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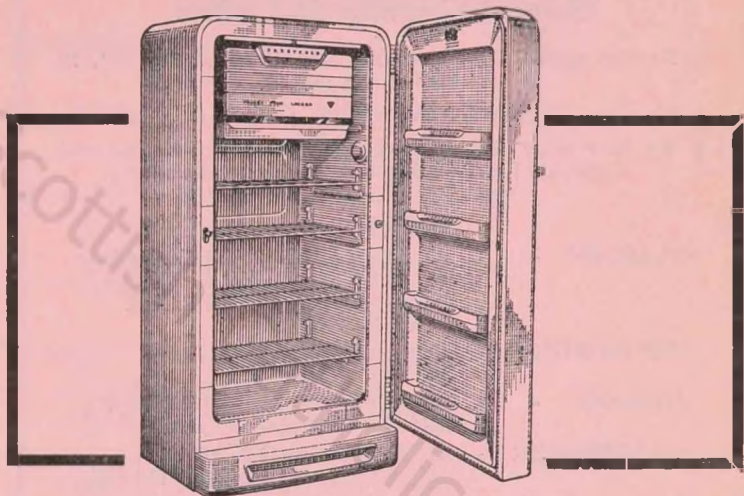

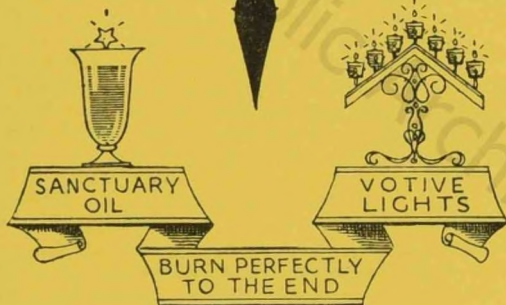

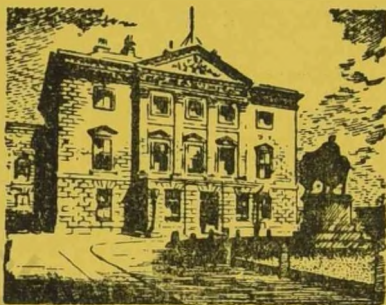

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SECTION II.

THE HIERARCHY OF SCOTLAND

From the Extinction of the Hierarchy in 1603 till its Restoration in 1878.

1. The ancient Hierarchy ended with James Betoun, Abp. of Glasgow, who died at Paris on the 25th April, 1603, aged 79. After being subjected to the jurisdiction of the Archpriests and first Vicar-Apostolic of England till 1623, and afterwards to local Prefects of the Mission, the Clergy were incorporated into a missionary body by decree of Propaganda, 1653, and governed by the following Prefects-Apostolic: **William Ballantyne** (or **Bellenden**), 1653-61; **Alexander Dunbar** (or **Winstler**), 1662-68, 1672-94; and **John Walker** (or **Ross**), 1668-71. In May, 1694, a Scottish Vicariate-Apostolic was established. This was divided into two Districts, the Lowland and the Highland, in February, 1731; and these two into three, the Eastern, Western and Northern, by Papal Rescript of 13th February, 1827. This last arrangement remained in force till the re-establishment of the Hierarchy by the Apostolic Letter, *Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice*, 4th March, 1878.

From the Restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878

The Apostolic Letter "Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice" of Leo XIII, 4th March, 1878, divided Scotland into the Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (with four Suffragan Sees) and the Archdiocese of Glasgow, which was directly subject to the Holy See. By the Apostolic Constitution "Maxime Interest" of Pius XII, 25th May, 1947, and the Apostolic Constitution "Dominici Gregis" of the same date, the Archdiocese of Glasgow was erected into a Province and divided into the Metropolitan See of Glasgow with the Suffragan Sees of Motherwell and Paisley.

DOMESTIC PRELATES, Privy Chamberlains and Honorary Chamberlains of His Holiness the Pope, have the title of *Monsignore*. Prelates are addressed as *Right Rev. Mgr.*, Chamberlains as *Very Rev. Mgr.*

Monsignore when followed by surname is usually written and pronounced *Monsignor*.

MITRED ABBOTS.—*The Right Rev. Abbot* [name]; *Right Rev. Father*.

PROVINCIALS of Religious Congregations.—*The Very Rev. Father* [name]; or *The Very Rev. Father Provincial* (with initials of the Religious Order.)

RECTORS OF COLLEGES and Heads of Religious Houses are usually addressed as *Very Rev.*

DEAN.—The use of this as a title is apt to be misleading and should be avoided.

OBITUARIES—1958

Rev. Edward Scanlan—19th February, 1958

The death occurred on Wednesday, 19th February, 1958, after a short illness, of Father Edward Scanlan, parish priest of St. Michael's, Shortlees, Kilmarnock.

Father Scanlan was in the fifty-first year of his age, having been born on 1st September, 1907, at Auchinleck, in Ayrshire. After his primary school studies at St. Joseph's School, Kilmarnock, he proceeded, in 1924, to Blairs College, to prepare for the priesthood, and, three years later, he went to the Royal Scots College in Valladolid. From Valladolid, he was transferred to St. Patrick's College, Thurles, and on 10th June, 1934, in St. Patrick's Cathedral at Thurles, he received the priesthood at the hands of the Most Rev. John Harty, Archbishop of Cashel.

When he returned to his native diocese, in the summer of 1934, Father Scanlan was appointed to a curacy at St. Andrew's Cathedral, Dumfries, where he won the esteem and affection of his fellow priests and of the whole congregation by his friendliness and zeal. That same earnestness of purpose and kindliness was shown in all the other appointments that came to him, his two curacies at Annan and at St. Margaret's, Ayr, and later as parish priest of Newton Stewart from 1938 to 1940, and of Hurlford from 1940 to 1953. In 1953, the Bishop of Galloway had decided to form a new parish in the expanding industrial town of Kilmarnock, and he chose as its founder parish priest Father Scanlan, now a man of forty-six, who retained much of the active zeal of his youth and combined it with much rich experience in the conduct of parochial affairs. The remaining years were years of constant toil, building up a new parish around the fine church of St. Michael, the latest phase of which was the erection of a much-needed parochial hall. But all this anxiety and labour took its unseen toll of Father Scanlan's health. At the beginning of February he became ill and, admitted to Ayrshire Central Hospital, his condition became steadily worse and, after a short illness, he died.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated in St. Michael's Church, Kilmarnock, on Friday, 21st February: the celebrant of the Mass was Father Donald Bonnar of Johnstone, Father Joseph N. Maxwell, of Stevenston, being deacon and Father Lawrence Breen, of Prestwick, subdeacon. A crowded congregation, which included prelates and clergy and representatives of religious orders from Galloway and the neighbouring dioceses, heard Bishop McGee preach the panegyric and express in words the general sense of tragedy which affected all in the unexpected death of this comparatively young priest, at a time when he had just completed the equipment of his new parish and "everything seemed complete and set for many years of zealous and successful work." But, sudden though the call may have been,

it came to one already prepared, as His Lordship pointed out: "He was a good priest, a devoted priest. He accepted the sufferings of his last illness with admirable patience and Christian fortitude. Any time I went to see him, although he was very weak and exhausted, he always had a smile and he died with the names of Jesus, Mary and Joseph on his lips." May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. Bernard Canon McLaughlin—22nd February, 1958

By the death of Canon Bernard McLaughlin of Musselburgh, which occurred on Saturday, 22nd February, 1958, the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh has lost one of its most remarkable priests.

Canon McLaughlin was born at Balerno, Midlothian, on 12th June, 1891; he entered Blairs College, in September, 1905, to prepare for the priesthood and, in 1911, he was sent to the Scots College, Rome, for his higher ecclesiastical studies. There he was ordained, on the 10th August, 1917, by Cardinal Basilio Pompili, Cardinal Vicar of Rome, and returning to his native archdiocese in the following year, he was appointed curate at St. Patrick's, Edinburgh. He spent eight years as a curate in this busy city parish and, in 1926, he was given charge of the parish of Our Lady, Star of the Sea, at North Berwick. In 1934, he was transferred to St. Agatha's, Methil, where he remained for three years, and finally, since 1937, he has been parish priest of the church of Our Lady of Loretto, in Musselburgh. In 1947, he was appointed a Canon of the Metropolitan Chapter of St. Mary's Cathedral in Edinburgh.

It was typical of Canon McLaughlin that he should have requested that no panegyric be preached at his funeral for, notwithstanding the many natural and acquired gifts, with which his personality was endowed, he always remained sincerely humble of heart and completely devoid of any pomposity. In each parish to which he was appointed, he gave liberally of his abundant store of learning to his people, without making any parade of learning and he worked zealously and with devoted care for his flock but always without fuss. Yet despite his retiring nature, Canon McLaughlin exercised an influence, which extended far beyond his immediate pastoral charge. The central theme of the Canon's life was the beauty of God's house as a worthy tabernacle for God dwelling among his people. This he made the starting-off point in the spiritual formation of his congregation, ever striving to make his people well-instructed in the things of faith and alert to the need for living the full sacramental life of the Church. The Canon's fine artistic sense and his profound understanding of our Catholic culture found full expression in pursuing this object and his people caught something of his quiet enthusiasm.

Each successive parish experienced something of the Canon's "artistic apostolate." At North Berwick, for instance, he installed a fine organ, and refurbished the sanctuary as a setting for the splendid new altar. But it was Musselburgh which saw the full flowering of his very individual approach to pastoral care. At Musselburgh, he found the attractive and finely proportioned gothic

church, built by Archibald Macpherson in 1905, for the late Monsignor McGettigan, and he set about completing its decoration. The most impressive features of the scheme of decoration, which was devised by Canon McLaughlin himself, are the beautiful mural paintings of the sanctuary, executed by the late Mr. George Duffly, and the brilliant series of stained glass windows, depicting the life of Our Lady, designed by Nina Miller-Davidson and her husband, the late Charles L. Davidson. This series of windows forms a unique example, in any Scottish church, of a complete scheme of decoration, worked out by a single group of artists, and, in design and in colour, the windows are superb. The final result of all Canon McLaughlin's efforts is a church which must be numbered among the two or three finest Catholic churches in Scotland, and not the least important member of the team of artists who brought the scheme to success was Canon McLaughlin himself. Further, as a fit setting for the church, the grounds were laid out as a delightful rose garden, which, seen in summer with its thousands of blooms, well merits the description of one visitor—"A Te Deum in colour and fragrance."

"Art for art's sake" had no place among the maxims of Canon McLaughlin's life. All this was done simply to bind his people together in the common purpose of offering to God a worthy dwelling in their midst, of providing a place, where the great Sacrifice of Calvary might be renewed and where the sacred liturgy might be carried out in seemly fashion: his people understood and co-operated generously and the material beauty of the place was reflected in the spiritual lives of the parishioners.

Canon McLaughlin soon found that his work was attracting a wider public than his own people of Musselburgh. So much interest was, in fact, aroused that the church of Our Lady of Loretto has been included in guide books to the district and has been featured in national magazines. Visitors from far and near, Catholic and non-Catholic, came, singly and in groups. On one occasion, a non-Catholic minister, with his entire congregation, spent over two hours in the church and gardens. Many of these visitors came into contact with the Catholic Church here for the first time. All went away impressed as much by the beauty of the place as by the personality of the parish priest, cultured, unassuming, affable.

When Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated for Canon McLaughlin, on Tuesday, 25th February, his people crowded the church to pay their last respects to a priest who had won their sincere affection, not because he was cultured and artistic, but because he was a wise, devoted and kindly shepherd of souls. The Mass was celebrated by Canon McLaughlin's brother, the Very Rev. Thomas McLaughlin, Superior General of the Mill Hill Fathers; the deacon of the Mass was Monsignor Richard Delaney, of Dunfermline; and Canon Bernard O'Hanlon, South Queensferry, was subdeacon. The music of the Mass was rendered by choir-boys of Musselburgh parish and a choir of priests from the archdiocese. His Grace, Archbishop Gray presided, gave the Absolutions and asked the prayers of the congregation, and of Canon McLaughlin's friends everywhere, for the repose of his soul. May he rest in peace.

Rev. John Roger — 9th March, 1958

St. Joseph's Church, Cardowan, was crowded to the doors on Wednesday, 12th March, 1958, when parishioners, together with clergy from the Diocese of Motherwell and far beyond, assembled to take part in the Solemn Requiem offered by His Lordship Bishop Scanlan for the repose of the soul of the late parish priest of Cardowan, Father John Roger, who died suddenly on Sunday, 9th March, after a short illness.

Father Roger was a native of Maryhill, Glasgow, born there on 23rd August, 1901. He studied for the priesthood at St. Mary's College, Blairs, and at the Royal Scots College in the city of Valladolid, where he was ordained thirty-one years ago, 2nd April, 1927, in the Church of Our Lady of the Rosary, by the Archbishop of Valladolid.

