## THE HIERARCHY OF SCOTLAND

From the Extinction of the Hierarchy in 1603 till its  
Restoration in 1878.

1. The ancient Hierarchy ended with James Betoun, Abp. of Glasgow, who died at Paris on the 25th April, 1603, aged 79. After being subjected to the jurisdiction of the Archpriests and first Vicar-Apostolic of England till 1623, and afterwards to local Prefects of the Mission, the Clergy were incorporated into a missionary body by decree of Propaganda, 1653, and governed by the following Prefects-Apostolic: **William Ballantyne** (or **Bellenden**), 1653-61; **Alexander Dunbar** (or **Winster**), 1662-68, 1672-94; and **John Walker** (or **Ross**), 1668-71. In May, 1694, a Scottish Vicariate-Apostolic was established. This was divided into two Districts, the Lowland and the Highland, in February, 1731; and these two into three, the Eastern, Western and Northern, by Papal Rescript of 13th February, 1827. This last arrangement remained in force till the re-establishment of the Hierarchy by the Apostolic Letter, **Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice**, 4th March, 1878.

## ARCHBISHOPS AND BISHOPS OF SCOTLAND

### From the Restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878

The Apostolic Letter "Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice" of Leo XIII, 4th March, 1878, divided Scotland into the Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (with four Suffragan Sees) and the Archdiocese of Glasgow, which was directly subject to the Holy See. By the Apostolic Constitution "Maxime Interest" of Pius XII, 25th May, 1947, and the Apostolic Constitution "Dominici Gregis" of the same date, the Archdiocese of Glasgow was erected into a Province and divided into the Metropolitan See of Glasgow with the Suffragan Sees of Motherwell and Paisley.

## THE PROVINCE OF

### ST. ANDREWS AND EDINBURGH

*The Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh consists of the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh and the four Suffragan Sees of Aberdeen, Argyll and the Isles, Dunkeld, and Galloway.*

*The See of the Isles (Insularum or Sodorensis) is said to have been founded about 447 by St. Patrick, who consecrated Germanus, its first Bishop; it was united to Man till the end of the 14th century; and was vacant for 325 years, from the death of Roderick Maclean in 1553 till the restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878.*

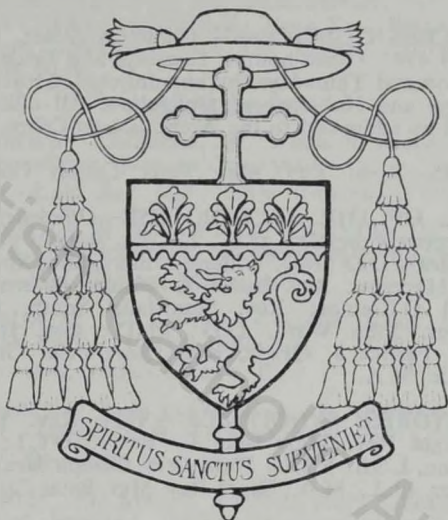

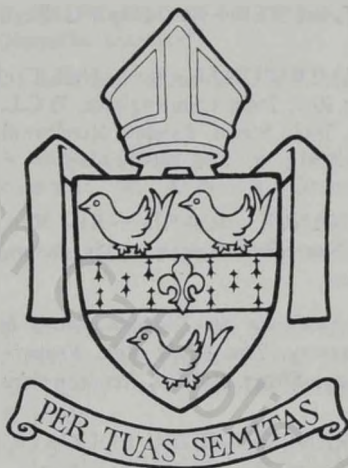

## OBITUARIES — 1969

### Rev. Pierce Grace — 1st February, 1969

On Saturday, 1st February, 1969, Father Pierce Grace died just outside his Chapel House in Glenrothes, Fife. He had only arrived back from a visit home to Ireland, had flown from Dublin to Glasgow, snatched a cup of tea and hurried out to visit a sick parishioner. For several years he had lived with a heart complaint, forgotten that day in his priestly zeal to do his job. As he rushed out, he found the car hard to start, pushed and shoved, forgetting the classical advice of doctors to one in his state of health and in a few minutes he collapsed and died. The very firmness of his dedication, shown throughout his life, now took him to its completion in his Saviour.

Father Pierce was born in Newport, Co. Tipperary, on the 21st August, 1913. He went to the local primary school and then on to the Irish Christian Brothers in Kilkenny and finally entering St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny, in September, 1933. He was ordained in St. Mary's Cathedral, Kilkenny, on the 11th June, 1939. His formation had built into his personality a strong sense of belonging to a family, a locality, a college, a people and a tradition, a formation from which he was always to draw strength and assurance. Throughout his life he returned constantly to renew these sources of vitality. All his holidays were spent back home; never were family, college or friends neglected or forgotten. The College annual reunion was an annual event attended with great loyalty, contacts were renewed and enlarged.

In 1939, Father Grace arrived in Scotland, the mission he had chosen after seriously deliberating whether Africa might not be where his vocation lay. Musselburgh was his one and only curacy, lasting fifteen years. The old burgh took to itself the fine big man, with the big laugh, who never seemed to tire. His devotion to his priesthood fulfilled in a love of his people, his unswerving service of his parish priest, the late Canon McLaughlin, the physical work he put into the rose garden in the church grounds were quickly seen and appreciated by all who knew him. Musselburgh will always remember those fifteen years as long as the roses bloom.

