SECTION I.

THE HIERARCHY OF THE CHURCH

THE Catholic Hierarchy, or the governing body of the Holy Catholic Church, consists of: 1, His Holiness the Sovereign Pontiff, assisted by the Sacred College of Cardinals, and by the Sacred Congregations (of which the Cardinals are the chief members), the Tribunals and the Offices of the Roman Curia; 2, The Patriarchs, Archbishops and Bishops; 3, The Apostolic Delegates, Vicars and Prefects; and 4, certain Abbots and Prelates.

I.—GENERAL SUMMARY.



His Holiness The Pope,

Bishop of Rome and Vicar of Jesus Christ,
Successor of St. Peter, Prince of the Apostles,
Supreme Pontiff of the Universal Church,
Patriarch of the West, Primate of Italy,

Sacred College of Cardinals.

Consisting, when it is complete, of six Cardinal Bishops, fifty Cardinal Priests and fourteen Cardinal Deacons.

Patriarchates.

There are ten Patriarchates, with fourteen Patriarchal Sees, eight of the Latin Rite, and six of the Oriental Rite.

The greater, or more ancient Patriarchates, are those of: Alexandria, *Latin* and *Coptic*; Antioch, with four Patriarchal Sees, *Latin*, *Greco-Melchite*, *Maronite* and *Syriac*; Constantinople, *Latin*; and Jerusalem, *Latin*. The less are those of: Babylon, *Chaldaic*; Cilicia, *Armenian*; the East Indies, *Latin*; Lisbon, *Latin*; Venice, *Latin*; and the West Indies, *Latin*.

Besides the *Residential Sees*, there are many *Titular Sees*, formerly (until 3rd March, 1882) called *Sees in partibus infidelium*, that is, Sees in infidel regions, the Archbishops and Bishops of which only take their title from them without being bound to residence. These Sees are, for the most part, assigned to Archbishops and Bishops appointed, either to Apostolic Delegations, Vicariates or Prefectures; or to the office of Coadjutor, Auxiliary or Administrator of a Diocese. Many are vacant.

II.—THE SOVEREIGN PONTIFF.

HIS HOLINESS POPE PIUS XII (EUGENIO PACELLI), the 261st Roman Pontiff, was born at Rome, March 2nd, 1876; ordained Priest, 2nd April, 1899; consecrated Titular Archbishop of Sardis, May 18th, 1917; created Cardinal, December 16th, 1929; Secretary of State, 7th February, 1930; elected Pope March 2nd and crowned March 12th, 1939.

III.—THE SACRED COLLEGE OF CARDINALS.

The Cardinals, as the advisers and assistants of the Sovereign Pontiff, are the Supreme council or senate of the Church. On the death of the Pontiff, they elect his successor.

There are three orders of Cardinals, *Bishops, Priests and Deacons*. These orders are distinct from those of the Hierarchy; with very few

exceptions, the Cardinal Priests are archbishops and bishops; and the Cardinal Deacons are generally priests.

The Sacred College, when complete, consists of 70 members; 6 Cardinal Bishops, whose Dioceses are the six "Suburban Sees," near Rome; 50 Cardinal Priests, who take their title from the "Titular Churches," to which they are appointed, with jurisdiction and right to a throne, etc., therein; and 14 Cardinal Deacons, who are appointed to other churches called "Deaconries."

The first Cardinal Bishop is *Dean*, the first of the Priests is *First Priest*, and the first of the Deacons is *First Deacon*, of the Sacred College. The Dean has the right of consecrating, and the First Deacon the right of proclaiming and crowning, a new Pope.

On the death of the Pontiff the Cardinal *Camerlengo* has the administration of the public affairs of the Holy See.

The "creation" of a Cardinal sometimes precedes, even by several years, its "publication" or proclamation. The Cardinal is then said to be "reserved *in petto*," and, when proclaimed, he takes precedence according to date of creation.

3. **Congregation for the Eastern Church.**—Having jurisdiction over all persons and things pertaining to the Oriental Rites, except in matters that belong to the Holy Office. *Sec.*: Cardinal Eugene Tisserant, Palazzo dei Convertendi, Via della Conciliazione, Roma.

4. **Congregation of Sacramental Discipline.** — Legislation as to the administration and reception of the Sacraments in matters not subject to the jurisdiction of the Holy Office or the Congregation of Rites; dispensations from impediments to Marriage and to Ordination and in regard to the Blessed Eucharist; questions as to the validity of Marriages and of Ordinations. *Sec.*: S. E. R. Mgr. Francesco Bracci, Palazzo delle Congregazioni, Piazza S. Callisto, Roma.

5. **Congregation of the Council.**—The observance of precepts of the Church and dispensations therein. Regulations as to parish priests and canons; to pious associations, pious bequests and pious works; to benefices, ecclesiastical property, etc. Also whatever relates to the celebration of Councils and their ratification, and to meetings and conferences of Bishops. *Sec.*: S. Ex. Mgr. Francesco Roberti, Palazzo delle Congregazioni, Piazza S. Callisto, Roma.

6. **Congregation for the Affairs of Religious.**—The Regulations of matters between Bishops and Religious, and amongst Religious themselves, including persons who, without vows, live a community life, or are secular members of Third Orders. 10. **Congregation for Extraordinary Ecclesiastical Affairs.**—The consideration of matters submitted to its examination by the Supreme Pontiff through the Cardinal Secretary of State; especially those connected with civil laws, or relating to agreements made with civil powers. The **Pontifical Commission for Russia**, which has charge of the faithful of Latin Rite in Russia, is joined to this Congregation. **Sec.: S. Ex Mgr. ENGLAND AND WALES.

HIERARCHY RESTORED BY POPE PIUS IX., 29th SEPTEMBER, 1850.

By Apostolic Letters of Pope Pius X., 28th October, 1911, England and Wales, which from 1850 had only one Province, were divided into three Provinces. By Apostolic Letters of Pope Benedict XV., 7th February, 1916, a fourth Province, of Cardiff, was added. On 22nd March, 1917, the new diocese for Essex was erected, receiving the name of Brentwood on 20th July, 1917. The Diocese of Lancaster, Suffragan of Liverpool, was formed on 22nd November, 1924.

SECTION III.

THE HIERARCHY OF SCOTLAND

From the Extinction of the Hierarchy in 1603 till its Restoration in 1878.

1. The ancient Hierarchy ended with James Betoun, Abp. of Glasgow, who died at Paris on the 25th April, 1603, aged 79. After being subjected to the jurisdiction of the Archpriests and first Vicar-Apostolic of England till 1623, and afterwards to local Prefects of the Mission, the Clergy were incorporated into a missionary body by decree of Propaganda, 1653, and governed by the following Prefects-Apostolic—**William Ballantyne** (or **Bellenden**), 1653-61; **Alexander Dunbar** (or **Winster**), 1662-68, 1672-94; and **John Walker** (or **Ross**), 1668-71. In May, 1694, a Scottish Vicariate-Apostolic was established. This was divided into two Districts, the Lowland and the Highland, in February, 1731; and these two into three, the Eastern, Western and Northern, by Papal Rescript of 13th February, 1827. This last arrangement remained in force till the re-establishment of the Hierarchy by the Apostolic Letter, *Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice*, 4th March, 1878.

The Apostolic Letter "Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice" of Leo XIII, 4th March, 1878, divided Scotland into the Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (with four Suffragan Sees) and the Archdiocese of Glasgow, which was directly subject to the Holy See. By the Apostolic Constitution "Maxime Interest" of Pius XII, 25th May, 1947, and the Apostolic Constitution "Dominici Gregis" of the same date, the Archdiocese of Glasgow was erected into a Province and divided into the Metropolitan See of Glasgow with the Suffragan Sees of Motherwell and Paisley.

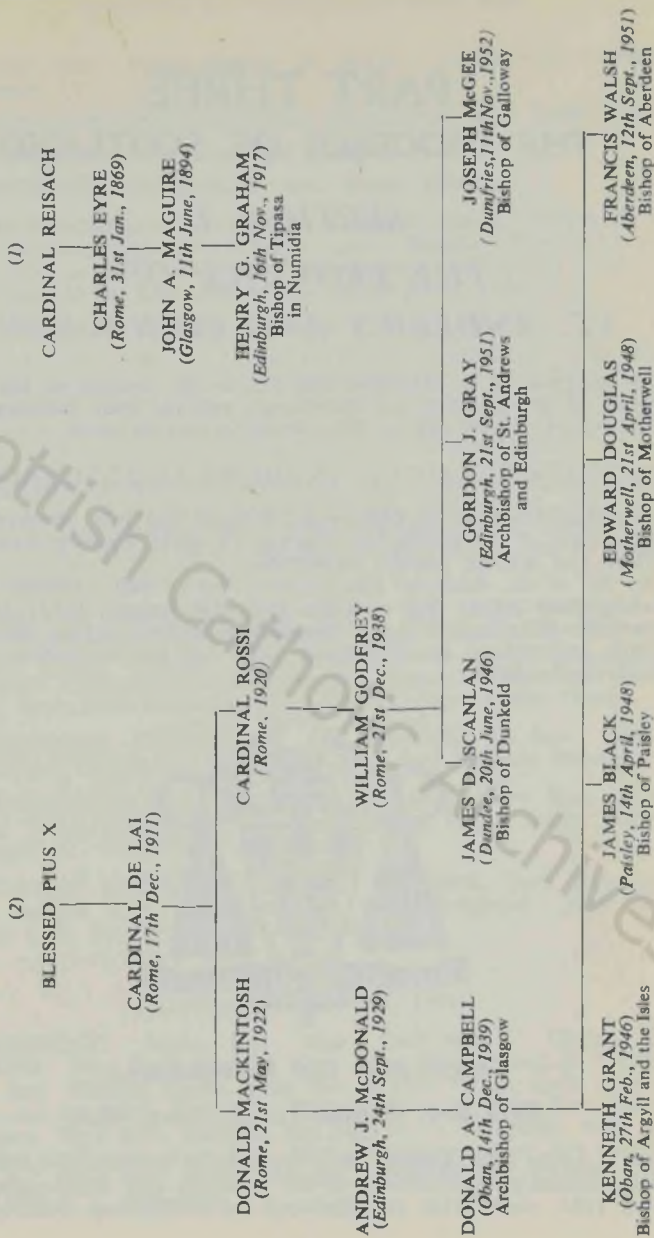

The Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh consists of the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh and the four Suffragan Sees of Aberdeen, Argyll and the Isles, Dunkeld and Galloway.

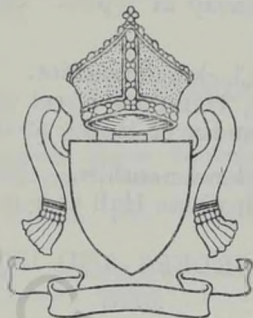

The See of Glasgow, comprising the City of Glasgow, the County of Dumbarton and the Baldernock district of Stirlingshire, was founded about 543 by St. Kentigern (or Mungo); erected into a Metropolitan See, with four Suffragan Sees, by Innocent VIII., 9th January, 1492 and was vacant for 275 years from the death of James Betoun, 4th Archbishop, at Paris, on 25th April, 1603, till the restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878.

He was ordained at Carlow on the 8th June, 1952, by the Right Rev. Thomas Keogh, Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin. He is now stationed at St. Bridget's, Baillieston.

Rev. HERBERT FLACK, born at Bangor, Co. Down, on the 28th December, 1923, was educated at St. Malachy's College, Belfast, and at All Hallows' College, Dublin. He was ordained at All Hallows' College on the 22nd June, 1952, by the Right Rev. James Fergus, Bishop of Achonry. Father Flack is now stationed at St. Aloysius', Chapelhall.