The first ten years of his priestly life in the Archdiocese of Glasgow were spent in the busy parish of St. Mirin, in Paisley, where Father Roger's priestly zeal found full scope. Another decade was passed as curate in St. Mary's, Whifflet, and, in 1947, he was appointed parish priest of St. Athanasius' parish, Carlisle, where the enormous expansion of the war-time Law Hospital created many problems, and, two years later, he was transferred to St. Joseph's parish, Cardowan, where he passed the last eight years of his life.

For some time Father Roger had been suffering from a bronchial complaint when an attack of pneumonia supervened, setting up a heart condition so serious, that the neighbouring parish priest, Father Michael Little of Muirhead, administered the Last Sacraments on Saturday night, and at half past six the following morning Father Roger passed to his eternal reward.

"The ways of God are inscrutable and the uncertainties of human life are commonplace," said His Lordship Bishop Scanlan in his panegyric. "Just the afternoon before he was called to God, Father Roger administered the Sacrament of Baptism. He gave supernatural life to a new-born child so soon before he himself was called away from his life in the world, to one which we hope and pray will be a life of endless happiness for him." May he rest in peace.

Rev. Edward Lavery — 5th April, 1958

It was on Holy Saturday morning, 5th April, 1958, that we learned of the untimely death of Father Edward Lavery. He had been in indifferent health for some eighteen months, but was actually convalescing in a nursing home in Yorkshire when Almighty God called him.

He was born in Flemington, Motherwell, on 16th March, 1923, and received his early education in St. Patrick's Primary School, Shieldmuir. From there, he went to the Abbey School, Fort Augustus, where he spent two years under the Benedictines. It was there that he discovered his vocation to the Priesthood. In 1938, he went to Blairs College, where he did his preliminary and philo-

sophical studies. In 1944, he began his theological studies in St. Peter's College, Bearsden, and was among those who spent a year in St. Joseph's College, Mill Hill, and completed his studies in the new seminary of St. Peter's, Cardross. He was ordained priest by His Lordship Bishop Douglas in Motherwell Cathedral, on 29th June, 1948.

Father Lavery's first appointment was to St. Mary's, Hamilton, and then to St. Anne's, Cadzow, where he spent four years under his old rector, Mgr. McGonagle. He was transferred to the Holy Family, Mossend, where he spent three years, and then he went to St. Mary's, Larkhall. He was only a matter of months in Larkhall when his health gave rise for concern and he was removed to Stonehouse Hospital. After his recovery, he was sent to St. Mary's, Whifflet. He was only fifteen months in St. Mary's when he had to leave his work for what proved to be the last time.

In January, Father Lavery was removed to the Bon Secours Nursing Home, Langside. After some time, his progress appeared to be encouraging, so much so that his doctor suggested that he should go to England to convalesce. The place chosen was a convent in Holme-on-Spalding Moor, Yorkshire. During his stay there he was able to say Mass practically every day and even attended the Holy Week services in what proved to be the last week of his life.

To those who knew Father Edward, he was of a shy and retiring disposition, but at the same time could be most pleasant and entertaining. His qualities were many. He will always be remembered for his devotion to the sick and the poor, and for his generosity to all and sundry. His life was short but full. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Patrick McHugh — 1st May, 1958

Rev. Patrick McHugh, first parish priest of St. Andrew's, Airdrie, died on the 1st May, 1958, in a Glasgow hospital.

He was born at Greenock on the 28th January, 1906, and attended St. Mary's school there. On the 12th August, 1920, he entered St. Mary's College, Blairs, to study for the priesthood, and, on the 6th September, 1924, he arrived at St. Peter's, Bearsden, to begin his philosophical and theological studies. In both colleges he was well liked by everyone because of his happy disposition and his excellence at all games. He was an outstanding athlete. On the Feast of St. John the Baptist, 24th June, 1930, he was ordained in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow. Now his great energy and zeal was to be used for the salvation of souls.

His first parish was Our Lady of Good Aid, now the Cathedral, Motherwell. He worked hard, fulfilling all his priestly duties, and he was also chaplain to the Boy Scouts. He always remembered them and it was no surprise when, years afterwards, he went with them on pilgrimage to Rome in the Holy Year, 1950. Other parishes where he laboured included Langloan, Kirkintilloch, where he was chaplain to the C.Y.M.S., St. Patrick's, Coatbridge, where he started a new branch of the C.Y.M.S., and lastly, St. Andrew's as parish

priest. Here he worked hard, establishing a new parish, and the new church that he built will always be a memorial to him.

From 1939 to 1945, he was absent from the Archdiocese. At the very outbreak of war, he volunteered as a chaplain to the Army, and was accepted. The priestly work that he performed during those fateful years will never be known. He was in many theatres of war, and his great strength and cheerfulness helped many. His popularity was such, that everyone knew him as "Father Mac." He was Mentioned in Despatches.

The Bishop of Motherwell appointed him chaplain to the newly-formed Diocesan Council of the C.Y.M.S. All the experience he had gathered in dealing with men was now applied in lectures and meetings to make the Brothers of the C.Y.M.S. saintly and active Lay Apostles.

He had many grand qualities, but his greatest was his exact care and loyal love for his Master in the Holy Eucharist. Wherever he was, everything had to be as perfect as possible. "When he went up to the holy altar, he honoured the vesture of holiness." He will long be remembered by those who knew him. May he rest in peace.

The Right Rev. Mgr. John Provost MacNeill, M.C.

14th May, 1958

Two outstanding Highland priests died during 1958: Mgr. John Provost MacNeill of Morar, and Mgr. William Canon Macmaster of Fort William. In background and temperament they were quite different from one another, but in common they possessed to a high degree the qualities that are most necessary for a priest. It is no exaggeration to say that they were among the best known and most revered men in the West of Scotland in their generation.

Mgr. MacNeill was born in Bernera, that tiny island at the extreme south of the Hebridean chain, on which stands Barra-head lighthouse. To-day it is the home only of sea-birds, but in 1880 there were five crofts on it. The date of his birth was the 3rd July, 1880. His father, Michael MacNeill, was a comparatively prosperous fisherman, who had the distinction among his family of having been to school in the neighbouring island of Mingulay. He engaged a "scholar" to give his children the rudiments of education, so that when the family moved to Castlebay in 1887, John was at least abreast of his classmates in reading and writing. Castlebay was then a busy fishing port and Michael MacNeill built a house and shop and set up a business—one of the first of the local people to do so. Castlebay church was built about this time, and John was attracted towards the altar by his devout parents and the parish priest, the late Canon Chisholm.

In 1893 he went to Blairs. The venerable old college was then in a dilapidated state, but before he left he was to spend a year in the new Blairs. In 1898, he went to Issy, and then in due course to St. Sulpice. While still a deacon, he was recalled to Scotland and ordained priest by Bishop Smith in Oban on 25th March, 1903. His

first appointment was to the parish of the Small Isles, a difficult parish, without a proper house for the priest, and involving poverty as well as hazardous journeys in dangerous seas. In 1905 he was chosen to succeed the distinguished Father Allan Macdonald in Eriskay. While Barra was then fairly prosperous, South Uist and Eriskay were desperately poor. Father MacNeill is remembered by the people of Eriskay with affection, as a worthy successor to his saintly predecessor. Those who know the Isles of the West only as the object of a summer cruise, or the subject of sentimental songs, or even as they are to-day, places of happy and care-free living, cannot imagine the conditions in which they were at the end of the last century. The work of a priest demanded ceaseless sacrifice, and would—and did—tax the health of the strongest of men. The Isles were served by a succession of priests of whom the diocese has good reason to be proud, and whose life-stories, though brief, would be very edifying. Conditions had begun to improve by 1905, but in the nine years spent by Father MacNeill in Eriskay, he shared the poverty of the people, as well as their hard work and joyful faith.

In 1914, when Lochiel raised the 5th Battalion of the Cameron Highlanders, Father MacNeill was among the first to enlist. His career in the First World War is well remembered and often referred to by the men who were his comrades. They loved him for his happy nature, and they respected him for his personal bravery. Through the terrible carnage of 1915-1917, he was always to the front in battle. His name became a legend among the Camerons. Twice mentioned in despatches, he received the Military Cross and later a Bar. In 1917, he was severely wounded and invalided home. It was the 13th October, and the 9th Division had launched the attack on Paschendaele Ridge. In torrential rain their plans had miscarried, and casualties were very high. A soldier ploughing through the mud, found lying among the dead the priest who had been in the thick of the fighting, and scarce knowing whether he were still alive, he dragged him to safety. The "London Gazette" of 23rd April, 1918, published the award of the Bar to the M.C. "for conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, in going out in front of our lines under intense machine-gun fire to dress the wounded and bring them in: he saved many lives, and only gave up when wounded in the lung, left leg and right arm." In the history of the 5th Camerons we read: "The loss of Father MacNeill was deeply deplored by the whole battalion, wherein he was greatly loved and respected, not only for his upright character, but also for his unwavering gallantry. For in every attack he would go over the top with the front line, usually with 'A' or 'B' Company, in which were to be found most of his own flock, and there he would remain day and night until they were relieved."

His career in the Forces did not end at Paschendaele, however, for he returned to duty as chaplain in the Fourth Battle Squadron, and the end of the war found him on service in H.M.S. 'Bellerophon.' Then, in March, 1919, he returned to Eriskay; the following year he was transferred to Daliburgh in South Uist. About that time he was introduced to the Inverness County Council, on which he

was to serve with great distinction for thirty-four years. For the next few years he continued to labour for the relief of poverty in the Isles, and in order to give more people in his parish the opportunity of receiving the Sacraments without having to walk many miles over the hills, he built the little church of Our Lady of Sorrows at Garrynamonie in the south end of his parish.

In 1923 he came to Morar. The district has changed much since then, for at that time the people were scattered over a wide area, much of which is now deserted: while Mallaig was a little hamlet where Mass was said only on Saturdays. But as Mallaig grew, the need for a church there became urgent. Father MacNeill said Mass on Sundays in the school until, in 1935, he had built the beautiful little church of St. Patrick, designed by the late Mr. Reginald Fairlie, R.S.A. In 1926 he was appointed to the Diocesan Chapter, and in 1946 he became Vicar General. Shortly afterwards he was made a Domestic Prelate. In his thirty-five years in Morar he served God as a simple country priest, acknowledged leader of the whole community, irrespective of creed. But the sphere of his influence was very great even outside the bounds of his parish. On the many committees on which he served, both of Church and State, his opinions were received by all with the greatest respect, and weighed heavily in any discussion. He was a wonderful character; a man of few words who would listen patiently to the most voluble speakers without interrupting, and when they were finished he would sum up with devastating clarity, giving his own opinion without appearing to do so, and without giving offence. He had a brilliant wit, devoid of all trace of bitterness. He would break the tension of a heated moment with an "obiter dictum" which would dissolve the hard feelings in laughter. As a preacher, he was unique. He seemed to break all the rules of oratory, using no gestures, no long words, never raising his voice for effect. But he spoke from the heart, and held his audience spell-bound.

Mgr. MacNeill suffered the first serious illness in 1952, when a cerebral haemorrhage left him almost totally blind, and the last years of his life were spent in darkness. With periods of better health, he would be taken in his car for a visit to some sick person, or just to meet and talk to his parishioners, but gradually the periods of suffering became longer, and at the beginning of 1958 it was obvious that his life was drawing to a close. A constant stream of callers came to his room. Catholics and Protestants, rich and poor. Death in the end came suddenly, and on the 14th May, 1958, he died in the presence of the faithful housekeeper who had attended him day and night through the long years of his blindness.

His Lordship Bishop Grant and the clergy of the diocese accompanied his body to the grave in Morar cemetery. In the same cemetery lies the soldier who carried him from the battlefield to give forty more years of service to the Church. On one occasion Mgr. MacNeill said in a speech: "Morar—the name is written on my heart." His own name will long be remembered by the people of Morar. May he rest in peace.

Right Rev. Monsignor John M. Ashe — 11th June, 1958

John Martin Ashe, Domestic Prelate of His Holiness, Canon of the Cathedral Chapter of Motherwell, and Parish Priest of St. Joseph's, Blantyre, died in the Bon Secours Hospital, Tralee, Co. Kerry, on 11th June, 1958. He had been suffering grievously for some considerable time. After treatment in a hospital here, he returned to St. Joseph's, but he was still a very sick man. So on Whit Sunday he crossed to Ireland, hoping that the change of air might do him good. However, his condition rapidly deteriorated, necessitating his removal to hospital, and the end came within a week of his admission. A great crowd of the people of Dingle (where the Monsignor was well known) and a large number of the priests of the diocese of Kerry, with some from Scotland, attended the obsequies in the parish church, where after the Mass, the absolutions were given by His Lordship the Bishop of Kerry, the Right Rev. Denis Moynahan. The body was then laid to rest in the cemetery by the church, where, we understand, a memorial cross will be erected by the people of Blantyre. In St. Joseph's, Blantyre, on 14th June, Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by the Right Rev. James D. Scanlan, Bishop of Motherwell, the Assistant Priest being the Right Rev. Monsignor G. M. Rogers, V.G., the Deacon Very Rev. J. Canon Rooney (Rutherglen), the Sub-deacon Very Rev. M. Canon Ward (St. Mary's, Glasgow); Canons D. Flynn and J. Battel were Assistant Deacons at the throne. His Lordship the Bishop of Paisley was present in the sanctuary, as was also the Right Rev. James Ward, V.G., representing His Grace the Archbishop of Glasgow. The Right Rev. Monsignor A. Hamilton preached the panegyric. Before giving the absolutions, His Lordship Bishop Scanlan paid his own personal tribute, expressing his sympathy with the relatives and with the parishioners, his deep sense of loss in the demise of one of his most trusted priests, and his appreciation of the magnificent service rendered by the late Monsignor to the diocese of Motherwell.

