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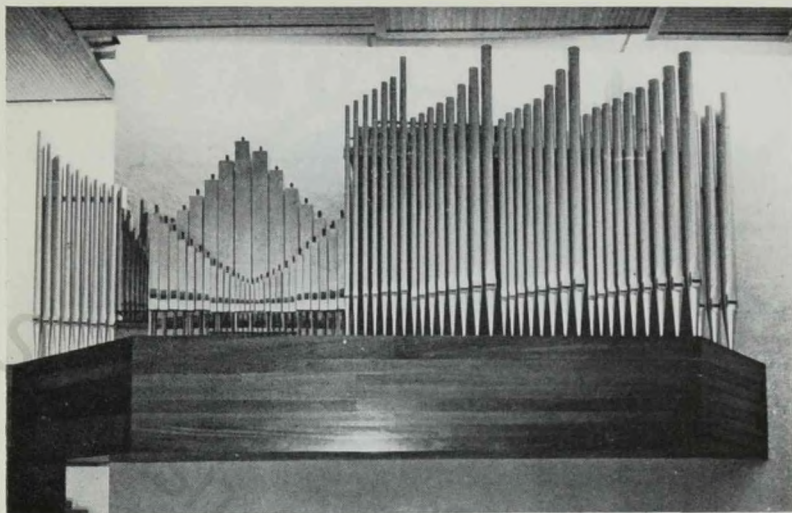
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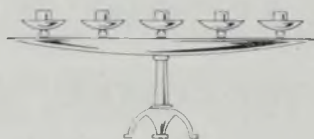

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SECTION II.

THE HIERARCHY OF SCOTLAND

From the Extinction of the Hierarchy in 1603 till its Restoration in 1878.

1. The ancient Hierarchy ended with James Betoun, Abp. of Glasgow, who died at Paris on the 25th April, 1603, aged 79. After being subjected to the jurisdiction of the Archpriests and first Vicar-Apostolic of England till 1623, and afterwards to local Prefects of the Mission, the Clergy were incorporated into a missionary body by decree of Propaganda, 1653, and governed by the following Prefects-Apostolic: **William Ballantyne** (or **Bellenden**), 1653-61; **Alexander Dunbar** (or **Winster**), 1662-68, 1672-94; and **John Walker** (or **Ross**), 1668-71. In May, 1694, a Scottish Vicariate-Apostolic was established. This was divided into two Districts, the Lowland and the Highland, in February, 1731; and these two into three, the Eastern, Western and Northern, by Papal Rescript of 13th February, 1827. This last arrangement remained in force till the re-establishment of the Hierarchy by the Apostolic Letter, **Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice**, 4th March, 1878.

The Apostolic Letter "Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice" of Leo XIII, 4th March, 1878, divided Scotland into the Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (with four Suffragan Sees) and the Archdiocese of Glasgow, which was directly subject to the Holy See. By the Apostolic Constitution "Maxime Interest" of Pius XII, 25th May, 1947, and the Apostolic Constitution "Dominici Gregis" of the same date, the Archdiocese of Glasgow was erected into a Province and divided into the Metropolitan See of Glasgow with the Suffragan Sees of Motherwell and Paisley.

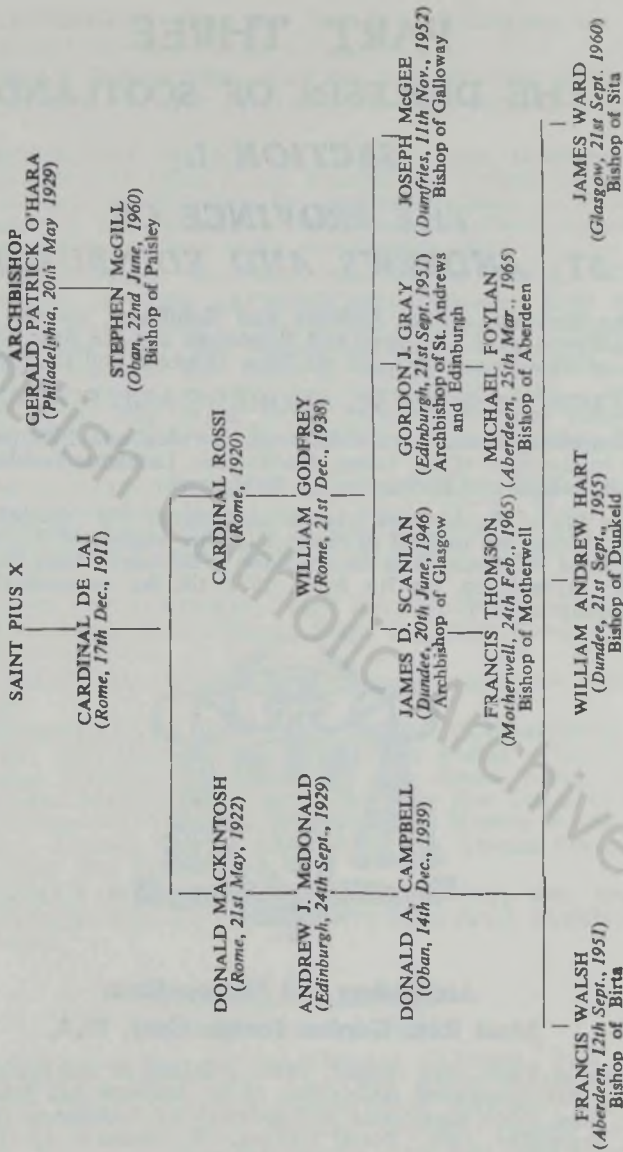

Comprising Counties of Argyll and Inverness (south of a line drawn from the northern extremity of Loch Luing to the junction of the Counties of Inverness, Aberdeen and Banff); the Islands of Bute and Arran and the Hebrides.

The See of Argyll was founded about 1200, being disjoined from the Diocese of Dunkeld; and was vacant for more than three centuries. James Hamilton was appointed to the See on 14th July, 1553, but was probably never consecrated.

The See of the Isles (Insularum or Sodorensis) is said to have been founded about 447 by St. Patrick, who consecrated Germanus, its first Bishop; it was united to Man till the end of the 14th century; and was vacant for 325 years, from the death of Roderick Maclean in 1553 till the Restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878.

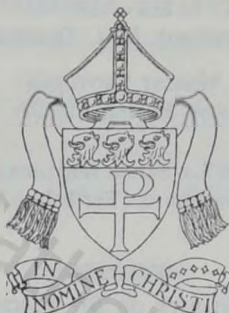

CARDINALS.—*His Eminence Cardinal* [name]; if a Bishop or Archbishop: *His Eminence Cardinal Archbishop* (or *Bishop*) of . . .; or *His Eminence Cardinal* [name], *Archbishop* of . . .; *My Lord Cardinal*; *Your Eminence*.

ARCHBISHOPS.—*His Grace the Archbishop* of . . .; or *The Most Rev.* [name], *Archbishop* of . . .; *My Lord Archbishop*; *Your Grace*.