Rev. JAMES JOSEPH KEEGAN was born at Carrigtwohill, Co. Cork, on the 19th April, 1927. He pursued his ecclesiastical studies at St. Colman's, Fermoy, and at St. Patrick's College, Carlow. He was ordained at Carlow on the 8th June, 1952, by the Right Rev. Thomas Keogh, Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin. Father Keegan has been appointed to St. Mary's, Longriggend.

Rev. JAMES MONAGHAN, born at Donecarney, Drogheda, Co. Meath, on the 1st March, 1926, was educated at St. Finian's College, Mullingar, and at All Hallows' College, Dublin. He was ordained at All Hallows' College on the 22nd June, 1952, by the Right Rev. James Fergus, Bishop of Achonry. He is now stationed at St. Bartholomew's, Coatbridge.

Rev. MARTIN O'GRADY was born on the 11th September, 1927, at Nooan, Kilnaboy, Co. Clare. He was educated at St. Flannan's College, Ennis, and at St. Patrick's College, Carlow. He was ordained at Carlow on 8th June, 1952, by the Right Rev. Thomas Keogh, Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin, and is now stationed at St. Augustine's, Coatbridge.

Rev. TIMOTHY O'SULLIVAN was born on the 21st May, 1929, at Old Fort, Killinardrish, Co. Cork. He was educated at St. Finbarr's College, Farranferris, and at St. Patrick's College, Carlow. He was ordained for the Diocese of Cork on the 8th June, 1952, at Carlow, by the Right Rev. Thomas Keogh, Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin. He has been appointed to St. Cuthbert's, Burnbank.

Diocese of Paisley.

Rev. RICHARD FITZGERALD was born at Clonora, New Birmingham, Thurles, Co. Tipperary, on the 28th June, 1925. He was educated at St. Patrick's College, Thurles, and ordained for the Archdiocese of Cashel on the 15th June, 1952, in the Cathedral, Thurles, by the Most Rev. Jeremiah Kinane, Archbishop of Cashel. Father Fitzgerald is at present stationed at St. John's, Barrhead.

Rev. SYLVESTER McGRADY was born on the 20th July, 1923, at Downpatrick, Northern Ireland. He was educated at the Redemptorist College, Galway, Queen's University, Belfast, and St. Peter's College, Cardross. He was ordained in St. Mirin's Cathedral, Paisley, on the 12th June, 1952, by the Right Rev. James Black, Bishop of Paisley, and has now taken up an appointment at St. John's, Port-Glasgow.

SECTION III.

OBITUARY—1951-52

REV. JOHN McLAUGHLIN—3rd December, 1951.

On the 3rd of December, 1951, the Diocese of Motherwell sustained the loss of one of its Parish Priests when Fr. McLaughlin was taken to his reward from the Parish of St. Catherine of Siena, Harthill.

Born on the 30th May, 1903, in the Partick district of Glasgow, John McLaughlin was schooled at St. Peter's, Partick. There he reached the then known qualifying stage and was admitted to St. Aloysius' College, Garnethill. He did not spend much time there, for his vocation destined him for the Priesthood, and so he entered Blairs College in August, 1917. Arrived in St. Mary's among his class-mates, he settled down to the routine life of the seminary. In due course the Higher Certificate year came along and, in June, 1922, having obtained the certificate, he was among fourteen youths posted to Valladolid to read Philosophy and Theology.

There again, he soon found his feet and, as year after year of the course of seven went by, he moved steadily on to his life's ambition. His steadfast and patient nature always impressed his contemporaries. This was very evident when, within a very short time of one another, he lost both his father and mother. Unshaken by this double trial, John McLaughlin kept steadily on the road mapped out by Providence. His perseverance saw its reward on May 25th, 1929, on which date he was raised to the Priesthood by Archbishop Gandasegui y Gorrochátequi.

On his return to Scotland, he was on supply at St. Bridget's, Baillieston, for a few weeks and then, in July of the same year, he was posted to St. Mary's, Greenock.

For the better part of fifteen years he worked among the Greenockians and, naturally, in such a long time, knew all and was known by all in St. Mary's. Small in stature, he was big in heart, and his kindness and consideration for others were truly priestly.

In 1944, Fr. McLaughlin was transferred to St. Columba's, Viewpark. By this stage in his career it was natural for him to look forward to the day when he could have his own house and parish. He was both happy and proud, therefore, when on 8th September, 1950, he was appointed to Harthill. Once there, he set about putting things the way he wanted them, after his characteristic fashion, and was obviously full of the work his Bishop had given him to do.

That work, however, for Fr. McLaughlin was not of long duration. Barely a year after his promotion he was taken with an illness that necessitated a major operation. With his usual fortitude, on being asked what it involved, his answer was, "I have a fifty-fifty chance of survival." He took the chance in the name of God and accepted the desire of his Maker, that he should go, on the 3rd December, 1951.

Fr. Patrick Heaney celebrated Requiem Mass, assisted by Fr. William Hart and Fr. William Mallon, in the presence of His Lordship Bishop Douglas. The people of Harthill packed their Church and showed how well a good priest had worked among them. They joined many of his fellow priests to St. Patrick's Cemetery, New Stevenston, where the interment took place. *May he rest in peace.*

VERY REV. DANIEL CANON COLVIN—8th December, 1951.

The Very Rev. Daniel Canon Colvin was born at Lightburn, in the Shettleston district of Glasgow, on the 24th January, 1877. After studying for the priesthood at St. Mary's College, Blairs, and at the Royal Scots College in Spain, he was ordained on the 29th June, 1902, by Archbishop José Maria Cos, Archbishop of Valladolid. On his return to his native Archdiocese, Father Colvin was appointed, in succession, curate at Maryhill, Cambuslang and Burnbank. In 1915, he was given charge of the mission at Largs and, later, of the mission at Gourrock. When the new mission of St. Constantine's, Govan, was opened in 1921, Father Colvin became first Rector of that mission and, in 1931, he came to St. Patrick's, Coatbridge. His administration of this important parish saw many improvements, not least the complete renovation of the church and the liquidation of all parochial debt, prior to the celebration of the centenary of St. Patrick's parish in 1948.

In October, 1945, Father Colvin was appointed to the Chapter of Glasgow Cathedral and, when the new Diocese of Motherwell was created, he became an honorary Canon of Glasgow and one of the Diocesan Consultors of Motherwell Diocese.

For the past few years, failing health restricted Canon Colvin's former active life: his parochial visitation, his daily visits to the school became less frequent; his presence at parochial and diocesan functions became latterly very rare, but the respect and love of his flock and the esteem of his fellow priests did not lessen. At the Requiem Mass, Bishop Douglas summed up the Canon's simple, devout and hard-working life: "Canon Colvin did not seek the lime-light, but his sterling worth was known to you. Above all he was a man of prayer."

Canon Colvin died at the ripe age of 74, on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, 1951. Over eighty priests from far and near, civic dignitaries and several ministers from local parishes gathered in St. Patrick's Church for the solemn Requiem Mass, at which Bishop Douglas presided. Bishop Black of Paisley, a former curate of St. Patrick's, was also present in the sanctuary. The parishioners and the school-children thronged the route, reciting the Rosary aloud, as the cortege passed through the town to St. Patrick's Cemetery, New Stevenston, where the interment took place. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. PATRICK LOY—3rd January, 1952.

Tragic was the news that was read in the morning papers, telling how Fr. Loy had met with a fatal accident on the 3rd January, 1952. An open carriage door, when the train entered Port-Glasgow Station—an empty carriage save for a coat and hat, told its own story. He was found on the railway line, about two hundred yards from the station. He was dead. Fr. Loy was born in Birnieknowe, a village in South Ayrshire, in the year 1879. After his primary education, he entered Blairs College, 1892, to commence his studies for the priesthood. On the completion of his course in Blairs, he went to St. Peter's College, Bearsden, for a few years and then finished his theological studies in Rome, where he was ordained by Cardinal Respighi, 11th April, 1903.

His first appointment was to Fort-William, but he was there only temporarily and his stay was of short duration. From there he came to St. John's, Portugal Street, Glasgow, with Canon McCluskey as parish priest. Here he laboured and learned to become the wonderful priest of after years.

Fr. Loy was truly a wonderful priest. Almighty God was generous indeed in the gifts He gave him. He had a really magnetic personality. He drew all types to himself and knew how to get the best out of each. He will stand out, however, as a preacher of exceptional ability and a great organiser.

As a preacher he was sought by many to preach on different occasions, but particularly at Quarante Ore. Many times the congregation has been visibly moved by his sermons.

St. Charles', Kelvinside, where he laboured for twenty years, will ever remember him with affection. When he went there, the Women's Sacred Heart Sodality had a very small attendance, but in a matter of months the church was filled and even overflowing. The Boys' Guild was very dear to him—their concert party was always in great demand. The Young Men's Society of Springburn will ever be indebted to Fr. Loy for his great work amongst them. At their twenty-fifth anniversary celebrations, they showed with what great affection they remembered him.

During the war, Fr. Loy was transferred to Pembroke Dock. There he truly showed his extraordinary gifts of organisation. He was not long there before he had a little church and a beautiful altar built by the donations of the different services (American and British).

Soon he saw the clamant need for some place where all the different units might meet. In a short time he had the premises, had them painted and decorated and, with the help of a very willing band of voluntary lady workers, started a canteen. It became the principal rendezvous for not only the Catholic soldiers and sailors, but also for the non-Catholics. It was a wonderful effort and Fr. Loy never missed an opportunity of doing many a spiritual work amongst them.

No matter in what parish Fr. Loy worked, he will always be remembered by the children for his kindness to them and by the sick for his visits to them and his deep sympathy with them. *May he rest in peace.*

VERY REV PETER CANON FITZPATRICK—

6th January, 1952

The death of Canon Fitzpatrick has recalled to my mind an incident of many years ago. It was during a parochial Mission. The sermon had been on the Particular Judgment, and the preacher had been impressive and realistic. At the supper table there was discussion on the theme, and somebody remarked: "But what will any of us be able to say for ourselves on that dread occasion?" The senior of the Mission Fathers, long gone now to his reward, said very gently: "Well, I think I could say I have done an honest day's work."

I have a feeling that Canon Fitzpatrick was able to make that claim for himself at the Great Tribunal. His soul went to that inevitable Examination from his Presbytery of St. Peter-in-Chains, Ardrossan, on January 6th, 1952. He was a Mayo man: Foxford in that county was his birthplace. Born there in 1888, he had his secondary education in the Diocesan Seminary of St. Jarlath's, Tuam. He spent a few months in the Missionary College of All Hallows, Dublin; and then, casting in his lot with the Archdiocese of Glasgow, he came to St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick, in the late autumn of 1908. The honest day's work I have referred to began in that College, and began at once. He had but a single purpose—to make himself as competent as possible for the life he had chosen. He studied hard, he prayed hard. It was not always easy. He was temperamental and excitable; his nervous nature prevented him from doing justice to his abilities; at times like examination days he suffered acutely because of it. This handicap remained with him to the end. It was particularly evident when he was in unfamiliar company; frequently he essayed to disguise it, and these efforts were the explanation of a certain boisterous exuberance that must have been enigmatic to those who knew him not.