John Ashe was born in Ryepatch, Nevada, U.S.A., on 27th November, 1889. His parents returned to their native Kerry while he was a child, so he received his early education in the Christian Brothers' School at Dingle. In 1906 he entered St. Brendan's Seminary, Killarney, and two years later was enrolled in St. Peter's College, Bearsden, as a student for the Archdiocese of Glasgow. Having completed his ecclesiastical studies there, he was ordained priest in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, on 28th June, 1914, by the Co-adjutor Archbishop D. Mackintosh. He served as assistant priest in St. Patrick's, Glasgow, St. Mary's, Duntocher, and St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, where he was Master of Ceremonies to the Archbishop. In 1931, he became parish priest of St. Thomas', Neilston, was transferred to the parish of Christ the King, Glasgow, in 1938, and finally, in 1945, was given charge of St. Joseph's, Blantyre. Before the division of the Archdiocese of Glasgow, Father Ashe was for some years a member of the religious examining board for schools, and also held the post of secretary-treasurer of the Diocesan Education Board. With the establishment of the Diocese

of Motherwell, he was appointed a Diocesan Consultor and Diocesan Treasurer, and in addition administered the funds of the Association of the Propagation of the Faith and other societies, and was treasurer of the Bellevue Refuge Committee. When the Chapter was formed he became one of the Canons, and when a Vice-President of the National Committee of the A.P.F. was required he was unanimously appointed to the post. In this latter capacity he journeyed to Rome to present the Scottish report to the Directors of the A.P.F. on behalf of the Scottish National Committee. On this occasion he was photographed with the late Holy Father and was thus pictured for the first time in the robes of a Domestic Prelate. He had received this honour a short time before, and he was solemnly invested in St. Joseph's on his return from the Eternal City by His Lordship Bishop Scanlan. He was not destined for long to enjoy this crowning acknowledgment of his long and faithful service.

The list of offices held by Monsignor Ashe gives some indication of the trust placed in him by his ecclesiastical superiors and of his own ability and capacity for work, but all this has to be seen against the background of his labours as a very busy and efficient parish priest and pastor of souls—and this he was, above everything else; and when we remember that St. Joseph's comprises over 6,000 souls we can well imagine (or can we?) the multifarious claims made upon him. Yet withal he played his part in the pulpit and in the confessional, and still found time to say his prayers; this, with his daily Mass was surely the mainspring of his activity—but that is his secret, and God's. His love of the House of God need only be mentioned, for it is recorded in the recent redecoration of the church and the addition of the beautiful mortuary chapel.

But the foregoing is only the framework, as it were, of a life—briefest summary of the sequence of events. To get a glimpse of the man, we may be allowed to quote from the panegyric of his friend and classmate. The very text of Mgr. Hamilton's discourse might be said to have been the motif of Mgr. Ashe's life: "While daylight lasts, I must work in the service of Him who sent me: the night cometh when there is no working any more." (John ix. 4.) "It can be said at once of Monsignor Canon Ashe that his was a full working day. The whole of his life—and that is the daylight of which Our Lord speaks—was devoted to the work of Him who sent him, who called him to the priesthood and sent him to labour in His vineyard. I go back half a century, to the years spent in Bearsden. Those were the formative years—years of study in all the branches of the priestly sciences, years of training in the ways of the spiritual life, of strict discipline of prayer, of sport, too, and all the fun of college life. Into all this John Ashe threw himself with the zest of eager youth. Those, I say, were the formative years, though I am not forgetful of earlier years in the good Irish home, where the seeds of his vocation had been so carefully nurtured. They were years of promise, too, those college years—promise of things to come, promise that has been abundantly fulfilled in his forty years of priesthood." After referring to Monsignor Ashe's work in the various parishes mentioned above, the preacher said:

"You may think that all this, save for the honours that came to him, was very ordinary and could be said, thank God, of most of our priests. True, and John Ashe would have been the first to assert it. In what then did he excel? To my mind it was not so much what he did as how he did it that made him the great priest he certainly was. His personal holiness is known only to God and I would not dare to comment on it. But taking the day-to-day things of a priest's life, I think his greatness consisted in this that he performed them with meticulous care and exactitude—from the keeping of books to the saying of Mass. And doesn't the little way of the spiritual life consist in doing ordinary things extraordinarily well? . . .

"Still, I am conscious that I have so far given no idea of the personality of the man. The man I have so far described could be a very dull person indeed, and John Ashe was not that kind of person. To comparatively few is it granted to preserve the lightness of heart of boyhood's days. Those who had the privilege of knowing Mgr. Ashe will agree that he was one of the favoured few. His genial manner, his ready wit, his constant fund of humour were clear evidence of this. Even his appearance and general bearing belied his years. Is it any wonder that he was always welcome at clerical gatherings? When John Ashe was present there was never a dull moment. This buoyancy was simply the overflow of a deeper thing, the spirit that dominated his whole life right to the end, something that every priest must strive to maintain though old in years and racked in body, the thing he proclaims every time he approaches the altar—*ad Deum qui laetificat juventutem meam* . . . And this brings me to another characteristic which is but another aspect of that same spirit—a dogged and unyielding courage in face of constant and recurring illness. Subject to distressing fits of coughing which often exhausted him, nothing daunted he would struggle on manfully; he would not make this a pretext for taking things easy; he would be up and about as sprightly as ever at the first opportunity, and only those who knew him well could suspect what he endured." In these few words we have a sketch of the sort of man that John Ashe was; "*Delectare in Domino*," Delight in the Lord—this could well have been the motto of his escutcheon. May he rest in peace.

Rev. James Cullen — 12th August, 1958

On Tuesday, 12th August, 1958, at the Hospital of Our Lady of Lourdes, Drogheda, occurred the death of Father James Cullen of the Archdiocese of Glasgow, who retired, because of ill health, in 1956, from the charge of Twechar parish.

The eldest of a family of ten—four sons and six daughters—Father Cullen spent most of his youth in Omeath, Co. Louth, and studied for the priesthood at St. Patrick's College, Armagh, and St. Peter's College, Bearsden. He was ordained on 24th June, 1916, in St. Mary's Church, Calton, Glasgow.

Following curacies at St. Saviour's, Govan, where he served for fifteen years, and St. Alphonsus', Glasgow, where he remained for

four years, he was appointed parish priest at Houston in 1932. Three years later came the tragic accident, which gravely affected Father Cullen's health for the remainder of his days.

After being transferred to Gourrock, in the hope that a change of environment might help him, ill-health nevertheless forced him to go into retirement for a time.

Later, however, his health somewhat restored, he was able to take up duty as parish priest at Twechar, formerly served from Croy, where the task was given to him of setting up the parish of St. John of the Cross.

After a while, however, his health again deteriorated and, on the advice of his doctor, he retired and went back to his native Ireland. There he lived out the last few years of his life.

Solemn Requiem Mass was offered up in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, on Saturday, 16th August, the celebrant being Right Rev. Mgr. James Ward, Vicar General of Glasgow Archdiocese, prelates and clergy and people being present from the whole Province of Glasgow.

Mgr. Ward preached the panegyric at the close of the Mass. He conveyed the deep regrets of Archbishop Campbell that he was unable to be present at the Requiem, and spoke of the great zeal and devotion which Father Cullen showed during the years when he was an assistant at St. Saviour's.

"There were many in that vast parish who recalled with gratitude the zeal and devotion of Father Cullen. The parish itself had reason to be grateful for the alertness and great organising ability he showed during the early days of his priesthood. After many years in Govan, Father Cullen was transferred to St. Alphonsus' and then made parish priest in Houston. To Houston he brought the same great zeal and devotion he had shown during his years in Govan.

"It was during this period that an unfortunate event occurred. In 1935 he was involved in a motor accident in which his dear friend Father Donnelly, Vice-Rector of St. Peter's College, was killed. The thought of that tragedy remained as a shadow over the rest of Father Cullen's life.

"In order that a change of environment might assist him, his superiors changed him to Gourrock. There, too, he worked with zeal and devotion. But again the thought of that tragedy prevented him from showing the alertness he had displayed during the early years of his priesthood.

"A skin trouble, plus his nervous disposition, made it necessary he should retire for a while. But, with his health somewhat restored, he came to take up duty again in Twechar. To him was given the task of setting up the parish of St. John of the Cross as a separate unit. In Twechar Father Cullen threw himself with great energy, for a man of his health, into the task of establishing a new parish. He lived in circumstances far from luxurious. He lived among the people, and his first thought was that they should have some place in the parish where there should be a home for Our Lord in the

Blessed Sacrament. With the loyal co-operation of the men of Twechar, he built a small church within one year of his arrival there. It is not a basilica, but it is the centre of the Catholic life of the people of Twechar. In it they will pray earnestly for the priest who inspired them to build that place. It was only long after a home had been made for Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament that this good priest thought of providing a home for himself. So he built a new presbytery in Twechar.

"Unfortunately his health continued to deteriorate and though he strove zealously to attend to the needs of his people, the time came when his medical advisers considered it necessary that he should retire. So he left Twechar to return to his native country. There, for the past year or so, he had been under the care of the Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes at Drogheda. There he died."

The church at Twechar was crowded when Father Deans, the present parish priest, offered Requiem Mass for Father Cullen on Monday morning, for the benefit of those who could not manage to attend the Mass in St. Andrew's Cathedral on Saturday.

Father Cullen was buried in Ireland after Requiem Mass in St. Lawrence's Church, Omeath. Most Rev. Dr. W. Conway, Auxiliary Bishop, Archdiocese of Armagh, presided at the obsequies, and Most Rev. Dr. O'Callaghan, Bishop of Clogher, was also present. Rev. S. Cullen, C.C., Ardee, brother, was the celebrant. Archbishop Campbell of Glasgow was represented by Canon Boland. St. Patrick's, Anderston, and Father Thomas O'Kane, St. Michael's. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Owen Traynor, Ph.D., S.T.L. — 23rd August, 1958

The Rev. Owen Traynor was born at Coatbridge on 4th September, 1907. Following a call to the sacred priesthood, he entered Blairs College in 1923 and, five years later, his superiors transferred him for the higher studies of philosophy and theology to the ancient Scots College in Rome. His fellow students remember Father Traynor in those years as a genial, if somewhat shy, companion, who prepared himself steadily and diligently for the splendid office to which he had dedicated his life. Endowed with a fine intelligence, he reaped a rich harvest from the public lectures and disputations of the Gregorian University and from his own studies in the College. Having acquired the doctorate in philosophy and the licentiate in theology, he was promoted to the priesthood in 1934, being ordained on 15th July in the church of Sant' Ignazio by His Excellency Archbishop Passetto.

When Father Traynor returned to his native archdiocese in 1935, he was appointed as curate to the parish of St. Mungo, in Greenock. Later, he laboured in the crowded city parishes of St. Anne, Whitevale Street, and St. Joseph, North Woodside Road, and in 1947, he was transferred to the somewhat less strenuous parish of St. Joseph, Clarkston. During this period, it became gradually apparent that his

health was undermined and, for a time, he retired altogether from parochial work. Some eighteen months ago he resumed parochial duties and was assigned to St. John the Baptist's parish at Port-Glasgow. Here, as in earlier parishes, his quiet, unassuming earnestness made him popular with the parishioners, to whom his sudden death, on Saturday, 23rd August, came as a profound shock.

Notwithstanding the sudden and unexpected nature of the event, some seventy prelates and canons and other clergy, representing the entire Province of Glasgow, came to St. John's, Port-Glasgow for the funeral Mass, celebrated on Tuesday, 26th August, by Father Traynor's cousin, Father Francis Givens of East Kilbride. Monsignor McIntyre, Vicar General of Paisley Diocese, preached the panegyric and, as the funeral cortege moved away to St. Patrick's Cemetery, New Stevenston, large crowds lined the streets in silent prayer for a beloved priest. May he rest in peace.

Rev. James Donnelly—25th August, 1958

The Rev. James Donnelly was born in Dumfries on the 5th of January, 1884, and received his primary education in St. Andrew's Schools of that town. On entering Blairs College to study for the priesthood in the Autumn of 1898 he soon proved himself to be possessed of high mental abilities and was advanced rapidly through the various classes. He had no disposition for athletics of any kind but was an omnivorous reader and was most conscientious in the employment of spare time. He early developed an interest, most unusual in boys of his years, in questions of a social nature and in the rudiments of political economy and this interest remained with him till his death.