In 1954, Falkland, Fife, became the scene of his first labours as parish priest. Here the historic world of Scotland's past was eagerly accepted by Father Grace. He blossomed afresh in surroundings, which those who knew him well thought accorded with his personal dignity, his sedate charm, his contentment with what was traditional and well tried. "Old Pierce," a title of affection, seemed to have found a setting which blended well with his general demeanour, the Palace, the Chapel Royal, the Lomonds, the Neuk of Fife, the countryside with its people and farms. Their priest knew and sympathised with them all. Here the man from Tipperary would have loved to have finally settled. He was loathe to leave.

But, beyond the Lomonds, Glenrothes was shooting up. He found his time slowly becoming monopolised by these new demands. People were arriving every day and people required a new church, a new parish, the willing horse was ready for the new development. He began by saying Mass in an old school, and plans were made for a new church. Father Grace exulted in the challenge, listened to the experts, studied and read, discussed and mused over the excitements that were taking shape around him. He transferred his affection and energy from the old to the new, his enthusiasm being focussed on producing a church and house to suit the times and modernity in which he knew he would be placed. Mr. Jack Coia of Glasgow and Mr. Benno Schotz, designers for the future, found in Father Pierce a mind open to new vistas, ready for new forms and sensitive to new materials. St. Paul's Church in Glenrothes, opened in 1958, is the fruit of partnerships which will always testify to the clear-sighted vision of Father Grace. Proudly he often quoted from architectural magazines the praises of his new church, one of the finest examples of modern building ideas. The Crucifix, the Lady Statue and the Stations of the Cross, when completed, will for years acclaim the genius of their designer, but also the taste of the priest who commissioned them.

But Glenrothes grew apace and shortly Father Grace bought an old church in Leslie. Within the short space of eight years he had adapted the building, furnished and decorated it and with a growing population persuaded the Cardinal, then Archbishop, to set up, in 1966, the new parish of St. Mary's, Glenrothes. What a transformation was accomplished, not only in the area but also in Father Grace. He was as equally acceptable in this new world of rapid change as he had been in the old world of Falkland where time has seemed to stand still.

From 1964 onwards Father Pierce lived with a sure knowledge that he had to be careful. Refusing aid as long as he was able, he carried on. He refreshed himself by returning home to his family and friends, relaxing when opportunity was offered among his fellow-priests. He entertained and played golf to lift his mind from parish problems, but also selflessly to encourage and hearten his priest friends. His deep commitment and zeal for souls had shaped his life, affected all who met him and led him to his Master, who will readily reward him. May he rest in peace.

**Right Rev. Monsignor William Robert Canon Clapperton,  
D.D., M.A., Prot. Apost. — 19th February, 1969**

Monsignor William Robert Clapperton, who died in Rome on the 19th February, 1969, was one of the outstanding personalities of modern Scottish Catholic life. He belonged to a family deeply rooted in the life and traditions of the north-east. The Clappertons of Fochabers apparently never lost the Faith. In 1720, "one Thomas Clapertoun, a violent Papist," led an anti-Protestant riot in Fochabers. Several members of his family, both men and women, had played an

important part in the development of the Church in Scotland during the period in which the north-east was the dominant section of Scottish Catholicism. Three of his uncles were priests: Mgr. James Clapperton, who was for a time on the staff at Valladolid and served for forty years at Peebles; Canon William Clapperton, who served at Preshome, Fochabers, Tynet and Buckie, and who is better known for his valuable research into Scottish Catholic archives; and Mgr. Robert Provost Clapperton, who worked mainly in Dundee, where he was Provost of the Chapter and Vicar General. The average length of the lives of these three was eighty-three years—the age at which Mgr. William died. Two of his aunts—sisters of the three priests—were founder members of the Ursuline community at St. Margaret's Convent, Edinburgh. A ballad, "Bonny Peggy Clapperton," which was current in the north-east, was written about one of these sisters.

Mgr. Clapperton was very reserved and seldom spoke about himself or his family, but the influence of this long Catholic tradition was visible in him throughout his life. He himself continued and enhanced this family tradition both by his service to the Church and by his truly magnificent benefactions to the Scots College in Rome.

He was born at Fochabers on 24th January, 1886, son of Thomas Clapperton and Mary Martin. After attending the Grammar School in Aberdeen, he went, in 1901, to Ushaw, from which he took his degree in Classics at Durham University. In 1907, he entered the Scots College, Rome, to begin an association of more than sixty years with the College. After his ordination in 1913, he became vice-rector of the College and, in 1921, he was nominated Privy Chamberlain to His Holiness the Pope. In 1922, he succeeded Mgr. Mackintosh as rector of the College and, on 29th November, 1923, he was made a Domestic Prelate. Almost immediately the College entered its most flourishing period. At the instigation of Archbishop Mackintosh the new rector enlarged the college by the addition of a wing on Via Rasella which was completed in 1926. By 1929 the number of students had risen to fifty-four, the highest number the college has ever had. In 1930 the new villa was inaugurated at Marino, where the Scots had had their summer residence for nearly three centuries.

When war broke out in 1939 the College continued its work in Rome. But a year later the entry of Italy into the war necessitated the departure of all the students and staff. After making arrangements for the wartime management of the property, Monsignor Clapperton returned to Scotland and became parish priest of Banff. The novelty of pastoral work kept him interested and he was exemplary in the way he tended his little flock. But his heart was still in Rome and he made no attempt to hide his satisfaction when in 1946 the bishops sent him back to Rome to reopen the College.