He was ordained to the Priesthood in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Clyde Street, on June 28th, 1914. The late Rector of St. Peter's, the Right Reverend Monsignor Henry Forbes, put three ideals constantly before the students of that generation: he would have them respectful to authority, meticulous in punctuality, organised in their private prayers. Father Fitzpatrick gave continued edification in all three. His one and only curacy—at St. Joseph's, Tollcross—lasted for nineteen years. As a Pastor, he began in Strathaven. Subsequently, he had charge of the missions at Dalry, Kilwinning and Kilbirnie; and finally he went to Ardrossan.

He was a wise administrator. With the patrimony of the Church he was scrupulously exact; with his private means—which were at one time considerable—he was secretly and liberally charitable. He

did not read widely. Contemporary literature and fiction had but small appeal for him—but not so the sacred and ecclesiastical sciences. To the pursuit of these he gave his mental activity, and he always had some problem to discuss and elucidate with his brother priests. In the parishes he laboured in, he will long be remembered for his conscientious, painstaking and regular visitation. He put this task high amongst his priestly duties; in it he never lost his first fervour. He was going round the houses of Ardrossan during the last year of his life with the same interest and enthusiasm he had shown in St. Joseph's, Tollcross, when this century was young.

In the month of November, 1951, he was elected to the Chapter of the Diocese of Galloway. He was never installed; that most menacing of modern ailments, thrombosis, intervened and took his life. What his reactions to the honour were, it is difficult to say. Perhaps he welcomed it; perhaps it embarrassed him . . . But this discerning gesture from the Galloway Diocese gave considerable satisfaction to his former colleagues of the old Archdiocese. *May he rest in peace.*

RIGHT REV. MGR. WALTER CHARLES COMYN
—17th January, 1952.

The death occurred, in a Glasgow Hospital, on the 17th January, 1952, of the Right Rev. Mgr. Walter Charles Comyn, a retired priest of Clifton Diocese, who had spent the last years of his long life in Scotland.

The son of the late Lt.-Col. Comyn of Coulter, Staffordshire, he was ordained to the priesthood in 1906 and, for about thirty years, he was engaged on mission work, at Radford, Stone, Oxford, Trowbridge, Eccleshall, Blackmore Park and Dorchester. In 1919, he was raised to the dignity of Domestic Prelate to His Holiness.

In the early nineteen-thirties, Mgr. Comyn came to Scotland and, after spending two years taking care of the Catholics at Glenfinnan and at Ardrishaig, he took charge, in 1936, of the mission of Lochgilphead. He gave up this charge in 1940 because of failing eyesight and for the past twelve years he lived in retirement in Glasgow, bravely enduring the great affliction of total blindness.

He died on January 17th, 1952, at the advanced age of eighty-five. The Solemn Funeral Mass was celebrated in St. Aloysius' Church, Garnethill, by the Rector, Father John Brady, S.J. The funeral took place at Dalbeth. *May he rest in peace.*

VERY REV. JOSEPH C. CANON LONG—17th January, 1952.

The Very Rev. Joseph C. Canon Long was born at Hamilton, Lanarkshire, on December 3rd, 1874. After some years at St. Mary's School, Hamilton, he went to the Jesuit College of Mount St. Mary's in England and, for his ecclesiastical studies, he was transferred to Waterford, Ireland, where he was ordained priest on June 16th, 1901.

His first curacy was at St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh, and later

he served the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh as priest-in-charge of the missions of Dunbar, Loanhead and Inverkeithing. During his residence at Inverkeithing, Father Long was a member of the Fife Education Authority and he acted also as a member of the Catholic Education Council for Scotland during the momentous changes brought about by the Education Act of 1918.

From Inverkeithing, Father Long was transferred to Fauldhouse and later, in 1929, to Falkirk. During his pastoral charge of Falkirk, he had the happiness of establishing the Carmelite Convent at Arnot Hill and the now flourishing parish of Larbert. After four years spent in administering the parish at Falkirk, Father Long was chosen, because of his wide experience and personal character, for the important and delicate office of Spiritual Director in Blairs College, where he had to inspire, guide and counsel the young aspirants to the sacerdotal state and lay the foundations of their spiritual life. His work at Blairs received recognition when, in 1936, Father Long was elected to the Cathedral Chapter of St. Andrews and Edinburgh.

In 1941, Canon Long retired from this work at Blairs and, after a few years of residence at Gourock, he became chaplain to the Benedictine Convent at Dumfries. At the time of his death, on January 17th, 1952, Canon Long was under the care of the Alexian Brothers at Mount St. Columba's, Warrenpoint, Co. Down. Among the many friends who travelled to Warrenpoint for the funeral was His Grace, Archbishop Gray of St. Andrews and Edinburgh.

Canon Long was a man of many talents, a capable administrator who increased the equipment and resources of each parish he held. He was, moreover, a man of deep spiritual life, a pleasant companion whose conversation ranged over many topics, disclosing the riches of a well-stocked and discerning mind. He was an undoubted authority on matters educational with many recollections of the educational changes accomplished thirty-four years ago. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. JOHN McMAHON—24th January, 1952.

Pray for the soul of the Reverend John McMahon, who died at Dundee on January 24th, 1952, in the 66th year of his age, and the 40th of his Priesthood.

Fr. John McMahon was born at Perth on the 11th of November, 1886, and was baptised in the Church of St. John the Baptist. He attended the local primary school, and was a devoted altar-server. He entered Blairs College on September 1st, 1900. At the end of three years in Blairs, he was sent abroad, as was the custom at the time, to finish his classical studies at the Royal Scots College at Valladolid, Spain. In 1906, he proceeded to the Urban College of Propaganda in Rome, where for five years he followed the usual course of Higher Ecclesiastical studies. The early promise of his primary school days was fulfilled when he took a Doctorate in Philosophy and a Bachelorship in Divinity. He was initiated to the Clerical State on May 9th, 1909, by the reception of the Tonsure;

and was promoted to Minor Orders on June 5th of the same year, and again on March 12th of the following year. This long sojourn abroad, however, impaired his health, and prudence counselled his return to his native air in January, 1911. After a rest of one month's duration, he entered St. Peter's College at New Kilpatrick, to complete his studies. He was raised to the Subdiaconate on June 23rd, 1912. The Orders of Diaconate and Priesthood were conferred on him in the Church of his Baptism on June 29th and 30th of that same year by Bishop Macfarlane.

Of his forty years of Priesthood, Fr. McMahon served for seventeen in the Church of Our Lady of Victories in Dundee; for a little over four in St. John Vianney's in Alva; for some two years in St. John's in Stevenston; and for the remaining sixteen as Chaplain to the Little Sisters of the Poor at Wellburn, Dundee. It did not fall to Fr. McMahon to contribute in any outstanding way to the historical records of the Church in Scotland, but innumerable acts of kindness and devotion to the faithful, and in particular his untiring devotion to the sick and bereaved, created for him an enduring place in the hearts of the people.

For the last sixteen years of his life, Fr. McMahon's zeal was placed at the service of the Little Sisters of the Poor. He brought to this work all the excellent qualities of mind and soul that were manifest in his previous labours, to wit—a remarkable affability in conversation and manner, an equable and sympathetic temperament, and a friendliness manifested to all and on all occasions.

For a year prior to his death, his work was frequently interrupted by ill-health; and since summer the attacks became more frequent and more severe. He died in the Dundee Royal Infirmary where he had been removed for professional attention, fortified by the Rites of the Church. Bishop Scanlan presided at the Solemn Dirge on Sunday, January 27th, and officiated at the Solemn Obsequies on Monday, January 28th, in the Church of Our Lady of Victories, Dundee. Mgr. Canon Foylan preached the panegyric. The funeral took place at Balgay Cemetery, Dundee. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. JOSEPH CRUMLY—30th January, 1952.

The Rev. Joseph J. Crumly was born at Govan, Glasgow, on the 6th August, 1880. He entered Blairs College in 1894 and six years later went to St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick, for his higher ecclesiastical studies. Father Crumly was ordained on the 9th June, 1906, in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, by Archbishop Maguire. After ordination, he was appointed assistant priest at St. Mary's, Cleland, and later he acted in the same capacity at St. Roch's, Glasgow. For several years he was Chaplain to H.M. Prison, Barlinnie, and in 1923 he was appointed priest-in-charge of St. Martin's, Renton. In 1929, he was transferred to St. Charles', Paisley, and in 1941, to St. Anne's, Glasgow.

Father Crumly was not a priest widely known to the laity in the Archdiocese. He was of a quiet, retiring disposition and, though

he appreciated and sought the company and conversation of his fellow priests, he seldom took part in public functions outside his parish. Beyond the boundaries of his own parish, he was best known in his capacity of religious examiner of schools, a burdensome commission which he carried out with genial efficiency.

In May, 1949, his health, which for some years had been a source of anxiety, had deteriorated to such extent that, on medical advice, he retired from active work and took up residence at Dalbeth, near the Good Shepherd Convent. He collapsed and died unexpectedly on the 30th January, 1952. He was in his 72nd year. *May he rest in peace.*

RIGHT REV. WILLIAM MELLON, BISHOP OF GALLOWAY
—2nd February, 1952.

The Right Reverend Bishop William Henry Mellon was born on 6th January, 1877, in Edinburgh. After studying in Blairs College, Aberdeen, he went for a short time to Paris to begin Philosophy under the Sulpicians; this course he finished in Rome, where as a student of the Scots College he attended the Gregorian University and there pursued also his studies in Theology.

He was ordained priest on 29th March, 1902, and returned to his native diocese the following year. There he laboured as curate and parish priest. It was while he was in charge of St. Columba's parish, Edinburgh, that he was nominated Coadjutor Bishop of Galloway by Bulls of 21st August, 1935.

He was consecrated in Edinburgh by His Grace, Archbishop McDonald on 28th October of the same year, and came to reside in Dumfries, where he was administrator of the Cathedral. When His Lordship, Bishop McCarthy, died on 24th December, 1943, Bishop Mellon succeeded to the See of Galloway.

His coat-of-arms described him well. It shows a hand grasping a pastoral staff, together with some sheep. The motto he chose was the one attributed to St. Ninian, the first Bishop of Galloway: *Fides Petri in Sede Petri.*

Bishop Mellon was an outstanding example of the good shepherd. "I know mine and mine know me." He was the pastor of a vast territory of four counties, but he knew it intimately, even to the least important side-street. A keen motorist, and not a particularly slow one either, he traversed the entire region times without number, always bent on episcopal work.

His knowledge of his priests was personal. He knew them all intimately. He was fully acquainted with the needs and difficulties of every parish in his diocese. He was a bishop.

He had no secretary, but wrote or typed all his letters himself. He said that he did this for the very purpose of keeping in direct and intimate touch with his priests, the local pastors of souls. His letters were homely, friendly and human. Bishop Mellon would never content himself with a mere receipt when a priest sent to him the

proceeds of a diocesan collection. There was always an accompanying letter of thanks to the priest and a word of congratulation to the people for their generosity. There would be a further note added, say, about the weather, and some paternal advice to the priest to take precautions during a particularly cold spell, or an inquiry about the priest's health or about the progress of some repairs in the parish. These were amazing letters to receive from one of the exalted status of a bishop, but they bore eloquent testimony to the shepherd's love for his flock.

He made it his duty to visit every priest who was ill, even in a distant nursing home. He went to the funeral of every priest of his who died, even of one who died only three days after entering the diocese. On at least one occasion he accompanied the priest's remains to the interment in Ireland.

Though he never forgot his episcopal dignity, he never paraded it. He walked or sat modestly and humbly, a priest among priests, a gentleman among gentlemen. There radiated from him a gentleness and kindness that finally broke down all barriers, some of which existed from the moment of his entry into the diocese, and he won the hearts of all. He had a shepherd's patience with sheep that went astray. Thus those who had occasion to receive from him a merited reprimand could testify to his inborn goodness.