In 1902 he was selected by the late Bishop Turner to go to the Scots College, Rome, and was ordained to the priesthood there, in 1908. The bishop had him in mind for the doctorate of theology but, after passing one year in the necessary studies, his health began to cause some anxiety and he was brought home and stationed as curate in Kilmarnock. He laboured in that large industrial town under physical disabilities for some six years but was finally compelled, by medical advice, to place his resignation, most unwillingly, in the hands of Bishop McCarthy, in 1917, and retired to private life in his native town of Dumfries. Here, he spent, subject to frequent recurrences of his painful sickness, thirty-six years. He never lost interest in life and in the affairs of the church. He set himself to practise photography and became a constant contributor to many illustrated magazines. At length, in 1958, no longer capable of ministering to himself, he asked to be allowed to go to the Brothers of Charity, in Belmont, Waterford, and there, in August, worn out by years of long sickness, he passed peacefully to God. The Galloway Diocese was represented at his funeral by the Very Rev. John W. Canon O'Sullivan, Administrator of the Cathedral, Dumfries. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Douglas Gordon Stuart, M.A.—16th September, 1958.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated in St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen, on Saturday, 20th September, for the repose of the soul of Father Douglas G. Stuart of Aberdeen Diocese, who died at Rothesay in the fifty-eighth year of his age. The celebrant of the Mass was Canon Alexander Kerr, of Braemar, Father James A. McLaughlin, of Aberlour, was deacon and Father Wilfrid Davis, of Dingwall, was Subdeacon. Canon Joseph Lamont, of Keith, preached the following panegyric.

"The Lord guided him straight to his goal, and on the way showed him the heavenly Kingdom, and gave him knowledge of holy things. He enriched him by his toil, and gave to all his labours a happy issue." (Wisdom x, 10).

These words are applied by the Church, in her daily office, to the Saints, and we hesitate to use them for other men, for the saints are outstanding. But all of us, saint and sinner alike, have the same origin and the same destiny. We are made from nothing, but we are not made for nothing, and we shall never return into nothing. We are made by God into something that is like Him, and not only into something that is like Him, but into something that He could become, a man; something that He loved enough to die for. And so, saint and sinner, we are made to God's image and likeness, and redeemed by Christ, we are surrounded by splendours. It is because the saints have used these splendours so much better than us, that we hesitate to associate ourselves with them, as long as we are in this life. And yet we hope to be with them when we die. What we work and pray for is heaven, and what is heaven but to be with God and his saints in full splendour. We may and indeed do, trail along behind the saints in this world, and have less splendour in the world to come, but follow them we must, if we want to fulfil our destiny, which is the same as theirs.

These words then can be applied to more than the canonised saints of the Church, and I have not hesitated to apply them to-day to Father Douglas Stuart, my fellow priest, who has gone to God. I have applied them to him because it seems to me that they sum up his life, and give a meaning to his death.

"The Lord guided him straight to his goal and on the way showed him the heavenly Kingdom." What was the goal of Douglas Gordon Stuart? Obviously the same as that of every man, to know, love and serve God in this world and to be happy with him forever in heaven. But how did he recognise that goal and how did he attain it? Let us look at his life and see.

Douglas Gordon Stuart was born in Aberdeen on the 29th August, 1900, of non-Catholic parents. He received his early education at Gordon's College, and early in his life showed a realisation of the goal he wanted, for whilst still a non-Catholic he expressed a desire to be a priest. On being told that the first preliminary to that was to be a Catholic, he set about the attainment of this first step. There were many difficulties in his way, but with that steadfastness of

character which he showed all his life in every action, he kept to his purpose. He was, I understand, serving Mass in this very sanctuary where he now lies, before he had been received into the Church. At last, on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady, 1919, his first step was realised and he was received into the Catholic Church. I have no doubt that the date was deliberately chosen by himself, and that he asked Our Blessed Mother to help him and guide him all his life. She also would show him the heavenly Kingdom. By this time he was a student at Aberdeen University, where he was studying for his degree of Master of Arts. In 1924, he graduated with honours (first class) in English. During all his student days he had his goal clearly before him, the priesthood. He was accepted by the late Bishop Bennett as a student for Aberdeen Diocese and he went to the Scots College in Rome to prepare for the priesthood.

"The Lord gave him a knowledge of holy things." A priest has not only to look to the salvation of his own soul. He has to look to others as well. For that it is necessary to have a knowledge of holy things, to know how to preside, how to bless and how to preach. Douglas Stuart went to Rome to acquire the knowledge and training to enable him to reach his goal. There also he passed through the various steps to the priesthood, and finally, on the 25th May, 1929, in the Basilica of St. John Lateran, he received the power of the priesthood from His Eminence Cardinal Pompili. The Lord had guided him to his goal. Henceforth he has the power to offer sacrifice to God on behalf of the people.

"With dedicated heart, he will keep early vigil at the Lord's gates, the Lord who made him, to win audience for his plea to the most High. His lips will be eloquent in prayer as he entreats pardon for sins." (Ecclesiasticus xxxix. 6.)

Father Douglas Stuart returned to Scotland in 1930 and began his priestly mission in his native city. From 1930 to 1934 he was a curate at this Cathedral of St. Mary. It was a further period of training, where under supervision he put into practice all that he had learned. In 1934, he was appointed to the parish of Dingwall in Ross-shire, which in reality meant that he lived in Dingwall and was responsible for all the Catholics in the county of Ross and Cromarty. This is a sparsely populated county, with few Catholics, and normally did not call for very great effort. But it so happened that at that time developments were taking place, and construction camps sprang up in various places, with many Catholics amongst their personnel. These applied to Father Stuart for their spiritual needs, and with his unflinching pleasantness he endeavoured to supply them all. Then, in 1939, war broke out and another population moved in, and the number of Catholics went higher still, even more widely scattered over those thousands of square miles. Father Stuart endeavoured to supply all their needs. In addition to the parish church at Dingwall, he had at least four other Mass centres where he went as often as possible, saying three Masses every Sunday, with other Masses and numerous visits on week-days. "The Lord enriched him by his toil." For this had he been ordained; for this

had he striven after to attain his goal, and he gave of his best. This was the chief centre of his priestly work, and all his acute intelligence, all his ready eloquence and fine command of English, all his zeal for souls and all his kindness was poured out on those under his charge. But it could not go on indefinitely. The physical strain was immense, but for fifteen years he continued to give of his best. Then, in 1949, on a visit to Edinburgh, he was attacked by a coronary thrombosis and was taken to the infirmary there, dying. But he did not die then. "The Lord enriched him by his toil," but not yet were his labours to receive happy issue. I remember visiting him in the infirmary at that time and he told me, with that cheerful smile of his, about his illness, and regretted that he did not die, for now he would be no more use. He who for nineteen years had given so much in priestly activity could not foresee that he had to give now a further nine years in patience and suffering. But he accepted God's will. The philosophers say that he who has not suffered has not lived. Father Stuart was to learn to live fully.

Slowly he recovered from his illness, and after a few months at Inverness he was considered able to look after the parish of Dufftown in Banffshire. He went there in October, 1951, and hoped to be able to spend the rest of his life there. But now he was not sufficiently robust to be a parish priest, and after four years he left Dufftown and retired to Aviemore in September, 1955. For three more years he struggled on, saying Mass for the few Catholics of Aviemore, still "keeping vigil at the Lord's gate, to win audience for his plea to the most High." But it was nearing the time for the Lord to give to all his labours a happy issue. There are those who die in harness, in full vigour: Father Stuart nearly did that. There are those who complete their task and die of old age after honourable retirement. Father Stuart did not do that. There are those who give a certain number of years of their life to the task they have undertaken, and then are cut down by ill health and forced to spend the remainder of their life as invalids or semi-invalids. Father Stuart did do that. Is that a happy issue to all his labours? At first sight it would seem not. But to us who follow the banner of the Man who died the most frustrated death of all on the Cross, it should not be so. To achieve one's goal of the priesthood, to live for nineteen years a full and vigorous life as a priest, to spend nine years, learning again indeed, what personal suffering is and by one's cheerfulness, resignation and readiness to accept God's will, to teach it to others, as he has taught it to me, that seems to me to be a happy issue indeed.

Father Stuart died at Rothesay on the Feast of St. Ninian, September 16th. We have come to-day to his native city, to the cathedral church of the diocese, where he made his first profession of faith, and where he first exercised his sacred ministry, to pay our last respects to his memory. We, his fellow priests and brethren of this diocese, have lost a good friend and colleague, whose ready smile and cheerful presence will be sadly missed. You the people of the diocese, and in particular of the Cathedral, Dingwall, Dufftown and Aviemore, have lost a priest whom you loved and revered

for he had very many lovable qualities. I hope I have not canonised him. He would hate that. Each one of us shall say or have said three Masses for the repose of his soul, and nearly every secular priest in Scotland shall say one Mass for him. That is because we believe that he shall need, as we in our turn shall need those Masses. "With dedicated heart he kept early vigil at the Lord's gates to win audience for his plea to the most High." Now others must take over for him. I have no doubt that the Lord, who made him, has received him kindly. But He is a just God and there is much to account for. Remember Father Stuart in your prayers.

To the Bishop of the diocese, who has lost a good and faithful priest, to his sister who has lost her only brother, we offer our sympathy and prayers. To his housekeeper, who looked after him in his vigour and nursed him in his illness, we offer our thanks. For Father Douglas Stuart we offer our prayers that the happy issue of all his labours may be, even now, the glory and splendour of God.

Rev. James Butler — 10th October, 1958

When death came to Father James Butler, on the 10th October, 1958, it came suddenly, but not unexpectedly. He had been in poor health for some years so that when the end came he was spiritually and mentally prepared for it.

Father Butler was born on the 2nd December, 1904, at Donaghmore, Co. Limerick. He completed his secondary education in St. Munchin's College and, later on, at the Sacred Heart College, Limerick, before going to St. Patrick's College, Carlow, in 1922, to begin his more immediate studies for the priesthood. Three years later, when he began his theological studies in the Senior House, he was appointed a prefect to Knockbeg College, the Junior Seminary of the Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin. This office very much increased the prestige of the student who held it. As a student, James Butler was very popular with his fellows, largely on account of his pleasant and kindly disposition, but, without doubt, also on account of his quite outstanding athletic ability. He was popular, too, in the eyes of authority because of the earnest and diligent way in which he sought to prepare himself for the priesthood.

He was ordained on the 9th June, 1929, and, before the month was out, he found himself on the mission, in Glasgow, having been appointed to the parish of the Sacred Heart, Bridgeton. There he remained for fourteen years, discharging with a rare zeal those ordinary duties of a junior curate in a busy city parish. The Boys' Guild and, later, the Women's Sacred Heart Confraternity, were the objects of his special care. To the particularly difficult task of caring for adolescent boys, he brought to bear tremendous enthusiasm and remarkable singleness of purpose. And of course he was successful. In later years, many of his boys attributed their success in life to his sound priestly guidance, and it was noticeable that they were well represented at his obsequies.

In 1943 he was transferred to the parish of the Holy Family at Mossend and, warm-hearted as he was, he felt the wrench on leaving.

However, his feelings were quickly subjected to his sense of duty and soon the people of Mossend were beginning to know and love their new senior curate. In 1949, the Diocese of Motherwell having already been established, it was decided to open a new parish at Bellshill, and Father Butler was appointed its first parish priest. Once again he was given a peculiarly difficult task and one which was sure to make great demands on his stamina. A new church and presbytery had to be built and the country was still suffering from the effects of the war. As he himself was to say afterwards, it was "a story of permits, of shortages, of heart-breaks, of hopes and despair. But our Faith was in God Almighty," and all obstacles were surmounted. The difficulties served but as a challenge which his courageous and enthusiastic spirit could not ignore, and two years later, in 1951, he had the great joy of seeing his new church solemnly opened. It is a fine building; one of the first of the post-war churches and stands as a monument to his energy and zeal.

It was during these building years that the deterioration in his health first became apparent, but the climax did not come until 1954, when on returning from Lourdes, he suffered a complete breakdown. Some two months later, he had recovered, but not completely so, and from then onwards his activities had to be much curtailed. A second heart attack, in the summer of 1958, reduced him to the status of a semi-invalid and, despite every care and strict adherence to medical advice, a third attack in October proved fatal. It was God's will.

Over two hundred priests assisted at his Requiem and heard Monsignor Rogers pay eloquent tribute to the great work he had done. "It can be truly said of this priest that he quite literally killed himself with hard work."

Father Butler enjoyed a well developed personality and was withal a very happy person. Very much a man's man, he was rich in the priestly virtues and will long be remembered by both priests and people especially for his great kindness and sincerity. He died, perhaps not full of years, but full of good works and well loved, and the Church is the poorer by his passing. May he rest in peace.