BISHOPS.—*His Lordship the Bishop* of . . .; or *The Right Rev.* [name], *Bishop* of . . .; *My Lord Bishop*; *Your Lordship*. (In Ireland, Bishops are usually addressed as *Most Rev.*)

VICARS-GENERAL.—These hold the rank of Protonotaries Apostolic, and are addressed: *The Right Rev. Mgr.* [name], *V.G.*; if also Provost or Canon: *The Right Rev. Mgr. Provost* or *Canon* [name], *V.G.*

PROVOSTS, CANONS.—*The Very Rev. Provost* or *Canon* [name]; or *The Very Rev. A. Canon B.*

DOMESTIC PRELATES, Privy Chamberlains and Honorary Chamberlains of His Holiness the Pope, have the title of *Monsignore*. Prelates are addressed as *Right Rev. Mgr.*, Chamberlains as *Very Rev. Mgr.*

Monsignore, when followed by surname, is usually written and pronounced *Monsignor*.

MITRED ABBOTS.—*The Right Rev. Abbot* [name]; *Right Rev. Father*.

PROVINCIALS of Religious Congregations.—*The Very Rev. Father* [name]; or *The Very Rev. Father Provincial* (with initials of the Religious Order.)

RECTORS OF COLLEGES and Heads of Religious Houses are usually addressed as *Very Rev.*

DEAN.—The use of this as a title is apt to be misleading and should be avoided.

OBITUARIES — 1968

Rev. Denis McGrath — 4th January, 1968

Denis Michael McGrath was born in Dungarvan, Co. Waterford, Ireland, on the 28th September, 1903. He came from a family that served the Church well. He had an uncle who held high office in the Dominican Order, another uncle who was a parish priest in the Diocese of Waterford and a brother who is, at present, a parish priest in that same diocese. The announcement of his death brings back memories of an energetic and gifted priest. Possessed of a keen mind, he had more than average intelligence and, even as a student, was widely read. As a young priest he became interested in social questions and was an active member of the Catholic Social Guild.

Father McGrath was educated in Mount Melleray and St. John's College, Waterford. Having completed his theological studies in St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick, he was ordained in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, on the 24th April, 1927, by the late Archbishop Donald Mackintosh.

The parishes he served in were: St. Patrick's, Dumbarton; St. Michael's, Parkhead; St. Anne's, Cadzow; St. Aloysius', Springburn, and latterly St. Fergus', Paisley. Never very robust in health, he went on sick leave at the beginning of the war and lived with his family in Ireland until 1948. When the Diocese of Paisley was established, he returned and was appointed assistant priest in the new parish of St. Fergus. After four years, failing health forced him to retire, this time permanently. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Anthony Flynn — 12th February, 1968

The death, on 12th February, 1968, in Bangour Hospital, of Father Anthony Flynn, awakened a deep feeling of grief and loss in the hearts of many people in the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh and particularly in the parish of Camelon which he had served so long and so faithfully.

Father Anthony Flynn was born 62 years ago in Winchburgh, West Lothian, and entered St. Mary's College, Blairs, in 1918, to begin his studies for the priesthood. His preparatory studies completed, in due course, he was sent to France to continue with his higher studies at Coutances, in Normandy. He was ordained in 1930 and his first appointment in his native archdiocese was as curate in St. Patrick's, Edinburgh, under the genial guidance of Canon Patrick Birnie. Some four years later, in 1933, he was given charge of the Sacred Heart parish in Penicuik, where the older parishioners still

remember him with affection. In 1936, he was appointed to St. Mary of the Angels, Camelon. Here he was to spend 31 years as parish priest—exactly half of his life's span. These were happy years and good years for Father Flynn and for his parishioners at Camelon. He was earnest and zealous in all that pertained to the church: his duty to God and the welfare of his people were ever his prime considerations. To his people and to his fellow priests he was genial and friendly; the innate charity of his nature made him speak well even of the wayward. The greatest joy of his years as parish priest at Camelon came in 1960 when, after delay and frustration, he saw the completion of the fine new church of St. Mary of the Angels, for which his people had been longing for so many years. Father Flynn himself was not destined to enjoy the amenity of the new church for long. A crippling disease was already undermining his stamina and gradually he was becoming less able to cope with the duties that fall to a parish priest. With regret, he retired from his parish in the late summer of 1967 and, a short six months later, on 12th February, 1968, he passed to his eternal reward. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. John F. Provost O'Donnell — 3rd March, 1968

In the early hours of Sunday morning, 3rd March, 1968, at St. Margaret's Hospice, Clydebank, the death took place of the Very Rev. John F. O'Donnell, parish priest of St. Margaret's, Johnstone, and Provost of the Paisley Cathedral Chapter. For some years he had been in poor health and, about a fortnight before his death, he had been moved to St. Margaret's Hospice to be nursed by the Irish Sisters of Charity.

Provost O'Donnell was the oldest priest of the Diocese of Paisley. Born in Dundee seventy-seven years ago, on 17th September, 1891, he spent his boyhood in Glasgow and went to Blairs College as a student for the Archdiocese of Glasgow. In due course he was transferred to the seminary of St. Sulpice in Paris: he began his course there in 1913, but the outbreak of war in 1914 made it necessary for him to continue his studies for a time at St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick. By 1915 he was back in Paris, where he remained until 1918, returning to Scotland to be ordained on the 24th June, 1918, in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, by Archbishop Maguire.

After ordination, he was appointed curate in the busy city parish of St. John's, Portugal Street. Father O'Donnell was to spend fifteen arduous but rewarding years in this densely populated and bustling parish where his main endeavours were probably those directed, through the Catholic Young Men's Society, to helping the younger generation of parishioners to confront and overcome the bitter problems of the depression, though his work as chaplain to the Women's Sacred Heart Confraternity will be remembered by many as his greatest achievement in that parish.

In 1933 Father O'Donnell was transferred to St. Patrick's, Shotts, but this appointment lasted only a few months and, in the following year, he moved to St. Mary's, Whifflet, and remained there until 1937,

in which year he was appointed as parish priest of St. Brigid's, Newmains. Three years later, in 1940, he became parish priest of the Clyde coast parish of St. Joseph's, Helensburgh, a pleasant place in itself but sandwiched between two harassing problems: on the one hand there was a vast landward area where Catholics were scattered and few, and on the other hand, from the river, came the incessant demands of naval personnel, since the Clyde was, at that time, the all-important and extremely busy base for Allied naval operations in the Atlantic during the Second World War.

On the death of Canon Aloysius Reifenrath in the autumn of 1945, Father O'Donnell was appointed to St. Margaret's, Johnstone: here tasks of a different order awaited him. Like many similar buildings in the West of Scotland, whose maintenance had suffered enforced neglect during the years of depression and war, the nineteenth-century fabric of St. Margaret's Church was found to be extensively affected by dry rot. Father O'Donnell embarked on a wholesale restoration programme and gave a new life to the old church. He also undertook the building of a completely new and more spacious chapel-house to accommodate the increased staff of priests.

Recognition of his life-long and devoted work for the Church came in these last years. When the Cathedral Chapter of Paisley Diocese was established in 1952, he became one of its original members and, when the office became vacant in 1957 through the death of Monsignor F. R. Pirrie, he became Provost of the Cathedral Chapter. But the years of unremitting labour had taken their toll of his strength and, for many months before his death, his health had given cause for grave anxiety.

