SECTION III.

LITURGICAL USE OF THE CALENDAR.

I. THE FESTIVALS.

The Festivals of the Church are not all celebrated with the same degree of solemnity; the words *Double*, *Semi-Double* and *Simple*, found in the Calendar, show the degree of solemnity with which each feast is celebrated. The order is as follows: *double of the first class*, *double of the second class*, *double major*, *double*, *semi-double* and *simple*. When the office is *double*, an entire Anthem is said or sung before and after each Psalm; when *semi-double*, only a word or two are said or sung before the Psalm. A *simple* has only three lessons at Matins. A *feria* is a week-day for which no Saint's Office is appointed.

The principal Festivals are *doubles of the first class*. Some Festivals have an Octave, or succession of eight days, on which, with certain exceptions, the Office and Mass of the Feast are said, or a commemoration made.

II. THE ROMAN MISSAL.

The prayers and portions of the Holy Scripture, of which the Mass is composed, are partly always the same and partly different every day. Those that are invariable are contained in what is called the *Ordinary* of the Mass, at the beginning of the Missal. The parts that are changeable, or *proper*, *viz.*, the *Introits*, *Collects*, *Epistles*, *Graduals* and *Tracts*, *Gospels*, *Offertories*, *Secrets*, *Communions* and *Post-Communions*, form the subsequent contents. As the *Prefaces* are not so frequently subject to change, they follow each other in regular succession in the *Ordinary* of the Mass.

If a double of the 1st or 2nd class, or a Feast of Our Lord, falls on the Sunday, the Mass of the Feast is said instead of that of the Sunday, unless it be a Sunday of the *first class*, *viz.*, the First Sunday of Advent, the Sundays of Lent, Passion, Palm, Easter, Low, Pentecost and Trinity Sundays, which are never superseded. The Sundays of the *second class*, which are superseded only by doubles of the *first class*, are the 2nd, 3rd and 4th of Advent; Septuagesima, Sexagesima and the Quinquagesima Sundays. The Gospels for Sundays thus superseded are said at the end of the Mass.

instead of St. John's Gospel; and a Commemoration of Sunday, by its proper *Collect*, *Secret* and *Post-Communion* is made after the *Collect*, etc., of the Festival. The Calendar, in the first part of this Directory, indicates the various Prayers said at Mass on each day of the year.

III. THE VESPER BOOK.

The Evening Service of the Church is contained in the Vesper Book. The following is the order of Vespers: *Pater noster* and *Ave Maria* being said, the Priest intones the Versicle *Deus, in adjutorum meum intende*, to which the choir answer by the Response, *Domine, ad adjuvandum me festina*, with the *Gloria Patri*; and when five Psalms, with their Anthems, have been sung, the Priest chants the *Little Chapter*. Then are sung the Hymn, with its versicle and Response and *Magnificat* with its Antiphon, followed by the Prayer and Commemorations appointed for the day; which, if it be neither a double nor within an Octave, are followed by the Commemoration or *Suffrage* of the Saints (or during Paschal time, the Commemoration of the Cross), to be found after the Common Vespers for Sunday. All these Commemorations on Sunday are indicated in the Calendar.

THE HIERARCHY OF THE CHURCH.

THE Catholic Hierarchy, or the governing body of the Holy Catholic Church, consists of: 1. His Holiness the Sovereign Pontiff, assisted by the Sacred College of Cardinals, and by the Sacred Congregations (of which the Cardinals are the chief members), the Tribunals and the Offices of the Roman Curia; 2. The Patriarchs, Archbishops and Bishops; 3. The Apostolic Delegates, Vicars and Prefects; and 4. certain Abbots and Prelates.

Besides the *Residential Sees*, there are many *Titular Sees*, formerly (until 3rd March 1882) called *Sees in partibus infidelium*, that is, Sees in infidel regions, the Archbishops and Bishops of which only take their title from them without being bound to residence. These Sees are, for the most part, assigned to Archbishops and Bishops appointed, either to Apostolic Delegations, Vicariates or Prefectures; or to the office of Coadjutor, Auxiliary or Administrator of a Diocese.—Many are vacant.

II. THE SOVEREIGN PONTIFF.

HIS HOLINESS POPE PIUS XII (EUGENIO PACELLI) the 261st Roman Pontiff, was born at Rome, March 2nd, 1876; ordained Priest, 2nd April, 1899; consecrated Titular Archbishop of Sardis, May 18th, 1917; created Cardinal, December 10th, 1920; Secretary of State, 7th February, 1930; elected Pope March 2nd and crowned March 12th, 1939.

III. THE SACRED COLLEGE OF CARDINALS.

The Cardinals, as the advisers and assistants of the Sovereign Pontiff, are the Supreme council or senate of the Church. On the death of the Pontiff, they elect his successor.

There are three orders of Cardinals, *Bishops*, *Priests* and *Deacons*. These orders are distinct from those of the Hierarchy: with very few exceptions, the Cardinal Priests are archbishops and bishops; and the Cardinal Deacons are generally priests.

The Sacred College, when complete, consists of 70 members; 6 Cardinal Bishops, whose Dioceses are the six "Suburban Sees," near Rome; 50 Cardinal Priests, who take their title from the "Titular Churches," to which they are appointed, with jurisdiction and right to a throne, etc., therein; and 14 Cardinal Deacons, who are appointed to other churches called "Deaconries."

The first Cardinal Bishop is *Dean*, the first of the Priests is *First Priest*, and the first of the Deacons is *First Deacon*, of the Sacred College. The Dean has the right of consecrating, and the First Deacon the right of proclaiming and crowning, a new Pope.

On the death of the Pontiff the Cardinal *Camerlengo* has the administration of the public affairs of the Holy See.

The "creation" of a Cardinal sometimes precedes, even by several years, its "publication" or proclamation. The Cardinal is then said to be "reserved in *petto*," and, when proclaimed, he takes precedence according to date of creation.

1. *Congregation of the Holy Office.*—The protection of faith and morals; the judging of heresy; the doctrine and the use of Indulgences; impediments to Marriage with non-Catholics; dogmatic teaching as to Marriage and other Sacraments; the examination, and the prohibition, of books dangerous to faith, or otherwise pernicious.

2. *Consistorial Congregation.*—The preparation of matter for Consistories; the erection and division of dioceses, etc., and the election of Bishops. Also whatever relates to the government of dioceses not subject to the *Propaganda*; to the reports of Bishops concerning the state of their dioceses; to apostolic visitations; and to the spiritual care of emigrants.

3. *Congregation of Sacramental Discipline.*—Legislation as to the administration and reception of the Sacraments; dispensations from impediments to Marriage and to Ordination, and in regard to the Blessed Eucharist; questions as to the validity of Marriages and of Ordinations.

4. *Congregation of the Council.*—The observance of precepts of the Church and dispensations therein. Regulations as to parish priests and canons; to pious associations, pious bequests and pious works; to benefices, ecclesiastical property, etc. Also whatever relates to the celebration of Councils and their ratification, and to meetings and conferences of Bishops

5. *Congregation for the Affairs of Religious.*—The Regulations of matters between Bishops and Religious, and amongst Religious themselves, including persons who, without vows, live a community life, or are secular members of Third Orders. Also the granting of dispensations to Religious.

6. *Congregation "de Propaganda Fide."*—Having jurisdiction over missionary countries, including, however, many regions where hierarchies are established. From this jurisdiction the United Kingdom, Holland, Luxemburg, Canada, Newfoundland and the United States were withdrawn in 1908.

7. *Congregation for the Eastern Church.*—Having jurisdiction over all persons and things pertaining to the Oriental Rites, except in matters that belong to the Holy Office.

8. *Congregation of Sacred Rights.*—The care and regulation of rites and ceremonies; the beatification and canonisation of Saints; and whatever relates to sacred relics.

9. *Congregation of the Ceremonial.*—The regulations of papal ceremonies; of sacred functions performed by Cardinals; and of the precedence of Cardinals, and of envoys to the Holy See.

10. *Congregation for Extraordinary Ecclesiastical Affairs.*—The consideration of matters submitted to its examination by the Supreme Pontiff through the Cardinal Secretary of State; especially those connected with civil laws, or relating to agreements made with civil powers.

11. *Congregation of Seminaries and of Universities of Studies.*—The regulation of university and other studies; the granting of power to confer degrees, etc.

SECTION III.

THE HIERARCHY OF SCOTLAND.

I. VICARS-APOSTOLIC.

From the Extinction of the Hierarchy in 1603 till its Restoration in 1878.

1. The ancient Hierarchy ended with JAMES BETOUN, Abp. of Glasgow, who died at Paris on the 25th April 1603, aged 79. After being subjected to the jurisdiction of the Archpriests and first Vicar-Apostolic of England till 1623, and afterwards to local Prefects of the Mission, the Clergy were incorporated into a missionary body by decree of Propaganda, 1658, and governed by the following Prefects-Apostolic—WILLIAM BANNATYNE (or Bellenden), 1658-61; ALEXANDER DUNBAR (or Winster), 1662-68, 1672-94; and JOHN WALKER (or Ross), 1668-71. In May 1694 a Scottish Vicariate-Apostolic was established. This was divided into two Districts, the Lowland and the Highland, in February 1731; and these into three, the Eastern, Western and Northern, by Papal Rescript of 18th February 1827. This last arrangement remained in force till the re-establishment of the Hierarchy by the Apostolic Letter *Ex supremo Apostolatus apice*, 4th March 1878.

3. *Celebrations for Benefactors and Deceased Clergymen.*

The Sacred Congregation of the Council by a Rescript dated the 17th July 1924 has decreed (1) that the former obligation of Masses for deceased priests and five annual Masses for Benefactors ceases on the 31st December 1924, and (2) that from the 1st January 1925 all priests affiliated to a Diocese in Scotland must celebrate one Mass each year for Benefactors and all deceased priests.

A voluntary association exists among the secular clergy of the country to perpetuate the ancient custom: a copy of the Constitution of the Association and Form of Promise may be had from the Diocesan Registrar. (*See Ordo Monit. n. XI.*)

3. DIOCESE OF ARGYLL AND THE ISLES.

THE See of Argyll was founded about 1200, being disjoined from the Diocese of Dunkeld; and was vacant for more than three centuries. JAMES HAMILTON was appointed to the See on 14th July 1553, but was probably never consecrated.

The See of the Isles (*Insularum* or *Sodorensis*) is said to have been founded about 447 by ST PATRICK, who consecrated GERMANUS, its first Bishop; was united to *Man* till the end of the 14th century; and was vacant for 325 years, from the death of RODERICK MACLEAN in 1553.

PART V.

ECCLESIASTICAL AND GENERAL INFORMATION.

SECTION I.

ECCLESIASTICAL LAWS AND OBSERVANCES.

1. EASTER DUTIES AND INDULGENCES.

THE Faithful of Scotland are authorised to satisfy the obligation of the Paschal Communion and to gain the Plenary Indulgence on any day from Ash Wednesday to the Sunday within the Octave of the Ascension, inclusively (S.C.C.; 1st Oct. 1931).

2. FAST AND ABSTINENCE DAYS.

The new Code of Canon Law makes many important changes in the general law of fasting and abstinence. The Indult, however, granted in perpetuity to Scotland by the Holy See on 27th January, 1911, still continues in force. The regulations of both Code and Indult as they apply to Scotland are here summarised.