**Right Rev. Mgr. William Canon Macmaster, Prot. Ap.
—13th October, 1958**

Mgr. Macmaster was born in Kinlochmoidart on 18th November, 1870, and died in Glasgow on 13th October, 1958. To assess the worth of this great priest, and to understand his character, it is necessary to realise that he belonged to a past generation. He was old enough to remember the excitement of the restoration of the Hierarchy in Scotland and the foundation of the diocese he was to serve so well. That was in the year that his parents moved to Murligan in Lochaber, and he was eight years of age. The Blairs to which he went at the age of eleven was the grim old institution which had educated generations of "commandos" for the spiritual battle for Scotland. There he learned to renounce all the freedom of home, for he saw his home again only once before his ordination,

and that was when he called for a short visit before going abroad. He went to Spain in 1887, where in 1894 he was ordained. The first eight years of his priesthood were spent as professor in Valladolid, so when he eventually began his missionary work in 1902, he had been twenty years in college as student and professor, and still most of the present generation of priests in the diocese had not been born! One of the students he had taught in Spain, and who was still there when he left, was to become his Bishop; and he is dead now these past twenty years. Mgr. Macmaster outlived his generation; indeed he served the Church as an active priest for a longer period than any other West Highland priest of whom we have a record.

But old age alone is not a virtue, and were he to be considered only from the point of view of age, he might well be remembered only as a feeble old man. In that feeble frame, however, there burned a fiery spirit, and he will be remembered not just because he lived long, but because throughout his long life he set an example of regularity in his devotions and zeal for the glory of the house of God.

His first appointment on the mission was to Castlebay, in Barra, but after a year or so his health broke down so completely that he was forced to seek relief from his work. Those were days of cruel poverty in the diocese, and great hardships in the priesthood. No provision could be made for a priest in bad health. He had to stay at his post and die young, or else to seek employment in some less strenuous diocese. Many great men were lost to the diocese about this time, and among those who died in early life, leaving great promise unfulfilled, names spring readily to mind: Fathers James Dawson, George Rigg, Donald Morrison and his brother Patrick, Hugh Campbell, John Mackintosh, Donald MacLellan, Allan Macdonald. And now it seemed as if the same fate was in store for Father Macmaster. With the help of friends and relatives he went to Teneriffe in the Canary Islands to seek a cure. It seemed hopeless, and a man from Oban who met him there was told that he intended to return to Scotland, that he might die at home. He returned in 1907, but not to die. In Laggan, where he was appointed, he found his health and, after eight years there, he was completely restored.

To Taynuilt he came in 1915, and there he began the campaign to collect money for the Aged and Infirm Priests' Fund. By advertisement, by preaching, and by every other means in his power, he made known the needs of the diocese in this respect, and he succeeded in gathering a goodly sum. During the rest of his active life the Fund, as well as the Clerical Friendly Society, continued to prosper. Many priests have since had good reason to be grateful to him.

In 1922, he succeeded to Fort William as Canon Macmaster, and immediately he set about the work which now remains as a monument to his zeal. He started with the problem of education. With the ultimate goal in mind, a Catholic Secondary School for Western Inverness-shire, he brought to Fort William the Sisters of Charity

of St. Vincent de Paul, to open a hostel for girls, and teach in the primary school. He built a new primary school beside the convent, and it was transferred to the Education Authority. Then he built the new church of St. Mary's nearby, and purchased the house for the priest and a piece of land on which he hoped to build a hall. Thus the essentials of the parish were gathered into a single unit. The church is one of the most beautiful in Scotland, the work of the late Mr. Reginald Fairlie, R.S.A. It is a model of good taste and usefulness, and after a quarter of a century, it still looks new. The debt was finally paid off, and the church was consecrated by Bishop Campbell in 1942. The Canon was made a Domestic Prelate that same year.

In 1944 he celebrated his golden jubilee, but his work was by no means done. The presentation which he received from his people at that time was set aside as a fund for another church in his parish. This was built at Corpach, and the new parish of St. Anne came into being in 1951. That year he was again honoured by the Holy See, with the dignity of Protonotary Apostolic. Mgr. Macmaster continued to work on the Education Committee for his final objective, a Catholic Secondary School, and he was finally gratified to know that the scheme was approved, although he did not live to see the work started.

In 1954 the parish and the diocese celebrated his diamond jubilee in the priesthood, and again the presentation which he received was given over for the adornment of the house of God. The money was spent on a set of beautiful wrought-iron gates at the entrance to St. Mary's church.

By now the years were rapidly taking toll of the mortal frame of Mgr. Macmaster. He suffered a serious collapse in 1953, and the end seemed to have come. But the indomitable spirit drove the body back to service. Day after day, the earliest risers would see his bent figure going towards the church for meditation before Mass. As long as he could move, he moved towards the altar, and when he could no longer say Mass with safety, he knew the end had come. No one had a chance to say goodbye, for he was taken to the Bon Secours Nursing Home in Glasgow. There, after a few weeks of preparation under the care of the good Sisters, and the attentive eye of his housekeeper, who had served him for more than forty years, he gave up his soul to God on the 13th October, 1958.

His parishioners mourned his passing, and regretted especially that they had no opportunity to offer their thanks once more for all he had done for them. But they know well how little he thought of speeches or words of thanks or worldly acclaim. They know that the best thanks they could offer, and the only thanks he would ask, are prayers for his soul and an effort to practise the lessons he preached.

After a Solemn Mass of Requiem in Fort William, offered by Bishop Grant, at which His Lordship paid tribute to the long years of service given by Mgr. Macmaster to the Church in the diocese,

the funeral took place to the cemetery of Killiechurriel in Lochaber, and there he rests in the soil hallowed by the bones of many great priests and people, his own people, in a district where the light of faith has burned brightly for centuries. May he rest in peace.

Rev. John Little—14th December, 1958

When Father John Little was called by Almighty God to Himself on the 14th December, 1958, his friends were not surprised. Father Little knew no rest in the service of God. A few years ago, his medical adviser warned him that, if he did not take things a little easier, his heart would not stand the pace for long. But every priest in the archdiocese knew that it was well nigh morally impossible for Father Little to take things easy. One might say that he was a most impatient patient and withal he was completely resigned to God's holy will. He suffered much during the last few years; no one, however, heard a word of complaint escape his lips. Whenever he was asked how he was keeping, the reply was always the same: "Oh, fine!"—and on he would go with his priestly work. Finally will-power could no longer force his body onwards and he had to return to the nursing home for rest. Even in that last illness, he was impatient to get back to his people in St. Flannan's and to his work for souls. Thinking he had recovered sufficiently to leave the nursing home, he went to his brother, Father Michael Little, at St. Barbara's, Muirhead, to complete that recovery. God had decreed otherwise and, after four days there, he was called to his eternal reward. One might aptly sum up Father Little's priestly life in the maxim: "Work while it is day: the night cometh when no man can work."

A large and representative gathering of the clergy assisted at his funeral obsequies in St. Flannan's, on Wednesday, 17th December. The Mass was offered by his nephew, Father John Connelly, S.D.B., while two other nephews, Father Thomas Connelly and Father Michael Connelly, were deacon and sub-deacon.

Addressing the congregation after the Mass, Archbishop Campbell said: "Father Little died comparatively young, for he was only in his middle fifties. For the past twenty-nine years, he had laboured zealously in the cause of God in various parts of the archdiocese. He worked for a time as a priest in Paisley, but the greater part of his life as a young priest was passed in St. Paul's, Shettleston. When the time came for him to accept the greater responsibility of a parish priest, it was my privilege to have sent him to St. Flannan's. He was then full of happiness and hope, and he expressed to me the thought that was always uppermost in his mind, to save his own soul and to be an instrument in the hands of God for the salvation of the souls of others. Father Little had been suffering for some time but he always was inclined to disregard his own physical illness. He never wanted to lie down to it. He was always active . . . Every time I visited Father Little in the nursing home, I always came back home highly edified by this good man's virile faith and hope and

trust in Divine Providence. He surely was a man of prayer, a man whom God had blessed with a strong sense of duty, a strong realisation of his sacred vocation.

"I mourn the passing of this good priest but, while that feeling of sorrow is natural, we know that God has called him to a better place, to an everlasting home. I take this opportunity of assuring his relatives that their sorrow is shared in by me, by the people of the archdiocese, the people of St. Flannan's and a countless host of other people, who got to know him and admire him."

Father Little studied for the priesthood at St. Mary's College, Blairs, and at St. Peter's College, Bearsden, and he was ordained by the late Archbishop Donald Mackintosh on the 29th June, 1929. He is buried in St. Peter's Cemetery, Dalbeth. May he rest in peace.

Rev. William Flanagan—23rd December, 1958

The death occurred in the early morning of Tuesday, 23rd December, 1958, at the Bon Secours Nursing Home, Langside, of the Rev. William Flanagan, who retired some six years ago from the pastorate of the Holy Family Parish in Mossend. Father Flanagan was born in Glasgow eighty years ago, on 12th September, 1878. He entered Blairs College to study for the priesthood in September, 1893, going abroad for his higher ecclesiastical studies, in 1897, he spent a year at Notre Dame des Champs, in Paris, and then returned to Scotland to complete his course of philosophy and theology at St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick. On 24th May, 1904, he received the priesthood at the hands of the Most Rev. John A. Maguire, Archbishop of Glasgow.

Soon after his ordination, Father Flanagan was appointed curate in the large and busy parish of St. Laurence, at Greenock, where the well-known Dr. Michael Fox was parish priest, and that early training in the ministry made a lasting impression on the young priest. This appointment ended in 1911 and there followed ten years as a curate in the city parish of St. Aloysius', Springburn. In 1921, Father Flanagan was given charge of the parish of St. David of Scotland, in the small mining community of Whiterigg, in North Lanarkshire. Between 1926 and 1937, he was back again in the City of Glasgow, as parish priest of St. Agnes' Parish, Lambhill, in succession to Father John McMenemy. During these years as priest-in-charge of St. Agnes' Parish, Father Flanagan was called upon to solve the difficulties attendant upon the separation of the Possilpark district from St. Agnes' and its establishment as the independent parish of St. Teresa of Lisieux in 1932. These were the years of the inter-war economic depression which bore heavily on St. Agnes' congregation and, among other means of alleviating the distress of the times, it is remembered how Father Flanagan, in 1934, set up an Advisory Bureau which did much useful work for the parishioners. In 1937 he again succeeded Father John McMenemy, this time as parish priest of the Holy Family Parish, in Mossend. At Mossend, he remained until 1952, when advancing years and infirmity forced him to retire from

active service. During these years, he carried out extensive alterations to the graceful church of the Holy Family, in Calder Road, Mossend, and he played an important part in the establishment of the two new parishes of St. Columba, Viewpark, in 1939, and of the Sacred Heart, Bellshill, in 1949. Since 1952, Father Flanagan lived in quiet retirement at Rutherglen until recent illness caused him to seek the care of the Bon Secours Nursing Sisters at their hospital in Glasgow, and there, in the early hours of Tuesday, 23rd December, 1958, the octogenarian priest passed peacefully away.

Father Flanagan was of a quiet scholarly disposition, and his delightful sense of humour endeared him to all with whom he came in contact.

The funeral Mass was celebrated in the Holy Family Church, Mossend, on Wednesday, 24th December, 1958, by the Right Rev. James Donald Scanlan, Bishop of Motherwell, in the presence of a crowded congregation, which included a large number of priests from the whole Province of Glasgow. The interment took place at St. Patrick's Cemetery, New Stevenston. May he rest in peace.

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APPENDIX I.

ECCLESIASTICAL LAWS AND OBSERVANCES.

1. EASTER DUTIES AND INDULGENCES.

THE Faithful of Scotland are authorised to satisfy the obligation of the Paschal Communion and to gain the Plenary Indulgence on any day from Ash Wednesday to Trinity Sunday. (S.C.C.: 11th Oct., 1946).

2. FAST AND ABSTINENCE DAYS.

The new Code of Canon Law makes many important changes in the general law of fasting and abstinence. The Indult, however, granted in perpetuity to Scotland by the Holy See on 27th January, 1911, still continues in force. The regulations of both Code and Indult as they apply to Scotland are here summarised.

A. LAWS OF FASTING.

1. The law of fasting is binding on all between their 21st and 59th birthdays, unless they are excused by reason of health or the nature of their employment.

In all cases of doubt a confessor should be consulted.

2. On Fast days only one full meal, which may be taken either at midday or in the evening, is allowed.

In addition two light collations are permitted, one consisting of two or three ounces of food, which may include a little butter, jam or marmalade, and the other of eight to ten ounces, at which butter, cheese, eggs, or fish may be taken. Milk is allowed at either of these collations.

On Fast days which are not also days of abstinence, flesh meat and soup made from meat may be taken only at the chief meal by those bound to fast. The old law, forbidding the use of fish and flesh at the same meal, is abolished.

3. The Fast days of the year are:—

(a) The Ember days.