Present at the Solemn Requiem Mass in St. Margaret's, Johnstone, were Archbishop Scanlan of Glasgow, Bishop Hart of Dunkeld, representatives of Johnstone Town Council and friends of Provost O'Donnell from all over the West of Scotland. The Mass was celebrated by Monsignor Francis Magauran, V.G., who deputised for Bishop Black who was unable to be present. Preaching the panegyric, Monsignor Magauran surveyed Provost O'Donnell's lengthy and widespread ministry in the West of Scotland and emphasised the two outstanding qualities of his character—his open-hearted friendliness and his sincere charity. Led by Monsignor Magauran, many priests and parishioners accompanied the funeral procession to St. Conval's Cemetery, Barrhead, where Provost O'Donnell was interred. May his soul rest in peace.

Very Rev. James Joseph Canon Hogan — 5th March, 1968

Glasgow Archdiocese was greatly blest when, in the summer of 1923, the two senior students of St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny, were told by their bishop that he could spare them for pastoral work in Glasgow. Thus it was that the late Canon James J. Hogan, accompanied by Father Patrick Coogan, his class-mate and fellow townsman of Kilkenny City, came to St. Peter's College for ordination to the priesthood.

Canon Hogan was born at Troy's Gate, Kilkenny, on 25th September, 1897. He entered St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny, in 1911, for studies preparatory to the sacred priesthood. He came to Glasgow in 1923 and was ordained in the chapel of St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick, on 22nd September, 1923, by Archbishop Donald Mackintosh.

After ordination, he was appointed to St. Anthony's, Govan, where he laboured for the entire duration of his long curacy of eighteen years. "Laboured" is the appropriate word for, in those days, St. Anthony's had charge also of St. Constantine's parish and whatever confraternities, societies or parochial activities one parish enjoyed the other parish insisted on having the equivalent, a situation which effectively duplicated the work of the curates. The double parish had no fewer than four hospitals to attend, the largest of them, the Southern General Hospital, had some 2,000 beds and had to be visited every day: indeed the situation was such that normally two priests had to be on sick call duty each day. So deep was Father Hogan's interest in the welfare of the parishioners that, despite the constant pressure of work, he knew all the people of his extensive district and, to any enquiry, he could without hesitation provide the required information about an individual parishioner about his family and, if need be, about his neighbours.

He laboured in his own individual way. He was proud, in the best sense of the word. He was proud of his family, they alone had paid for his education and made possible that in which he most gloried, his priesthood. He was proud of his native city, proud of his native land, Ireland. The Psalmist tells the priest, in his breviary: "Act in a manly way." It was thus he laboured among the people of Govan. A guiding principle for him were the Master's words: "If thy eye be single, thy whole body will be lightsome." He was lighthearted and always in the best of form and never more so than in his dealings with the parishioners of St. Anthony's and St. Constantine's.

Came the day, in 1941, when he was appointed parish priest of Neilston. The green fields, which surrounded the Renfrewshire church and presbytery, must have increased his sense of being completely at home as he moved among his parishioners. His retreat in this peaceful village was a quiet preparation for the herculean task that awaited him in the next appointment that came to him, in 1946, to the bombed-out district of Duntocher. Here was tragedy indeed: the church, school, chapel-house as well as the greater part of the homes of the people had been largely wrecked in the air-attacks on Clydeside. Many people had been killed and the survivors for a time were scattered far and wide. As the people returned to the district, their attempts at re-housing themselves and reconstructing their lives met with constant difficulty and frustration because of the serious economic plight of the nation. The loyalty of the people to their Sunday Mass at this time was something to be marvelled at. For years, the only place available for Sunday Mass was a small wooden hall which held only a few dozen people. Sunday after Sunday, winter

and summer, no matter the weather, the greater part of the congregation, which could not find room inside, would crowd round the wooden hut, within sound of the Sanctus Bell, while Mass was being said. For such people, Father Hogan decided, only the best was good enough. He imparted a new vigour, a new enthusiasm and a new sense of purpose to the parish and began the work of building a worthy church. In his encounters with the frustrating delays and restrictions, which were part of life in those post-war years, he must often have murmured to the great patron saint of the district: "O come to our aid, in our battles take part!" It was as a united family—priests and people—that the Catholics of Duntocher rejoiced when the foundation stone of the new church was laid on 18th September, 1952, and two years later, when the fine new church of St. Mary was solemnly opened on 14th November, 1954.

The rise of new housing estates around Duntocher, to house the people of Dalmuir and Clydebank, added to Father Hogan's responsibilities and it was with a sense of relief as well as of joy that he announced to his people on Sunday, 15th December, 1957, the establishment of the new parish of St. Joseph to care for a congregation of more than 2,000 Catholics who now resided in the district of Faifley.

Father Hogan was parish priest of St. Mary's, Duntocher, for twenty-two years: it had been a long hard struggle to re-equip the parish and to provide leadership for his people in the bewildering social and religious changes that followed from the Second World War and the Second Vatican Council. In recent years, Father Hogan showed signs of advancing age, but he had stood shoulder to shoulder with his people in their hour of need, he had inspired them with his own courage and he had won a secure place in their hearts. His people were unanimous in their congratulations when, in 1967, Father Hogan was made an honorary Canon of the Cathedral Chapter of Glasgow and when, a few months later, on the morning of Tuesday, 5th March, 1968, he died at the Bon Secours Hospital in Glasgow their grief was as sincere as it was widespread. He died as he had lived, in a truly Irish way, lovingly fingering his rosary beads, merely nodding his head when one asked: was he all right? In spirit he was already with his own. May he rest in peace.

Right Rev. James Black, Bishop of Paisley — 29th March, 1968

In the late evening of 29th March, 1968, the Right Reverend James Black, first Bishop of Paisley, died after a long life both as priest and bishop.

James Black was born on the 25th June, 1894, at Bellgrove Street in the venerable parish of St. Mary in Glasgow's East End—a parish which has now given three bishops to the Church in Scotland. In 1900 the Black family moved to Tollcross and it was here that the future priest and bishop was to grow from childhood to manhood. He had a happy home life and was reared in the best traditions of