From then till his retirement in 1960, he had to devote much of his time to the restoration of the buildings, which had inevitably suffered during the period of his absence. By 1958 it became evident that the main college building in Rome was in need of very costly fundamental repairs. For some time he resisted the temptation to abandon

the Via Quattro Fontane, where the College had been since 1602. But in the end he recognised that, since the money for restoration could not be found, the only way of saving the College was to sell this very central site and rebuild on the outskirts of the city. He therefore opted for this course, but left it to his successor to supervise the building of the new College.

Throughout his rectorship Monsignor Clapperton was a prudent and intelligent administrator, giving constant and diligent attention to the preservation of the College properties and to the many business matters that his work as rector and agent of the Bishops involved. He was in fact the last of the old-style Roman agents of the Scottish Bishops and Clergy, an office which became largely superfluous with the establishment of the Apostolic Delegation to Great Britain. Monsignor Clapperton was also for many years the Scottish representative on the Council for the Propagation of the Faith. He had also been postulator for the cause of Blessed John Ogilvie and in charge of the arrangements for the beatification in 1929.

However, it is not for any of these activities that he will most be remembered but for the influence he had on his students. This was quite unique and at first sight difficult to account for. He lacked the easy charm of those who attract people at their first meeting; and some of those who knew him only superficially failed to understand him. To know him as he really was, one had to penetrate the brusque exterior which was largely a protection and a cloak for the real character that lay underneath. There, under the cloak, one found a man who longed to give and to receive affection but whose shyness made him embarrassed at doing so.

Fortunately, young people are perceptive and even the first generation of his students had discovered the real Clapperton; and each year, as new students arrived, they soon learnt from the older students the true nature of their rector and did not have to discover it for themselves. Thus they came easily to love and admire him in spite of his failings and his unusual personal traits. Of these personal characteristics he had more than his share; indeed, there is no one who even vaguely resembles him. His failings were not serious and, though sometimes they vexed his students, more often they amused them and endeared him to them. What was most remarkable was that the affection which his students acquired for him in their youth continued undiminished after they had left the College.

What was the secret of this lasting influence which he had on all the students of the College? It was not his manner, which was often awkward and embarrassing. It was not anything he said either in public or in private. He wrote extremely well but he did not express himself well in speech. He had a very good mind and was a prize-winner both at Durham and at the Gregorian. But, once he had graduated, he did not use his mind academically, as he had the ability to do. He was not deeply interested in philosophy or theology or, indeed, in any speculative subject. Instead, he devoted himself to practical matters and especially to the administration of the College. He was always at work, interviewing his students or preparing pro-

grammes or supervising repairs or budgeting or doing accounts. What made the lasting impression on his students was not what he said but what he was and what he did. In him they saw someone living the life of a good priest.

His piety was of the old-fashioned school of Bishop Challoner or Bishop Hay—morning meditation, Mass said with great exactitude, thanksgiving after Mass, Divine Office—much of it said aloud, visit to the Blessed Sacrament, rosary, spiritual reading, night prayers—no exaggeration but unfailing regularity. This was his way of life in the College, in the parish at Banff and in his last years at the Lateran. It was a simple but deeply rooted spirituality and it gave him strength in times of crisis, as when the College was short of money or its whole future threatened, or when he had just received a rebuff from his superiors. One had to see him in prayer on such occasions to appreciate how deeply religious he really was. In spite of appearances he was a humble man, ready to review his own opinions and to apologise if he felt he had acted wrongly. There are very few people so able as he was to make an objective judgment even in matters which concerned him deeply or to appreciate the point of view of those with whom he differed.

His simple uncomplicated spirituality was his support in his old age, when a lesser man might easily have become disconsolate and felt that his whole world was collapsing and that much of his work had been in vain. The old College, for which he had given almost his whole life, had been abandoned; the villa, of which he had been so proud, was now unused except by strangers; Rome and the Vatican were being more and more disregarded and the Holy Father himself being attacked and ridiculed even by people still calling themselves Catholics. All of this might easily have knocked the heart out of an old man to whom Rome had meant so much.

But Monsignor Clapperton was not dismayed. He had a fresh mind for his years and he was not by nature opposed to change. He himself had changed the Scots College enormously during his years as rector. Though he regretted the transfer of the College from its historic site, he finally saw the necessity for this and, after much vacillation, had advised the bishops to sell the old site and rebuild elsewhere. And he gave his full moral support and most generous financial help to his successor during the building of the new College in the Via Cassia.

The changes in the Church in general did not upset him. He welcomed what was good in them, and what was bad left him unperturbed. His faith was too strong to be shaken by any apparent threats to the Church. He continued to perform his spiritual exercises with the same regularity as when he was in the seminary—except that in his old age he spent more time before the Blessed Sacrament, usually in the little oratory in Palazzo Venezia. His last years were enriched also by his friendship with Padre Pio, whom he greatly admired and frequently visited.

