

1. Notarial instrument recording election by the parishioners of Abertkirrdur of James Innes of Towchis as parish clerk of church of same in place of the late Alexander Innes, 30, 31 Dec 1545; SRO no 54
2. Confirmation by Patrick, Bishop of Moray, of above election, 25 Feb 1545/6

3. Disposition by William Innes of that lltk in favour of James Innes of Towchis of the Kirktown of Abertkirrdur, 8 Nov 1553; SRO no 62
4. Tack by Mr James Dundas, Chanter of Murray, in favour of Alexander Innes of Cokstoun, of teind sheaves of Melle + Liffill Cokstoun, in return for money to repair kirk, 2 July 1585; SRO no 113
5. Sasine of Alexander Innes as heir to his father of the Vicar Pensioner's manse of Elgin, 9 May 1658
6. Sasine of Alexander Innes and Isobel Hardie, his wife, of a little stone house in the east part of Elgin, granted by William Sutherland, burgess of Elgin, 24 Aug 1661
7. Disposition to James Walker of the burgh of Elgin + his wife, of and upon the little stone house in Elgin near the east part by Bessie + Catharine Innes, daughters of deceased Alexander Innes, 17 Sept 1677
8. Regrat Disposition: Bessie + Katharin Inneses and ayis to James Walker, his spouse + son - St Laurence Manse, Elgin, 17 July 1717
9. Disposition of Land: Robert + Thomas Innes. Docketed " --- from him to the Dunbars of Hemprigs, Aisleish + Inchbrok". Concerns documents from 1611 - 1761
10. Stewart Souter, Duff House to Pat. Rose, Banff about 10 bundles of old papers belonging to Sir James Norcliff Innes and deposited in Pat. Rose's father's hands by him, 14 June 1805.