It was towards the end of his life that two events occurred which gave him intense joy. One was the coming of the priests of the Congregation of the Passion to his diocese. They opened a house of studies for their own students at Dankeith, near Kilmarnock, in 1946, and soon afterwards they acquired Coodham estate in the same neighbourhood as a Retreat House and a centre of Catholic social and religious activities. The other event was the extension of the territory of Galloway diocese so as to take in North Ayrshire and the Cumbrae Isles. Bishop Mellon never let an opportunity pass of expressing his great delight in these two additions to his diocese.

For a long time he enjoyed the long motor-run from Dumfries to North Ayrshire. He was wont to say that it was a tonic to him. But there came gradually a change. He began to perceive that his residence was not central enough, for the great majority of his people were not to be found in his three Southern counties but in Central and North Ayrshire. His trips to the north were becoming too frequent and too exhausting, and his own health too frail. He almost collapsed under the strain and he applied in June, 1951, for a Co-adjutor, who however never came.

"The good shepherd giveth his life for his sheep." There will never be publicly known how much Bishop Mellon risked his life for his flock. Frequently he disregarded the counsel of his medical advisers in order to travel far when priests or laity were in peril. His visit to Knockshinnoch Colliery when miners were entombed is but one instance of this. Nothing could restrain him from a personal visit to the scene of the disaster where working men's lives were in danger, be they Catholics or not, nor from the homes of their sorrowing relatives. On other occasions when his clerical friends

would suggest prudence, he would chuckle with glee that he had successfully accomplished the journey in spite of their forebodings.

It was a visit such as this which hastened his death. On a most wintry day and in spite of his weak health, he insisted on attending the Requiem Mass of Canon Fitzpatrick at Ardrossan, and returning to Dumfries the same day, being motored each way through a blizzard on the Cumnock Hills. That was his last public appearance. It was January 11th. He died on February 2nd, the Feast of the Purification of Our Blessed Lady.

Bishop Mellon made a will, but he had nothing to leave. The parishes of Galloway will erect a monument over his grave. He was to have celebrated the Golden Jubilee of his priesthood on March 29th. It is confidently hoped that the Mother of God had taken him by that time to celebrate it in heaven. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. MICHAEL BARRY—24th March, 1952.

Father Michael Barry was born at Kinsale, Co. Cork, Ireland, on the 11th July, 1917. He studied for the priesthood at St. Finbar's College, Cork, and at All Hallow's College, Dublin, and on the 21st June, 1942, he was ordained priest at All Hallows' College, by the Bishop of Ross, the Right Rev. Denis Moynihan.

Father Barry came to the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh in the summer of 1942 and was appointed curate at St. Michael's Church in Linlithgow. The Second World War was in the midst of its dreadful course, a high proportion of the Catholic manhood of the country was in the armed forces and the need for more and more Catholic chaplains to the Services was urgent. Father Michael Barry answered this arduous call and became a chaplain to the Royal Navy in July, 1944. For two years he helped to look after the spiritual welfare of the men of the Royal Navy in the Far Eastern war zone—South India, Singapore, North Borneo—and in this difficult task he earned alike the gratitude of the men he served and the commendation of his ecclesiastical superiors.

After two years in the Far East, he returned to home waters and became Catholic chaplain on H.M.S. *Anson*. During his tenure of this appointment he had a permanent altar erected on board ship, and this innovation was so successful that the Admiralty had similar altars built in other ships.

Two years of overwork in the exacting climate of the Indian Ocean and the enormous burden of responsibility and commitments as chaplain in home waters completely undermined his health. He fell a victim to that scourge which still evades modern medical research—cancer.

Father Barry was admitted to hospital in Liverpool and retired from the Royal Navy in October, 1951. About a month before he died, he was removed to the Mater Nursing Home in Dublin, and here he died on the 24th March, 1952. He was only thirty-four years

of age and had been a priest for less than ten years, but these years were crowded with anxious responsibility and exacting work for souls in the service of Him Who also gave His life for the sheep, and Who, in a world to come, where there is peace, will Himself be our reward. Father Michael Barry was buried at his native place of Kinsale, Co. Cork. *May he rest in peace.*

RIGHT REV. MGR. WILLIAM CANON BOHAN

—23rd May, 1952.

Mgr. William Canon Bohan, New Abbey, Kirkcudbrightshire, for eight years Vicar General of the Galloway Diocese, died at Dumfries and Galloway Royal Infirmary on Friday, May 23rd, at the age of 75. Mgr. Bohan held the office of Vicar General from 1943 until the death of Bishop Mellon of Galloway in February, 1952, when he became Vicar Capitular. Owing to ill-health he had to resign this post in May, and was succeeded by Mgr. J. McHardy, Ayr.

William Bohan was born in 1877 at Toomevara, Nenagh, Co. Tipperary, Ireland, and entered All Hallows' College, Dublin, in 1894, being ordained there in 1901. Shortly afterwards, he came to Scotland, and his first appointment was as curate at St. Margaret's, Ayr. He was later sent to Girvan, and was parish priest successively at Muirkirk, Newton Stewart and Stranraer. He served for seventeen years in Stranraer, and while there he was raised to the Cathedral Chapter of the Galloway Diocese in November, 1937. When Bishop Mellon succeeded to the Bishopric on the death of Bishop McCarthy on Christmas Eve, 1943, Mgr. Bohan was named Vicar General of the Diocese and in February of the following year he was transferred to the little village church of St. Mary's, New Abbey, in the shade of the beautiful ruin of the thirteenth century Cistercian Abbey of Sweetheart. On the death of Bishop Mellon, Mgr. Bohan became Vicar Capitular, a post which he was forced to resign owing to illness after holding it for only three months.

Many were surprised at the news of Mgr. Bohan's death, and to many it seemed to come with dramatic suddenness. But that was because not all knew how serious his illness was. He died at midday on Friday, May 23rd, and up to the moment of unconsciousness he showed a keen interest in diocesan affairs and frequently asked for the latest news. When asked if there was any particular priest he would like to visit him, he replied that any and every priest would be welcome.

His death took away the last of a band of Irish Volunteers who came to the assistance of the Galloway Diocese in an hour of great need. Towards the end of last century, Bishop William Turner, then in command, decided that if that comparatively young diocese was to increase and grow strong, it would be necessary to have men fired with missionary zeal. He therefore directed his appeal to Ireland and from that great Foreign Mission College of All Hallows' came a favourable reply. Father Bohan was one of those who arrived in 1901. Because there was no room for him in the "parochial inn"

he was boarded out for some time. This inconvenience did not upset him. Quickly he settled down to his work and became an enthusiastic admirer of the Scottish way of life and the character of her people. The affection he bore to the country of his adoption only increased his love for his native country.

Mgr. Bohan was not a great traveller. His journeys to the Continent were very few—performed after the fashion of a religious exercise. Not once, however, when the opportunity presented itself did he fail to spend part of his annual holiday in his beloved Ireland. The green fields of Toomevara and the achievements of her hurling team were of greater interest to him than many more modern aspects of life.

Although seventy-five years of age, he was remarkably young in mind and body, and when in June, 1951, he celebrated his Golden Jubilee as a priest, at a ceremony in Dumfries, he was the picture of health. He was a slow moving, dignified man who never understood the rush of modern life. He never hurried, yet he kept all his appointments. He never missed a bus nor a meal. If he was in a busy parish his engagements were up to schedule. If in a quiet place, he kept himself busy.

His life was so regulated that he was easily found at any particular time. Early morning found him in the sacristy preparing for his daily Mass. Letters were attended to after breakfast and answered by return of post. His daily exercise in walking or cycling, he always fitted into his programme. Each week he visited the priests in Dumfries, and he never failed to look in at the parochial house of any parish he visited. He delighted in the company of his fellow priests—particularly "the boys," as he liked the junior clergy termed. His conversations on these occasions were always interesting. He kept himself up to date in his reading and usually chose what was both interesting and instructive. Never did his refined and cultured nature find relief in want of charity. It was in his facial expression that one detected approval or disapproval. Should one speak on sport one discovered a youthful mind. Did one challenge or accept a challenge in his favourite sport of golf one received a lesson one did not forget. An excellent hurler, he had exchanged the caman for the golf club when he came to Scotland, and he became an expert in his new game.

The impairing of Mgr. Bohan's voice through a throat affliction was a very serious handicap in his work and caused him much anxiety. He struggled bravely, however, and in the scrupulous discharge of his duty preached regularly sermons and instructions that were well prepared but not heard by all. He made up by example what he failed to convey by word.

In public life he was well known and highly respected. On the Education Committee of Wigtownshire County Council, on which he served, his relations with his colleagues were of a most cordial nature.

Mgr. Bohan was buried in St. Andrew's Cemetery, Calside, Dumfries, near the grave of Bishop Mellon, on Monday, May 26th. His body had been brought from New Abbey and received into St.

Andrew's Cathedral the previous evening. The celebrant at the Requiem Mass in the Cathedral, which preceded the funeral, was Canon Martin Doyle, who was then parish priest of St. Peter's, Dalbeattie, and he was assisted by Fr. McLaughlin, Stevenston, deacon, and Fr. J. P. Flannery, Dumfries, sub-deacon. Present in the sanctuary were Mgr. J. McHardy, Ayr; Canon J. McQuillan, Troon; Canon W. O'Connor, Galston; Dr. A. Fyfe, Moffat; and Fr. O'Connor, Saltcoats.

A large number of priests from the Galloway Diocese attended the funeral, but many others from all over Scotland did not receive the news of Mgr. Bohan's death in time to enable them to travel to Dumfries. A large number of messages of sympathy was received from those who could not attend. The principal mourners at the funeral were Mr. William Bohan, London, a nephew of the Monsignore, and Mrs. Jardine, New Abbey, his housekeeper. Also present were Mr. and Mrs. Maxwell Witham, of Kirkconnel House, New Abbey. *May he rest in peace.*

VERY REV. JAMES CANON DURKIN—27th May, 1952.

On 27th May, 1952, Glasgow lost one of its most outstanding priests, Canon James Durkin, parish priest of St. Michael's, Parkhead. He was born in Hardgate, Dunbartonshire, and after early schooling in Clydebank, spent some time at St. Aloysius' College before going to Blairs in 1895. In 1900 he was sent to Bearsden, and there in due course he received minor and major orders, being ordained priest by Archbishop Maguire at St. Andrew's Cathedral on the Feast of St. Columba, 9th June, 1906.

His first appointment was to Cadzow, where he showed himself to be a zealous priest and a capable administrator during the successive illnesses of Father Peter McConnachie. From Cadzow, he went to Shieldmuir, where he is still lovingly remembered. There he assisted Canon George Ritchie, Dr. Rogan and Father Delbeke during their successive incumbencies. During this time he was also called upon to administer the parishes of Newmains and later, Kilbirnie, while the respective parish priests were ill. Thus he found the opportunity of buying the building which is now the Catholic Church of Beith.

In 1921, he was appointed to the charge of Carluke. In 1926 he was transferred to Cardonald, and in 1933 he was sent to St. Michael's, Parkhead.

Already he was a religious examiner of schools. Soon after, he was appointed secretary of the committee charged with the care of the Children's Refuge. In 1948, on the division of the diocese, he was appointed a member of the Glasgow Cathedral Chapter.