A. LAWS OF FASTING.

1. The law of fasting is binding on all between their 21st and 59th birthdays, unless they are excused by reason of health or the nature of their employment.

In all cases of doubt a confessor should be consulted.

2. On Fast days only one full meal, which may be taken either at midday or in the evening, is allowed.

In addition two light collations are permitted, *one* consisting of two or three ounces of food, which may include a little butter, jam or marmalade, and *the other* of eight to ten ounces at which butter, cheese, eggs, or fish may be taken. Milk is allowed at either of these collations.

On Fast days which are not also days of abstinence, flesh meat and soup made from meat may be taken only at the chief meal by those bound to fast. The old law, forbidding the use of fish and flesh at the same meal, is abolished.

3. The Fast days of the year are:—

- (a) The Ember days
- (b) The Vigils or Eves of Pentecost, the Assumption, All Saints and Christmas, but when any of these Feasts falls on a Monday, though the Vigil is observed on the previous Saturday, it does not carry with it the obligation of fasting or abstinence

On Christmas Eve the quantity of food permitted at the evening collation may be doubled.

- (c) All the days of Lent, except Sundays, but on Holy Saturday the fast ends at midday.

4 Except in Lent a Holiday of Obligation is never a Fast day.

B. LAWS OF ABSTINENCE.

1. The use of flesh meat or of soup made from meat is forbidden on Abstinence days to all who have completed their 7th year.

2. The use of eggs, butter, margarine, as well as of dripping, lard, suet or other condiments made from animal fat, is allowed on all days of the year without exception.

3. The days of Abstinence are:—

- (a) The Fridays throughout the year.
- (b) The Ember Wednesdays.
- (c) The Vigils of the Assumption, All Saints and Christmas, except when any of these Vigils falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

- (d) In Lent, Ash Wednesday, Ember Saturday, and (up to midday) Holy Saturday.

4. Except in Lent, a Holiday of Obligation is never a day of Abstinence.

(Approved by the Hierarchy, 11th October 1932.)

3. MARRIAGES.

Marriage may be contracted on any day of the year. The Solemnising of Marriage, *i.e.* the Solemn Blessing of the Church, which is given only during Mass, is forbidden from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, and from the first Sunday of Advent to Christmas Day, all dates being inclusive. Bishops, however, may for a just reason allow the Solemnising of Marriage any day during the forbidden periods, provided the laws of the Liturgy be observed. A widow, who has already received this Blessing, may not again be blessed at any subsequent marriage.

Marriage is constituted by the free consent of two parties taking one another for husband and wife. Anything interfer-

ing with the freedom of consent, in the way of serious error, grave fear and violence, may endanger the validity of the marriage bond.

The age required for valid marriage is sixteen years complete in the case of the man, fourteen years complete in that of the woman; those under twenty-one years of age should before marriage inform their parents and obtain their consent.

Marriage cannot be contracted without a Dispensation by persons within the third degree of kindred or the second degree of affinity; if attempted the marriage is invalid. Spiritual kindred contracted by Baptism, *i.e.* between a god-parent and a god-child, is also an invalidating impediment.

Marriage between a Catholic and an unbaptised person is invalid without a dispensation.

A "mixed" marriage (that is, a marriage between a Catholic and one who, though baptised, does not profess the Catholic Faith) is unlawful without a Dispensation; and the Dispensation cannot lawfully be given unless for a sufficiently grave reason, and subject to the following conditions as laid down by the Council of Fort Augustus (Decr., xvii. 5): 1. That *all* children that may be born of the marriage shall be baptised, and brought up, in the Catholic Faith. 2. That the Catholic party shall have full liberty for the practice of the Catholic religion. 3. That no religious marriage ceremony shall take place elsewhere than before the Catholic Priest. 4. That the Catholic party shall endeavour to effect the conversion of the non-Catholic party to the true faith of Christ. These promises will ordinarily be made in writing by the parties.

For parties preparing for marriage, the golden rule is: *give very early notice to the parish priest*, who will furnish precise and helpful instructions as to both civil and ecclesiastical requirements. Banns have to be proclaimed on three consecutive Sundays or Holidays, and evidence of Baptism has to be furnished by both parties, even in the case of a mixed marriage. If it can be done without serious inconvenience, Catholics should be confirmed before marriage. As a general rule, the parish priest of the bride, in the case of a mixed marriage the parish priest of the Catholic party, will take charge of the marriage.

The Decree *Ne temere*, which became law in Scotland only on the 1st of September, 1908, made important regulations for the celebration of marriage, either between two Catholics, or between a Catholic and a non-Catholic. These regulations have been incorporated into, and somewhat modified by, the new Code of Canon Law, which came into force on the 19th

May, 1918. The following points should be noted:—

I. Engagements, even when formally and solemnly contracted, afford no canonical ground for claiming a fulfilment of the promise.

II. Only those marriages are valid which are contracted before the parish priest or the Ordinary of the place, or a priest delegated by either of these, and at least two witnesses.

III. The parish priest and the Ordinary of the place validly assist at a marriage:

(a) only within the limits of their territory: within which they assist validly at marriages not only of their own subjects, but also of those not subject to them;

(b) provided that not compelled by violence or by grave fear they ask and receive the consent of the contracting parties.

IV. They assist licitly:

(a) when they have legitimately ascertained the free state of the contracting parties;

(b) when they have ascertained that one of the contracting parties has a domicile, or at least has lived for a month in the place where the marriage takes place.

V. When the parish priest or Ordinary or delegate as above (No. II.) cannot be got:

(a) in danger of death marriage may be validly and licitly contracted before two witnesses only;

(b) outside the case of danger of death, when these conditions are prudently considered as likely to last for a month, marriage may be contracted before two witnesses only.

(c) in either case, if any priest is at hand, he should be called in to assist; but his presence or absence does not affect the validity of the marriage.

VI. (a) The above laws are binding on all persons baptised in the Catholic Church, and on those who have been converted to it from heresy or schism.

(b) The same laws are binding on the same Catholics as above, if they contract marriage with non-Catholics, baptised, or unbaptised, even after a Dispensation has been obtained.

(c) Non-Catholics, whether baptised or unbaptised, who contract among themselves, are nowhere bound to observe the Catholic form of marriage; nor are those who, being born of non-Catholic parents, have been baptised in the Catholic Church, but have been brought up from infancy away from the Catholic faith.

4. SICK CALLS.

All sick calls should be given in at the Priest's house at a timely hour in the morning. If this reasonable rule were

adhered to, it would save the Clergy much unnecessary labour, and the people many disappointments, which they may justly ascribe to their own want of system.

On Saturdays, eves of Holidays, and other days which are generally devoted to the Confessional, the Priest should not, if possible, be called away from this important duty. Unless in cases of necessity, sick calls should not be made on Saturdays or Sundays, when the Clergy have so many other duties to attend to.

It is the duty of the people to conform to whatever regulations may be made by the Clergy, on these and other matters connected with Religion, in their respective congregations. All things should be done in order, according to the advice of St Paul.

When the Priest is called to attend a sick person, everything that he requires for the administration of the Sacraments should be furnished as becomingly as possible in the room where the sick person lies—viz., a table covered with a clean linen cloth, on which should be laid 2 candles, a vessel of holy water with a sprinkler, a small vessel of common water for the purification of the Priest's fingers after the administration of the Holy Viaticum, and a napkin for the sick person at the time of Communion. As the Priest generally brings the Blessed Sacrament on these occasions, everything should be so becomingly prepared, according to their means, as to show the great respect of the inmates for Jesus Christ, and the high value they set upon the honour thus rendered to their house in the visit of their Lord and Redeemer.

While the Priest is administering the Viaticum and Extreme Unction, the assistants should devoutly offer up their prayers to God on behalf of the sick person, to implore that he may receive those Sacraments with the necessary dispositions.

SECTION II.

INDULGENCES AND DEVOTIONS.

1. INDULGENCES.

EXPLANATION OF INDULGENCES.

An indulgence is a remission of the whole, or part, of the *temporal* punishment that often remains to be suffered for sins which, as to their guilt and *eternal* punishment, have been already remitted. For the effect and validity of an Indulgence, it is not only necessary that there be a competent authority in him who grants it, and a just cause or motive for the grant, but it is also necessary, on the part of him who obtains it, that he renounce and be sincerely sorry for all his sins, that he be in the state of grace, and that he duly perform the conditions

prescribed. Of Indulgences, some are called *plenary*, which when fully obtained, remit the whole of the temporal punishment that remained due on account of past sins; others are for a certain number of years or days, which when fully obtained, remit as much of the temporal punishment as would have been discharged by the performance of so many years or days of Canonical Penance. Thus, by a *quarantine* Indulgence was meant the remission of so much of the future penalty (*poena*) of sin as is the equivalent of keeping a Lent according to the strict discipline of the Church. Quarantines are no longer mentioned in the official collection of indulgenced prayers (Vatican Press, 1938).

Indulgences attached to sacred objects, such as rosaries, etc., are available to any person using these objects, and the Indulgences cease only when the thing is destroyed or sold.

The conditions for most Plenary Indulgences include Confession, Communion, Visit to a Church and prayers for the Pope's intentions. For an Indulgence granted for any particular day, Confession made eight days before will suffice; Communion may be made the day before, and both Confession and Communion any day within the Octave. For Triduums, Novenas and suchlike Confession and Communion may be made any day within the Octave after the conclusion of the exercises. For daily communicants, or for those who confess regularly twice a month, no special confession is necessary. The visit may be made to any church or oratory and may be made from noon of the preceding day to midnight of the last day of the time appointed. Prayer for the Pope's intentions should be recited vocally and not merely mentally. Jubilee Indulgences, as well as some others, have their own special conditions.

PLENARY INDULGENCES GRANTED TO SCOTLAND.

1st. From the Feast of St Thomas, Apostle, 21st December, to the first Sunday after the Epiphany, inclusively.

2nd. From Ash-Wednesday to the second Sunday of Lent, inclusively.

3rd. During the time appointed in each Diocese for complying with Easter duties.

4th. From Pentecost Sunday to Sunday after Corpus Christi.

5th. From Sunday before the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul to the Octave day.

6th. From Sunday before the Feast of the Assumption to the Octave day.

7th. From Sunday before the Feast of All Saints to the Octave day.

8th. On the Feast of St Andrew, and during the Octave.

Conditions for gaining these Indulgences.

1st. That within the time prescribed the faithful approach the Sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist.

When Confession is required as a condition for gaining an indulgence, it may be made eight days before or eight days after. The Holy Communion prescribed may be made the day before or within the eight days after. One Confession and Communion will suffice for the gaining of several Plenary Indulgences on the same day. *Canon 931.*

2nd. That on the day of their Communion they offer up some prayers to God for the happy state of the whole Church of Christ, for its Supreme Pastor the Bishop of Rome, for peace and concord between all Christian Princes; for the exaltation and propagation of the Holy Catholic Faith especially in our own country, and for the eternal salvation of all Christians.

3rd. That, if they have an opportunity, they visit within the limited time some church or oratory, and pray to God as has been mentioned before.

4th. That, if their circumstances enable them, they perform some works of mercy.