Apart from his piety, what did most to form his students was probably his attitude to College discipline. He struck the proper balance between a rigid enforcement of the rules and a complete disregard for them. To Monsignor Clapperton the rule was very important indeed. He took great care in drawing up regulations for the running of the community and spent years writing and rewriting the new Book of Rules, which in a few years was to become a museum piece. Then, having drawn up the rules, he put them before the students as an ideal to be aimed at. He knew they would not be kept perfectly. And the students knew that he would not expel them or keep them from ordination because of trivial breakages of the rules. He treated his students as adults. Yet he never failed to urge them to observe the rule in order to discipline themselves. For him the rule was to be followed, not from fear of punishment but because it would lead them in the right direction. Of the men trained by him there is not one who will not agree that under his direction life in the College was exceedingly happy. With him in charge the rule was not a burden but a help. This was perhaps the chief reason for his enduring influence on his students; and it showed his genius as an educator. He saw the happy mean between unbending discipline and the anarchy with which we are threatened today. He knew how to teach his students the value of authority and the manner in which it should be used.

His long service to the College and to the Church in Scotland were recognised in 1955, when he was raised to the rank of Protonotary Apostolic. In the following year he was made an Honorary Canon of his native diocese of Aberdeen. In 1960, when he decided to retire from the rectorship of the College, he was appointed Canon of the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran and there he spent his last nine years in gracious retirement. He would have preferred a canonry in St. Peter's, but, having been appointed to St. John's, he would not change and he gave it his full loyalty, devoting himself to the tasks committed to him by the Chapter, whose members soon recognised his worth. Even in his retirement he remained closely associated with the College, where he was a constant and most welcome visitor. And he enjoyed receiving members of the College at his new home.

His last illness was severe but mercifully short and he remained lucid till the end, receiving the Sacraments with great devotion and with his usual attention to the rubrics. A few days before his death he had the consolation of receiving a personal message and a rosary from the Holy Father. He died in the Blue Nuns' hospital in Rome in the early hours of 19th February, 1969, four weeks after his eighty-third birthday. The funeral Mass was celebrated in St. John Lateran by the Provost of the Chapter, assisted by Canon Boyle and Mgr. Flanagan, rector and former rector of the College, in the presence of the College students and of his many friends in Rome. Monsignor Scanlan, Archbishop of Glasgow, represented the Scottish Hierarchy. As was fitting and at his own wish, Mgr. Clapperton was buried, not in the tomb of the Lateran Chapter but in that of the Scots College in the Campo Verano. Thus, even in death he remains with the

College to which he had dedicated his whole life and to which he left the very considerable fortune which he had inherited from his family.

On the occasion of his month's mind the members of the Scots College Society and other members of the Scottish clergy met in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, for a solemn Requiem, celebrated by Mgr. Flanagan, President of the Scots College Society, assisted by Canon Denis Meechan and Canon Connolly. The attendance of former students from every part of Scotland was a proof of their respect and gratitude for this great and good and wise man by whom they had had the privilege of being trained. In him they had known one strong in faith, unsparing of himself, persevering in prayer, with a deep devotion to Our Lord and His Blessed Mother and an unswerving loyalty to the Church. This is the kind of priest Monsignor Clapperton was and the kind he wanted his students to be. May he rest in peace.

**Rev. Thomas J. O'Kane — 25th February, 1969.**

Thomas John O'Kane was born at Portadown, County Armagh, on 21st April, 1902. A few years later the family moved to Glasgow, where he received his early education at St. Mungo's Academy before entering Blairs College in 1917. From there he proceeded in due course to St. Peter's College, Bearsden. On completion of his studies in philosophy and theology, he was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop Donald Mackintosh in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, on 24th April, 1927.

His first appointment was to St. Ignatius', Wishaw, where he was destined to serve as a curate for nineteen years. Fr. O'Kane is still remembered in Wishaw for the energetic and faithful way in which he carried out his pastoral duties during these long years. In common with the other industrial towns in Lanarkshire, Wishaw in 1927 was experiencing the worst rigours of the depression with its attendant evils of unemployment and poverty, a condition which was to continue into the middle 'thirties. This was a challenging situation for a young priest starting out on his pastoral life and Fr. O'Kane responded to the challenge by devoting himself to the apostolate of social action. He expended a great deal of time and energy in mastering the social teaching of the Church so thoroughly that he was able to expound it in a form which could be easily assimilated by ordinary men and women. The result was the publication in 1936 by the Catholic Social Guild of *A Catholic Catechism of Social Questions*. The Catechism was adopted by the Social Guild and other similar groups as their official textbook and by 1960 no less than thirty reprints had been necessary. In the same period sales of the Social Catechism had topped the 100,000 mark, a truly remarkable performance for a work of this nature. The Catechism was also published in several foreign languages, an eloquent tribute to its intrinsic worth and the talent of its author.

*A Catholic Looks at Life* first appeared in embryo form in the Wishaw Parish Magazine, to be subsequently enlarged and published as a booklet in 1943. In the next few years a further six editions were called for. Less formal but more provocative than the Catechism, it displays the same preoccupation with social problems.

Despite the painstaking research which this type of work involved, Father O'Kane yet found time to develop the cultural life of his parishioners, particularly the younger people. He delivered many illustrated lectures on such subjects as "Ireland," "Lourdes," "The Holy Land," for which many of the slides were prepared from his personal collection of photographs. He produced dramatic and musical shows, some of which took the form of plays he had written based on the narratives of other authors. He also has to his credit an original play: *A Princess Came to Scotland*, depicting the life and times of St. Margaret, which was published in 1937; and he compiled a small booklet of prayers and devotional exercises, named the *Blessed Sacrament Guild Manual*: this was published in 1952 and was widely used in the churches of the Archdiocese of Glasgow for Holy Hour Devotions.