These are the simple statements of the outstanding events in his life. They mark the appreciation and the development of those features of Canon Durkin's character, which the Archbishop emphasised on the day of his funeral, namely, his priestliness, his

simplicity and his humility. He was one of the most priestly of priests; he loved his brethren in the priesthood and rejoiced to have them in his home and at his board. His love for Our Lady and for the Blessed Sacrament seemed to be his very life's inspiration and force. The charity of God did indeed direct his heart and his body, as the Church directs her ministers to pray for each Sunday at Prime. That charity began at home with his own parishioners, but it spread far beyond his parish and included all that could help his brethren either at home or on the missions. The little ones of Nazareth House and of Bellevue loved him as their father; missionary bishops made detours on their way to Prestwick aerodrome to thank him for the constant and generous help he had sent them, or got others to send them. And his right hand never knew what the left was doing. To the charity of God was added that other grace prayed for at Prime: the patience of Christ. Although he was a very big man physically, for years he had suffered from a most painful complaint. A time came when his pains became chronic; he was never free from them except when he slept. But not half-a-dozen people suspected that his beaming smile and ready laugh hid an aching body. Blindness began to creep upon him; still he managed to laugh and smile. In the early months of 1951 he met with an accident as he was going down to the confessional on a Saturday evening; he never recovered completely from the injuries, though again he managed to convince many by his cheerful remark, "Oh, I am all right." Then suddenly he was attacked by an illness that demanded his removal to hospital. A week later he was sent home in hopes that treatment might remove the need for an operation. But he did not rally, and had to return to hospital. He underwent an operation on Monday, 26th May, but, in spite of high hopes held out, he passed away early the next morning, being assisted all through his last night by his senior assistant—just as he had assisted Dr. Rogan through his last hours, in April, 1919. The scenes that marked the return of his remains to Parkhead and their transfer to the Church of St. Michael, on the Thursday evening, will never be forgotten by those who witnessed them. Office for the Dead was sung by a large body of clergy, presided over by Mgr. Ward, V.G. From then until High Mass next morning, the faithful of St. Michael's kept vigil by the remains of him whose deep love they returned so warmly. Mgr. Ward was the celebrant of the funeral Mass, assisted by Father Thomas Murray, Coatdyke, as deacon, and Father Joseph Power, Parkhead, as subdeacon. His Grace the Archbishop presided at the throne, and His Lordship the Bishop of Paisley, attended by Mgr. Flanagan, Rector of the Royal Scots College, Valladolid, was in the sanctuary. Several other Monsignori were present as well as the members of the Chapter of Glasgow and representatives of other Chapters. The clergy numbered over two hundred.

The children lined the route as the funeral procession started for Dalbeth. The final prayers at the graveside were said by Rev. Dr. Kilpatrick, assisted by the Very Rev. Canon Galbraith.

Opera eorum sequentur illos; their works shall follow them. May he rest in peace.

REV. WILLIAM J. HAYES—25th June, 1952.

The Rev. William J. Hayes was born at Pallasgrean, Co. Limerick, on the 19th July, 1884. After some early ecclesiastical studies at Carlow College and at St. Joseph's Seminary, Roscrea, he came to St. Peter's College, Bearsden, in 1908. He completed his theological course at St. Peter's College and was ordained on the 29th June, 1913, by Archbishop Mackintosh in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow.

Father Hayes served as a curate in St. Roch's, Glasgow, and in St. Anne's, Cadzow. In 1931, he was appointed as priest-in-charge of the mission at Larkhall and, after some seven years there, he was appointed, in 1938, to the mission of St. James, Renfrew.

Simplicity was the keynote of his character: he went about his daily parochial tasks in quiet but effective fashion. He had little regard for display or publicity. He was heard often to repeat a dictum of the late Monsignor Forbes that the essentials for a priest in the Glasgow Archdiocese were common sense and good health: he was amply endowed with both qualities until the closing years of his life.

He was appointed to St. Mungo's, Greenock, in 1949, but illness intervened and forced him to retire from active work. His last two years were spent in retirement in his native land. On the 25th June, 1952, when in his 67th year, Father Hayes died in a Dublin nursing home. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. WILLIAM McLELLAN—16th July, 1952.

The Rev. William McLellan was born seventy-four years ago, on the 2nd October, 1878, at Mallaig, North Morar. He entered Blairs College to study for the priesthood in October, 1891. From Blairs he went to Paris, in 1895, where he spent three years, studying at Notre Dames des Champs and at Issy. The last years of his college life were spent at the Scots College, Rome, and he was ordained at Rome, in the Basilica of St. John Lateran, by Cardinal Respighi, on 30th March, 1901.

During the first two years spent in his native diocese as a priest, Father McLellan acted as curate at the Cathedral in Oban; thereafter, for thirty-three years, he had charge of various missions in the diocese, Bornish in South Uist (1903-1913); Craigston, on Catholic Barra (1913-1919); Inverie, Knoydart (1919-1925); Mingarry in Moidart (1925-1931); the Isle of Eigg (1931-1934); and Glenfinnan, beside historic Loch Shiel (1934-1936). In all of these places, Father McLellan gained a high place in the affection and esteem of the Catholic people because of his zeal for their spiritual and temporal welfare. He was a man of many talents, a skilful piper and an accepted authority on bees and bee-keeping.

In 1936, for reasons of health, he retired from active work and lived for the past few years quietly at St. Anne's, Musselburgh, and there he died on July 16th, 1952. He was buried in his native

Morar. The Funeral Mass was celebrated in St. Cumin's Church, in Morar, by the Right Rev. Mgr. John Provost Macneil, Vicar General of the diocese, in the presence of a large and representative congregation, who had come from far and near to pay their last respects to a much loved priest. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. EWEN J. CONNOLLY—20th July, 1952.

The Rev. Ewen J. Connolly was born in Edinburgh on the 23rd December, 1888. He entered Blairs College in 1904 and, in October, 1909, he went to the Scots College, Rome, for his higher ecclesiastical studies. He was ordained to the sacred priesthood on the 22nd April, 1916, by Archbishop Cappetelli.

Returning to his native diocese in 1917, Father Connolly was appointed assistant to Canon Michael Turner at Falkirk, and here he remained for two years. In 1919, he took up duties as priest-in-charge of the mission at Duns in Berwickshire. After a couple of years he exchanged the tranquil parochial charge of this small mission in the Border country, for mission work in the industrialised area of Fife and West Lothian. He was in charge of the mission of Bowhill from 1921 to 1928, the mission of Addiewell from 1928 to 1937, and the mission of Broxburn from 1937 to 1941. In all of these missions, the Catholic community remembers him as a pious and unassuming shepherd of souls.

For reasons of health, he had to retire from active parochial duties in 1941, and the last decade of his life was spent in retirement in the Midlands of England. He died at Stoke-on-Trent on the 20th July, 1952, in the sixty-fourth year of his age. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. HUGH MILLIGAN—30th July, 1952.

The Rev. Hugh Milligan was born at Rocktown, Knockloughrin, Co. Derry, on the 15th October, 1893. He received his ecclesiastical education at St. Malachy's College, Belfast, at St. Patrick's College, Carlow, and at St. Peter's College, Wexford, and, in this last mentioned college, he was ordained on the 29th May, 1924, by the Right Rev. William Codd, Bishop of Ferns.

Father Milligan was practically unknown to the clergy and laity of the Archdiocese of Glasgow because he was engaged in parochial work in Scotland for only a few years. For a few months after his ordination he was stationed at Penicuik in Midlothian and, from 1925 to 1928, he was a curate in Our Holy Redeemer's, Clydebank. Since 1928 he was stationed in Ireland and latterly, on account of his health, he lived in retirement at his native place, Knockloughrin. He died on the 30th July, 1952, aged fifty-nine years. *May he rest in peace.*

REV. CHARLES GALLAGHER—15th September, 1952.

The Rev. Charles Gallagher was born at Parkhead, Glasgow, on the 30th April, 1891. In August, 1908, he entered Blairs College and, five years later, he was transferred to the Scots College, Rome. He received the priesthood on the 18th May, 1919, at the hands of Cardinal Pompili. Father Gallagher's first appointment as curate was to St. Luke's, Glasgow, and later he worked as a curate in the parishes of St. Laurence's, Greenock; St. Agnes', Lambhill; and St. Roch's, Glasgow. Ill health caused him to be released from parochial work for a time but, during the years of the recent war, he became chaplain to the Good Shepherd Convent and Institution, which had been evacuated to Castle Huntly, Longforgan, Perthshire. In 1946, he was appointed chaplain to the newly-founded convent of St. Helen, Kirklee, Glasgow, and he continued in this position until his death, which took place in a Glasgow nursing home on the 15th September, 1952, Father Gallagher being in the 62nd year of his age.

Notwithstanding his poor health, Father Gallagher maintained a cheery, friendly manner; he was affable to all, without distinction of age or rank. His sincerity, good humour and liveliness made him a popular figure at all gatherings, clerical or lay.

His Grace Archbishop Campbell presided at the solemn Requiem Mass in St. Peter's Church, Partick, and before the absolutions he paid eloquent tribute to the good work achieved by Father Gallagher during his years as a priest in Glasgow Archdiocese. The Requiem Mass was celebrated by Canon Stuart of St. Peter's, with Fathers Taggart and Cawley as deacon and sub-deacon. The sanctuary and church were filled with a large and representative body of clergy, including Bishop Black of Paisley, Monsignor Clapperton, Rector of the Scots College, Rome, the Vicars-General of Glasgow and Motherwell and Canons of the Glasgow Chapter.

The funeral took place to Dalbeth Cemetery, where Canon Stuart officiated at the graveside. *May he rest in peace.*

APPENDIX I.

ECCLESIASTICAL LAWS AND OBSERVANCES.

1. EASTER DUTIES AND INDULGENCES.

THE Faithful of Scotland are authorised to satisfy the obligation of the Paschal Communion and to gain the Plenary Indulgence on any day from Ash Wednesday to Trinity Sunday. (S.C.C.: 11th Oct., 1946).

2. FAST AND ABSTINENCE DAYS.

The new Code of Canon Law makes many important changes in the general law of fasting and abstinence. The Indult, however, granted in perpetuity to Scotland by the Holy See on 27th January, 1911, still continues in force. The regulations of both Code and Indult as they apply to Scotland are here summarised.

A. LAWS OF FASTING.

1. The law of fasting is binding on all between their 21st and 59th birthdays, unless they are excused by reason of health or the nature of their employment.

In all cases of doubt a confessor should be consulted.

2. On Fast days only one full meal, which may be taken either at midday or in the evening, is allowed.

In addition two light collations are permitted, one consisting of two or three ounces of food, which may include a little butter, jam or marmalade, and the other of eight to ten ounces, at which butter, cheese, eggs, or fish may be taken. Milk is allowed at either of these collations.

On Fast days which are not also days of abstinence, flesh meat and soup made from meat may be taken only at the chief meal by those bound to fast. The old law, forbidding the use of fish and flesh at the same meal, is abolished.

3. The Fast days of the year are:—

(a) The Ember days.

(b) The Vigils or Eves of Pentecost, the Assumption, All Saints and Christmas, but when any of these Feasts falls on a Monday, though the Vigil is observed on the previous Saturday, it does not carry with it the obligation of fasting or abstinence.

On Christmas Eve the quantity of food permitted at the evening collation may be doubled.

(c) All the days of Lent, except Sundays, but on Holy Saturday the fast ends at midday.

4. Except in Lent, a Holiday of Obligation is never a Fast day.

B. LAWS OF ABSTINENCE.

1. The use of flesh meat or of soup made from meat is forbidden on Abstinence days to all who have completed their 7th year.

2. The use of eggs, butter, margarine, as well as of dripping, lard, suet or other condiments made from animal fat, is allowed on all days of the year without exception.