To gain any number of times a Plenary Indulgence granted *toties quoties* the necessary and sufficient prayers to be said for the Pope's intention at each visit to a church are six Our Fathers, six Hail Marys and six Glorias. (*A.A.S.*, 1930, 363.)

PLENARY INDULGENCES GRANTED TO ALL THE FAITHFUL.
THE INDULGENCES OF THE STATIONS.

The nature and number of the indulgences attached to the Stations of the Cross by the Holy See in the course of the centuries had become uncertain in consequence of the loss of authentic documents. The Holy See therefore has abolished all indulgences hitherto conceded and grants to all the faithful who with contrite heart make the stations of the Cross the following indulgences:—

1. A Plenary Indulgence as often as the Stations of the Cross are made.

2. Another Plenary Indulgence if they go to Holy Communion on the same day on which they make the Stations; or if, having made the Stations ten times they go to Holy Communion within a month.

3. A Partial Indulgence of ten years for each Station they have made, if after beginning the Stations they are unable, for some reasonable cause, to complete them.

The sick, who are unable to recite a suitable ejaculation, may still gain a Plenary Indulgence by merely kissing or looking upon the crucifix specially blessed.

The sick, those travelling, and any others legitimately impeded gain the Indulgence, if while holding in their hands the crucifix specially blessed, they say: Our, Father, Hail Mary and Gloria twenty times, that is fourteen times for the fourteen Stations, five in memory of the Sacred Wounds, and once for the Pope's intention. If some reasonable cause prevents the completion of this exercise, these persons may gain a Partial Indulgence of ten years for each time they have recited an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Gloria.

PORTIUNCULA INDULGENCE.

From noon of the 1st till midnight of the 2nd of August all may gain a Plenary Indulgence as often as they visit a Franciscan Church or any Church enjoying the privilege of the Portiuncula, and say six Paters, six Aves, and six Glorias for the Pope's intention. The usual condition of Confession and Holy Communion is enjoined.

COMMEMORATION OF THE HOLY SOULS.

From noon of the 1st till midnight of the 2nd of November or on the following Sunday all may gain a Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, as often as they visit a Church or public or semi-public Oratory and say the prayers for the Pope's intention.

VISITING A CATHOLIC CEMETERY.

During the Octave of the Commemoration of All Souls a Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory may be gained by the faithful who visit a Catholic Cemetery, on the usual conditions (31st October 1934).

THE CATECHISM INDULGENCE.

A Plenary Indulgence on any two days of each month may be gained by all who either teach or learn the catechism for the space of, at least, twenty minutes twice in the month. The usual conditions of Confession, Communion, visit to a Church and prayer for the Pope's intention are prescribed. For every such period devoted to teaching or learning the catechism a partial indulgence of 100 days may be gained by the contrite of heart. (*A.A.S.*, 1930, 343.)

A NEW ROSARY INDULGENCE.

A Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions of Confession and Communion, may be gained by anyone of the faithful who devoutly recites five decades of the Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament exposed for public veneration, or reserved in the tabernacle. (*A.A.S.*, Sept. 1927.)

THE HOLY HOUR.

All who perform the pious exercise of the Holy Hour in any church, public oratory, or semi-public oratory to which they

have legitimate access, may gain (1) A Plenary Indulgence provided they confess their sins and receive Holy Communion and recite the usual prayers for the Pope's intentions; (2) A partial Indulgence of ten years, if they are at least contrite of heart. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 171.)

THE FORTY HOURS DEVOTION.

Whether the form of exposition is strictly Clementine or modified by the Bishop's authority, a Plenary Indulgence, once on each day, may be gained by all who visit the Blessed Sacrament during Quarant Ore and recite a Pater, Ave and Gloria five times, and one Pater, Ave and Gloria for the Pope's intention. Confession and Communion are enjoined. Alternatively, a partial Indulgence of fifteen years is granted to the contrite of heart each time they visit a Church during the Forty Hours Devotion and recite the same prayers. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 381.)

PROCESSIONS OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained by all those who assist at Processions of the Blessed Sacrament, whether the processions are within or without a sacred building. Confession, Communion and prayer for the Pope's intention are enjoined (A.A.S., 1933, p. 478.)

SPIRITUAL VISITS TO THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

Those who are legitimately prevented from making a visit in person may now gain a Partial Indulgence of five years by making a spiritual visit to the Blessed Sacrament and reciting the Pater, Ave and Gloria five times to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and once for the Pope's intention, provided they are contrite of heart.

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained once a week if, through the same impediment, the spiritual visit is made daily. (A.A.S., 1935, p. 169.)

VISITING THE ALTAR OF REPOSE.

The contrite of heart who visit the "Altar of Repose" on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday and recite the Pater, Ave and Gloria five times and once for the Pope's intention may gain a *toties quoties* indulgence of fifteen years. A Plenary Indulgence may be gained on each of these days if the further conditions of confession and communion are fulfilled. (A.A.S., 1935, p. 277.)

PARTIAL INDULGENCES: THE LITANY OF THE B. VIRGIN.

On 6th May 1879, His Holiness granted the Apostolic Benediction, and an Indulgence of seven years on each Saturday, and on the Feasts of the Blessed Virgin, to the Faithful of England and Scotland who shall recite or sing the Litany of the Blessed Virgin in any church in either country. This Indulgence is now extended to all the faithful and may be gained each time the Litany is recited or sung (*Preces et Pia Opera*, Vatican Press, 1938).

VISITING A CHURCH AND PRAYER FOR THE POPE'S INTENTION.

The phrase, "visiting a church," means going to a church with the intention of honouring God, either in Himself or in His saints, and, if no set prayer is enjoined, offering mental or vocal prayer according to each one's piety and devotion. When no other prayers are specified, the condition "prayer for the Pope's intention" is satisfied by reciting one Pater, one Ave and one Gloria. (*A.A.S.*, 1933, p. 478.)

2. THE PENTECOST NOVENA.

For the Pentecost Novena, prescribed by Encyclical Letters of 5th May 1895 and 9th May 1897, the following Indulgences have been granted to those taking part in it:—1st. Ten years for each day; 2nd. A Plenary Indulgence on any one day of Novena, or on Pentecost, or on any day of the subsequent Octave, on the usual conditions of Confession and Communion and prayers for the Pope's intention, attendance on at least five days being necessary. [These Indulgences are attainable by those also who are legitimately impeded from attending the Public Devotions, provided the Novena be done in private and the other conditions fulfilled; the partial Indulgence in this case is seven years]. Moreover, those who again, during the Octave of Pentecost, inclusive of Trinity Sunday, privately recite every day, according to their devotion, some prayers to the Holy Ghost, may gain a partial Indulgence of seven years for each day. All these Indulgences are applicable to the souls in Purgatory.

3. THE OCTAVE OF CORPUS CHRISTI.

For the continuance and daily increase of the abundant fruit produced by the Decree of 20th December 1905, on *Daily Communion*, Our Holy Father, POPE PIUS X., by a letter of the Sacred Congregation of Indulgences of the 10th April 1907, to the Bishops of the Catholic Church, has expressed his wish to have, as far as may be possible, the following annual observances:—

(a) IN CATHEDRAL CHURCHES.

That on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, either immediately after the Festival of CORPUS CHRISTI, or (if the circumstances

of persons or places so require) at some other time of the year to be fixed by the Bishop, there shall be in every Cathedral Church three days' prayer, as here described: namely—

1. That, *on each day*, there shall be a sermon on the great excellence of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and on the dispositions required for worthily receiving it. That, after the sermon, the Blessed Sacrament shall be exposed; and during the Exposition the prayer *O most Sweet Jesus* (see below) shall be recited, to be followed on the Sunday by the *Te Deum*. That the *Tantum ergo* shall then be sung, and the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament be given.

II. That, *on the Sunday*, the last of the three days, there shall be, at the usual parochial Mass, a homily by the Parish Priest on the gospel of the Sunday within the octave of CORPUS CHRISTI—or, if the Sunday be not within the Octave, a sermon in preparation for a fervent Communion; and at this parochial Mass the faithful shall communicate. That, on this Sunday afternoon (or evening), there shall be the same service as on the two preceding days. And in the sermon the preacher shall exhort the faithful to more fervent piety towards the Most Holy Sacrament, and especially to a more frequent participation of this heavenly banquet, in accordance with the approved teaching of the *Catechismus Romanus* (see n. vi. of the Decree of 20th December 1905). Moreover, at Benediction (as is said above), the *Tantum ergo* will be preceded by the *Te Deum*.

(b) IN PARISH CHURCHES.

His Holiness earnestly recommends that also in Parish Churches according as each Bishop in his prudence and discernment shall judge fit, there shall be at least those pious exercises which are above described for the Cathedral Churches for the Sunday within the Octave, or some other Sunday in the year.

That the faithful may more eagerly take part in the aforesaid pious exercises, His Holiness has been pleased to grant the following Indulgences, applicable also to the souls in Purgatory:—

1. An Indulgence of ten years for each of the three days' prayer. 2. A Plenary Indulgence to be gained once during the three days, on any day thereof, by those who devoutly assist at the devotions of any one day, and after Confession and Holy Communion pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. 3. A Plenary Indulgence to be gained on the Sunday by all who, after Confession, receive

Holy Communion together in a Cathedral or a Parish Church, and pray for the Holy Father's intentions.

PRAYER BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

O most sweet Jesus, Who didst come into this world to enrich the souls of all mankind with the life of Thy grace, and Who, to preserve and sustain this life in them, dost daily give Thyself in the most august Sacrament of the Eucharist, as a saving medicine to heal their infirmities and a divine food to support their weakness, we pray and beseech Thee to pour forth upon them most graciously Thy holy spirit, so that, being filled therewith, any who are in mortal sin may, by returning to Thee, be restored to the life of grace which they have lost; and that those who, by Thy great mercy, already serve Thee may daily, as far as each one is able, come devoutly to Thy heavenly banquet, and in the strength thereof may find a remedy for their daily venial faults and a support of the life of Thy grace, and, thus becoming more and more cleansed from sin, may obtain the everlasting happiness of heaven. Amen

4. THE FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART.

By the Encyclical Letter *Miserentissimus Redemptor* of Pius XI dated 8th May 1928, it is decreed that the Act of Reparation thereto appended shall be solemnly recited in all churches throughout the world on the Feast of the Sacred Heart. The Act, together with the Litany of the Sacred Heart, is to be recited during Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

ACT OF REPARATION.

O sweet Jesus, Whose overflowing charity for men is requited by so much forgetfulness, negligence and contempt, behold us prostrate before Thy altar eager to repair by a special act of homage the cruel indifference and injuries, to which Thy loving Heart is everywhere subject.

Mindful alas! that we ourselves have had a share in such great indignities, which we now deplore from the depths of our hearts, we humbly ask Thy pardon and declare our readiness to atone by voluntary expiation not only for our own personal offences, but also for the sins of those, who, straying far from the path of salvation, refuse in their obstinate infidelity to follow Thee, their Shepherd and Leader, or, renouncing the vows of their baptism, have cast off the sweet yoke of Thy law.