Catholic family life; he inherited from his father—a convert from the Presbyterian religion—a tolerance of other people's views and a wide-ness of sympathy; from his mother, a searching mind and the ability to appreciate the tradition and growth of the Catholic Faith in the rapidly changing Glasgow of that time. From St. Joseph's School, Tollcross, he proceeded to St. Aloysius' College for his secondary education in 1906, and from then until 1912 his name appeared with unbroken regularity in the "prize lists," beginning with "First Prize" in his first year at that school. His prizes showed his versatility even at this early age and he won special prizes for Mathematics, Religious Knowledge and Classics; to his dying day he did not lose the pleasures of old memory and of tried friendship which were sown during his schooldays. In the University of Glasgow Bursary Competition, he was awarded the "Stewart Bursary," and it looked as if he was set for a promising academic career. But it was not to be. To the astonishment of some people and even the annoyance of others, he abandoned an academic career in favour of the priesthood. He was sent to St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick, in October, 1913, although his mentor at this period of his life, Canon Toner, later Bishop of Dunkeld, had hoped that he would pursue his studies at Valladolid. The choice of St. Peter's College, for a young man of James Black's disposition proved to be a happy one. He had the good fortune of sharing company with a cross-section of the priests who would later become co-partners with him in the pastoral ministry, but above all, he came under the influence and kindly direction of the cultured Monsignor Octavius Claeys. The period in history was not such a happy one. The Great War of 1914 had begun and because of national loyalties a certain confusion and unrest suddenly penetrated the confines of St. Peter's College. The outcome was, that James Black, not merely from a sense of patriotism but also from a sense of obedience to his archbishop, volunteered for military service and enlisted in the Royal Munster Fusiliers at Tralee. Soon afterwards, he was sent to France and in one of the many battles of the Somme, he was severely wounded by machine-gun fire. For a time it was gravely feared that he would have to lose a leg, but the trouble submitted to hospital treatment, and eventually he returned back home to Bearsden. He received his Orders in quick succession: First Tonsure on 2nd May, 1919; Minor Orders on the 3rd and 4th May, 1919; Subdiaconate, 1st November, 1919; Diaconate, 1st May, 1920, and he was ordained to the priesthood in St. Andrew's Cathedral on 27th June, 1920, by Bishop McCarthy of Galloway; he thus became the first of St. Peter's soldier-students to be raised to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Glasgow.

Father Black's first appointment was to St. Patrick's, Coatbridge, in August, 1920, and in later years, he would recall that the most rewarding part of his priestly ministry was spent in that great parish. For us, of the present generation, with all the benefits of a welfare society, it is difficult to realise the hardships—social and personal—of those years. Coatbridge was an "iron Burgh" and its people were almost solely dependent on heavy industry for their livelihood. The parish of St. Patrick was large and extensive, and the pastoral care

of its people, fell, to a great extent, on Father Black. Despite temporary measures of alleviating the social distress of the depression years, in which Father Black helped to provide "soup kitchens" and make provision for the supply of boots for those in need, the great exodus of the unemployed to the New World had begun. In later years, as a bishop, the constant flow of hundreds of letters of grateful appreciation which he received from U.S.A., Canada, Australia and South of the Border at Corby and Luton testified to what he had hoped would always remain, his inconspicuous acts of charity. He rarely had money in his pocket and it was only through withholding from him what was left of his yearly salary, that he was able to have a holiday, and this, if possible, he would spend at the Shrine at Lourdes—a devotion that was to remain with him a lifetime. He initiated the Holy Week and Easter ceremonies at St. Patrick's and, in an unecumenical age, he preached a memorable sermon at the unveiling of the war memorial at the West End, Coatbridge. With the death of Canon Geerty, his esteemed parish priest, he was transferred to St. Peter's, Partick, in October, 1931. St. Peter's was one of the largest city parishes and, as senior curate, much of the administration of the parish was given to him; nonetheless, he was no isolationist, and his involvement in the life of the parish continued to be his first interest. At this time of his life, he came to know the Marist Brothers at Partickhill, and his unaffected admiration for their selfless way of life and their dedication and skill in the most difficult of all arts, moved him to be their counsellor and life-long friend. In June, 1938, he was transferred to Holy Cross, Crosshill, and in January, 1939, he was appointed to his first charge as parish priest of Our Lady and St. John's, Blackwood. It was here that Father Black was given scope for his many talents and abundant energy; he would recall that the happiest two years of his life were spent at Blackwood and, with a disposition such as he possessed, the reasons for such a statement are not hard to find. A parish for him was not merely a territory limited by boundaries nor was its value assessed by its financial income; rather, he saw in a parish—people—people, whose traditions were the growth of all that was best in the Catholic Faith. And to him people mattered—and mattered furiously. At Blackwood, he had given over part of the presbytery and sacristy of the church, for the use of evacuees, he had to attend to the needs of army and evacuee camps, he had poor means of transport and little money. And yet he was happy! The secret of his happiness lay in the pastoral care which he gave to his people and they, in turn, responded, not merely with loyalty, but with admiration and genuine affection. In June, 1941, he was transferred to St. Charles', Paisley, and for six months until December, 1941, he was to give himself, with no less devotion, to the pastoral needs of a people whose Catholic tradition was even greater than that of Lanarkshire or Glasgow. He provided a later morning Mass at St. Charles' and was set to promote greater educational opportunities for a new emerging Catholic population. But his stay at St. Charles' was short-lived. With the retirement of Father Augustine Kirk, O.S.B., Notre Dame Training College required a new chaplain, and Archbishop Mackintosh recognised that he had in

Father Black, a person of scholarly mind, easy of approach, and singularly charitable. He took up duties there in December, 1941, and was to remain there until April, 1948, teaching History and Ethics besides attending to the spiritual needs of the Notre Dame Sisters and the students. In 1946 he was appointed to the Education Authority of Glasgow in succession to Canon Archibald McSparran, and within a month of the death of Monsignor William Daly on the 11th May, 1947, he became Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Glasgow.

After the creation of the Diocese of Paisley by the Apostolic Constitution, "Maxime Interest," of Pius XII, on 25th May, 1947, Monsignor Black was elected first Bishop of Paisley: this was on 22nd February, 1948, and he received episcopal consecration at the hands of Archbishop Campbell in the new Cathedral Church of St. Mirin, Paisley, on 14th April, 1948. His wide pastoral experience, touching all levels of society, his knowledge of the living tradition and development of the Church in Scotland, and, above all, a vivid personality whose lot had been so much intertwined with both priests and people, made him admirably suited to be the first Bishop of Paisley. But he also had a searching mind and a sense of history, and he was quick to realise that the moulding of a new diocese was no easy job. In area, the new diocese was almost co-terminous with the County of Renfrew, in terms of population the most crowded, and it had within its confines the two largest burghs in Scotland. Due to its geographical structure and industrial development, there were two very large concentrations of Catholics based respectively upon Paisley and upon Greenock—with its "conurbation" at Port-Glasgow and Gourrock. The historical development of the Church in the new diocese was also interesting. On the one hand, the new cathedral town of Paisley, although it had inherited all the advantages from the parent Archdiocese of Glasgow, had an older Catholic tradition and consequently the identity of the town and its people was quite different from that of Glasgow. On the other hand, Greenock—and its "conurbation"—was similar, in many respects, to that of Lanarkshire. In relationship to the parent archdiocese, it was isolated and considered very provincial; in tradition and growth, it had benefited enormously from the Irish immigration and consequently the socio-religious structure of both parishes and schools tended to be large, unequal and disjointed, but, at the same time, due to the heritage of the people and the provincialism of the area, a closely-linked bond between priests and people had been formed. The new bishop was keenly aware of this background to his diocese; he had the mind of an historian and had the capacity of being able to see, not merely round facts, but through facts in the light of the historical development of the Church in Scotland. He enthusiastically set his mind on uniting and co-ordinating the efforts of his priests and people in Paisley and Greenock and it was, for this very reason that he settled his residence at Kilmacolm, thus apparently isolating himself and his work—sometimes at great inconvenience—from the cathedral town of Paisley. In the twenty years but a fortnight, of his episcopate, he was responsible for the canonical erection of eleven parishes—many

of which, but not all, required a new church—throughout the County of Renfrew, including four within the Burgh of Paisley. He opened nine new churches and two of a temporary nature and he had hoped to be spared to open the new church of St. Andrew, Greenock. He invited the Franciscan Missionary Sisters for Africa to Moredun, Paisley, in 1954; the Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions to Cathcart in 1958, and the Montfort Fathers to Barrhead in 1961. He blessed the new chapel of St. Joseph's College, Lochwinnoch; consecrated the mother churches of Paisley and Greenock, and the chapel of the new Convent of the Good Shepherd, Bishopton; he opened the Juniorate of the Montfort Fathers and had the pleasure of seeing a new National Junior Seminary, St. Vincent's College, Langbank, being opened within the confines of the diocese in 1961. At the request of the War Office, he undertook a tour of the British Forces' establishments in Germany in 1954 and administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to many service men and even more so, to many more of their children. Although suffering from an undetected right-arm fracture, which caused considerable pain, he attended the opening of the Second Vatican Council but was shortly afterwards detained in Rome under the care of the Blue Nuns; he rallied sufficiently well to be able to attend all other further sessions of the Council.

