by him when he was a student: contains

a. "Tractatus Theologici De actibus humanis eorumdemque Regulis"

b. List of subscribers, Glenlivet, written by Bp Paterson on the blank front and back pages of the volume, presumably between 1793 and 1812 when he was priest at Tombae.

7 "TRACTATUS de ACTIBUS HUMANIS" II

Bound volume, begun 1789, in the same hand as 6 above. This volume has a sermon on temperance in Bp Paterson's adult hand added on the blank pages at the front of the volume.

"11-36" on front flyleaf.

8 "DE PECCATIS ET GRATIA"

Bound volume in same hand as 6, 7 above. An index is added at the back in Bp Paterson's adult hand.

"I-46" on front flyleaf.

9 "DE BAPTISTI" [sic]
Bound volume, same hand as 6-8 above. "11-37" on front flyleaf.

10 BOUND NOTEBOOK, containing:

pp 1-69, 71ff: R.H. pages: "On the Death of the Just", "On the Necessity and
the facility of prayer"; Bp Paterson's adult hand, (respectively)
pp 2-8. Inside front flyleaf: and following left hand pages: Easter communicants
pp 12-20 1794, Glenlivet, followed by accounts for groceries
pp 22-36 Left hand pages: Glenlivet communicants, Christmas 1795
pp 72, 74 Groceries

also Eastern District mark.

On the following pages are sermon notes in Paterson's hand, interspersed
with accounts, and notes in Latin

The notes in Latin, together with the title "Cahier ---" are probably
in the same hand as 6-9 above.