In 1946 it became necessary to make provision for the increasing Catholic population of the Bishopbriggs area. Archbishop Campbell entrusted the task of establishing the new parish of St. Matthew to Father O'Kane, who undertook his commission with great enthusiasm. His first concern was to provide his people with a suitable church, and the energy he expended in this direction was rewarded when the beautiful edifice, dedicated to St. Matthew, was formally blessed by the archbishop in 1950.

Another problem which confronted him from the beginning was the provision of educational facilities for the children. Numbers were not sufficient to justify the building of a separate school by the public authority and in consequence the children had to travel to neighbouring schools. The parents were unhappy about the situation, particularly where younger children were involved. Father O'Kane's solution was to invite the Sisters of Mercy to open a private school for the children of St. Matthew's, handing over the ground-floor of his presbytery for use as classrooms. The results gave great satisfaction to all concerned, not least to Father O'Kane as is evident from the many snapshots of a radiant pastor surrounded by smiling children.

With the new parish of St. Matthew's firmly established, Father O'Kane was transferred in 1952 to the much larger parish of St. Michael's, Parkhead, which had been in existence for three-quarters of a century. The provision of a new church to replace the old building which had become inadequate for the needs of the parishioners had been under consideration for a considerable time. The realisation of this project engaged Father O'Kane's attention from the time he took up his new appointment, but he soon appreciated that the problems, mainly concerning the availability of a suitable site, which had frustrated the efforts of his predecessors, were not

susceptible of a quick solution. To improve the situation during the long years of delay, he set about the seemingly impossible task of beautifying the old church. Nothing much could be done with the exterior apart from keeping it in a reasonable state of preservation. Within the church he achieved a remarkable transformation by substituting small ambos on either side of the sanctuary for a massive pulpit which had obscured the view of the altar and by erecting an elegant baldacchino. At a later date extra accommodation was provided by incorporating an adjacent building into the main fabric of the church to form a very attractive Lady Chapel.

Apart from his abiding interest in social action, Father O'Kane was involved in many activities outwith the bounds of his parish. Most noteworthy of these was the work he performed on behalf of the Catholic Truth Society of Scotland. For many years he served on the Glasgow Archdiocesan Council and on the Scottish Council as chairman of the very important Publications Committee.

In his latter years in Parkhead, Father O'Kane experienced a prolonged period of ill-health which finally led to his retirement in 1967. However he had the consolation of knowing that the work of building the new St. Michael's Church was already under way, and that when completed it would be embellished with an original set of paintings of the Stations of the Cross which he had commissioned. These must prove a lasting memorial to his fifteen years as Parish Priest of St. Michael's.

His retirement was spent at the family home in Termonfeckin, Drogheda, where, in spite of increasing debility, he maintained his interests and his good spirits.

He died in Drogheda on 25th February, 1969. May he rest in peace.

#### **Rev. Peter McKeesick — 2nd April, 1969**

The Rev. Peter McKeesick, who was chaplain to the City Hospital, Edinburgh, since his ordination in 1954, died in that hospital early on Wednesday morning, the 2nd April, 1969. He had undergone a major operation a few days earlier. A native of Dalkeith, Father McKeesick was forty-four years of age at the time of his ordination, which followed studies at Campion House, Osterley, and St. Edmund's, Ware. His first appointment was to St. Cuthbert's, Slateford, and when the new parish at Oxgangs was cut off from Slateford, eight years ago, Father McKeesick moved to the new parish of St. Mark. At the Requiem Mass celebrated in St. Mark's Church, Oxgangs, on Monday, 7th April, 1969, the Right Rev. Mgr. Peter Canon Connolly, spoke the following panegyric:

"Father Peter McKeesick, the youngest of seven children, was eighteen months old when his father died. 'We knew the hard life.' When he was fourteen he left school to work, to 'support my mother and to help the family.'

" His aged mother is still alive, and I hope his brother and sisters will tell her that this church was filled to capacity with priests and friends who had come to pray for her son, and to pray in sympathy for her and her family.

" When Father McKeesick was about thirty, he felt a powerful call from God to live a life of reparation, as he put it, in the priesthood. Although he enjoyed college life, he found the difficulties of study almost too much. But these were part of the reparation so he accepted and welcomed them.

" After his Ordination he found his public appearances in the pulpit and in the solemn ceremonies at St. Cuthbert's made such demands on his nervous energy as to leave him weak afterwards. But he was always willing, and he never complained. A life of reparation was to cost him dear in sacrifice.

However, he found happiness in visiting the homes of parishioners. As someone said: " He was always on the road." Many parishioners in St. Cuthbert's and St. Mark's can testify to that.

" But his chief apostolate was in the care of the old and of the physically and mentally sick in hospitals. In the hospitals and homes of this parish his name became a byword for compassion and dedication. He contrasted his aged mother, surrounded by family loving care, with the aged in hospital who had no family who would look after them. And his heart went out to them in sympathy. In very active measure his charity expressed itself in mercy, in putting himself in the sufferer's position and feeling their sufferings as his own; he became involved in their sorrows and worries as if they were his own. And in this mercy he found the inspiration to continue reparation in his dedication to the sick. Many of those who recovered their health found it easier to praise him in tears rather than in words. Many who were helped to a happy death will have already welcomed him to their company.

