1. Ann Agnes Trail, Hammersmith Convent to James Gillis, Edinburgh: she wants to know about his proposed convent at Edinburgh as she is thinking of taking the habit. Her family; conversions, etc, 17 July 1832.
2. same to same; congratulations on conversion of his mother; the proposed Edinburgh convent - which nuns is he hoping will come; what sort of schools will they supply, etc. She is hesitating between a contemplative and an active order. 23 July 1832.

8. same to same: she and Miss C [Lapperton] are still at Hammersmith; they are at last on the point of leaving. News of Hammersmith convent, 2 Aug 1833.

10. same to same: asking him to come & assist at the clothing; her health, etc, 25 Sept 1833
11. same to same, Fochabers: finding nuns for the proposed Edinburgh community; news, etc, 28 Nov 1833
12. same to same: the Edinburgh community; "Exposition of the Quarante Ore", 17 Dec 1833 with a note added by Sr St. Hilaire sending condolences on death of Gillis's father.
13. same to same: names of the French nuns who will come to Scotland; they will need time to settle before starting the boarding school; the dress they are to wear in Scotland, etc, 1 May 1834