We are now resolved to expiate each and every deplorable outrage committed against Thee; we are determined to make amends for the manifold offences against Christian modesty in unbecoming dress and behaviour, for all the foul seductions laid to ensnare the feet of the innocent, for the frequent violation of Sundays and holidays, and the shocking blasphemies

uttered against Thee and Thy Saints. We wish also to make amends for the insults to which Thy Vicar on earth and Thy priests are subjected, for the profanation, by conscious neglect or terrible acts of sacrilege, of the very Sacrament of Thy divine love; and lastly, for the public crimes of nations who resist the rights and the teaching authority of the Church which Thou hast founded.

Would, O divine Jesus, we were able to wash away such abominations with our blood. We now offer, in reparation for these violations of Thy divine honour, the satisfaction Thou didst once make to Thy eternal Father on the Cross and which Thou dost continue to renew daily on our altars; we offer it in union with the acts of atonement of Thy Virgin Mother and all the Saints and of the pious faithful on earth; and we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of Thy grace, for all neglect of Thy great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past.

Henceforth we will live a life of unwavering faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the gospel and especially that of charity. We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending Thee and to bring as many as possible to follow Thee.

O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; and by the crowning gift of perseverance keep us faithful unto death in our duty and the allegiance we owe to Thee, so that we may all one day come to that happy home, where Thou with the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. Amen.

The Indulgences granted are: (1) To the faithful present in any Church or Oratory at the recital of the above Act and the Litany of the Sacred Heart during Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament an Indulgence of seven years and further a Plenary Indulgence if, after Confession, they receive Holy Communion, and (2) to those who anywhere or at any time, even in private, recite the above Act, an Indulgence of five years and further a Plenary Indulgence once in the month if they repeat the Act daily during the month, visit a Church or Oratory, go to Confession and receive Holy Communion (18th March, 1932).

5. THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING.

Whereas, by the Decree of the S. Congregation of Indulgences, 22nd August 1906, His Holiness Pope Pius X. ordered that each year on the Feast of the Sacred Heart, in all Parish Churches as well as others where the feast is observed, the form of Consecration used by Pope Leo XIII. on the 25th

May 1899 should be recited during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by the Litany of the Sacred Heart, it is now enacted (S.R.C., 28th Apr. 1926) that (1) the observance is optional on the Feast of the S. Heart, but obligatory on the Feast of Christ the King, and (2) the Form to be used is the one given below. To all who with devout and contrite heart assist at this pious exercise and pray for the Pope's intentions, His Holiness grants an Indulgence of seven years, and further a Plenary Indulgence to those who, after confession, receive Holy Communion. These Indulgences are applicable to the souls in Purgatory. Those who recite the following prayer even in private may gain (1) an Indulgence of five years; (2) a Plenary Indulgence if they repeat the prayer daily during the month, visit a Church or Oratory, go to Confession and receive Holy Communion.

FORM OF CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS.

Most sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us humbly prostrate before Thy altar. We are Thine, and Thine we wish to be; but, to be more surely united with Thee, behold each one of us freely consecrates himself to-day to Thy most Sacred Heart. Many indeed have never known Thee; many too, despising Thy precepts, have rejected Thee. Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart. Be Thou King, O Lord, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken Thee but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned Thee: grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house lest they die of wretchedness and hunger. Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof, and call them back to the harbour of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one Shepherd. Be Thou King of all those who are still involved in the darkness of idolatry or of Islamism, and refuse not to draw them all into the light and kingdom of God. Turn Thine eyes of mercy toward the children of that race, once Thy chosen people. Of old they called down upon themselves the Blood of the Saviour; may It now descend upon them a laver of redemption and of life. Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the divine Heart that wrought our salvation; to It be glory and honour for ever. Amen.

6. THE MONTH OF OCTOBER.

For the *October Devotions*, prescribed by Decrees of 20th August 1885, etc., the following Indulgences have been

granted:—1st, seven years each time one joins in the public recital of the Rosary and Litany of the B. Virgin (or, being legitimately impeded, says them privately), and prays according to the intentions of the Pope; 2nd, a Plenary Indulgence to those who, having done this at least ten times, confess and communicate; 3rd, a Plenary Indulgence to all who, on the Feast of the Rosary or within the Octave, confess, communicate and pray in some church to God and the B. Virgin according to the intention of His Holiness; 4th, seven years each time (during October), for the recital, after the Rosary, of the following prayer to St Joseph enjoined by the Encyclical of 15th August 1889; if the prayer is recited outside October a partial Indulgence of three years is granted each time and a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions when the prayer is said daily for a month.

PRAYER TO ST JOSEPH.

To thee, O blessed Joseph, we fly in our tribulation, and while imploring the help of thy most holy spouse, thy protection also with confidence we crave. By that affection which united thee with the Immaculate Virgin, Mother of God, and by the fatherly love with which thou didst embrace the Child Jesus, we humbly supplicate thee to look down benignantly on the heritage which Christ Jesus purchased with His Blood, and in thy might and power to succour us in our necessities.

Defend, O most provident Guardian of the Divine Family, the chosen race of Jesus Christ; keep us, most loving father, from all taint of error and corruption; do thou from heaven, as our most powerful Protector, stand graciously by us in this conflict with the powers of darkness; and as of old thou didst rescue the Child Jesus in the imminent peril of His life, so now defend the Holy Church of God from hostile wiles and all adversity, and through thy never-failing patronage so shield each one of us, that, guided by thy example and supported by thy aid, we may live in holiness, piously die and attain eternal happiness in heaven. Amen.

7. CONSECRATION OF FAMILIES TO THE SACRED HEART BY MEANS OF THE ENTHRONEMENT.

It is the earnest desire of the Holy See that all Christian families should be consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and that a statue or image of Him be set up in a prominent place in each house, so that Christ may be enthroned as ruler in the home. All families should be consecrated separately, not in groups. The priest blesses the image, and recites the Act of Consecration. When a priest cannot be had, the image, which should be previously blessed, will be set in its place by the head of the family or other lay person, who also will recite the Act of Consecration. The Indulgences granted to each

member of the family are: (1) 7 years and on the day of consecration; (2) a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions on the day of consecration; (3) 3 years on the annual renewal of the consecration; (4) a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions on the annual renewal. The form of consecration, *which alone is valid for the effect of the Indulgences* (S.P.A.: 1st March 1918: *A.A.S.*, x, p. 154), is the following:—

ACT OF CONSECRATION.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, who didst manifest to Blessed Margaret Mary the desire of reigning in Christian families, we to-day wish to proclaim Thy most complete regal dominion over our own. We would live in future with Thy life, we would cause to flourish in our midst those virtues to which Thou hast promised peace here below, we would banish far from us the spirit of the world which thou hast cursed; and Thou shall reign over our minds in the simplicity of our faith, and over our hearts by the whole-hearted love with which they shall burn for Thee, the flame of which we shall keep alive by the frequent reception of Thy Divine Eucharist.

Deign, O Divine Heart, to preside over our assemblings, to bless our enterprises, both spiritual and temporal, to dispel our cares, to sanctify our joys, to alleviate our sufferings. If ever one or other of us should have the misfortune to afflict Thee, remind him, Heart of Jesus, that Thou art good and merciful to the penitent sinner. And when the hour of separation strikes, when death shall come to cast mourning into our midst, we will all, both those who go and those who stay, be submissive to Thy eternal decrees. We will console ourselves with the thought that a day will come when the entire family, reunited in Heaven, can sing for ever Thy glories and Thy mercies.

May the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and the glorious Patriarch St Joseph, present this consecration to Thee, and keep it in our minds all the days of our life.

All glory to the Heart of Jesus our King and our Father.

8. PRAYERS AFTER LOW MASS.

Pope Pius XI. has ordered that these prayers be said for Russia. A partial Indulgence of *ten years* is attached to their recitation in addition to the Indulgence of *seven years* granted for the triple invocation of the Sacred Heart. (*A.A.S.*, 1934, p. 312.)

To be said kneeling. Hail Mary, *three times.*

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy; Hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To Thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to Thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, Thine eyes of mercy towards us; and after this our

exile, show unto us the Blessed Fruit of Thy womb, Jesus; O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

V. Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray.

O God, our refuge and our strength, look with favour on Thy people who cry to Thee; and through the intercession of the Glorious and Immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and St Joseph her Spouse, of Thy Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and of all the Saints, mercifully and graciously hear the prayers which we pour forth for the conversion of sinners, and for the freedom and exaltation of our Holy Mother the Church. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

St Michael the Archangel defend us in the day of battle; be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil;—" the Lord command him," we humbly pray;—and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and the other wicked spirits who go about the world for the destruction of souls. Amen.

To the above prayers may be added the following invocation said three times:—

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us.

(Indulgence of 7 years).

9. THE ANGELUS.

In Catholic countries, and in many places at home the Angelus Bell is rung in the morning, at noon and in the evening at sunset to honour the Mystery of the Incarnation. To gain the indulgences attached to this Devotion, the Angelus must be said *kneeling*, except on Saturday evening, and Sunday, when it is said *standing*. In Paschal Time, that is, from Holy Saturday at noon till the Saturday before Trinity Sunday at noon, inclusively, the *Regina Cœli* is said instead of the Angelus. This prayer is always said *standing*. Those who do not know the *Regina Cœli* may gain the indulgences by saying the Angelus; but it must be said *standing* during Paschal Time. For the convenience of the Faithful is appended a translation of the *Regina Cœli* taken from the *Raccolta*.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia.

For He whom thou wast made worthy to bear.

Alleluia.

Hath risen as He said. Alleluia.

Pray for us to God. Alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia.

R. For the Lord hath risen indeed. Alleluia.

Let us pray.

O God, who through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, has vouchsafed to give joy to the whole world, grant us, we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of eternal life. Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

10. ASSOCIATION FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH.

The Association assists by prayers and alms the Catholic Missionaries in heathen and non-Catholic countries.

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP.—(1) The daily recitation of *Our Father* and one *Hail Mary*, with the invocation: *St Francis Xavier, pray for us*; and (2) the annual contribution of not less than 2s. 2d. yearly, or one halfpenny weekly. (3) Special Members contribute one guinea, or more. yearly (4) Life Membership subscription, £8.

ORGANISATION.—The usual method of collection is by the formation of Groups or Circles of Ten Members, of whom one acts as Collector. The Collector receives the contributions of his group, circulates among them the *Annals of the Associations*, and pays over his collection to the Local Treasurer. A return of the sums received, and of their appropriation is inserted annually in the *Annals of the Propagation of the Faith*. One copy of each issue of the *Annals* is supplied to every ten members.

SPIRITUAL FAVOURS.—An exceptionally large number of spiritual privileges, including Plenary and Partial Indulgences, is granted to Associates. Extensive Faculties are also given to Priests who direct local centres or become special members. A complete list of these privileges may be obtained from the Secretary of the Scottish Branch. St John's, Portobello, or from any of the Diocesan Officials (*vid.* Part iv., Sect I, 4).

11. CATHOLIC TRUTH SOCIETY.

The following Indulgences were granted to the Catholic Truth Society in perpetuity by a Decree of the S. Cong. de Prop. Fide, 6th October 1896:—

(1) A Plenary Indulgence (applicable to the Souls in Purgatory to all present and future members of the Society on the day of their joining the Society, and also on the Feasts of S. Andrew, the Apostle; St Margaret, Queen of Scotland; S. Patrick; S. Columba and S. Ninian, or on any day within the Octave of these Feasts, on condition that they visit an Oratory of the Society, or their own Parish Church, and, after confessing their sins with sincere repentance and receiving Holy Communion, pray for the Propagation of the Holy Faith and for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff.