" He said: ' I may have lost a few; but it was not for want of trying'; for he suffered profoundly from the possibility of anyone not repenting of sin. ' By God's grace, as far as I know, in God's sight, I am ready.'

" And God met him in the hospital where so much of his reparation had been offered and called him to Himself.

" Father McKeesick would be the very last to allow me to end this inadequate appreciation of his priesthood without a prayer—a prayer for continual remembrance of him before the altar of God. ' Have pity on me, have pity on me, at least you my friends, for the hand of the Lord is upon me.' "

### **Rev. Roger McCauley — 3rd April, 1969.**

Roger McCauley was born in Co. Mayo, Ireland, on 27th March, 1904. He was educated in St. Muredach's College, Ballina, and in St. Peter's College, Wexford.

Father McCauley was ordained by Right Rev. William Codd, Bishop of Ferns, on 7th June, 1928. On coming to Glasgow he took up an appointment as curate in St. Peter's, Partick, where he served until 1939, when he was transferred to St. Mary's, Saltcoats. He stayed in Saltcoats until the autumn of 1940, when he went on sick leave. He returned to his native Ireland and there he remained till his death. May he rest in peace.

**Very Rev. Francis Canon Meaney — 17th May, 1969**

Canon Meaney died on the 17th May, 1969, in the Bon Secours Hospital, Cork. A few days earlier he had gone there for an operation.

Canon Meaney was born in Kildysart, Co. Clare, seventy-six years ago. After primary school at home, he came to Blairs College, Aberdeen, in 1908, to begin his studies for the priesthood. Here he developed a love for learning and his flair for languages. He became a very good footballer as well, though his contemporaries describe him as "a very hard player." On completing the course at Blairs, he was sent to France, in 1913, to be trained by the Sulpicians. The first two years were at Avignon, where he acquired a love for history and architecture, as he followed the Philosophy Course. Then he came to Paris, to Issy-les-Moulineaux, for the Theology Course, and at the same time became most interested in Canon Law. Here his extraordinary memory found full play—he could quote "chapter, verse and number" from Canon Law in later discussions. His last year in France was spent at Rue du Regard, and on the 29th June, 1918, he was ordained priest by Cardinal Amette in the Church of St. Sulpice.

His first appointment in his adopted diocese was to St. Andrew's, Dumfries, where he was noted for his forthright manner. But after only two years his health gave grave cause for anxiety so he was sent to South Africa to recuperate. The climate proved most beneficial and so he returned to Britain, but not yet to the rigours of Scotland. For a short time he acted as chaplain to a convent near Plymouth, followed by a spell in London, in a parish near London Bridge.

On return to Scotland, Father Meaney went on loan to the Archdiocese of Glasgow, where he served under the famous Father Stack, in Cambuslang. Then in May, 1928, he was appointed curate in St. Margaret's, Ayr. He remained here for seven years, assisting first Canon Woods and then Mgr. McHardy, who was appointed to St. Margaret's in February, 1932. Prestwick at this time was served from Ayr. Father Meaney was especially active in co-operation with Mgr. McHardy in developing and preparing Prestwick for the day when it would be a separate parish. Finding accommodation for the weekly Sunday Mass could pose quite a problem, especially in the summer when the congregation was more than trebled—now in the Town Hall—now in the Public School—or again in the Co-operative Hall—but always he managed to find a place. Money-raising for the building of a Church-Hall always had his whole-hearted support and attention, leading to the opening, in 1933, of the new parish.

In July, 1935, Father Meaney was appointed parish priest of St. Paul's, Hurlford. He gave himself to his new duties with zeal and energy which were very necessary, since his predecessor had been in very poor health for many years. Father Meaney is still remembered by the older men for his clear-cut and valuable lectures on the social encyclicals of the popes. His exposition and explanations of these valuable documents left a lasting impression.

In 1938, Father Meaney was transferred to take charge of St. Francis Xavier's, Waterside, where he continued his good work for six years until, in 1944, he went to St. Cuthbert's, Maybole. While at Maybole, he was appointed to the Chapter of the Diocese on 11th May, 1955, and installed on 2nd February of the following year by Rt. Rev. Joseph McGee. By the end of that year, he was asked to take over the post of secretary to the Chapter, a post he held until his retirement on 30th May, 1963. For several years his health had not been too robust and his eyesight began to trouble him. He had always been conscious and worried about the state of his health because of his earlier illness. So he retired and went to live in a home, run by the Sisters of Mercy at Clonakilty, Co. Cork. Here he settled down very well to enjoy six years of peace and ease. He was always pleased to receive visitors, especially priests, from Scotland and the Diocese of Galloway, to get the latest news of his friends. In this respect, Mgr. Kennedy, V.G., was most faithful and attentive.

On 29th June, 1968, Canon Meaney celebrated the Golden Jubilee of his Ordination. This great event was not allowed to pass unnoticed by his friends and fellow-priests in Galloway. A presentation fund was organised and Father Burke, a native of Cork, was deputed and gladly consented to be the bearer of a gift and good wishes to the Jubilarian on behalf of the canons and priests of the diocese.