But the administrative side of a bishop's life—although it is necessary, tiring and sometimes burdensome—was not the only, nor indeed the primary concern of Bishop Black. He would cease work in the midst of daily routine office duties at the request of a beggar seeking help, and would spend, not a few minutes at the door with him, but sometimes several hours, and not infrequently, the welcome guest was invited to stay for lunch. Human nature fascinated him, because the undercurrents of his searching mind was able to see so much of the good beneath the superficial; he could see the "Prince of Men" in the poorest of God's creatures. No one who knew him can picture him otherwise than as a man essentially human, twinkling with fun and rippling with vitality. In his social engagements—which are so much part of a bishop's life—he enriched the company with his gracious presence; in his speeches, he would begin on a humorous note set for him by others, but in a minute or two, without any airs of pietism, without any effect of embarrassment, he would soon be speaking about something that was quite near to his heart. It is strange that the memories we cherish of him are so real and alive—his undisguised admiration for lesser men than himself—his utterly disarming manner in the presence of affectation—his gentle, encouraging and sometimes even amusing asides at a liturgical celebration—his fondness for company and good cheer . . . Human? He had his share of human frailties and for such human frailties, may he receive the pardon he always desired. For the wideness of his human sympathies, may he be rewarded.

And yet to those who knew him well, the human qualities of his character—his kindness, understanding, tolerance, generosity and sympathy, were but the expression of something deeper—his continual desire to see the Will of God and fulfil it. It was this deeper

aspect of his character which prompted him to abandon a promising academic career and begin his studies for the priesthood; which made him volunteer for military service when he was on the threshold of Major Orders; which made him find satisfaction and happiness in large industrial parishes in Lanarkshire and Glasgow for twenty years, not as a parish priest, but as an assistant priest.

Later, as a bishop, the Will of God continued to be supreme in the ordering of his life. To a great extent, he had to sacrifice his natural bent for social relationships and conviviality which he had built up during his priestly ministry, and in their place he had to assume the role of authority and the loneliness of a bishop's life; but the authority which he assumed was tempered by his great humanity and singleness of purpose. He did not see his authority or exercise it in an authoritarian manner, but looked on it as an office of collaboration and partnership with both priests and people, and this, in turn, evoked from his subjects an obedience which grew into affection and devotion; whether it was arranging a date for Confirmation or building a church, it was not his own choice or convenience which he considered, but the views and suggestions of his priests—and invariably they were accepted. But it was in the last ten years of his life, when his health was impaired, sometimes gravely, that the greatness of both the man and the priest was magnified. In the teeth of recurring pain, he seldom cancelled a public engagement, social or religious. Sometimes, after a completely sleepless night, he would try to muster some energy before appearing in assembled company; if in a church, always with dignity; if at a social function, always the life and soul of the company. And beneath all his outward appearance—in manner and behaviour—he suffered much. In the last few months of his life, he was confined to his house, and to a few people it was given to know the extent of his suffering. His patience and endurance of pain, during this time, characterised the spirit of his deeper life. He was conscious almost to the end—one almost felt from a sense of duty—and he died as he would have wanted—Bishop and Father of his people and at their service.

His remains were taken to St. Mirin's Cathedral on the evening of April 2nd; the Office of the Dead was recited, followed by a simple Requiem Mass in the presence of a packed congregation; until midnight of the same evening, large crowds filed past the coffin to pay their last respects to one who had endeared himself to them during his long lifetime. On the following day, April 3rd, Solemn Pontifical Requiem Mass was celebrated by Most Reverend James Donald Scanlan, Archbishop of Glasgow and Metropolitan of the Province, in the presence of the entire Scottish Hierarchy, representatives of the Apostolic Delegate and the English Hierarchy, the Lord Lieutenant of the County of Renfrew, together with representatives of the seven burghs within the diocese.

In his panegyric, Archbishop Scanlan, referring to and quoting Monsignor Ronald Knox, said: "that a bishop, because he is privileged to enter into such personal relations with his flock, has an opportunity, which in these bureaucratic days is granted to few of us.

He will be remembered on earth and judged in heaven, not so much by his administrative competence, not so much by his judicial prudence, as by the eyes that kindled at his coming, the hearts that were lightened by his passing by." . . . "That, surely," he said, applies exactly to this humble, modest shepherd of his flock whom it has pleased God to withdraw from earthly toil and strife."

The funeral took place to St. Conval's Cemetery, Barrhead, where the Right Reverend James Black, first Bishop of Paisley, after an abundant harvest in God's vineyard, lies buried in the centre of the "priests' plot," surrounded by twenty deceased prelates and priests of the new diocese which he had established and formed so well. His epitaph in the memory of the priests and people who mourn him, could well be the words: "Wise in counsel, strong also in purpose and piety, great gaiety was to him but the mask of great virtue." May his great and noble soul rest in peace.

Rev. Joseph Gerard Oxley — 27th June, 1968

Only six months after his ordination as a priest, Father Oxley, in December, 1950, suffered an unusual illness which temporarily left him blind. He was then assistant priest at St. Columba's, Annan—his first posting. This severe illness, which necessitated a long rest cure, only served to strengthen the deep faith and prayer life of this young priest, qualities which were evident and practised in his six years of study at St. Kieran's Ecclesiastical College, Kilkenny. His classmates knew that this illness could have been borne by none other than Father Oxley with such fortitude and patience and spiritual profit to himself and others.

He was able to take up again in a limited way the duties of a priest which he did at St. Mary's, New Abbey, and later at St. Francis Xavier's, Waterside. His general health improved and he was able to serve as parish priest at St. Joseph's, Catrine, being also chaplain to Ballochmyle Hospital. He was changed to St. Palladius', Dalry, at Eastertime, 1967.

His untimely death just fifteen months later, on 27th June, 1968, came as a considerable shock to his family and friends and to the clergy and people of Galloway diocese. He had not yet reached his 43rd birthday. At the time of his death he had been on holiday with his family at Killucan, Co. Westmeath, where he had been born on the 30th August, 1925. St. Finian's, Mullingar, was responsible for his secondary education. The Hospital, Mullingar, cared for him in his very brief illness and where he gave up his short life to God.