(2) A Partial Indulgence of one hundred days every time they succeed in persuading a new member to join the Society, and every time they attend a General or Local Meeting of the Society.

By decree of the Sacred Penitentiary, 7th November, 1935, the following indulgences were also granted to the members of the Box-Tenders' Association:

(1) A Plenary Indulgence can be gained by members on the usual conditions (a) on any day they choose after joining the association; (b) on the Feast of St Francis de Sales; (c) once a month on condition that they have faithfully and regularly carried out their duty of looking after the book-case.

(2) A Plenary Indulgence can be gained at the hour of death by members who, after Confession and Holy Communion

or at least after an act of contrition, piously utter the Holy Name of Jesus with their lips, if they can do so, or at least in their hearts, and patiently accept death from the hands of God as a penalty for sin.

(3) A Partial Indulgence of three hundred days may be gained by members each and every time they arrange the pamphlets in good order and afterwards make an act of contrition, at least with a contrite heart, before the Blessed Sacrament.

SECTION III.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION.

1. EXCERPTS FROM PARLIAMENTARY ACTS.

Voluntary or Denominational Schools.

Education (Scotland) Act 1918.

Sec. 18 (3). Any school transferred to the education authority shall be held, maintained and managed as a public school by the education authority, who shall be entitled to receive grants therefor as a public school, and shall have in respect thereto the sole power of regulating the curriculum and of appointing teachers:

Provided that—

- (i) the existing staff of teachers shall be taken over by the education authority and shall, from the date of transfer, be placed upon the same scale of salaries as teachers of corresponding qualifications appointed to corresponding positions in other schools of the same authority.
- (ii) all teachers appointed to the staff of any such school by the education authority shall in every case be teachers who satisfy the Department as to qualifications, and are approved as regards their religious belief and character by representatives of the church or denominational body in whose interest the school has been conducted:
- (iii) subject to the provisions of section sixty-eight (Conscience Clause) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1872, the time set apart for religious instruction or observance in any such school shall not be less than that so set apart according to the use and wont of the former management of the school, and the education authority shall appoint as supervisor, without remuneration, of religious instruction for each such

school, a person approved as regards religious belief and character as aforesaid, and it shall be the duty of the supervisor so appointed to report to the Education Authority as to the efficiency of the religious instruction given in such school. The supervisor shall have right of entry to the school at all times set apart for religious instruction or observance. The education authority shall give facilities for the holding of religious examinations in every such school.

(4) Any question which may arise as to the due fulfilment or observance of any provision or requirement of the preceding sub-section shall be referred to the Department, whose decision shall be final.

(8) In any case where the Department are satisfied, upon representations made to them by the education authority of any education area, or by any church or denominational body acting on behalf of the parents of children belonging to such church or body, and after such inquiry as the Department deem necessary, that a new school is required for the accommodation of children whose parents are resident within that education area, regard being had to the religious belief of such parents, it shall be lawful for the education authority of that area to provide a new school, to be held, maintained and managed by them subject to the conditions prescribed in sub-section (3) of this section, so far as those conditions are applicable; the time set apart for religious instruction in the new school being not less than that set apart in schools in the same education area which have been transferred under this section.

Approved Schools.

The Children and Young Persons Act (Scotland).

Sec. 66 (1). The Court of Justice, in determining the certified school to which a youthful offender or child is to be sent, shall endeavour to ascertain the religious persuasion to which the offender or child belongs, and the detention order shall, where practicable, specify the religious persuasion to which the offender or child appears to belong, and a school conducted in accordance with that persuasion shall, where practicable, be selected.

(3) Where an order has been made for sending a youthful offender or child to a certified school, which is not conducted in accordance with the religious persuasion to which the offender belongs, the parent, legal guardian, nearest adult

relative, or person entitled to the custody of the offender or child may apply—

(a) if the detention order was made by a . . . court acting in and for the place in and for which the court which made the order acted; and

(b) in any other case, to the Secretary of State to remove or send the offender or child to a certified school conducted in accordance with the offender's or child's religious persuasion, and the Court or Secretary of State shall, on proof of the offender's or child's religious persuasion, comply with the request of the applicant:

Provided that—

- (i) the application must be made before the offender or child has been sent to a certified school, or within thirty days after his arrival at the school, and
- (ii) the applicant must show to the satisfaction of the Court or Secretary of State that the managers of the school named by him are willing to receive the offender or child:
- (iii) nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing any such person as aforesaid from making an application to the Secretary of State after the expiration of the said period of thirty days to exercise the powers of transfer conferred on him by the other provisions of this Act.

There is a Catholic Senior Approved School for boys at Springboig, Shettleston.

There are Catholic Certified Approved Schools for boys at Bishopbriggs, Glasgow (Intermediate); Slatefield Street, Glasgow (Junior); Springboig, Shettleston (Senior); and Tranent (Messrs. Considine, 2 Queen Street, Edinburgh, Secretary and Treasurer); for girls at Kenmure, Bishopbriggs, at Dalbeth, Glasgow, and Nazareth House, Claremont Street, Aberdeen.

3. POSTAL REGULATIONS.

INLAND LETTERS FOR THE UNITED KINGDOM.

When prepaid, not above 2 ounces, 2½d.; for every additional 2 ounces, ½d. Inland letters must not exceed 2 feet

in length, 1 foot in width, or 1 foot in depth, unless official letters sent to or from a Government Office.

LETTERS TO THE COLONIES AND FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

To British Colonies and possessions abroad, to Egypt, the United States of America, and the places in Morocco where there are British Post Office Agencies, the postage is 2½d. for 1 ounce, and 1d. for each additional ounce. To Foreign Countries, with the above exceptions, 3d. the first ounce, and 1½d. for each additional ounce.

PRINTED PAPER (INLAND).

When prepaid, not above 2 ounces, 1d., each additional 2 ounces, ½d. Limit of weight, 2 lbs.

The following articles or documents may be sent at Printed Paper rate:—Books and other publications, commercial or business papers of a formal character, as invoices, orders for goods or work to be done, inquiries for quotations; printed notices and letters (these may have the date, time, and place of meeting or appointments filled in in writing and formulas of courtesy not exceeding five words or initials); printed Christmas, New Year, Easter, Birthday, picture, greeting and visiting cards; manuscripts and printed proofs. "Printed Paper" should be written on the top left-hand corner of the address side of the envelope or wrapper. The cover or packet may not be sealed or fastened.

POST CARDS (INLAND).

The prepaid rate of postage on every post card is 2d., except where it fulfills the conditions mentioned under Printed Paper rate, where the charge will be 1d. To come under the latter rate the words "Printed Paper" must appear on the address side and post card should be crossed out. Post cards must be made of ordinary cardboard, not thicker than the thickest, nor thinner than the thinnest, official post card. They must not exceed 5½ in. by 4½ in., nor be less than 4 in. by 2½ in. The left-hand half of the address side may bear a written or printed communication.

POST CARDS TO THE COLONIES AND FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

Post cards for a destination outside the United Kingdom are charged at the rate of 2d. for a single post card, and 4d. for a reply post card. They must be similar in size and substance to the official post card, and must have the title "POST CARD" printed or written on the address side. Post cards for any British Possession and certain Foreign Countries may bear a written or printed communication on the left-hand half of the address side.

NEWSPAPERS (INLAND).

For every registered newspaper not exceeding 4 oz., $1\frac{1}{2}$ d., with a further $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for every additional 4 oz., or fraction thereof. If two or more newspapers are sent in a single packet, each copy will be liable to the same postage as if it had been posted separately. The limit weight is 2 lbs. Every packet must be open at both ends, and must have no enclosure, except its supplement or supplements. To places abroad, the postage is $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for every 2 oz.

UNPAID.

Unpaid inland letters, halfpenny packets, and newspapers are charged with double postage, and if *insufficiently stamped*, with double the deficiency.

REGISTRATION.

Prepaid letters, newspapers, and printed papers and commercial papers may be registered for the United Kingdom, and for almost all places abroad, for a fee of 3d.

PARCEL POST (INLAND).

The greatest length allowed is 3 feet 6 inches, the greatest length and girth combined, 6 feet. The greatest weight allowed is 15 lb. The rates are:—

For inland money orders the charge is: for sums not exceeding £3, 4d.; above £3 and not exceeding £10, 6d.; above £10 and not exceeding £20, 8d.; above £20 and not exceeding £30, 10d.; above £30 and not exceeding £40, 1s.

The above rates apply to Orders issued for payment in the Irish Free State.

POSTAL ORDERS

are issued for any value, mounting by sixpence, from 6d. to 4s. 6d., 5s. to 21s., at the following rates of poundage; 6d. to 1s., 1d.; 1s. 6d. to 5s., $1\frac{1}{2}$ d.; 6s. to 21s., 2d.

Broken amounts, but not fractions of a penny, may be made up by the use of stamps not exceeding five pence in value or three in number affixed to the face of any postal order.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

1s. and upwards received at an interest of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. (or 6d. for every pound) per annum.

SECTION IV.

CHRONICLE.

I. NOTEWORTHY EVENTS.

8th December, 1940.—**St Columbkille's, Rutherglen**, was solemnly opened by His Grace the Archbishop of Glasgow on Sunday, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. The new church—work on which began nearly six years ago—replaces one which was the first Catholic place of worship in Rutherglen since the Reformation, and which was opened in February, 1853. Previous to that the Catholics of Rutherglen had to walk on Sunday mornings to St Mary's, Abercromby Street, in order to hear Mass.

The first Mass in the new church was celebrated by Mgr. Daly, V.G., with Father Troy, Barrhead, deacon, and Father Hoey, Rutherglen, sub-deacon. Father Conroy, D.D., Bearsden, was master of ceremonies, assisted by Father Kennedy, Rutherglen. His Grace Archbishop Mackintosh, who presided, was attended by Canon Doyle, Govan. Also present in the sanctuary were His Lordship Bishop Toner, Dunkeld (formerly parish-priest at Rutherglen), attended by Father Ashe, King's Park; His Lordship Bishop Graham of Tipasa, attended by Father Welsh, D.D., Falkirk; Mgr. Provost Kelly, Dumbarton; Mgr. Mullin, Partick; Mgr. Forbes, Bearsden; Canon Fitzgerald, St Mary's, Canon McBrearty, Springburn; Canon Doyle, Govan; Canon Paterson, Blantyre; Canon McMillan, Greenock; and Mgr. McGonagle, Rector of Blairs College, Aberdeen.

Before the sermon, which was preached by Bishop Toner, Father Plunkett addressed the congregation. He asked them to remember the late Canon Mackintosh, to whom, he said, was entirely due the erection of their beautiful basilica.

The new church, which occupies a commanding site in the centre of the town, completes a building scheme embracing the presbytery, which was finished about three years ago.

A large congregation can be housed in the church, which has a seating capacity of 1200, with ample standing accommodation in the aisles and in the spacious areas in front of the side chapels.

The plan of the church is rectangular, with a semi-circular shaped Sanctuary, and is based on the Roman Basilica style, having a broad centre passage and two side aisles, the aisles being separated from the main body of the church by rows of arches resting on columns of similar material, blaxter stone. Alongside the aisles are the confessionals, five in number.