3. The days of Abstinence are:—

(a) The Fridays throughout the year.

(b) The Ember Wednesdays.

(c) The Vigils of the Assumption, All Saints and Christmas, except when any of these Vigils falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

(d) In Lent, Ash Wednesday, Ember Saturday, and (up to midday) Holy Saturday.

4. Except in Lent, a Holiday of Obligation is never a day of Abstinence.

(APPROVED BY THE HIERARCHY, 11th October, 1932.)

N.B.—For the time being the above legislation is modified by an Indult, issued by the Holy See on January 28th, 1949, which reduces the number of days on which the laws of fast and abstinence must be observed in the following manner: "until provision is made otherwise, abstinence should be observed every Friday, the law of abstinence together with fast on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, the Vigils of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ."

The Indult also adds a concession in the quality of food permitted: "graciously granting, nevertheless, that on days of abstinence together with fast it will everywhere be permissible to take eggs and milk products even in the morning and the evening."

3. MARRIAGES.

Marriage may be contracted on any day of the year. The **Solemnising** of Marriage, i.e., the Solemn Blessing of the Church which is given only during Mass, is forbidden from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, and from the first Sunday of Advent to Christmas Day, all dates being inclusive. Bishops, however, may for a just reason allow the Solemnising of Marriage any day during the forbidden periods, provided the laws of the Liturgy be observed. A widow, who has already received this Blessing, may not again be blessed at any subsequent marriage.

Marriage is constituted by the free consent of two parties taking one another for husband and wife. Anything interfering with the freedom of consent, in the way of serious error, grave fear and violence, may endanger the validity of the marriage bond.

The age required for valid marriage is sixteen years complete in the case of the man, fourteen years complete in that of the woman; those under twenty-one years of age should before marriage inform their parents and obtain their consent.

Marriage cannot be contracted without a Dispensation by persons within the third degree of kindred or the second degree of affinity; if attempted the marriage is invalid. Spiritual kindred contracted

by Baptism, i.e., between a god-parent and a god-child, is also an invalidating impediment.

Marriage between a Catholic and an unbaptised person is invalid without a dispensation.

A "mixed" marriage (that is, a marriage between a Catholic and one who, though baptised, does not profess the Catholic Faith) is unlawful without a Dispensation; and the Dispensation cannot lawfully be given unless for a sufficiently grave reason, and subject to the following conditions as laid down by the Council of Fort Augustus (Decr., xvii. 5): (1) That all children that may be born of the marriage shall be baptised, and brought up, in the Catholic Faith. (2) That the Catholic party shall have full liberty for the practice of the Catholic religion. (3) That no religious marriage ceremony shall take place elsewhere than before the Catholic Priest. (4) That the Catholic party shall endeavour to effect the conversion of the non-Catholic party to the true faith of Christ. These promises will ordinarily be made in writing by the parties.

For parties preparing for marriage, the golden rule is: Give very early notice to the parish priest, who will furnish precise and helpful instructions as to both civil and ecclesiastical requirements. Banns have to be proclaimed on three consecutive Sundays or Holidays, and evidence of Baptism has to be furnished by both parties, even in the case of a mixed marriage. If it can be done without serious inconvenience, Catholics should be confirmed before marriage. As a general rule, the parish priest of the bride, in the case of a mixed marriage the parish priest of the Catholic party, will take charge of the marriage.

The Decree *Ne temere*, which became law in Scotland only on the 1st of September, 1908, made important regulations for the celebration of marriage, either between two Catholics, or between a Catholic and a non-Catholic. These regulations have been incorporated into, and somewhat modified by, the new Code of Canon Law, which came into force on the 19th May, 1918. The following points should be noted:—

I. Engagements, even when formally and solemnly contracted, afford no canonical ground for claiming a fulfilment of the promise.

II. Only those marriages are valid which are contracted before the parish priest or the Ordinary of the place, or a priest delegated by either of these, and at least two witnesses.

III. The parish priest and the Ordinary of the place validly assist at a marriage:

(a) only within the limits of their territory; within which they assist validly at marriages not only of their own subjects, but also of those not subject to them;

(b) provided that not compelled by violence or by grave fear they ask and receive the consent of the contracting parties.

IV. They assist licitly:

(a) when they have legitimately ascertained the free state of the contracting parties;

(b) when they have ascertained that one of the contracting parties has a domicile, or at least has lived for a month in the place where the marriage takes place.

V. When the parish priest or Ordinary or delegate as above (No. II.) cannot be got:

(a) in danger of death marriage may be validly and licitly contracted before two witnesses only;

(b) outside the case of danger of death, when these conditions are prudently considered as likely to last for a month, marriage may be contracted before two witnesses only.

(c) in either case, if any priest is at hand, he should be called in to assist; but his presence or absence does not affect the validity of the marriage.

VI. (a) The above laws are binding on all persons baptised in the Catholic Church, and on those who have been converted to it from heresy or schism.

(b) The same laws are binding on the same Catholics as above, if they contract marriage with non-Catholics, baptised or unbaptised, even after a Dispensation has been obtained.

(c) Non-Catholics, whether baptised or unbaptised, who contract among themselves, are nowhere bound to observe the Catholic form of marriage.

4. SICK CALLS.

All sick calls should be given in at the Priest's house at a timely hour in the morning. If this reasonable rule were adhered to, it would save the Clergy much unnecessary labour and the people many disappointments, which they may justly ascribe to their own want of system.

On Saturdays, eves of Holiday's, and other days which are generally devoted to the Confessional, the priest should not, if possible, be called away from this important duty. Unless in cases of necessity, sick calls should not be made on Saturdays or Sundays, when the Clergy have so many other duties to attend to.

It is the duty of the people to conform to whatever regulations may be made by the Clergy, on these and other matters connected with Religion, in their respective congregations. All things should be done in order, according to the advice of St. Paul.

When the priest is called to attend a sick person, everything that he requires for the administration of the Sacraments should be furnished as becomingly as possible in the room where the sick person lies—viz., a table covered with a clean linen cloth, on which should be laid 2 candles, a vessel of holy water with a sprinkler, a small vessel of common water for the purification of the priest's fingers after the administration of the Holy Viaticum, and a napkin for the sick person at the time of Communion. As the priest generally brings the Blessed Sacrament on these occasions, everything should be so becomingly prepared, according to their means, as to show the great respect of the inmates for Jesus Christ, and the high value they set upon the honour thus rendered to their house in the visit of their Lord and Redeemer.

While the priest is administering the Viaticum and Extreme Unction, the assistants should devoutly offer up their prayers to God on behalf of the sick person, to implore that he may receive those Sacraments with the necessary dispositions.

APPENDIX II.

INDULGENCES AND DEVOTIONS

1. INDULGENCES.

EXPLANATION OF INDULGENCES.

An indulgence is a remission of the whole, or part, of the **temporal** punishment that often remains to be suffered for sins which, as to their guilt and **eternal** punishment, have been already remitted. For the effect and validity of an Indulgence it is not only necessary that there be a competent authority in him who grants it, and a just cause or motive for the grant, but it is also necessary, on the part of him who obtains it, that he renounce and be sincerely sorry for all his sins, that he be in the state of grace, and that he duly perform the conditions prescribed. Of Indulgences, some are called *plenary*, which, when fully obtained, remit the whole of the temporal punishment that remained due on account of past sins; others are for a certain number of years or days, which when fully obtained, remit as much of the temporal punishment as would have been discharged by the performance of so many years or days of Canonical Penance. Thus, by a *quarantine* Indulgence was meant the remission of so much of the future penalty (*poena*) of sin as is the equivalent of keeping a Lent according to the strict discipline of the Church. Quarantines are no longer mentioned in the official collection of indulgent prayers (Vatican Press, 1938).

Indulgences attached to sacred objects, such as rosaries, etc., are available to any person using these objects, and the Indulgences cease only when the thing is destroyed or sold.

The conditions for most Plenary Indulgences include Confession, Communion, Visit to a Church and prayers for the Pope's intentions. For an Indulgence granted for any particular day, Confessions made eight days before will suffice; Communion may be made the day before, and both Confession and Communion any day within the Octave. For Triduum, Novenas and suchlike, Confession and Communion may be made any day within the Octave after the conclusion of the exercises. For daily communicants, or for those who confess regularly twice a month, no special confession is necessary. The visit may be made to any church or oratory and may be made from noon of the preceding day to midnight of the last day of the time appointed. Prayer for the Pope's intentions should be recited vocally and not merely mentally. Jubilee Indulgences, as well as some others, have their own special conditions.

PLENARY INDULGENCES GRANTED TO SCOTLAND.

1. From the Feast of St. Thomas, Apostle, 21st December, to the first Sunday after the Epiphany, inclusively.
2. From Ash-Wednesday to the second Sunday of Lent, inclusively.
3. During the time appointed in each Diocese for complying with Easter duties.

4. From Pentecost Sunday to Sunday after Corpus Christi.
5. From Sunday before the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul to the Octave Day.
6. From Sunday before the Feast of the Assumption to the Octave Day.
7. From Sunday before the Feast of All Saints to the Octave Day.
8. On the Feast of St. Andrew, and during the Octave.

CONDITIONS FOR GAINING THESE INDULGENCES.

1. That within the time prescribed the faithful approach the Sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist.

When Confession is required as a condition for gaining an indulgence, it may be made eight days before or eight days after. The Holy Communion prescribed may be made the day before or within the eight days after. One Confession and Communion will suffice for the gaining of several Plenary Indulgences on the same day. *Canon 931.*

2. That on the day of their Communion they offer up some prayers to God for the happy state of the whole Church of Christ, for its Supreme Pastor the Bishop of Rome, for peace and concord between all Christian Princes; for the exaltation and propagation of the Holy Catholic Faith, especially in our own country, and for the eternal salvation of all Christians.

3. That, if they have an opportunity, they visit within the limited time some church or oratory, and pray to God as has been mentioned before.

4. That, if their circumstances enable them, they perform some works of mercy.

To gain any number of times a Plenary Indulgence granted *toties quoties* the necessary and sufficient prayers to be said for the Pope's intention at each visit to a church are six Our Fathers, six Hail Marys, and six Glorias. (A.A.S., 1930, 363.)

PLENARY INDULGENCES GRANTED TO ALL THE FAITHFUL.

THE INDULGENCES OF THE STATIONS.

The nature and number of the indulgences attached to the Stations of the Cross by the Holy See in the course of the centuries had become uncertain in consequence of the loss of authentic documents. The Holy See therefore has abolished all indulgences hitherto conceded and grants to all the faithful who with contrite heart make the Stations of the Cross the following indulgences:—

1. A Plenary Indulgence as often as the Stations of the Cross are made.

2. Another Plenary Indulgence if they go to Holy Communion on the same day on which they make the Stations; or if, having made the Stations ten times they go to Holy Communion within a month.

3. A Partial Indulgence of ten years for each Station they have made, if after beginning the Stations they are unable, for some reasonable cause, to complete them.

The sick, who are unable to recite a suitable ejaculation, may still gain a Plenary Indulgence by merely kissing or looking upon the crucifix specially blessed.

The sick, those travelling, and any others legitimately impeded gain the Indulgence, if while holding in their hands the crucifix specially blessed, they say: Our Father, Hail Mary and Gloria twenty times, that is fourteen times for the fourteen Stations, five in memory of the Sacred Wounds, and once for the Pope's intention. If some reasonable cause prevents the completion of this exercise, these persons may gain a Partial Indulgence of ten years for each time they have recited an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Gloria.

PORTIUNCULA INDULGENCE.