Father Oxley is buried in his own family plot at Killucan. Rt. Rev. Mgr. Kennedy, V.G., represented the bishop, clergy and people of Galloway at the funeral rites on the 29th June, 1968, feast of SS. Peter and Paul, and tendered the sympathy of all to his bereaved relatives.

Pontifical Requiem Mass was celebrated in St. Palladius', Dalry, on Tuesday, 2nd July, at which Bishop McGee preached the panegyric. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Alexander Michael Gibney Smith — 14th October, 1968

Father Alexander M. G. Smith, parish priest of Inverurie, died suddenly on Monday, the 14th October, 1968. He was buried at Inverness, his native town, where, at the Requiem Mass in St. Mary's, Father John F. Copland, St. Joseph's, Woodside, preached the panegyric.

"The news that Father Alex. Smith had died in the early hours of Monday morning, in Woodend Hospital, shocked us all," he said. "As that shock gradually diminished, our sympathy went out to his sisters, His Lordship the Bishop, his congregation at St. Mary's, Inverurie, and St. John's, Fetternear, to his many friends of all creeds and classes of life. It was characteristic of him that he had no acquaintances—only friends.

"As a fellow student, I can remember his coming to Blairs College in 1935; shy, diffident, with that soft Highland accent so noticeable amongst the Glaswegian drawl so prevalent at that time. As his talents developed, he was a good cricketer, a beautiful singer and an accomplished organist, so did his confidence, and with it that charm which was to become so much part of him.

"Blairs gave way to St. Peter's College, Bearsden, in the dreary years of World War Two. In 1945, while some major repairs were being done to the college, the students of St. Peter's were transferred to St. Joseph's, Mill Hill, London. This was a missionary college with a wholly different outlook from that of a seminary for secular priests. It was a difficult adjustment to make, but in making it, he all unwittingly was preparing himself for a very important period in his life. After a year, the students returned to Scotland, but not to Bearsden, which had been destroyed by fire, but to the new College of St. Peter at Cardross. Here he completed his studies and, in 1947, was ordained by Bishop Matheson in the church where he had been baptised twenty-four years before, the very same church where today, twenty-two years later, we are attending his funeral.

"The next five years were spent as a curate at St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen, with that wonderful parish priest, the late Monsignor Paterson. In recent months, I have heard him harken back to these years with particular affection. He liked people; and because of this, the subsequent years at Kirkwall and Lumsden must have been difficult for him. In 1956, he was back in St. Mary's Cathedral, this time as administrator, but it was to be for a short spell only. It was in the Spring of 1957 that Bishop Walsh spoke to him of the need for secular priests to help the hard-pressed missionaries in Africa. The idealist in him was roused and he volunteered immediately. In the Autumn of that year he began his studies in preparation for that life, at London University, gaining a certificate in Tropical Education. He was attached to St. Chad's parish in London, and it was while here that his interest in university life and the student, developed. On qualifying, he was sent to the diocese of Bukoba in Tanganyika, now Tanzania, and taught for a time in the Teacher Training Centre at

Kajunguti. But Father Smith had inherited the romantic nature of the Irish and Scottish Gael. He yearned for the mountains of home and the people that he knew. Tanganyika was already fiercely nationalistic and the anti-European feeling that he encountered hurt and puzzled him. This was a period of intense spiritual suffering from which he emerged triumphant and renewed, but his health had suffered, probably irreparably, and he had to return to his own country. After a short period in the parish of Our Lady of Aberdeen, Kincorth, a parish without a church, he was appointed to the joint parish of St. Mary's, Inverurie, and St. John's, Fetternear. This was a scattered parish, and in his now impaired state of health, a physically difficult parish, but he loved the people and they loved him. In a sense he had come home.

"It was now the era of the Second Vatican Council and the upsurge of ecumenism; this was a subject after Father Smith's own heart and the district of the Garioch became a model which many areas could well copy. He also took an active interest in the affairs of the burgh, and the nearness to Aberdeen meant that he was able to keep up his interest in the university and the life of the student, whom he understood and to whom he was prodigal with his help. It was a natural consequence that he should be chosen as chaplain to the Newman Association; here his influence was felt not only in Aberdeen, but in the Association throughout Britain. He resigned this appointment only a few weeks ago.

"It was fitting that his last task should be the renovation of the church of St. Mary in Inverurie. This, although we did not know it, was his "Nunc Dimittis." The beautiful new sanctuary seems to cry out: "Here was a great priest whose life was acceptable to God." In his life, as in the sanctuary, the sacrifice was now complete. Today we gather here to pray for him."

The following tribute from the Rev. Douglas Lister, The Manse, Upper Largo, Fife, formerly minister of St. Andrew's Parish Church, Inverurie, appeared in the issue of the *Inverurie and District Advertiser* of the 18th October:

"If ever a man has been a true 'father in God' to his people and a true 'colleague in Christ,' that man was Alex. Smith. It is through his like that goodness is bred; through charity like his that real unity of heart is won.

"For his memory, those of us who knew him, are grateful, for his people we would pray God's help and continuing usefulness." May he rest in peace.

Rev. Eric Siordet Barber, B.A. — 9th November, 1968

A large gathering of the clergy assisted at the Solemn Requiem Mass in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh, on Tuesday, 12th November, 1968, for Father Eric S. Barber, who died at St. Raphael's Hospital, on Saturday, 9th November, 1968. Concelebrating the Requiem Mass with Archbishop Gray were three members of the staff

of St. Andrew's College, Drygrange—Monsignor John Barry, Father Hugh White and Father Peter Nelson—together with Father James Thomson of Bathgate and Father Thomas Corcoran of Galashiels.

Father Barber's career was somewhat unusual for a Scottish priest. He was born in Sheffield on 6th February, 1893, and studied at Bootham School, York, and at Manchester University. Before becoming a Catholic and following his vocation to the priesthood, Father Barber had a long association, as actor and as playwright, with the British stage. He began his career with Miss Horniman's famous Manchester Repertory Theatre and subsequently acted with Robert Loraine, Matheson Lang and other celebrated actor-managers. For some time he was an actor-manager himself at the London Coliseum. He toured with his own company and often starred at the London theatres. Acting and theatrical management did not exhaust all his activities as a young man; he was an author as well and plays from his pen, *Crowner's Quest*, *The Soul of John Sylvester*, or *Jill the Giant Killer* were produced on the London stage and on the national radio network.

When Father Barber first turned towards religious life, he did so in Anglican Orders and as a member of a monastic community, living for a time in India during this period. Eventually he became a Catholic and, in 1941, began his studies for the priesthood at the Beda College. Four years later, on 19th March, 1945, he was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, in the Convent Chapel at Craiglockhart, by Archbishop Andrew J. McDonald. He served as curate in the Edinburgh parishes of St. Cuthbert, Cathedral and Holy Cross before going, in 1950, to Hawick. In 1955, he became chaplain at Balnakiel Convent, with the added duty of teaching elocution to the students at St. Andrew's College, Drygrange.

Even after ordination, Father Barber was not allowed to give up entirely his life-long association with the theatre. He was in constant demand as a judge at drama festivals and he was asked to conduct drama schools for the British Drama League and for the Scottish Community Drama Association. In the early 1950's his special knowledge of Shakespearean character parts formed the basis of a B.B.C. series entitled "Enjoying Shakespeare," which gave listeners many a new insight into the great playwright's work.