The interior walls of the church are of stone and plaster, and support a flat timber roof designed in long panels, broken into smaller panels over the Sanctuary, and lightly decorated in colour.

The architect was Mr. J. A. Coia of Glasgow.

20th April, 1941.—Low Sunday will long be remembered in the annals of **St Columba's** parish. It was the day of the solemn opening of the magnificent and spacious **new Church**, amid scenes of great joy and gratitude. The Church was blessed on the previous evening by Rev. Denis Flynn, parish-priest, assisted by Rev. Joseph Duffy and Rev. P. Wycherley.

Solemn High Mass was celebrated at 12 o'clock in the presence of His Grace the Archbishop of Glasgow. Archbishop Mackintosh was attended at the throne by the Right Rev. Mgr. Hugh Kelly as assistant priest and Mgr. William Daly, V.G. and Mgr. Henry Forbes as assistant deacons. Rev. John Ashe was master of ceremonies at the Throne. The celebrant of the Mass was Rev. James McKenna, M.R., with Rev. John Devine, M.R., deacon, and Rev. Edmund Macdonald, sub-deacon, all of whom had laboured in St Columba's in former days. Father Duffy, of St Columba's, was

master of ceremonies. In the Sanctuary were also present the Right Rev. Mgr. James Mullin, Very Rev. Edward Canon Fitzgerald (first pastor of St Columba's), Very Rev. Peter Canon O'Connor, and Very Rev. Wm. Canon Horgan. Some fifty priests of the Archdiocese joined in the celebrations.

The old Church in Cameron Street was opened on 18th February, 1906, as an independent mission, the district having formerly been part of St Joseph's parish. The Rev. Edward Fitzgerald, now Canon, was transferred from Helensburgh to take charge, with Rev. John Devine, now of St Anthony's, as assistant.

The Silver Jubilee of the mission was celebrated in 1931, with Father McKenna, Father Duffy, and Father McKnight participating. The congregation attended a concert in the Woodside Halls, and so great was its success that it had to be repeated on another evening.

In January, 1937, Father McKenna was transferred as Missionary Rector to Airdrie and was succeeded by the present pastor, Father Flynn. The need for a new Church was very pressing, and application to the Diocesan Authorities was made on Good Friday of the same year.

This was readily granted, as also was permission to erect a new presbytery. The work was entrusted to the distinguished Glasgow architect, Mr. J. A. Coia.

The new church, which occupies a fine spacious site at the corner of Hopehill Road and Callander Street, provides the district with a much-needed note of distinction. Together with the presbytery, it forms a harmonious architectural group, and the warm red of brick and tile is pleasing to the eye.

The building has been designed with a seating capacity of 1000, and there is ample standing accommodation in the aisles and the spacious areas in front of the side chapels.

The plan of the church is of the Gothic type, with the main nave separated from the side aisles by rows

of concrete piers which give support to massive and lofty concrete Gothic pointed arches. The side passages are subdivided in their length by the same piers and responds, also forming Gothic pointed arches of a smaller size.

4th July.—The congregation of **St Patrick's, Shieldmuir**, celebrated in July of this year the **Golden Jubilee** of the Foundation of the Mission as a separate unit. The principal function was the Solemn Mass *coram Archiepiscopo*, celebrated by Rev. B. Atkinson. The preacher was Rev. J. Black. A notable feature of the Mass was the splendid congregational singing. At the end of the service His Grace the Archbishop of Glasgow, the Most Rev. Donald Mackintosh, congratulated the congregation on the achievement of the past fifty years and the flourishing condition of the Mission at the present time, adding words of encouragement for the dark days of war which might still lie ahead. At a social function held on Sunday, 13th July, which was attended by representatives of civic bodies and the medical profession, a substantial sum was handed by the congregation to Father Hamilton for a suitable memorial of the Jubilee.

The Mission of Shieldmuir, formerly known as Rumbingsykes, was served prior to 1891, first by Hamilton, then by Wishaw, and latterly by Motherwell. Holy Mass was not celebrated there however, until Rev. Dr. Glancy of Motherwell erected the first building, a small chapel-school, which was opened on 12th May, 1879. There were then only 92 children on the school roll. By 1891 the Catholic population had so considerably increased that Rumbingsykes was made a separate Mission. It was henceforth known as Shieldmuir, and included the villages of Berryhill, Ravenscraig, Craigneuk, Flemington and part of Nethererton. Some of these villages have since disappeared, and to-day most of the congregation are within the united burgh of Motherwell and Wishaw,

The Rev. George Ritchie was the first priest-in-charge of Shieldmuir, and during the twenty-three years of his incumbency he did splendid work in forming the Catholic spirit of the people and in providing accommodation for their rapidly increasing numbers. He built the presbytery, and twice added to the existing chapel-school. In 1898 he erected the present Gothic church (designed by P. P. Pugin), in 1901 a recreation hall, in 1902 a new senior school, and in 1911 a new infant school, all at a total cost of £25,000. When Father (then Canon) Ritchie left Shieldmuir in 1914 for St Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, the Catholic population was 5,000. He was followed by Rev. Ellis P. Rogan, D.D., who, by the example of his saintly life and by his extraordinary zeal did much to consolidate the work of the founder of the Mission. After his death in 1919, Rev. Theophilus Delbeke took over the charge. Despite the depression following on the war he was able by careful management to enhance the beauty of the church by the provision of a carved oak pulpit, a chancel rood, stations of the cross, and oak panelling round the sanctuary. He died at Shieldmuir in 1929, and was followed in 1930 by Rev. Bartholomew Atkinson, who was responsible for the erection of the present magnificent suite of halls. On Fr. Atkinson's transference to Motherwell in 1935, the present incumbent Rev. Alexander Hamilton was appointed to Shieldmuir. Under his direction the church has been considerably improved by various alterations, an electric light installation, new confessionals and an additional sacristy. The Catholic population is now 6,500. There are over 1,200 children in the local school, and 100 in central and higher grade schools. The Mission is now served by four priests.

21st-26th July.—Probably the happiest inspiration of the year was the holding of a **Youth Conference** in **Craiglockhart Training College**. Every aspect of the youth problem was touched upon in a well thought out programme of subjects. Father Leicester King, S.J.,

and Miss McCluskey, M.A., provided the backbone to the week's studies with a joint course on the psychology of the adolescent. Practical lectures, the fruit of rich experience, were given by Miss Walker on "How to start and run a Club," Miss McLean on "The Purpose of a Club and the Club Spirit," and Mother Turnbull on "Youth and Music." Mr. Dard pointed out the serious lack in our educational system of any real training for one's office in life. The two systems for the training of youth were outlined, Fr. Turner explaining the Y.C.W. training for boys and Miss Gall the Grail training for girls. The evenings were given to a demonstration of aids to club work, Mrs. Brash showing the possibilities for handwork and needlework, Mrs. Ratcliffe explaining the use and misuse of dramatics, Miss MacKinnon use of dancing and games, and Mother Turnbull the benefit of community singing.

The organisers are to be congratulated on the excellence of the lectures and on the outstanding success of the Conference as a whole. The discussions following the lectures, which are indicative of the success of a conference, were fruitful in ideas and interest. All present acknowledged the great benefit they had derived from the week's studies.

18th October.—**Father Patrick Green** celebrated the **Golden Jubilee** of his ordination to the priesthood. He has been Chaplain to the Little Sisters of the Poor in Edinburgh for the last fifteen years and in their beautiful church, he sang High Mass that morning, *coram Archiepiscopo*, with Father McGrain, deacon and Father Monaghan, sub-deacon. The Right Rev. Mgr. Mullin, D.D., of Glasgow, was assistant priest and the deacons at the throne were Canons Birnie and Stuart. The master of ceremonies were Father Chase and Father Tom Gallagher. Canon Stuart was the preacher, and he read the Pope's blessing sent to Father Green, through the Apostolic Delegate to Great Britain.

It was a great day for the Sisters and the old people in St Joseph's Home, who honoured their beloved

Chaplain Jubilarian, by many simple and touching gifts, and by a very enjoyable concert.

At a later ceremony, presided over by Archbishop McDonald, O.S.B., Father Green was presented with a substantial wallet of notes from his many clerical friends. Among others who met to honour Father Green, that morning, were:—Mgr. McGettigan, V.G., Canon Bruce, Father David, O.F.M., Father Welsh, D.D., and Dr. Malone.

19th October.—This date was set aside as **Youth Sunday** throughout the Archdiocese of St Andrews and Edinburgh. Rallies and youth demonstrations were held under the auspices of the Federation of Catholic Boys' Clubs and the Federation of Catholic Girls' Clubs, their success being beyond expectation.

The response of the leaders, the tremendous enthusiasm displayed by the youth and the many promises of co-operation made this day a memorable one in the Catholic life of the Archdiocese.

Since the form of celebration marking the day was left to individual, local initiative the manifestation of keenness was quite spontaneous, an omen which promises well for the future of the Catholic Youth Movement. It is hoped that this event will be an annual one and that the passing of years will witness a steady united growth in the numbers and spiritual vigour of our Catholic youth.

30th October.—**Consecration of St Mary's Church, Haddington.** In the old Pre-Reformation Church at Haddington, which bore the title of Mary the Virgin, a certain stone was protected by glass that the knowing visitor might note and understand. In Haddington Old Church, which is partly in ruins, there is visible a consecration cross, chiselled out, rather than hewn, in the chancel pillar. Even the stones cry out that it was once a Catholic Church. The present Catholic Church has now twelve crosses, besides two at the door, all meant to tell the same story as the solitary

cross in the old Pre-Reformation Church, namely, that it too was solemnly consecrated.

The consecration of the present church was carried out by His Grace the Archbishop of Edinburgh. Among those present were Canons Birnie, Stuart, Franklin and Bruce, two of whom were former parish priests. The deanery too was well represented. Rev. Cuthbert Chase was master of ceremonies; the cantor was Richard Reikie and the school children sang the music of the High Mass.

Haddington is an old mission. Its first registered Baptism is dated September 1852. The Church was opened in 1862, and its consecration on 30th October, 1941, was the occasion of congratulations by the Archbishop to both pastor and people.

Father Joyce was a brother of the late Canon Joyce of Edinburgh. He was ordained in 1897 and his first appointment was to St Mary's, Irvine. Here Father Joyce remained until 1918 and accomplished great work in the parish, renovating the entire church.

Requiem Mass was celebrated at St Thomas' on Wednesday by Father Hugh Mimmagh, Cumnock; the deacon was Father Martin Doyle, Castle Douglas, and the sub-deacon, Father Patrick Hennessy, Kilmarnock.

The burial took place in Liberton Cemetery, Edinburgh.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. JOHN J. ROGAN, who died at Coatbridge, on 30th December, 1940, in the 39th year of his age, and the 13th year of his priesthood.

Rev. John J. Rogan, who was born in Shettleston, was ordained by Archbishop Mackintosh in 1927, following his

course of studies at Blairs College and St Peter's College, Bearsden. After his ordination he was appointed to St Peter's, Partick, and from there to Alexandria, Hamilton, and Coatbridge.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Father Daniel Colvin, M.R., uncle of the deceased, with Father John Boyle, Cleland, deacon, and Father Michael Dooley, Coatbridge, sub-deacon. Father Albert Chandler, Coatbridge, was master of ceremonies. The music of the Mass was sung by a choir of priests under the direction of Father Hamilton, Shieldmuir, with Father Murie, Knightswood, organist. A large number of priests were present at the Mass. His Grace Archbishop Mackintosh was represented by Mgr. Daly, V.G.