From noon of the 1st till midnight of the 2nd of August all may gain a Plenary Indulgence as often as they visit a Franciscan Church or any Church enjoying the privilege of the Portiuncula, and say six Paters, six Aves, and six Glorias for the Pope's intention. The usual condition of Confession and Holy Communion is enjoined.

COMMEMORATION OF THE HOLY SOULS.

From noon of the 1st till midnight of the 2nd of November or on the following Sunday all may gain a Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, as often as they visit a Church or public or semi-public oratory and say the prayers for the Pope's intention.

VISITING A CATHOLIC CEMETERY.

During the Octave of the Commemoration of All Souls a Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, may be gained by the faithful who visit a Catholic Cemetery on the usual conditions (31st October, 1934).

THE CATECHISM INDULGENCE.

A Plenary Indulgence on any two days of each month may be gained by all who either teach or learn the catechism for the space of at least twenty minutes twice in the month. The usual conditions of Confession, Communion, visit to a church and prayer for the Pope's intention are prescribed. For every such period devoted to teaching or learning the catechism a partial indulgence of 100 days may be gained by the contrite of heart. (A.A.S., 1930, 343.)

ROSARY INDULGENCE.

A Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions of Confession and Communion, may be gained by anyone of the faithful who devoutly recites five decades of the Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament exposed for public veneration, or reserved in the tabernacle. (A.A.S., Sept., 1927.)

THE HOLY HOUR.

All who perform the pious exercise of the Holy Hour in any church, public oratory, or semi-public oratory to which they have

legitimate access may gain (1) a Plenary Indulgence, provided they confess their sins and receive Holy Communion and recite the usual prayers for the Pope's intentions; (2) a Partial Indulgence of ten years, if they are at least contrite of heart. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 171.)

THE FORTY HOURS DEVOTION.

Whether the form of exposition is strictly Clementine or modified by the Bishop's authority, a Plenary Indulgence, once on each day, may be gained by all who visit the Blessed Sacrament during Quarant Ore and recite a Pater, Ave and Gloria five times, and one Pater, Ave and Gloria for the Pope's intention. Confession and Communion are enjoined. Alternatively, a Partial Indulgence of fifteen years is granted to the contrite of heart each time they visit a church during the Forty Hours Devotion and recite the same prayers. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 381.)

PROCESSIONS OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained by all those who assist at Processions of the Blessed Sacrament, whether the processions are within or without a sacred building. Confession, Communion and prayer for the Pope's intention are enjoined. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 478.)

SPIRITUAL VISITS TO THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

Those who are legitimately prevented from making a visit in person may now gain a Partial Indulgence of five years by making a spiritual visit to the Blessed Sacrament and reciting the Pater, Ave and Gloria five times to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and once for the Pope's intention, provided they are contrite of heart.

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained once a week if, through the same impediment, the spiritual visit is made daily. (A.A.S., 1935, p. 169.)

VISITING THE ALTAR OF REPOSE.

The contrite of heart who visit the "Altar of Repose" on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday and recite the Pater, Ave and Gloria five times and once for the Pope's intention may gain a *toties quoties* indulgence of fifteen years. A Plenary Indulgence may be gained on each of these days if the further conditions of Confession and Communion are fulfilled. (A.A.S., 1935, p. 277.)

PARTIAL INDULGENCES: THE LITANY OF THE B. VIRGIN.

On 6th May, 1879, His Holiness granted the Apostolic Benediction, and an Indulgence of seven years on each Saturday, and on the Feasts of the Blessed Virgin, to the Faithful of England and Scotland who shall recite or sing the Litany of the Blessed Virgin in any church in either country. This Indulgence is now extended to all the faithful and may be gained each time the Litany is recited or sung (*Preces et Pia opera*, Vatican Press, 1938).

VISITING A CHURCH AND PRAYER FOR THE POPE'S INTENTION.

The phrase "visiting a church," means going to a church with the intention of honouring God, either in Himself or in His saints, and, if no set prayer is enjoined, offering mental or vocal prayer according to each one's piety and devotion. When no other prayers are specified, the condition "prayer for the Pope's intention" is satisfied by reciting one Pater, one Ave and one Gloria. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 478.)

2. THE PENTECOST NOVENA.

For the Pentecost Novena, prescribed by Encyclical Letters of 5th May, 1895, and 9th May, 1897, the following Indulgences have been granted to those taking part in it:—(1) Ten years for each day; (2) a Plenary Indulgence on any one day of Novena, or on Pentecost, or on any day of the subsequent Octave, on the usual conditions of Confession and Communion and prayers for the Pope's intention, attendance on at least five days being necessary. (These Indulgences are attainable by those also who are legitimately impeded from attending the Public Devotions, provided the Novena be done in private and the other conditions fulfilled; the Partial Indulgence in this case is seven years.) Moreover, those who again, during the Octave of Pentecost, inclusive of Trinity Sunday, privately recite every day, according to their devotion, some prayers to the Holy Ghost, may gain a Partial Indulgence of seven years for each day. All these Indulgences are applicable to the souls in Purgatory.

3. THE OCTAVE OF CORPUS CHRISTI.

For the continuance and daily increase of the abundant fruit produced by the Decree of 20th December, 1905, on Daily Communion, Our Holy Father, Pope Pius X., by a letter of the Sacred Congregation of Indulgences of the 10th April, 1907, to the Bishops of the Catholic Church, has expressed his wish to have, as far as may be possible, the following annual observances:—

(a) IN CATHEDRAL CHURCHES.

That on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, either immediately after the Festival of Corpus Christi, or (if the circumstances of persons or places so require) at some other time of the year to be fixed by the Bishop, there shall be in every Cathedral Church three days' prayer, as here described: namely:—

1. That, on each day, there shall be a sermon on the great excellence of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and on the dispositions required for worthily receiving it. That, after the sermon, the Blessed Sacrament shall be exposed; and during the Exposition the prayer *O most Sweet Jesus* (see below) shall be recited, to be followed on the Sunday by the *Te Deum*. That the *Tantum ergo* shall then be sung, and the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament be given.

II. That, on the Sunday, the last of the three days, there shall be, at the usual parochial Mass, a homily by the Parish Priest on

the gospel of the Sunday within the Octave of Corpus Christi—or, if the Sunday be not within the Octave, a sermon in preparation for a fervent Communion; and at this parochial Mass the faithful shall communicate. That, on this Sunday afternoon (or evening), there shall be the same service as on the two preceding days. And in the sermon the preacher shall exhort the faithful to more fervent piety towards the Most Holy Sacrament, and especially to a more frequent participation of this heavenly banquet, in accordance with the approved teaching of the *Catechismus Romanus* (see n. vi. of the Decree of 20th December, 1905). Moreover, at Benediction (as is said above), the *Tantum ergo* will be preceded by the *Te Deum*.

(b) IN PARISH CHURCHES.

His Holiness earnestly recommends that also in Parish Churches, according as each Bishop in his prudence and discernment shall judge fit, there shall be at least those pious exercises which are above described for the Cathedral Churches for the Sunday within the Octave, or some other Sunday in the year.

That the faithful may more eagerly take part in the aforesaid pious exercises, His Holiness has been pleased to grant the following Indulgences, applicable also to the souls in Purgatory:—

1. An Indulgence of ten years for each of the three days' prayer.
2. A Plenary Indulgence to be gained once during the three days, on any day thereof, by those who devoutly assist at the devotions of any one day, and after Confession and Holy Communion pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
3. A Plenary Indulgence to be gained on the Sunday by all who, after Confession, receive Holy Communion together in a Cathedral or a Parish Church, and pray for the Holy Father's intentions.

PRAYER BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

O most sweet Jesus, Who didst come into this world to enrich the souls of all mankind with the life of Thy grace, and Who, to preserve and sustain this life in them, dost daily give Thyself in the most august Sacrament of the Eucharist, as a saving medicine to heal their infirmities and a divine food to support their weakness, we pray and beseech Thee to pour forth upon them most graciously Thy holy spirit, so that, being filled therewith, any who are in mortal sin may, by returning to Thee, be restored to the life of grace which they have lost; and that those who, by Thy great mercy, already serve Thee may daily, as far as each one is able, come devoutly to Thy heavenly banquet, and in the strength thereof may find a remedy for their daily venial faults and a support of the life of Thy grace, and, thus becoming more and more cleansed from sin, may obtain the everlasting happiness of heaven. Amen.

4. THE FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART.

By the Encyclical Letter *Miserentissimus Redemptor* of Pius XI dated 8th May, 1928, it is decreed that the Act of Reparation thereto appended shall be solemnly recited in all churches through-

out the world on the Feast of the Sacred Heart. The Act, together with the Litany of the Sacred Heart, is to be recited during Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

ACT OF REPARATION.

O sweet Jesus, Whose overflowing charity for men is requited by so much forgetfulness, negligence and contempt, behold us prostrate before Thy altar eager to repair by a special act of homage the cruel indifference and injuries, to which Thy loving Heart is everywhere subject.

Mindful alas! that we ourselves have had a share in such great indignities, which we now deplore from the depths of our hearts, we humbly ask Thy pardon and declare our readiness to atone by voluntary expiation not only for our own personal offences, but also for the sins of those, who straying far from the path of salvation, refuse in their obstinate infidelity to follow Thee, their Shepherd and Leader, or, renouncing the vows of their baptism, have cast off the sweet yoke of Thy law.

We are now resolved to expiate each and every deplorable outrage committed against Thee; we are determined to make amends for the manifold offences against Christian modesty in unbecoming dress and behaviour, for all the foul seductions laid to ensnare the feet of the innocent, for the frequent violation of Sundays and holidays, and the shocking blasphemies uttered against Thee and Thy Saints. We wish also to make amends for the insults to which Thy Vicar on earth and Thy priests are subjected, for the profanation, by conscious neglect or terrible acts of sacrilege, of the very Sacrament of Thy divine love; and lastly, for the public crimes of nations who resist the rights and the teaching authority of the Church which Thou hast founded.

Would, O divine Jesus, we were able to wash away such abominations with our blood. We now offer, in reparation for these violations of Thy divine honour, the satisfaction Thou didst once make to Thy eternal Father on the Cross and which Thou dost continue to renew daily on our altars; we offer it in union with the acts of atonement of Thy Virgin Mother and all the Saints and of the pious faithful on earth; and we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of Thy grace, for all neglect of Thy great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past.

Henceforth we will live a life of unwavering faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the gospel and especially that of charity. We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending Thee and to bring as many as possible to follow Thee.

O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; and by the crowning gift of perseverance keep us faithful unto death in our duty and the allegiance we owe to Thee, so that we may all one day come to that happy home, where Thou with the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. Amen.

The Indulgences granted are: (1) To the faithful present in any Church or Oratory at the recital of the above Act and the Litany of the Sacred Heart during Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament an Indulgence of seven years and further a Plenary Indulgence if, after Confession, they receive Holy Communion, and (2) to those who any where or at any time, even in private, recite the above Act, an Indulgence of five years, and further a Plenary Indulgence once in the month if they repeat the Act daily during the month, visit a Church or Oratory, go to Confession and receive Holy Communion. (18th March, 1932).

5. THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING.

Whereas, by the Decree of the S. Congregation of Indulgences, 22nd August, 1906, His Holiness Pope Pius X ordered that each year on the Feast of the Sacred Heart, in all Parish Churches as well as others where the feast is observed, the form of Consecration used by Pope Leo XIII. on the 25th May, 1899, should be recited during the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by the Litany of the Sacred Heart, it is now enacted (S.R.C., 28th April, 1926) that (1) the observance is optional on the Feast of the Sacred Heart, but obligatory on the Feast of Christ the King, and (2) the Form to be used is the one given below. To all who with devout and contrite heart assist at this pious exercise and pray for the Pope's intentions, His Holiness grants an Indulgence of seven years, and further a Plenary Indulgence to those who, after Confession, receive Holy Communion. These Indulgences are applicable to the souls in Purgatory. Those who recite the following prayer even in private may gain (1) an Indulgence of five years; (2) a Plenary Indulgence if they repeat the prayer daily during the month, visit a Church or Oratory, go to Confession and receive Holy Communion.

FORM OF CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS.

Most sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us humbly prostrate before Thy altar. We are Thine, and Thine we wish to be; but, to be more surely united with Thee, behold each one of us freely consecrates himself to-day to Thy most Sacred Heart. Many indeed have never known Thee; many too, despising Thy precepts, have rejected Thee. Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart. Be Thou King, O Lord, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken Thee, but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned Thee: grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house lest they die of wretchedness and hunger. Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof, and call them back to the harbour of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one Shepherd. Be Thou King of all those who are still involved in the darkness of idolatry or of Islamism, and refuse not to draw them all into the light and kingdom of God. Turn Thine eyes of mercy towards the children of that race, once Thy chosen people. Of old they

called down upon themselves the Blood of the Saviour; may It now descend upon them a laver of redemption and of life. Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the divine Heart that wrought our salvation; to It be glory and honour for ever. Amen.

6. THE MONTH OF OCTOBER.

For the **October Devotions**, prescribed by Decrees of 20th August, 1885, etc., the following Indulgences have been granted:—(1) Seven years each time one joins in the public recital of the Rosary and Litany of the B. Virgin (or, being legitimately impeded, says them privately), and prays according to the intentions of the Pope; (2) a Plenary Indulgence to those who, having done this at least ten times, Confess and Communicate; (3) a Plenary Indulgence to all who, on the Feast of the Rosary or within the Octave, Confess, Communicate and pray in some church to God and the B. Virgin according to the intention of His Holiness; (4) seven years each time (during October) for the recital, after the Rosary, of the following prayer to St. Joseph enjoined by the Encyclical of 15th August, 1889; if the prayer is recited outside October a Partial Indulgence of three years is granted each time and a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions when the prayer is said daily for a month.

PRAYER TO ST. JOSEPH.

To thee, O blessed Joseph, we fly in our tribulation, and while imploring the help of thy most holy spouse, thy protection also with confidence we crave. By that affection which united thee with the Immaculate Virgin, Mother of God, and by the fatherly love with which thou didst embrace the Child Jesus, we humbly supplicate thee to look down benignantly on the heritage which Christ Jesus purchased with His Blood, and in thy might and power to succour us in our necessities.

Defend, O most provident Guardian of the Divine Family, the chosen race of Jesus Christ; keep us, most loving father, from all taint of error and corruption; do thou from heaven, as our most powerful Protector, stand graciously by us in this conflict with the powers of darkness; and as of old thou didst rescue the Child Jesus in the imminent peril of His life, so now defend the Holy Church of God from hostile wiles and all adversity, and through thy never-failing patronage so shield each one of us, that, guided by thy example and supported by thy aid, we may live in holiness, piously die and attain eternal happiness in heaven. Amen.

7. CONSECRATION OF FAMILIES TO THE SACRED HEART
BY MEANS OF THE ENTHRONEMENT.

It is the earnest desire of the Holy See that all Christian families should be consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and that a statue or image of Him be set up in a prominent place in each house, so that Christ may be enthroned as ruler in the home. All families should be consecrated separately, not in groups. The priest blesses the image, and recites the Act of Consecration. When a priest cannot be had, the image, which should be previously blessed, will be set in its place by the head of the family or other lay person, who also will recite the Act of Consecration. The Indulgences granted to each member of the family are: (1) Seven years and on the day of consecration; (2) a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions on the day of consecration; (3) three years on the annual renewal of the consecration; (4) a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions on the annual renewal. The form of consecration, **which alone is valid for the effect of the Indulgences** (S.P.A.: 1st March, 1918: A.A.S., x, p. 154) is the following:

ACT OF CONSECRATION.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, who didst manifest to Blessed Margaret Mary the desire of reigning in Christian families, we to-day wish to proclaim Thy most complete regal dominion over our own. We would live in future with Thy life, we would cause to flourish in our midst those virtues to which Thou hast promised peace here below, we would banish far from us the spirit of the world which Thou hast cursed; and Thou shall reign over our minds in the simplicity of our faith, and over our hearts by the whole-hearted love with which they shall burn for Thee, the flame of which we shall keep alive by the frequent reception of Thy Divine Eucharist.

Deign, O Divine Heart, to preside over our assemblings, to bless our enterprises, both spiritual and temporal, to dispel our cares, to sanctify our joys, to alleviate our sufferings. If ever one or other of us should have the misfortune to afflict Thee, remind him, Heart of Jesus, that Thou art good and merciful to the penitent sinner. And when the hour of separation strikes, when death shall come to cast mourning into our midst, we will all, both those who go and those who stay, be submissive to Thy eternal decrees. We will console ourselves with the thought that a day will come when the entire family, reunited in Heaven, can sing for ever Thy glories and Thy mercies.

May the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and the glorious Patriarch St. Joseph, present this consecration to Thee, and keep it in our minds all the days of our life.

All glory to the Heart of Jesus our King and our Father.

8. PRAYERS AFTER LOW MASS.

Pope Pius XI. has ordered that these prayers be said for Russia. A Partial Indulgence of **ten years** is attached to their recitation in addition to the Indulgence of **seven years** granted for the triple invocation of the Sacred Heart. (A.A.S., 1934, p. 312).

To be said kneeling. Hail Mary, three times.

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy; Hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To Thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to Thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, Thine eyes of mercy towards us; and after this our exile, show unto us the Blessed Fruit of Thy womb, Jesus; O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

V. Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

LET US PRAY.

O God, our refuge and our strength, look with favour on Thy people who cry to Thee; and through the intercession of the Glorious and Immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and St. Joseph her Spouse, of Thy Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and of all the Saints, mercifully and graciously hear the prayers which we pour forth for the conversion of sinners, and for the freedom and exaltation of our Holy Mother the Church. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

St. Michael the Archangel defend us in the day of battle; be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil;—"the Lord command him," we humbly pray;—and do thou O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and the other wicked spirits who go about the world for the destruction of souls. Amen.

To the above prayers may be added the following invocation said three times:—

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us.

(Indulgence of seven years).

9. THE ANGELUS.

In Catholic countries, and in many places at home, the Angelus Bell is rung in the morning, at noon, and in the evening at sunset to honour the Mystery of the Incarnation. To gain the indulgences attached to this Devotion, the Angelus must be said kneeling, except on Saturday evening, and Sunday, when it is said standing. In Paschal Time, that is, from Holy Saturday at noon till the Saturday before Trinity Sunday at noon, inclusively, the *Regina Cœli* is said instead of the Angelus. This prayer is always said standing. Those who do not know the *Regina Cœli* may gain the indulgences by saying the Angelus; but it must be said standing during Paschal Time. For the convenience of the Faithful is appended a translation of the *Regina Cœli* taken from the *Raccolta*.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia.

For He whom thou wast made worthy to bear.

Alleluia.

Hath risen as He said. Alleluia.

Pray for us to God. Alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia.

R. For the Lord hath risen indeed. Alleluia.

Let us pray.

O God, Who through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, has vouchsafed to give joy to the whole world, grant us, we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of eternal life. Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

10. ASSOCIATION FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH.

The Association assists by prayers and alms the Catholic Missionaries in heathen and non-Catholic countries.

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP. — (1) The daily recitation of Our Father and one Hail Mary, with the invocation: St. Francis Xavier,

pray for us; and (2) the annual contribution of not less than 2s. 2d. yearly, or one halfpenny weekly; (3) Special members contribute one guinea, or more, yearly; (4) Life membership subscription, £8.

ORGANISATION.—The usual method of collection is by the formation of Groups or Circles of Ten Members, of whom one acts as Collector. The Collector receives the contributions of his group, circulates among them the *Annals* of the Associations, and pays over his collection to the local Treasurer. A return of the sums received, and of their appropriation is inserted annually in the "Annals of the Propagation of the Faith." One copy of each issue of the *Annals* is supplied to every ten members.

SPIRITUAL FAVOURS.—An exceptionally large number of spiritual privileges, including Plenary and Partial Indulgences, is granted to Associates. Extensive Faculties are also given to priests who direct local centres or become special members. A complete list of these privileges may be obtained from the Secretary of the Scottish Branch, St. John's, Portobello, or from any of the Diocesan Officials (vid. Part iv., Section I, 4).

11. CATHOLIC TRUTH SOCIETY.

The following Indulgences were granted to the Catholic Truth Society in perpetuity by a Decree of the S. Cong. de Prop. Fide, 6th October, 1896:—

(1) A Plenary Indulgence (applicable to the Souls in Purgatory) to all present and future members of the Society on the day of their joining the Society, and also on the Feasts of St. Andrew, the Apostle; St. Margaret, Queen of Scotland; St. Patrick, St. Columba and St. Ninian, or on any day within the Octave of these Feasts, on condition that they visit an Oratory of the Society, or their own Parish Church, and, after confessing their sins with sincere repentance and receiving Holy Communion, pray for the Propagation of the Holy Faith and for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff.

(2) A Partial Indulgence of one hundred days every time they succeed in persuading a new member to join the Society, and every time they attend a General or Local Meeting of the Society.

By decree of the Sacred Penitentiary, 7th November, 1935, the following Indulgences were also granted to the members of the Box-Tenders' Association:—

(1) A Plenary Indulgence can be gained by members on the usual conditions: (a) on any day they choose after joining the Association; (b) on the Feast of St. Francis de Sales; (c) once a month on condition that they have faithfully and regularly carried out their duty of looking after the book-case.

(2) A Plenary Indulgence can be gained at the hour of death by members who, after Confession and Holy Communion, or at least after an act of contrition, piously utter the Holy Name of Jesus with their lips, if they can do so, or at least in their hearts, and patiently accept death from the hands of God as a penalty for sin.

(3) A Partial Indulgence of three hundred days may be gained by members each and every time they arrange the pamphlets in good order and afterwards make an act of contrition, at least with a contrite heart, before the Blessed Sacrament.

12. SHORT FORM OF PROFESSION OF FAITH

To be used by permission in the Reception of Converts

I, holding in my hand God's holy gospels and enlightened by divine grace, publicly declare that I accept the Faith which is taught by the Catholic, Apostolic and Roman Church. I believe that Church to be the one true Church which Jesus Christ set up here on earth ; to which I make my submission with all my heart.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son our Lord ; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried ; He descended into hell ; the third day He rose again from the dead : He ascended into heaven, sitteth at the right hand of God the Father almighty ; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost ; the Holy Catholic Church ; the communion of saints ; the forgiveness of sins ; the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

I believe that seven sacraments were instituted by Jesus Christ for the salvation of mankind : Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, Penance, Extreme Unction, Holy Order and Matrimony.

I believe that the Bishop of Rome is the Vicar of Jesus Christ on earth, that he is the supreme visible Head of the whole Church, and that he teaches infallibly what we must believe and do for salvation.

I also believe everything which the Holy Catholic, Apostolic and Roman Church defines and declares that we must believe. To her I give my whole allegiance and I reject every error and schism which she condemns.

So help me God, and these His holy gospels which I touch with my hand.