In May of the following year the canon fell ill, and was taken to the Bon Secours Hospital in the City of Cork, where he underwent an operation. A few days later, however, on Saturday, 17th May, 1969, he died after receiving the last rites. His remains were taken to his home town, Kildysart, Co. Clare, where they were received by the parish priest, Very Rev. Timothy Daly. The Requiem Mass was celebrated in the church of his native parish on Tuesday, 20th May, 1969, at which Canon Matthew Littleton, St. Joseph's, Kilmarnock, represented Bishop McGee, the chapter and the diocese. May he rest in peace.

#### **Rev. Patrick Clarke — 11th July, 1969.**

The Rev. Patrick Clarke was born at Wishaw on the 21st February 1892, of a family prominent and respected in the Catholic community of that town. His desire to become a priest was carefully fostered by the parish priest of St. Ignatius', Wishaw, Father Joseph Van Hecke a Belgian priest whose name will always be held in benediction, not least for the number of young men he inspired to follow a vocation to the priesthood. Patrick Clarke entered St. Mary's College, Blairs in August 1907 and, five years later, in 1912, he went to the Roya

Scots College in Valladolid, where after the usual studies he was ordained priest, on the 14th June, 1919, in the Cathedral of Valladolid by the Right Rev. Peter Segura Sáenz, the bishop-auxiliary of that city.

When he came home to his native archdiocese, Father Clarke was appointed curate at St. Patrick's, Anderston, Glasgow. St. Patrick's, at that time, was in many ways the busiest parish in the city of Glasgow: its staff of seven priests were probably kept sane by the ebullient good humour of their popular senior curate, Father Andy Lynch, as they strove to attend to the needs of a Catholic population of over 12,000 souls, who could scarcely be squeezed into the ten Masses, celebrated every Sunday morning in their three churches, St. Patrick's, North Street, St. Bride's, Cheapside Street, and St. Martin's, Hill Street. Sundays were hectic but weekdays were almost as busy. The parochial average for marriages stood at over four per week, and the weekly average for baptisms would sometimes exceed fourteen per week. Sick calls and systematic pastoral visitation had a special urgency in those years when, due to deteriorating housing and under-nourishment, the incidence of disease, particularly tuberculosis, was high and, because of the general economic depression in the West of Scotland, countless families were dispirited by unemployment and so degraded by the resulting poverty and malnutrition that they were an easy prey to the busy exponents of atheistic communism. The religious supervision of three large schools needed more than usual care at that time when the Church was settling down to the new regime of the 1918 Education Act. Few evenings were free from the never-ending task of directing a whole litany of sodalities, societies and clubs and the clergy of St. Patrick's, moreover, had general responsibility for the welfare of Catholic seamen of many nationalities among the docks which formed the southern boundary of the parish.

Father Clarke threw himself wholeheartedly into this busy life. In fact he added to it by founding in the parish, in May 1921, the first Catholic Scout Troop in the Archdiocese of Glasgow. His early training in this bustling parish influenced the remainder of his active years and was evident in his steady, methodical and cheerful attention to duty. It was a strenuous life and the strain probably sowed the seeds of that heart weakness which clouded the later years of his life.

In 1929 he was transferred to the more tranquil parish of Holy Cross at Crosshill to assist the grand old man of that parish, Canon William O'Brien, who was then on the point of retiring through ill health after a pastoral ministry of forty-one years, during which he had built up a thriving congregation, equipped with schools, halls, a presbytery and a magnificent church. The new parish priest at Crosshill was Bishop Grey Graham: Father Clarke's esteem for Bishop Graham was only equal to the Bishop's sincere regard for his hard-working and very competent senior curate.

In the clerical changes made in the summer of 1938, Father Clarke was assigned temporarily to the staff of St. Peter's, Partick, pending his appointment as a parish priest. At St. Peter's, as elsewhere, the other clergy of the parish found him an agreeable and considerate

colleague and they regretted his departure, early in 1939, to take up duties as parish priest of St. Mary's, Largs.

For some time his usual vigorous health had been showing signs of being impaired and this condition was probably aggravated by the sudden change to the robust climate of the Ayrshire coast. He suffered a severe heart attack and, when he resumed his pastoral duties after the illness, the tempo of his activities was greatly reduced. In 1944 he was appointed to St. Mary's, Cleland, where, over a quarter of a century, his quiet devotion to the welfare of his parishioners won for him their deep loyalty and affection. It was in Cleland that he died on the 11th July, 1969. May he rest in peace.

### **Right Rev. Monsignor Duncan Provost MacLean—21st August, 1969**

Mgr. Duncan MacLean, parish priest of St. Mun's, Dunoon, and provost of the chapter of Argyll and the Isles, died in hospital in Glasgow on 21st August, 1969, a few days after his seventy-fifth birthday. A brief account of his life should be of interest to future generations of Scottish Catholics, to show how a typical Highland priest lived and worked in the years between the two world wars, and the personal contribution of this individual priest to Catholic life in the Highlands.

Duncan MacLean was one of a large family, born in Craigston in the island of Barra. His father had a croft, and was also the local tailor. He went to the local school until he was fifteen, and as there were only two teachers to cater for children of all ages there could be nothing of secondary education as we know it today. He had to start at the age of five to learn to read and write a foreign language, when he could not yet read his own, but by the time he was fifteen an intelligent and serious child in such a school, although lacking knowledge of Latin or science, had a thorough knowledge of English, was completely bilingual, was probably more familiar than most boys of his age with the English classics, and had been drilled in the discipline of studying for himself. He had moreover a good grounding in religious knowledge.