(b) The Vigils or Eves of Pentecost, All Saints, the Immaculate Conception and Christmas, but when any of these Feasts falls on a Monday, though the Vigil is observed on the previous Saturday, it does not carry with it the obligation of fasting or abstinence.

On Christmas Eve the quantity of food permitted at the evening collation may be doubled.

(c) All the days of Lent, except Sundays, but on Holy Saturday the fast ends at midday.

4. Except in Lent, a Holiday of Obligation is never a Fast day.

B. LAWS OF ABSTINENCE.

1. The use of flesh meat or of soup made from meat is forbidden on Abstinence days to all who have completed their 7th year.

2. The use of eggs, butter, margarine, as well as of dripping, lard, suet or other condiments made from animal fat, is allowed on all days of the year without exception.

3. The days of Abstinence are:—

(a) The Fridays throughout the year.

(b) The Ember Wednesdays.

(c) The Vigils of All Saints, the Immaculate Conception and Christmas, except when any of these Vigils falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

(d) In Lent, Ash Wednesday, Ember Saturday, and (up to midday) Holy Saturday.

4. Except in Lent, a Holiday of Obligation is never a day of Abstinence.

(APPROVED BY THE HIERARCHY, 11th October, 1932.)

N.B.—For the time being the above legislation is modified by an Indult, issued by the Holy See on January 28th, 1949, which reduces the number of days on which the laws of fast and abstinence must be observed in the following manner: "until provision is made otherwise, abstinence should be observed every Friday, the law of abstinence together with fast on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, the Vigils of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ."

The Indult also adds a concession in the quality of food permitted: "graciously granting, nevertheless, that on days of abstinence together with fast it will everywhere be permissible to take eggs and milk products even in the morning and the evening."

3. NEW REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE EUCHARISTIC FAST.

In a *Motu Proprio*, published on the 19th March, 1957, the following regulations concerning the Eucharistic Fast were promulgated:

1. The period of the Eucharistic Fast is shortened to three hours from solid food and alcoholic drinks, and one hour from non-alcoholic liquids. This regulation is to be observed both by priests, before the celebration of Mass, and by the faithful, before receiving Holy Communion, whether it be in the morning or evening. Water does not break the fast.

2. The above period for the Eucharistic Fast is to be observed even by those who celebrate Mass or receive Holy Communion at midnight or the early hours of the morning.

3. The sick, even though not confined to bed, may take non-alcoholic liquids or genuine medicine, either liquids or solid, at any time before celebrating Mass or receiving Holy Communion.

4. MARRIAGES.

Marriage may be contracted on any day of the year. The Solemnising of Marriage, i.e., the Solemn Blessing of the Church which is given only during Mass, is forbidden from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, and from the first Sunday of Advent to Christmas Day, all dates being inclusive. Bishops, however, may for a just reason allow the Solemnising of Marriage any day during the forbidden periods, provided the laws of the Liturgy be observed. A widow, who has already received this Blessing, may not again be blessed at any subsequent marriage.

Marriage is constituted by the free consent of two parties taking one another for husband and wife. Anything interfering with the freedom of consent, in the way of serious error, grave fear and violence, may endanger the validity of the marriage bond.

The age required for valid marriage is sixteen years complete in the case of the man, fourteen years complete in that of the woman; those under twenty-one years of age should before marriage inform their parents and obtain their consent.

Marriage cannot be contracted without a Dispensation by persons within the third degree of kindred or the second degree of affinity; if attempted the marriage is invalid. Spiritual kindred contracted by Baptism, i.e., between a god-parent and a god-child, is also an invalidating impediment.

Marriage between a Catholic and an unbaptised person is invalid without a dispensation.

A "mixed" marriage (that is, a marriage between a Catholic and one who, though baptised, does not profess the Catholic Faith) is unlawful without a Dispensation; and the Dispensation cannot lawfully be given unless for a sufficiently grave reason, and subject to the following conditions as laid down by the Council of Fort Augustus (Decr., xvii. 5): (1) That all children that may be born of the marriage shall be baptised, and brought up, in the Catholic Faith. (2) That the Catholic party shall have full liberty for the practice of the Catholic religion. (3) That no religious marriage ceremony shall take place elsewhere than before the Catholic Priest. (4) That the Catholic party shall endeavour to effect the conversion of the non-Catholic party to the true faith of Christ. These promises will ordinarily be made in writing by the parties.

For parties preparing for marriage, the golden rule is: **Give very early notice to the parish priest**, who will furnish precise and helpful instructions as to both civil and ecclesiastical requirements. Banns have to be proclaimed on three consecutive Sundays or Holidays, and evidence of Baptism has to be furnished by both parties, even in the case of a mixed marriage. If it can be done without serious inconvenience, Catholics should be confirmed before marriage. As a general rule, the parish priest of the bride, in the case of a mixed marriage the parish priest of the Catholic party, will take charge of the marriage.

The Decree *Ne temere*, which became law in Scotland only on the 1st of September, 1908, made important regulations for the celebration of marriage, either between two Catholics, or between a Catholic and a non-Catholic. These regulations have been incorporated into, and somewhat modified by, the new Code of Canon Law, which came into force on the 19th May, 1918. The following points should be noted:—

I. Engagements, even when formally and solemnly contracted, afford no canonical ground for claiming a fulfilment of the promise.

II. Only those marriages are valid which are contracted before the parish priest or the Ordinary of the place, or a priest delegated by either of these, and at least two witnesses.

III. The parish priest and the Ordinary of the place validly assist at a marriage:

(a) only within the limits of their territory; within which they assist validly at marriages not only of their own subjects, but also of those not subject to them;

(b) provided that not compelled by violence or by grave fear they ask and receive the consent of the contracting parties.

IV. They assist licitly:

(a) when they have legitimately ascertained the free state of the contracting parties;

(b) when they have ascertained that one of the contracting parties has a domicile, or at least has lived for a month in the place where the marriage takes place.

V. When the parish priest or Ordinary or delegate as above (No. II.) cannot be got:

(a) in danger of death marriage may be validly and licitly contracted before two witnesses only;

(b) outside the case of danger of death, when these conditions are prudently considered as likely to last for a month, marriage may be contracted before two witnesses only.

(c) in either case, if any priest is at hand, he should be called in to assist; but his presence or absence does not affect the validity of the marriage.

VI. (a) The above laws are binding on all persons baptised in the Catholic Church, and on those who have been converted to it from heresy or schism.

(b) The same laws are binding on the same Catholics as above, if they contract marriage with non-Catholics, baptised or unbaptised, even after a Dispensation has been obtained.

(c) Non-Catholics, whether baptised or unbaptised, who contract among themselves, are nowhere bound to observe the Catholic form of marriage.

5. SICK CALLS.

All sick calls should be given in at the Priest's house at a timely hour in the morning. If this reasonable rule were adhered to, it would save the Clergy much unnecessary labour and the people many disappointments, which they may justly ascribe to their own want of system.

On Saturdays, eves of Holidays, and other days which are generally devoted to the Confessional, the priest should not, if possible, be called away from this important duty. Unless in cases of necessity, sick calls should not be made on Saturdays or Sundays, when the Clergy have so many other duties to attend to.

It is the duty of the people to conform to whatever regulations may be made by the Clergy, on these and other matters connected with Religion, in their respective congregations. All things should be done in order, according to the advice of St. Paul.

When the priest is called to attend a sick person, everything that he requires for the administration of the Sacraments should be furnished as becomingly as possible in the room where the sick person lies—viz., a table covered with a clean linen cloth, on which should be laid 2 candles, a vessel of holy water with a sprinkler, a small vessel of common water for the purification of the priest's fingers after the administration of the Holy Viaticum, and a napkin for the sick person at the time of Communion. As the priest generally brings the Blessed Sacrament on these occasions, everything should be so becomingly prepared, according to their means, as to show the great respect of the inmates for Jesus Christ, and the high value they set upon the honour thus rendered to their house in the visit of their Lord and Redeemer.

While the priest is administering the Viaticum and Extreme Unction, the assistants should devoutly offer up their prayers to God on behalf of the sick person, to implore that he may receive those Sacraments with the necessary dispositions.

APPENDIX II.

INDULGENCES AND DEVOTIONS

1. INDULGENCES.

EXPLANATION OF INDULGENCES.

An indulgence is a remission of the whole, or part, of the **temporal** punishment that often remains to be suffered for sins which, as to their guilt and **eternal** punishment, have been already remitted. For the effect and validity of an Indulgence it is not only necessary that there be a competent authority in him who grants it, and a just cause or motive for the grant, but it is also necessary, on the part of him who obtains it, that he renounce and be sincerely sorry for all his sins, that he be in the state of grace, and that he duly perform the conditions prescribed. Of Indulgences, some are called *plenary*, which, when fully obtained, remit the whole of the temporal punishment that remained due on account of past sins; others are for a certain number of years or days, which when fully obtained, remit as much of the temporal punishment as would have been discharged by the performance of so many years or days of Canonical Penance. Thus, by a *quarantine* Indulgence was meant the remission of so much of the future penalty (*poena*) of sin as is the equivalent of keeping a Lent according to the strict discipline of the Church. Quarantines are no longer mentioned in the official collection of indulgenced prayers (Vatican Press, 1938).

Indulgences attached to sacred objects, such as rosaries, etc., are available to any person using these objects, and the Indulgences cease only when the thing is destroyed or sold.

The conditions for most Plenary Indulgences include Confession, Communion, Visit to a Church and prayers for the Pope's intentions. For an Indulgence granted for any particular day, Confessions made eight days before will suffice; Communion may be made the day before, and both Confession and Communion any day within the Octave. For Triduums, Novenas and suchlike, Confession and Communion may be made any day within the Octave after the conclusion of the exercises. For daily communicants, or for those who confess regularly twice a month, no special confession is necessary. The visit may be made to any church or oratory and may be made from noon of the preceding day to midnight of the last day of the time appointed. Prayer for the Pope's intentions should be recited vocally and not merely mentally. Jubilee Indulgences, as well as some others, have their own special conditions.

PLENARY INDULGENCES GRANTED TO SCOTLAND.

1. From the Feast of St. Thomas, Apostle, 21st December, to the first Sunday after the Epiphany, inclusively.
2. From Ash-Wednesday to the second Sunday of Lent, inclusively.
3. During the time appointed in each Diocese for complying with Easter duties.

4. From Pentecost Sunday to Sunday after Corpus Christi.
5. From Sunday before the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul to the Octave Day.
6. From Sunday before the Feast of the Assumption to the Octave Day.
7. From Sunday before the Feast of All Saints to the Octave Day.
8. On the Feast of St. Andrew, and during the Octave.

CONDITIONS FOR GAINING THESE INDULGENCES.

1. That within the time prescribed the faithful approach the Sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist.

When Confession is required as a condition for gaining an indulgence, it may be made eight days before or eight days after. The Holy Communion prescribed may be made the day before or within the eight days after. One Confession and Communion will suffice for the gaining of several Plenary Indulgences on the same day. *Canon 931.*

2. That on the day of their Communion they offer up some prayers to God for the happy state of the whole Church of Christ, for its Supreme Pastor the Bishop of Rome, for peace and concord between all Christian Princes; for the exaltation and propagation of the Holy Catholic Faith, especially in our own country, and for the eternal salvation of all Christians.

3. That, if they have an opportunity, they visit within the limited time some church or oratory, and pray to God as has been mentioned before.

4. That, if their circumstances enable them, they perform some works of mercy.

To gain any number of times a Plenary Indulgence granted *toties quoties* the necessary and sufficient prayers to be said for the Pope's intention at each visit to a church are six Our Fathers, six Hail Marys, and six Glorias. (A.A.S., 1930, 363.)

PLENARY INDULGENCES GRANTED TO ALL THE FAITHFUL.

THE INDULGENCES OF THE STATIONS.

The nature and number of the indulgences attached to the Stations of the Cross by the Holy See in the course of the centuries had become uncertain in consequence of the loss of authentic documents. The Holy See therefore has abolished all indulgences hitherto conceded and grants to all the faithful who with contrite heart make the Stations of the Cross the following indulgences:—

1. A Plenary Indulgence as often as the Stations of the Cross are made.

2. Another Plenary Indulgence if they go to Holy Communion on the same day on which they make the Stations; or if, having made the Stations ten times they go to Holy Communion within a month.

3. A Partial Indulgence of ten years for each Station they have made, if after beginning the Stations they are unable, for some reasonable cause, to complete them.

The sick, who are unable to recite a suitable ejaculation, may still gain a Plenary Indulgence by merely kissing or looking upon the crucifix specially blessed.

The sick, those travelling, and any others legitimately impeded gain the Indulgence, if while holding in their hands the crucifix specially blessed, they say: Our Father, Hail Mary and Gloria twenty times, that is fourteen times for the fourteen Stations, five in memory of the Sacred Wounds, and once for the Pope's intention. If some reasonable cause prevents the completion of this exercise, these persons may gain a Partial Indulgence of ten years for each time they have recited an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Gloria.

PORTIUNCULA INDULGENCE.