His Grace sent a message of sympathy, not only to the relatives, but also to the clergy.

Father Colvin stressed the great sadness of all at the sudden loss of Father Rogan, who had come with all his energy to work among the parishioners of Coatbridge for the glory of God. He thanked those who had come out to pray for Father Rogan and to offer up Holy Mass for the repose of his soul. He asked them to continue to pray for him in the future.

At the burial service in Dalbeth Cemetery, Father Colvin recited the prayers.

Father Rogan, who went to Coatbridge about three months ago, became ill on Christmas Eve.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. HUGH DELARGEY, who died at Airdrie, on the 8th January, 1941, in the 55th year of his age and the 27th of his priesthood.

Born in Motherwell in 1886, Rev. Hugh Delargey was educated at Our Lady's, Motherwell, Blairs College, Aberdeen, Scots College, Valladolid, and St Peter's College, Bearsden. He was ordained in St Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, on the feast of SS. Peter and Paul, 1913.

Father Delargey's first appointment was to St Luke's, Glasgow, where he remained for several years. He was afterwards transferred to St John's, Barrhead, and from there as parish priest to St Mary's, Longriggend. About four years ago he was appointed to All Saints', Coatdyke.

At Coatdyke Father Delargey accomplished great work. He purchased one of the best sites in the district on which he had hoped to build a new church.

At his silver jubilee which was celebrated in 1938 many tributes were paid to Father Delargey by fellow-priests and parishioners. His gift of genuine charity and his rich, bubbling wit, never failed to influence those who came in contact

with him. One of his pastimes was play-writing, and several works written by him were staged by the local dramatic company.

Solemn Requiem Mass for the Rev. Hugh Delargey, Coatdyke, was celebrated in All Saints Church on 10th January, by the Rev. James Traynor, Riddrie (brother-in-law), with Father J. Boyle, Cleland, deacon, and Father John J. Murphy, Alexandria, sub-deacon. Father Hugh Bogan, Barrhead, was master of ceremonies.

After Mass, Father James McKenna, Airdrie, paid a tribute to the work done by Father Delargey during his twenty-seven years in the archdiocese.

The Right Rev. Mgr. Daly, V.G., represented His Grace the Archbishop, who was unable to attend, and a large number of priests were also present.

At the burial in St Patrick's Cemetery, New Stevenston, Father Thomas Brady, Coatdyke, recited the prayers.

Pray for the repose of the soul of the REV. JAMES H. DOHERTY, who died at Kingussie, on 9th February, 1941, in the 55th year of his age and the 30th of his priesthood.

Rev. James Doherty was born in Coatbridge. He was educated at Blairs College and St Sulpice, Paris, where he was ordained in the early summer of 1911. His first appointment was to St Mary's, Glasgow, where he remained for eight years. Afterwards he was Chaplain at Bishopbriggs and at Langbank Home. For a short time he was a curate at St Joseph's, Tollcross. It was in 1925 that his health finally broke down and his long period of illness began.

Requiem Mass was celebrated in St Patrick's, Coatbridge, by Rev. Daniel Colvin, M.R., assisted by Rev. Albert Chandler as deacon, and Rev. Michael Dooley as sub-deacon. Rev. James Missett was master of ceremonies. His Grace the Archbishop, attended by Mgr. Daly, V.G., and Canon Doyle, assisted at the Mass.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. WILLIAM J. MALLOY, who died at Glasgow, on 18th February, 1941, in the 63rd year of his age and the 37th of his priesthood.

Born in India, where his father was serving in the army, Father Molloy was brought back to Scotland in his early years, his parents settling in Glenboig. He was educated at the school in Glenboig; at Blairs College; France; and latterly at St Peter's College, Bearsden. He was ordained priest in Glasgow in 1904 by Archbishop Maguire.

Father Molloy's first appointment was to Coatdyke, where he remained for several years. He was then appointed to

assist the late Canon Collins in the opening of St Roch's mission, Glasgow, in 1907. For nine years he was Chaplain to Barlinnie Prison, and was thereafter transferred as parish priest to Clarkston, Linwood, and Helensburgh. Seven years ago he was appointed to St John's, Barrhead. He had been in indifferent health for the past few years, and a few weeks before Christmas he became seriously ill and was removed to a Glasgow nursing home.

During his illness Father Molloy was attended by Father d'Andria, S.J., and by Father Brett, St Patrick's.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated in St John's Barrhead, His Grace the Archbishop presiding. The celebrant was Father Pirrie, Paisley; deacon, Father Flanagan, Mossend; and sub-deacon, Father Hammill, Barrhead.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. PATRICK REILLY, who died at Glasgow, on 10th March, 1941, in the 57th year of his age, and the 32nd of his priesthood.

Born fifty-seven years ago at Saltcoats, Rev. Patrick Reilly received his early education at St Mary's School, and later went to St Aloysius' College, Glasgow. His priestly education he received at Blairs and at St Sulpice, Paris, where he was ordained in 1908.

His first curacy was at Uddingston, where he worked for many years. There followed curacies at Croy and Coatdyke, and then he was appointed parish priest at Harthill where he built the church and presbytery. In 1926 he was transferred to Knightswood, and again he set himself the task of parish building. Living in a local house and saying his Masses at Whiteinch, he gathered together Knightswood's Catholics and began the erection of their church and presbytery.

Knightswood parishioners will mourn this priest whose unostentatious charity was well known and whose unfailing humour but increased as his death drew near.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated on 12th March, in the presence of His Grace the Archbishop. The celebrant was Father Clark, Paisley. Father Bonnyman, Whiteinch, was deacon, and Father Stuart, Lambhill, sub-deacon. All three are old classmates of the dead priest. Dr. Meehan, Cathedral, was master of ceremonies.

His Grace the Archbishop was attended by Mgr. Daly, V.G., and by Mgr. Forbes.

Among those present in the sanctuary were Canon Doyle, Govan; Canon Hayes, Troon; Canon Carey, Kilmarnock. A large number of priests were also present.

The music of the Mass was rendered by a priests' choir with Father Murie, St Ninian's, at the organ.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. THOMAS McEWAN, D.D., who died at Glasgow, on the 30th March, 1941, in the 59th year of his age and the 34th of his priesthood.

Dr. McEwan was born in Glasgow, of Irish parents, on 18th November, 1881. He was educated at St Aloysius' School, Springburn, and later at St Aloysius' College, Glasgow. In 1899 he went to Blairs College, Aberdeen, and two years later he was sent to the Scots College, Rome, where he was raised to the priesthood in the German College, Rome, by Cardinal Respighi, on 28th October, 1906.

Returning to Glasgow, in June, 1907, he celebrated his first Mass in St Aloysius', Springburn. After a short period at Holy Cross, Croy, he was appointed curate at St Mary's, Abercromby Street, where he remained for eighteen years. At St Mary's he put his whole heart into every project promoted by the late Canon Dyer. He organised the Sacred Heart Association which became a great spiritual influence in the East End of Glasgow, and it was here that he began his great work for the children of the Catholic schools.

In 1924 Dr. McEwan was sent to assist the late Father Stack at St Bride's, Cambuslang.

In November of the same year he was chosen by His Grace Archbishop Mackintosh to found the new mission of St Thomas', Riddrie. His tireless energy and organising ability are shown by the fact that the new mission is now one of the most progressive in the city.

For five years Dr. McEwan served on the old Education Authority as representative of the Camlachie and Springburn area.

Continuing his good work at Riddrie, Dr. McEwan set about providing for his fast-growing congregation by erecting a chapel-of-ease in the Carntyne housing scheme. His efforts were blessed when on 16th December, 1934, Archbishop Mackintosh formally declared open the new chapel. It was dedicated in honour of St Bernadette and is capable of accommodating about 600 people.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated in Our Holy Redemeer's, Clydebank, on Wednesday by Rev. Dr. McEwan's nephew, the Rev. James McEwan, Paisley, with Father O'Neill, Riddrie, deacon, and Father Harkin, Clydebank, sub-deacon. Dr. Meechan, Cathedral, was master of ceremonies.

Among the Cathedral chapter present were Mgr. Daly, V.G., Mgr. Provost Kelly, Mgr. Mullin, Mgr. Forbes, Canon Doyle, Canon FitzGerald, Canon McMillan and Canon Taylor.

Following the Mass, Mgr. Daly spoke a few words of tribute about Dr. McEwan.

At the burial in St Kentigern's Cemetery, Father James McEwan officiated.

Pray for the repose of the soul of VERY REV. WILLIAM CANON MACDONALD, who died at Dunoon, on the 26th April, 1941, in the 79th year of his age, and the 51st of his priesthood.

Canon Macdonald was the only priest in Argyll to serve under the four bishops of that diocese since its restoration in 1879. As a curate at Oban he served under Bishop Angus Macdonald and later under Bishop Smith, and at Dunoon he was under the jurisdiction of the late Bishop Martin, and latterly the present Bishop of Argyll and the Isles, the Right Rev. Donald A. Campbell, D.D.

Canon Macdonald, who was in his 79th year, was educated for the priesthood at Rome and was ordained in 1889.

He celebrated his golden jubilee two years ago.

After his ordination he was appointed curate at Oban where he served under Bishop Angus Macdonald, the first bishop of the diocese since 1553. Bishop Macdonald was later translated to the archdiocese of St Andrews and Edinburgh, and Canon Macdonald continued at Oban under his successor, Bishop Smith. He later served in the missions of Inverie, Knoydart, Daliburgh, South Uist and Glenfinnan. In 1919 Canon Macdonald was appointed to Portree, and five years later he began his work at Dunoon.

When Canon Macdonald went to Dunoon in 1924 the existing church, situated in Alfred Street, was an old building, having been opened in 1862 by the Rev. Joseph Small, a native of Hamilton. Canon Macdonald immediately began the task of building a new church.

For many years the accommodation of the old church was found inadequate, especially for the congregation during the summer months. The school adjoining the old church was also lacking in the necessary space for the growing numbers, and in 1925 it was practically condemned by His Majesty's Inspectors.

It was decided eventually to sell the old church to the Education Authority to be converted into a school, and during the period that the new church was in course of erection the congregation heard Mass in Dunoon Pavilion and latterly in the chapel house at Cragroy.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated in Oban Cathedral and the burial afterwards took place to Pennyfuir Cemetery.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. PATRICK McDANIEL, who died at Manchester, on 27th April,

1941, in the 66th year of his age and the 42nd of his priesthood.

The Rev. Patrick McDaniel was born in Dundee, on 30th January, 1875. He entered Blairs College in the summer of 1888, and four years later, he proceeded to Valladolid, to complete his study of philosophy and theology. He was ordained in the year 1899. He served for some years in the diocese of Galloway. Afterwards he returned to his own diocese of Dunkeld. He was sent as professor to his old College of Valladolid; but his health, never very robust, completely broke down, and he was forced to retire from active work. For many years he had been living in retirement at Manchester where he died.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. JOHN J. FLEMING, who died at Glasgow, on the 8th May, 1941, in the 65th year of his age and the 42nd of his priesthood.