In the following panegyric, delivered during the Requiem Mass in the Cathedral, Archbishop Gordon Joseph Gray, taking as his text: "Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no guile" (John 1, 47), gave a fine character sketch of this cultured and kindly priest.

"The true actor does not play his part: he lives it. As he strides the narrow confines of the stage, his own identity, with its past and future, its anxieties and joys, is forgotten. For the moment he is no longer himself. He is the character he is seeking to portray.

"Before God called him to His service in the priesthood, Eric Siordet Barber was an actor, a good actor, a professional actor, highly thought of in the theatrical world. Perhaps that is why I can

tell you so little of his past. For when he exchanged the costume of the stage for the vestments of the altar, Eric Barber forgot himself and his past. He had been chosen to play a new part. To portray Christ, to show Christ to men. From the day of his ordination, called to be an *alter Christus*—another Christ—he had but one ambition: to live Christ.

“How well he succeeded! How completely he forgot, obliterated himself that Christ might be portrayed in him! He was the soul of kindness. Never a word of criticism passed his lips. He was gentle, humble, affectionate: courteous with a courtesy that was wed to his very nature. One of his favourite sayings was that he loved goodness in any form. He did. In Nature around him, in the fields and the woods and the wild life he saw in his walks: in the books he read and loved. Above all in the people he met, young and old, in whom, despite human faults and weaknesses, he saw always the goodness that was a reflection, faint sometimes yet always a reflection, of the Master he so loyally served. He was a man of keen intellect and wide culture: a priest of deep spirituality and prayer. Yet simple in his devotions and childlike in his unquestioning obedience to the authority of the Church. St. Joseph was his refuge in need. He was ordained on his feastday. And perhaps that is why he rejoiced so greatly when he was appointed as chaplain to St. Mary's, Balnakiel. For Joseph served Mary in her needs. And he loved the Mother of God with an almost naive simplicity that centred on his devotion to the miraculous medal.

“I wonder sometimes how the post-Conciliar excesses of recent years affected him. It was authority that brought him from Canterbury to Rome. He would never question authority, whether in the dictates of the supreme pontiff or in the directives of his bishop. With his appreciation of beauty on the stage of the liturgy, in the grandeur of the Latin periods, in the solemn dignity of the Church's traditional chant, I wonder how the vernacular Mass—still somewhat crude in its early renderings—and English hymns—so often prosaic in phrasing and sadly lacking in musical inspiration—affected his sensitive ear. He never said nor criticised. If the vernacular liturgy was the Church's wish, if the English Mass could help his congregation to love and worship God—that was enough. He had neither time nor inclination to raise his voice against authority.

“I do not know in detail Eric Barber's theatrical career. He spoke little of his past. He played in Shakespeare. That is certain. I think he must have played, too, in 'Peter Pan.' For he had certainly discovered the secret of eternal youth. He loved his students at Drygrange. He welcomed the visits of young priests. He delighted when he heard them praised for the clear, distinct and cultured diction he so conscientiously demanded of them—and obtained. His own preaching was a model for his students. Though he never spoke of it as such. But because he was an actor and knew that an actor could glory in the human satisfaction of a captured audience, when he preached—and this you may not know—he always clasped in the palm of his

right hand, a tiny crucifix. It must not be he, the man, whose measured cadences would win a hearing from his audience, but Christ, through him.

"I mentioned 'Peter Pan.' Would you who met Father Eric Barber in recent years have believed that he had entered his 76th year? Yet that is so. He was born in Sheffield on February 6th, 1893. After graduating at Manchester University, in Dramatic Art, he both played upon the stage and managed his own company. Then, following his reception into the Catholic Church, he felt the call to the priesthood. He was accepted by the late Archbishop McDonald, and enrolled in 1941 at the Beda, for the war years evacuated to Upholland. He was 48 years of age. Yet, despite the sluggishness of memory that comes with later years, he completed an excellent course. Mgr. Duchemin, then Rector, wrote that in nearly every examination he attained full marks, and that his life was lived at the same high level. He had, in the Rector's words, 'a nice appreciation of the spiritual life and of the importance of recollection.' A year later, the Monsignor wrote: 'Needless to say that his natural powers of delivery—he was trained as an actor—will serve him well in preaching: while his genuine interior life will supply apt material for expression.' And he went on: 'The more I see of him, the more my good impressions are confirmed.' A sentence all those who knew him, would echo in all sincerity.

"Father Barber was ordained at the Sacred Heart Convent, Craiglockhart, on March 19th, 1945. He served as curate in Edinburgh at St. Cuthbert's, in the Cathedral and at Holy Cross. In May of 1950, he was transferred to Hawick and in December of 1955 was appointed as chaplain to St. Mary's, Balnakiel, and as an extra-mural professor of elocution at Drygrange, a post he loved and relinquished with sorrow at the end of this last summer term.

"His last curtain fell on Saturday, at 3.15 in the afternoon, at the close of the last act in the drama of a full and lovely life. His last curtain—not to the applause of a great audience, but to the soft murmur of the prayers for the dying; not surrounded by the players of his company, but by the Sisters who had nursed him and by brother priests he had loved. May God have mercy on his gentle priestly soul.

"To his sister, his relatives and friends, to his little flock at Balnakiel, we offer deep and heartfelt sympathy. They—and we—have lost a friend on earth, but gained yet one more advocate in heaven. Eternal rest give unto him, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace."

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APPENDIX I

ECCLESIASTICAL LAWS AND OBSERVANCES.

1. EASTER DUTIES.

The Faithful of Scotland are authorised to satisfy the obligation of the Paschal Communion on any day from Ash Wednesday to Trinity Sunday. (S.C.C.: 11th Oct., 1946.)

2. FAST AND ABSTINENCE DAYS.

By the Papal constitution "Paenitemini," binding from Ash Wednesday, 23rd February, 1966, the ecclesiastical law on fasting and abstinence was completely re-stated.

All the faithful are bound by the divine law of penance.

Lent still has its penitential character. The obligatory days of penance are all Fridays and Ash Wednesday. Their substantial observance is a matter of grave obligation.

Abstinence binds on all Fridays which are not holidays of obligation.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence.

Meat is prohibited by the abstinence law, but not eggs, milk foods and condiments from the fat of animals.

On a fast day only one full meal may be taken, but some food is allowed morning and evening in the quantity and quality determined by approved local custom.

The law of abstinence binds all who have completed their fourteenth year; the law of fasting binds all who have completed their twenty-first year and not yet entered their sixtieth year. Pastors and parents should see that those who are under age are trained in a true sense of penance.

Episcopal Conferences may, for a just cause, transfer a day of penance, taking account of the period of Lent. They may substitute other forms of penance, especially works of charity and exercises of piety, for fast and abstinence. Decisions of Episcopal Conferences in the matter should be reported to the Holy See.

A Bishop can dispense from these laws by the power he has from the conciliar decree on the Pastoral Duty of Bishops. A parish priest, for a just cause and within the regulations of Ordinaries, can dispense from fast and abstinence or commute the obligation into another pious work for individuals or families. A superior of a clerical religious society or institute can do likewise for his subjects.