From noon of the 1st till midnight of the 2nd of August all may gain a Plenary Indulgence as often as they visit a Franciscan Church or any Church enjoying the privilege of the Portiuncula, and say six Paters, six Aves, and six Glorias for the Pope's intention. The usual condition of Confession and Holy Communion is enjoined.

COMMEMORATION OF THE HOLY SOULS.

From noon of the 1st till midnight of the 2nd of November or on the following Sunday all may gain a Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, as often as they visit a Church or public or semi-public oratory and say the prayers for the Pope's intention.

VISITING A CATHOLIC CEMETERY.

During the Octave of the Commemoration of All Souls a Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, may be gained by the faithful who visit a Catholic Cemetery on the usual conditions (31st October, 1934).

THE CATECHISM INDULGENCE.

A Plenary Indulgence on any two days of each month may be gained by all who either teach or learn the catechism for the space of at least twenty minutes twice in the month. The usual conditions of Confession, Communion, visit to a church and prayer for the Pope's intention are prescribed. For every such period devoted to teaching or learning the catechism a partial indulgence of 100 days may be gained by the contrite of heart. (A.A.S., 1930, 343.)

ROSARY INDULGENCE.

A Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions of Confession and Communion, may be gained by anyone of the faithful who devoutly recites five decades of the Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament exposed for public veneration, or reserved in the tabernacle. (A.A.S., Sept., 1927.)

THE HOLY HOUR.

All who perform the pious exercise of the Holy Hour in any church, public oratory, or semi-public oratory to which they have

legitimate access may gain (1) a Plenary Indulgence, provided they confess their sins and receive Holy Communion and recite the usual prayers for the Pope's intentions; (2) a Partial Indulgence of ten years, if they are at least contrite of heart. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 171.)

THE FORTY HOURS DEVOTION.

Whether the form of exposition is strictly Clementine or modified by the Bishop's authority, a Plenary Indulgence, once on each day, may be gained by all who visit the Blessed Sacrament during Quarant Ore and recite a Pater, Ave and Gloria five times, and one Pater, Ave and Gloria for the Pope's intention. Confession and Communion are enjoined. Alternatively, a Partial Indulgence of fifteen years is granted to the contrite of heart each time they visit a church during the Forty Hours Devotion and recite the same prayers. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 381.)

PROCESSIONS OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained by all those who assist at Processions of the Blessed Sacrament, whether the processions are within or without a sacred building. Confession, Communion and prayer for the Pope's intention are enjoined. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 478.)

SPIRITUAL VISITS TO THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

Those who are legitimately prevented from making a visit in person may now gain a Partial Indulgence of five years by making a spiritual visit to the Blessed Sacrament and reciting the Pater, Ave and Gloria five times to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and once for the Pope's intention, provided they are contrite of heart.

A Plenary Indulgence may be gained once a week if, through the same impediment, the spiritual visit is made daily. (A.A.S., 1935, p. 169.)

VISITING THE ALTAR OF REPOSE.

The contrite of heart who visit the "Altar of Repose" on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday and recite the Pater, Ave and Gloria five times and once for the Pope's intention may gain a *toties quoties* indulgence of fifteen years. A Plenary Indulgence may be gained on each of these days if the further conditions of Confession and Communion are fulfilled. (A.A.S., 1935, p. 277.)

PARTIAL INDULGENCES: THE LITANY OF THE B. VIRGIN.

On 6th May, 1879, His Holiness granted the Apostolic Benediction, and an Indulgence of seven years on each Saturday, and on the Feasts of the Blessed Virgin, to the Faithful of England and Scotland who shall recite or sing the Litany of the Blessed Virgin in any church in either country. This Indulgence is now extended to all the faithful and may be gained each time the Litany is recited or sung (*Preces et Pia opera*, Vatican Press, 1938).

VISITING A CHURCH AND PRAYER FOR THE POPE'S INTENTION.

The phrase "visiting a church," means going to a church with the intention of honouring God, either in Himself or in His saints, and, if no set prayer is enjoined, offering mental or vocal prayer according to each one's piety and devotion. When no other prayers are specified, the condition "prayer for the Pope's intention" is satisfied by reciting one Pater, one Ave and one Gloria. (A.A.S., 1933, p. 478.)

2. THE PENTECOST NOVENA.

For the Pentecost Novena, prescribed by Encyclical Letters of 5th May, 1895, and 9th May, 1897, the following Indulgences have been granted to those taking part in it:—(1) Ten years for each day; (2) a Plenary Indulgence on any one day of Novena, or on Pentecost, or on any day of the subsequent Octave, on the usual conditions of Confession and Communion and prayers for the Pope's intention, attendance on at least five days being necessary. (These Indulgences are attainable by those also who are legitimately impeded from attending the Public Devotions, provided the Novena be done in private and the other conditions fulfilled; the Partial Indulgence in this case is seven years.) Moreover, those who again, during the Octave of Pentecost, inclusive of Trinity Sunday, privately recite every day, according to their devotion, some prayers to the Holy Ghost, may gain a Partial Indulgence of seven years for each day. All these Indulgences are applicable to the souls in Purgatory.

3. THE OCTAVE OF CORPUS CHRISTI.

For the continuance and daily increase of the abundant fruit produced by the Decree of 20th December, 1905, on Daily Communion, Our Holy Father, Pope Pius X., by a letter of the Sacred Congregation of Indulgences of the 10th April, 1907, to the Bishops of the Catholic Church, has expressed his wish to have, as far as may be possible, the following annual observances:—

(a) IN CATHEDRAL CHURCHES.

That on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, either immediately after the Festival of Corpus Christi, or (if the circumstances of persons or places so require) at some other time of the year to be fixed by the Bishop, there shall be in every Cathedral Church three days' prayer, as here described: namely:—

1. That, on each day, there shall be a sermon on the great excellence of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and on the dispositions required for worthily receiving it. That, after the sermon, the Blessed Sacrament shall be exposed; and during the Exposition the prayer *O most Sweet Jesus* (see below) shall be recited, to be followed on the Sunday by the *Te Deum*. That the *Tantum ergo* shall then be sung, and the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament be given.

II. That, on the Sunday, the last of the three days, there shall be, at the usual parochial Mass, a homily by the Parish Priest on

the gospel of the Sunday within the Octave of Corpus Christi—or, if the Sunday be not within the Octave, a sermon in preparation for a fervent Communion; and at this parochial Mass the faithful shall communicate. That, on this Sunday afternoon (or evening), there shall be the same service as on the two preceding days. And in the sermon the preacher shall exhort the faithful to more fervent piety towards the Most Holy Sacrament, and especially to a more frequent participation of this heavenly banquet, in accordance with the approved teaching of the *Catechismus Romanus* (see n. vi. of the Decree of 20th December, 1905). Moreover, at Benediction (as is said above), the *Tantum ergo* will be preceded by the *Te Deum*.

(b) IN PARISH CHURCHES.

His Holiness earnestly recommends that also in Parish Churches, according as each Bishop in his prudence and discernment shall judge fit, there shall be at least those pious exercises which are above described for the Cathedral Churches for the Sunday within the Octave, or some other Sunday in the year.

That the faithful may more eagerly take part in the aforesaid pious exercises, His Holiness has been pleased to grant the following Indulgences, applicable also to the souls in Purgatory:—

1. An Indulgence of ten years for each of the three days' prayer.
2. A Plenary Indulgence to be gained once during the three days, on any day thereof, by those who devoutly assist at the devotions of any one day, and after Confession and Holy Communion pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
3. A Plenary Indulgence to be gained on the Sunday by all who, after Confession, receive Holy Communion together in a Cathedral or a Parish Church, and pray for the Holy Father's intentions.

PRAYER BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

O most sweet Jesus, Who didst come into this world to enrich the souls of all mankind with the life of Thy grace, and Who, to preserve and sustain this life in them, dost daily give Thyself in the most august Sacrament of the Eucharist, as a saving medicine to heal their infirmities and a divine food to support their weakness, we pray and beseech Thee to pour forth upon them most graciously Thy holy spirit, so that, being filled therewith, any who are in mortal sin may, by returning to Thee, be restored to the life of grace which they have lost; and that those who, by Thy great mercy, already serve Thee may daily, as far as each one is able, come devoutly to Thy heavenly banquet, and in the strength thereof may find a remedy for their daily venial faults and a support of the life of Thy grace, and, thus becoming more and more cleansed from sin, may obtain the everlasting happiness of heaven. Amen.

4. THE FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART.

By the Encyclical Letter *Miserentissimus Redemptor* of Pius XI dated 8th May, 1928, it is decreed that the Act of Reparation thereto appended shall be solemnly recited in all churches through-

out the world on the Feast of the Sacred Heart. The Act, together with the Litany of the Sacred Heart, is to be recited during Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

ACT OF REPARATION.

O sweet Jesus, Whose overflowing charity for men is requitted by so much forgetfulness, negligence and contempt, behold us prostrate before Thy altar eager to repair by a special act of homage the cruel indifference and injuries, to which Thy loving Heart is everywhere subject.

Mindful alas! that we ourselves have had a share in such great indignities, which we now deplore from the depths of our hearts, we humbly ask Thy pardon and declare our readiness to atone by voluntary expiation not only for our own personal offences, but also for the sins of those, who straying far from the path of salvation, refuse in their obstinate infidelity to follow Thee, their Shepherd and Leader, or, renouncing the vows of their baptism, have cast off the sweet yoke of Thy law.

We are now resolved to expiate each and every deplorable outrage committed against Thee; we are determined to make amends for the manifold offences against Christian modesty in unbecoming dress and behaviour, for all the foul seductions laid to ensnare the feet of the innocent, for the frequent violation of Sundays and holidays, and the shocking blasphemies uttered against Thee and Thy Saints. We wish also to make amends for the insults to which Thy Vicar on earth and Thy priests are subjected, for the profanation, by conscious neglect or terrible acts of sacrilege, of the very Sacrament of Thy divine love; and lastly, for the public crimes of nations who resist the rights and the teaching authority of the Church which Thou hast founded.

Would, O divine Jesus, we were able to wash away such abominations with our blood. We now offer, in reparation for these violations of Thy divine honour, the satisfaction Thou didst once make to Thy eternal Father on the Cross and which Thou dost continue to renew daily on our altars; we offer it in union with the acts of atonement of Thy Virgin Mother and all the Saints and of the pious faithful on earth; and we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of Thy grace, for all neglect of Thy great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past.

Henceforth we will live a life of unwavering faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the gospel and especially that of charity. We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending Thee and to bring as many as possible to follow Thee.

O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; and by the crowning gift of perseverance keep us faithful unto death in our duty and

the allegiance we owe to Thee, so that we may all one day come to that happy home, where Thou with the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. Amen.

The Indulgences granted are: (1) To the faithful present in any Church or Oratory at the recital of the above Act and the Litany of the Sacred Heart during Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament an Indulgence of seven years and further a Plenary Indulgence if, after Confession, they receive Holy Communion, and (2) to those who any where or at any time, even in private, recite the above Act, an Indulgence of five years, and further a Plenary Indulgence once in the month if they repeat the Act daily during the month, visit a Church or Oratory, go to Confession and receive Holy Communion. (18th March, 1932).

5. THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING.

Whereas, by the Decree of the S. Congregation of Indulgences, 22nd August, 1906, His Holiness Pope Pius X ordered that each year on the Feast of the Sacred Heart, in all Parish Churches as well as others where the feast is observed, the form of Consecration used by Pope Leo XIII. on the 25th May, 1899, should be recited during the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by the Litany of the Sacred Heart, it is now enacted (S.R.C., 28th April, 1926) that (1) the observance is optional on the Feast of the Sacred Heart, but obligatory on the Feast of Christ the King, and (2) the Form to be used is the one given below. To all who with devout and contrite heart assist at this pious exercise and pray for the Pope's intentions, His Holiness grants an Indulgence of seven years, and further a Plenary Indulgence to those who, after Confession, receive Holy Communion. These Indulgences are applicable to the souls in Purgatory. Those who recite the following prayer even in private may gain (1) an Indulgence of five years; (2) a Plenary Indulgence if they repeat the prayer daily during the month, visit a Church or Oratory, go to Confession and receive Holy Communion.

FORM OF CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS.

Most sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us humbly prostrate before Thy altar. We are Thine, and Thine we wish to be; but, to be more surely united with Thee, behold each one of us freely consecrates himself to-day to Thy most Sacred Heart. Many indeed have never known Thee; many too, despising Thy precepts, have rejected Thee. Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart. Be Thou King, O Lord, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken Thee, but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned Thee: grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house lest they die of wretchedness and hunger. Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof,

and call them back to the harbour of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one Shepherd. Be Thou King of all those who are still involved in the darkness of idolatry or of Islamism, and refuse not to draw them all into the light and kingdom of God. Turn Thine eyes of mercy towards the children of that race, once Thy chosen people. Of old they called down upon themselves the Blood of the Saviour; may It now descend upon them a laver of redemption and of life. Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the divine Heart that wrought our salvation; to It be glory and honour for ever. Amen.