A native of Kilcummin, near Killarney, Father Fleming came from a distinguished family of Irish educationists.

Educated at Killarney and Maynooth, Father Fleming was ordained at the Irish seminary 41 years ago. He was first appointed to Blantyre, where he served for three years, and was then transferred to St John's where he was a curate for many years. His third appointment was parish priest at Renton, and from there he was transferred to Glasgow where he built the beautiful church of St Anne's.

The celebrant at the Solemn Requiem Mass was the Rev. Anthony Mullins, Sacred Heart, Glasgow. He was assisted by Father Harty, Shotts, deacon, and Father Harvey, St Anne's, sub-deacon.

His Grace Archbishop Mackintosh was represented by the Vicar-General, Mgr. Daly. Members of the Chapter present included the Very Rev. Canons McBrearty, Taylor, Paterson, FitzGerald, Horgan and McMillan. There was a large attendance of priests, and the church and routes to the church were thronged with parishioners.

Addressing the congregation Mgr. Daly described the late Father Fleming as a man of calm and comprehensive judgment; as a man of few words—a real man of action; as a priest of the old type, dignified, evaluating to the fullest what the priesthood meant.

Father Mullins officiated at the graveside at Dalbeth.

Pray for the repose of the soul of VERY REV. WILLIAM E. CANON ROONEY, Provost of the Cathedral Chapter of St Mary's, Edinburgh who died on the Feast of the Ascension, 22nd May, 1941, in the

84th year of his age, and the 57th of his priesthood.

The late Canon Rooney was born in Edinburgh, in 1857. He entered Blairs College in 1873, and passed on to Douai in 1877, and thence to Rome in 1879 where he was ordained on 22nd May, 1884. On his return to Scotland he was, first, stationed at St Mary's Cathedral, and thereafter for a brief stay at Penicuik. In 1887 he was appointed Vice-Rector of the Scots College at Rome where he held office till 1892. On his recall to the Archdiocese he was put in charge of St Alexander's, Denny, and subsequently he served the missions at Galashiels, St Andrews, and Peebles. In 1929 he was chosen Provost of the Chapter of St Mary's Cathedral.

The late Canon Rooney was the oldest priest in the Archdiocese. His was a strong, kindly personality, the strength derived from his absolute rectitude and sincerity of soul. He was a truly noblehearted priest, highly cultured and greatly gifted, and generous to a fault. How dearly he loved the glory of God's House, the churches at Galashiels and Peebles bear ample witness. Throughout his long life he made hosts of friends, and amongst his fellow priests his name will be long cherished and honoured.

He literally died in harness. Six weeks before the end he met with an accident while walking in his garden. Pneumonia gradually set in and after the last Sacraments had been administered he calmly passed away on the Feast of Our Lord's Ascension and the anniversary day of his own ordination. His body was conveyed to St Mary's Cathedral where Solemn Pontifical Requiem Mass was celebrated and the Absolutions were given by His Grace Archbishop McDonald, O.S.B. He was buried in the Priests' Enclosure in Mount Vernon Cemetery.

Pray for the repose of the soul of the REV. DENIS SCANNELL, who died at Kilbirnie, on the 29th May, 1941, in the 66th year of his age and the 39th of his priesthood.

Father Scannell was born in 1875 at Castlemartyr, Co. Cork. He was educated at St Colman's College, Fermoy; St Mary's College, Blairs; and at Scots College, Valladolid, Spain, where he was ordained in 1902. He served in curacies at Clydebank, Croy, and Coatbridge before he was appointed parish priest at Cadzow by His Grace Archbishop Mackintosh. It is interesting to note that this was the first clerical appointment made by the Archbishop following his consecration.

In 1936 Father Scannell was transferred from Cadzow to Kilbirnie, where he laboured until his death.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated at Kilbirnie by the Rev. Anthony Mullins assisted by the Rev. Father Duffy,

C.F., deacon, and the Rev. Father Rynn, sub-deacon. Members of the Glasgow Chapter present included the Very Rev. Fathers Doyle and Horgan. The Galloway diocese was represented by the Right Rev. Mgr. McHardy, and the Very Rev. Fathers Hayes and Carey. There was a large attendance of priests and the church was thronged with parishioners.

Due to the meeting of the Scottish hierarchy, His Grace Archbishop Mackintosh was unable to attend, but through Father Bradley, Stevenston, expressed his sympathy with the relatives of the deceased and the Kilbirnie parishioners.

The late Father Scannell's family were represented by the Rev. P. J. Scannell, Dublin (nephew), and Dr. and Mrs. Torley and Joseph Torley.

Father Mullins officiated at the graveside at Dalbeth.

A man of very high ideals, he will ever be remembered for his great work in Cadzow where he was instrumental in building a new church, schools and presbytery.

Students of Scots College, Valladolid, will remember Father Scannell for his production of plays. With permission from Canon Sheehan he translated "My New Curate" into Spanish and the play was a great success.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. FRANCIS JOSEPH LAVETH, who died at Skelmorlie, on the 9th June, 1941, in the 69th year of his age and the 46th of his priesthood.

Father Laveth, who was born in 1872, was ordained in Glasgow towards the latter end of the last century, and was first appointed to curacies at Holy Cross, Glasgow, Johnstone, and Kirkintilloch, where he served under Mgr. Mullin, now parish priest of Partick.

While at Kirkintilloch Father Laveth's health broke down, and it was found necessary to send him on a recuperative visit to Australia. After splendid work in Western Australia, and with his health fully recovered, he returned to the Glasgow Archdiocese, where he became first parish priest at Cardonald. In turn he became parish priest at Gourrock and Glenboig. He retired a few years ago to Skelmorlie.

The Right Rev. Mgr. Mullin was celebrant at the Solemn Requiem Mass in the presence of the Archbishop in St Peter's, Partick. He was assisted by the Rev. Frs. Rooney, deacon, and F. Hamilton, sub-deacon.

His Grace was attended at the throne by the Right Rev. Mgr. Daly, V.G., and the Very Rev. Canon Doyle. Canon FitzGerald was also present.

The music of the Mass was rendered by a choir of priests conducted by the Rev. A. Hamilton.

In a brief panegyric His Grace asked for the prayers of all for this good and zealous priest,

The Right Rev. Mgr. Mullin officiated at the graveside at Dalbeth where the pallbearers were the Rev. Fathers Proctor, Galbraith, M.C., Black, Rooney, F. Hamilton, and Douglas.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. THOMAS GANNON, who died at Dundee, on the 12th July, 1941, in the 41st year of his age and the 15th of his priesthood.

A native of Perth, Father Gannon, who was a nephew of the late Very Rev. Canon Lavelle, was educated at St John's School and Blairs College. He was just at the conclusion of his studies at Blairs during the last war when he was called up for military service.

After the Armistice he resumed his studies at St Peter's College, Bearsden, and went from there to the Scots College, Rome. He was ordained at the Church of St John Lateran, Rome, on 27th February, 1926.

His first appointment was a curacy at Our Lady of Victories where he remained for a few months, following which he was transferred to the Immaculate Conception, Lochee. Following six years of service at Lochee, Father Gannon suffered a serious breakdown in health, and on his recovery served in the Glasgow Archdiocese — at St Anne's Church, Glasgow. Father Gannon returned to his native diocese four years ago to take up his appointment as curate at SS. Peter and Paul's, in which parish he was serving until his last illness.

His Lordship Bishop Maguire, pontificating at the Solemn Mass of Requiem, was assisted by the Rev. Father Kaye, deacon, and the Rev. Dr. McLean, sub-deacon. The Rev. Father Foylan was master of ceremonies.

Pray for the repose of the soul of the VERY REV. PETER CANON O'CONNOR, who died at Glasgow, on the 24th July, 1941, in the 75th year of his age and 49th of his priesthood.

A native of Kilwinning, Canon O'Connor, who was in his 76th year, was educated at Clonliffe College, Dublin, and the Scots College, Rome. On his return to Glasgow following his ordination in Rome in 1892, Canon O'Connor was curate at a number of Archdiocesan missions prior to becoming parish priest at Clarkston.

He was later pastor at Shettleston, Glasgow, and Burnbank, and was appointed to the Maryhill mission in 1926. A gifted and widely-respected priest, he was president of the Diocesan Tribunal, and for a time an examiner at St Peter's College, Bearsden. He was elevated to the Chapter twelve years ago.

For some time Canon O'Connor had been far from well, but refused to rest from his priestly labours until his illness.

took a very serious turn a week ago. He died shortly after midnight on Thursday, 24th July.

His Grace the Archbishop of Glasgow attended by the Right Rev. Mgr. Daly, V.G., and the Right Rev. Mgr. Kelly (Dumbarton), presided at the Solemn Requiem Mass in the Immaculate Conception Church. The celebrant, the Right Rev. Mgr. Forbes (Bearsden) was assisted by the Rev. Father Stuart (Duntocher), deacon, and the Rev. Father Craigen (Immaculate Conception), sub-deacon. Father Rogers (Immaculate Conception) was the master of ceremonies.

The canons stalls were occupied by the Very Rev. Canons FitzGerald, Doyle, Taylor, McMillan and Birnie, the latter from the Archdiocese of St Andrews and Edinburgh, and a former classmate of the late Canon O'Connor.

The music of the Mass was provided by a choir of priests conducted by Father A. Hamilton (Shieldmuir).

There was a large attendance of clergy and the church was crowded to overflowing with sorrowful parishioners.

Pray for the repose of the soul of REV. JAMES G. BONNYMAN, who died at Aberdeen, on the 29th August, 1941, in the 56th year of his age and the 29th of his priesthood.

Father James Bonnyman, the third son of the late Mr. Peter Bonnyman, Clochan, and a nephew of the late Father James Bonnyman, Kirkintilloch, Glasgow, received his secondary education at Milne's Institution, Fochabers, to which in his day all the brighter pupils proceeded from Enzie. After a few years at Blairs College and a further period of training at St Peter's, Bearsden, his studies took him to Issy-les-Malmeau and the seminary of St Sulpice.

He was ordained in 1912 in Paris and there celebrated his first Mass in the Church of St Sulpice, assisted by the Rev. Peter Bonnyman, his brother.

For the year following his ordination Father James Bonnyman was assistant priest at the Cathedral, Aberdeen, and thereafter at Lerwick. During the early period of the last war he served at Wick till transferred to Ballater, where he served till 1926. From then till two years ago he was priest at Portsoy, following which he became pastor at Braemar—his last charge.

In all those places Father James Bonnyman, we feel certain, will have left the memory of a happy, genial and enriching personality, not only amongst his own beloved people, but among every section of the community.

Solemn Requiem Mass for the repose of Father Bonnyman's soul was celebrated in the presence of His Lordship Bishop Bennett, D.D., LL.D., by the Rev. Peter Bonnyman, Whiteinch. At the Mass, which was celebrated on 2nd Sept. in the

historic church of St Gregory, Rushholme, Father Peter Bonnyman was assisted by the Rev. J. F. Stuart, Duntocher, deacon, and the Rev. A. M. Bennett, sub-deacon. His Lordship was attended at the throne by the Right Rev. Charles Provost Macdonald.