Bishops and pastors should diligently promote more frequent use of the sacrament of penance and also extraordinary works of penance

for expiation or impetration, especially during Lent. The faithful are urged to fill their minds with the Christian penitential outlook so that they may be more ready to practise works of penance and charity.

3. NEW REGULATIONS ABOUT THE EUCHARISTIC FAST.

The law of eucharistic fast was changed by the Apostolic Constitution "Christus Dominus," 6th January, 1953, and further modified by the Motu Proprio "Sacram Communionem," 19th March, 1957.

On 21st November, 1964, a new law was made: "Having considered the difficulties of many regions about the eucharistic fast, the Supreme Pontiff, graciously acceding to the request of bishops, grants that the fast from solid food for priests and faithful shall be reduced to one hour before the reception of Holy Communion. This concession refers also to the moderate use of alcoholic liquids."

From the Motu Proprio of 1957, the sick, even though not confined to bed, may take non-alcoholic liquids or genuine medicine, liquid or solid, at any time before celebrating Mass or receiving Holy Communion.

4. MARRIAGES.

Before a marriage is celebrated, it must be certain that nothing stands in the way of its valid and licit celebration. (Code of Canon Law, Canon 1019, par. 1.)

The parish priest whose right it is to assist at the marriage must, at a suitable time beforehand, carefully investigate whether there is any obstacle to the celebration of the marriage. (Canon 1020, par. 1.)

The rules to be followed by the parish priest in making this investigation, given in an instruction of the Sacred Congregation of the Sacraments, 29th June, 1941, and modified for Scotland by a rescript of the same Congregation, 24th November, 1947, must be carefully observed in every case.

Celebration of Marriage with Mass. The marriage is celebrated after the homily which follows the gospel. This homily is obligatory. As a homily the address on pp. 19-21 of Messrs. Gill's pamphlet may be read. The nuptial blessing is always to be given, even in the closed seasons, and even if either or both spouses has received it in a previous marriage. The Nuptial Mass is to be said in English, using the Burns Oates altar missal, but according to circumstances, the nuptial blessing may be read in Latin.

Celebration of Marriage of Catholics without Mass. The order for this is now: A brief admonition or explanation, epistle, hymn if desired, gospel, homily (for which the address mentioned above may be used), prayer of the faithful, if desired, celebration of marriage, nuptial blessing.

APPENDIX II

INDULGENCES

The Papal Constitution "Indulgentiarum Doctrina," in force since 30th April, 1967, restates the Church's teaching on indulgences. The first four sections of the document affirm the Church's power to grant indulgences and explain indulgences doctrinally and historically.

A summary is appended of the fifth section in which the law on indulgences is completely revised.

An indulgence is a remission in the sight of God of temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven as far as their guilt is concerned. An indulgence is gained on certain conditions by the properly disposed Christian with the help of the Church which, as minister of the redemption, authoritatively dispenses and applies the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

Indulgences are plenary or partial; both can be applied to the dead. Henceforth partial indulgences will be described as such without any reference to terms of days or years. The Christian, at least sorry for his sins, who does some work to which a partial indulgence is attached, gains, with the help of the Church, a remission of temporal punishment equal to that which he had already merited by his good action.

A plenary indulgence may be obtained only once each day, apart from the case of a person at the moment of death who had already gained a plenary indulgence that day; partial indulgences may be obtained several times a day unless otherwise stated.

To gain a plenary indulgence the "work" to which the indulgence is attached must be performed; in addition, three conditions, sacramental confession, reception of Holy Communion and prayer for the Pope's intention must be fulfilled. The gainer must also be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin. If this disposition is lacking or any of the conditions is not fulfilled a partial indulgence only will be obtained.

The conditions may be fulfilled days before or after the "work" is performed, but it is fitting that Communion should be received and the prayer for the Pope's intention said on the day of the "work." Several plenary indulgences may be gained after one sacramental confession but reception of Holy Communion and prayer for the Pope's intention must be repeated for each individual indulgence. One Our Father and one Hail Mary always suffice for prayer for the Pope's intention; other prayers, dictated by the recipient's piety and devotion to the Holy Father, may be substituted.

As in canon 935, confessors may commute the "work" required for those legitimately prevented from its fulfilment. Local Ordinaries may permit their subjects to gain plenary indulgences without actual confession and Communion in places where that is difficult, provided they are heartily sorry for their sins and intend to receive those sacraments as soon as possible.

The terms "local" and "real" indulgences are abolished to make it clear that indulgences attach to works of the faithful, even though these works may be connected with a place or object of piety. Members of pious associations may gain indulgences attached to membership, even if they do not wear the insignia of membership.

Lists of indulgences are to be revised as soon as possible. Only the principal prayers and works of charity, piety and penance will be indulgenced.

A plenary indulgence for the dead may be obtained in all churches, public oratories and semi-public oratories, by those entitled to use them, on 2nd November. In parish churches a plenary indulgence may be obtained on two days, the feast of the titular and on 2nd August, the date of the Portiuncula indulgence. These indulgences may all be obtained on the exact date or, with the Ordinary's consent, on the Sunday before or after the exact date or on some other date which the Ordinary thinks more fitting. All other indulgences attached to visiting churches are to be revised.

A visit to a church, prescribed as the "work" for gaining an indulgence, is fulfilled by a pious recital there of the Our Father and the Creed.

If an object of piety is blessed by a priest and used by the faithful in a spirit of piety, a partial indulgence is gained. If the pious object (crucifix, cross, rosary beads, scapular, medal) is blessed by the Pope or a bishop, a plenary indulgence may be gained by its pious use on the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, provided that a profession of faith, in any legitimate form, is made.

The apostolic blessing by a priest at the hour of death still brings with it a plenary indulgence. If no priest is available, a Christian at the hour of death may gain the plenary indulgence provided that he is in the proper dispositions and was accustomed to saying some prayers during his life. It is recommended that a cross or crucifix be used in that case.

All privileges in regard to altars at which Mass is said are suppressed; in future a plenary indulgence for the dead can be obtained for every celebration of Mass.

The law as here detailed is in full force, but it does not revoke the law of the Code or of decrees of the Holy See if they are in conformity with these new laws.

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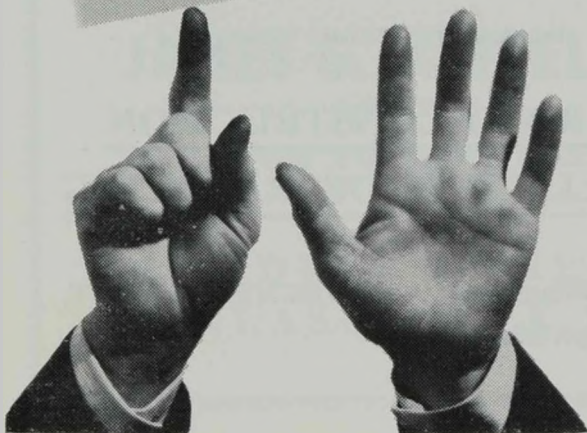
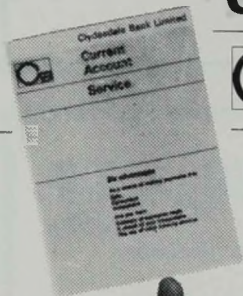
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