6. THE MONTH OF OCTOBER.

For the **October Devotions**, prescribed by Decrees of 20th August, 1885, etc., the following Indulgences have been granted:—(1) Seven years each time one joins in the public recital of the Rosary and Litany of the B. Virgin (or, being legitimately impeded, says them privately), and prays according to the intentions of the Pope; (2) a Plenary Indulgence to those who, having done this at least ten times, Confess and Communicate; (3) a Plenary Indulgence to all who, on the Feast of the Rosary or within the Octave, Confess, Communicate and pray in some church to God and the B. Virgin according to the intention of His Holiness; (4) seven years each time (during October) for the recital, after the Rosary, of the following prayer to St. Joseph enjoined by the Encyclical of 15th August, 1889; if the prayer is recited outside October a Partial Indulgence of three years is granted each time and a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions when the prayer is said daily for a month.

PRAYER TO ST. JOSEPH.

To thee, O blessed Joseph, we fly in our tribulation, and while imploring the help of thy most holy spouse, thy protection also with confidence we crave. By that affection which united thee with the Immaculate Virgin, Mother of God, and by the fatherly love with which thou didst embrace the Child Jesus, we humbly supplicate thee to look down benignantly on the heritage which Christ Jesus purchased with His Blood, and in thy might and power to succour us in our necessities.

Defend, O most provident Guardian of the Divine Family, the chosen race of Jesus Christ; keep us, most loving father, from all taint of error and corruption; do thou from heaven, as our

most powerful Protector, stand graciously by us in this conflict with the powers of darkness; and as of old thou didst rescue the Child Jesus in the imminent peril of His life, so now defend the Holy Church of God from hostile wiles and all adversity, and through thy never-failing patronage so shield each one of us, that, guided by thy example and supported by thy aid, we may live in holiness, piously die and attain eternal happiness in heaven. Amen.

7. CONSECRATION OF FAMILIES TO THE SACRED HEART BY MEANS OF THE ENTHRONEMENT.

It is the earnest desire of the Holy See that all Christian families should be consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and that a statue or image of Him be set up in a prominent place in each house, so that Christ may be enthroned as ruler in the home. All families should be consecrated separately, not in groups. The priest blesses the image, and recites the Act of Consecration. When a priest cannot be had, the image, which should be previously blessed, will be set in its place by the head of the family or other lay person, who also will recite the Act of Consecration. The Indulgences granted to each member of the family are: (1) Seven years and on the day of consecration; (2) a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions on the day of consecration; (3) three years on the annual renewal of the consecration; (4) a Plenary Indulgence on the usual conditions on the annual renewal. The form of consecration, which alone is valid for the effect of the Indulgences (S.P.A.: 1st March, 1918: A.A.S., x, p. 154) is the following:

ACT OF CONSECRATION.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, who didst manifest to Blessed Margaret Mary the desire of reigning in Christian families, we to-day wish to proclaim Thy most complete regal dominion over our own. We would live in future with Thy life, we would cause to flourish in our midst those virtues to which Thou hast promised peace here below, we would banish far from us the spirit of the world which Thou hast cursed; and Thou shall reign over our minds in the simplicity of our faith, and over our hearts by the whole-hearted love with which they shall burn for Thee, the flame of which we shall keep alive by the frequent reception of Thy Divine Eucharist.

Deign, O Divine Heart, to preside over our assemblings, to bless our enterprises, both spiritual and temporal, to dispel our cares, to sanctify our joys, to alleviate our sufferings. If ever one or other of us should have the misfortune to afflict Thee, remind him, Heart of Jesus, that Thou art good and merciful to the penitent sinner. And when the hour of separation strikes, when death shall come to cast mourning into our midst, we will all, both those who

go and those who stay, be submissive to Thy eternal decrees. We will console ourselves with the thought that a day will come when the entire family, reunited in Heaven, can sing for ever Thy glories and Thy mercies.

May the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and the glorious Patriarch St. Joseph, present this consecration to Thee, and keep it in our minds all the days of our life

All glory to the Heart of Jesus our King and our Father.

8. PRAYERS AFTER LOW MASS.

Pope Pius XI. has ordered that these prayers be said for Russia. A Partial Indulgence of **ten years** is attached to their recitation in addition to the Indulgence of **seven years** granted for the triple invocation of the Sacred Heart. (A.A.S., 1934, p. 312).

To be said kneeling. Hail Mary, three times.

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy; Hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To Thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to Thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, Thine eyes of mercy towards us; and after this our exile, show unto us the Blessed Fruit of Thy womb, Jesus; O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

V. Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

LET US PRAY.

O God, our refuge and our strength, look with favour on Thy people who cry to Thee; and through the intercession of the Glorious and Immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and St. Joseph her Spouse, of Thy Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and of all the Saints, mercifully and graciously hear the prayers which we pour forth for the conversion of sinners, and for the freedom and exaltation of our Holy Mother the Church. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

St. Michael the Archangel defend us in the day of battle; be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil;—"the Lord command him," we humbly pray;—and do thou O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and the other wicked spirits who go about the world for the destruction of souls. Amen.

To the above prayers may be added the following invocation said three times:—

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us.

(Indulgence of seven years).

9. THE ANGELUS.

In Catholic countries, and in many places at home, the Angelus Bell is rung in the morning, at noon, and in the evening at sunset to honour the Mystery of the Incarnation. To gain the indulgences attached to this Devotion, the Angelus must be said kneeling, except on Saturday evening, and Sunday, when it is said standing. In Paschal Time, that is, from Holy Saturday at noon till the Saturday before Trinity Sunday at noon, inclusively, the *Regina Cœli* is said instead of the Angelus. This prayer is always said standing. Those who do not know the *Regina Cœli* may gain the indulgences by saying the Angelus; but it must be said standing during Paschal Time. For the convenience of the Faithful is appended a translation of the *Regina Cœli* taken from the *Raccolta*.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia.

For He whom thou wast made worthy to bear.

Alleluia.

Hath risen as He said. Alleluia.

Pray for us to God. Alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia.

R. For the Lord hath risen indeed. Alleluia.

Let us pray.

O God, Who through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, has vouchsafed to give joy to the whole world, grant us, we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of eternal life. Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

10. PONTIFICAL WORK FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH.

The Work assists by prayers and alms the Catholic Missionaries in heathen and non-Catholic countries.

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP. — (1) The daily recitation of Our Father and one Hail Mary, with the invocation: St. Francis Xavier, pray for us, and (2) the annual contribution of not less than 2s. 2d. yearly, or one halfpenny weekly; (3) Special members contribute one guinea, or more, yearly; (4) Life membership subscription, £8.

ORGANISATION.—The usual method of collection is by the formation of Groups or Circles of Ten Members, of whom one acts as Collector. The Collector receives the contributions of his group, circulates among them the *Annals* of the Work, and pays over his collection to the local Treasurer. A return of the sums received, and of their appropriation is inserted annually in the "Annals of the Propagation of the Faith." One copy of each issue of the *Annals* is supplied to every ten members.

SPIRITUAL FAVOURS.—An exceptionally large number of spiritual privileges, including Plenary and Partial Indulgences, is granted to Members. Extensive Faculties are also given to priests who direct local centres or become special members. A complete list of these privileges may be obtained from the Secretary of the Scottish Council, St. Andrew's Cathedral, Dundee, or from any of the Diocesan Officials (vid. Part v.).

11. CATHOLIC TRUTH SOCIETY.

The following Indulgences were granted to the Catholic Truth Society in perpetuity by a Decree of the S. Cong. de Prop. Fide, 6th October, 1896:—

(1) A Plenary Indulgence (applicable to the Souls in Purgatory) to all present and future members of the Society on the day of their joining the Society, and also on the Feasts of St. Andrew, the Apostle; St. Margaret, Queen of Scotland; St. Patrick, St. Columba and St. Ninian, or on any day within the Octave of these Feasts, on condition that they visit an Oratory of the Society, or their own Parish Church, and, after confessing their sins with sincere repentance and receiving Holy Communion, pray for the Propagation of the Holy Faith and for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff.

(2) A Partial Indulgence of one hundred days every time they succeed in persuading a new member to join the Society, and every time they attend a General or Local Meeting of the Society.

By decree of the Sacred Penitentiary, 7th November, 1935, the following Indulgences were also granted to the members of the Box-Tenders' Association:—

(1) A Plenary Indulgence can be gained by members on the usual conditions: (a) on any day they choose after joining the Association; (b) on the Feast of St. Francis de Sales; (c) once a month on condition that they have faithfully and regularly carried out their duty of looking after the book-case.

(2) A Plenary Indulgence can be gained at the hour of death by members who, after Confession and Holy Communion, or at least after an act of contrition, piously utter the Holy Name of Jesus with their lips, if they can do so, or at least in their hearts, and patiently accept death from the hands of God as a penalty for sin.

(3) A Partial Indulgence of three hundred days may be gained by members each and every time they arrange the pamphlets in good order and afterwards make an act of contrition, at least with a contrite heart, before the Blessed Sacrament.

12. SHORT FORM OF PROFESSION OF FAITH

To be used by permission in the Reception of Converts

I, holding in my hand God's holy gospels and enlightened by divine grace, publicly declare that I accept the Faith which is taught by the Catholic, Apostolic and Roman Church. I believe that Church to be the one true Church which Jesus Christ set up here on earth ; to which I make my submission with all my heart.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son our Lord ; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried ; He descended into hell ; the third day He rose again from the dead : He ascended into heaven, sitteth at the right hand of God the Father almighty ; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost ; the Holy Catholic Church ; the communion of saints ; the forgiveness of sins ; the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

I believe that seven sacraments were instituted by Jesus Christ for the salvation of mankind : Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, Penance, Extreme Unction, Holy Order and Matrimony.

I believe that the Bishop of Rome is the Vicar of Jesus Christ on earth, that he is the supreme visible Head of the whole Church, and that he teaches infallibly what we must believe and do for salvation.

I also believe everything which the Holy Catholic, Apostolic and Roman Church defines and declares that we must believe. To her I give my whole allegiance and I reject every error and schism which she condemns.

So help me God, and these His holy gospels which I touch with my hand.



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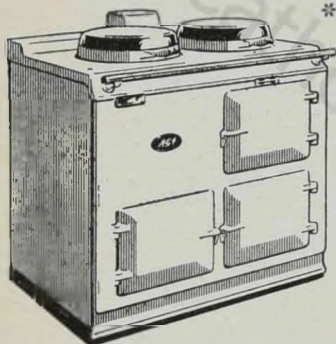


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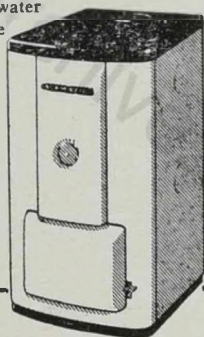


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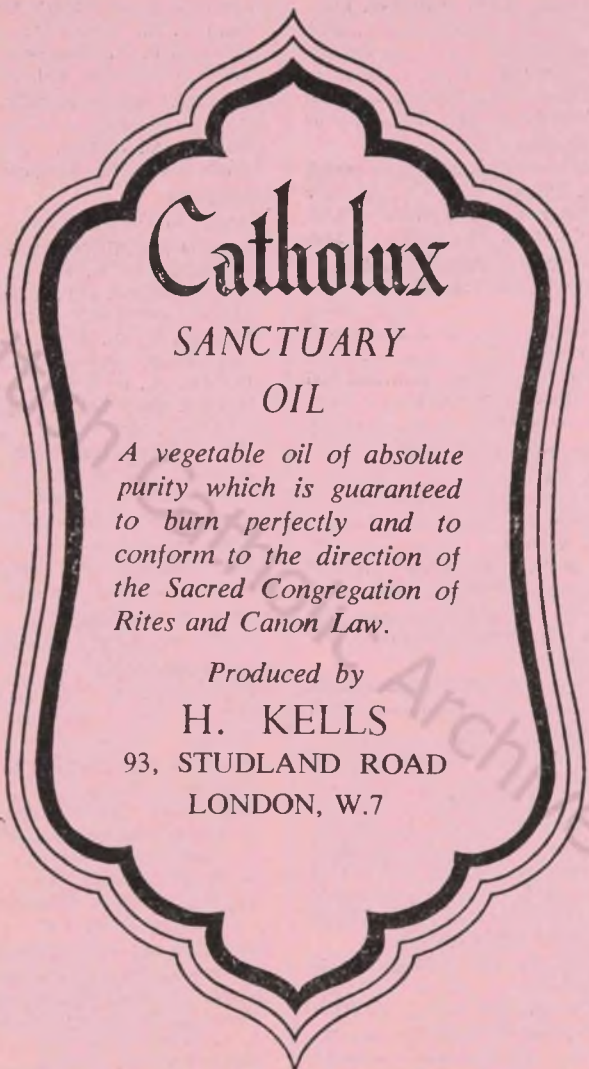
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