He entered Blairs in 1909 and went on to the Scots College in Rome in 1915. Shortly afterwards he volunteered for war service, and spent a year with the R.A.M.C. But his health was not good, and he returned to Rome to complete his studies. He was ordained priest in the Lateran Basilica on 15th April, 1922, by Cardinal Pompili. After short periods as curate in Dunoon, Rothesay and Roy Bridge, he was appointed to his first charge in 1925. It was in Laggan, Inverness-shire.

The church of St. Michael in Laggan no longer exists. It had never been the centre of a populous parish. It was built by Bishop Scott on the site of an old chapel, because he failed to get any other site in Badenoch. Perhaps no other site would have been any more convenient. The Catholics were few and scattered over a huge area. In Father MacLean's time there were only about thirty within the distance of a good long walk from the church, and only about eighty in the whole parish. Almost nine hundred feet above sea level, the roads were often blocked in winter and he might not see any of his people

for weeks at a time. The cold was intense; there was no heating in the church, and the water would freeze in the cruets. In summer he might expect a congregation of twenty or so, but in winter only five or six if any at all. Mass was said every third Sunday in an ordinary dwelling house in Kingussie for a slightly larger congregation. A young priest could not be expected to remain in such eremitical circumstances for more than a few years, although one young priest in the last century spent the first twenty-three years of his priesthood there! Father MacLean was the last to live at Laggan. When he left in 1928 his successors made Kingussie the centre of the parish.

His next parish was Bornish in South Uist, where he had hardships of a different kind. The people were very poor, living on a diet of porridge and milk, potatoes and fish (when they could get it), and oatcakes and barley bannocks. Meat was had as an occasional luxury. Very little money passed through their hands—just what they could earn by selling one or two stirks and a few sheep at the sales twice a year, or by gathering kelp and shell-fish on the shore. The priest's income was meagre; the "seat rents" were 2/6d. per person per half-year, and a Sunday collection was usually less than £2. Of course the people kept him supplied with food and fuel, and he was probably slightly better off than some of his predecessors, and no worse off than his neighbouring priests. It was the common lot at that time. He worked his glebe and kept a flock of sheep. At one time he experimented by introducing Cheviots in the hope of increasing the yield, but because of the climate he had to abandon this and revert to the hardy, black-faced breed. He needed money for the renovation of church and house. St. Mary's was another of Bishop Scott's buildings, almost a hundred years old. It was a long chapel with the little house attached at one end, damp and dilapidated beyond repair. As times gradually improved he succeeded in building a fine house some distance from the church, hoping to build a new church nearby. But the war came, prices soared, and after the war his successors decided to completely renovate the old church, which stands today as one of the most beautiful churches of its size in the West Highlands.

Life was hard, but it had its compensations. The people were excellent Catholics, devoted to the church and to their priest. If they did not receive the sacraments more than twice or three times in the year it was certainly not because they were indifferent to their religion. In remote parts of the islands those who were unable to travel would welcome the priest when he came to say Mass for them occasionally; the rest of the year they were content to pray as their fathers had prayed since the penal times when there were no priests. Liturgical ideas were primitive, perhaps, by standards of Vatican II. Their "entrance procession" was often a long trek over bog and rocks to the distant church; they may not have known what an "offertory antiphon" is, but they brought with them food for the priest's table and fuel for his comfort; the Mass and the altar were the centre of their prayers even if perforce these prayers were said at home in Gaelic more often than they were heard in church in Latin. This must be said, to explain why priests of the generation and

experience of Mgr. MacLean sometimes are slow to understand all that is implied in modern liturgical changes, and are always greatly saddened when they hear anyone speak disdainfully of the liturgy of the past. He himself did all he could to make the ceremonies in church as correct as possible. He performed the Holy Week ceremonies carefully, even though it meant bringing altar servers and choir members from considerable distances for rehearsal: on Maundy Thursday he would have High Mass—a rare event in the Isles.

His interest in Gaelic began at school, and in his first parish he took classes for learners. But in Bornish he started seriously on the work of translation. He translated into Gaelic the Catechism of Christian Doctrine that was used in schools throughout the country, because he considered the old Gaelic catechism inadequate. This is a matter that is often disputed; some teachers welcomed it, but others considered that the abstract theology and the difficult Gaelic expressions required for the translation made it too hard for the children to learn. Be that as it may, no-one would grudge credit to Father MacLean for the work he put into it. He translated some of the popular English hymns for use in the church. In later years with the new approach to catechetics he produced in Gaelic the first books of the new Scottish catechism.

Father MacLean played his part also in local government, as a member of the old Parish Council, later of the District Council and Inverness County Council. He was later to be for many years on the Argyll County Education Committee, and religious inspector of schools. In 1940 he was appointed to the neighbouring parish of Daliburgh, and in 1941 he went to Dunoon as Canon MacLean. He now had little time for his studies of Gaelic and Highland history. For some years he was alone in that busy parish and in later years his health caused great trouble. He had never been robust, but the damp climate of Bornish had caused chronic chest trouble, and for years he suffered the pain of duodenal ulcers. Nevertheless, besides his parish work in Dunoon he accomplished other things. He renovated the church, adding the lady chapel and installing a new high altar. He bought the house next to the church, renovated it and added a new wing to form the present presbytery.

In 1963, after years of preparation, he produced the eighth edition of the Gaelic prayer book, "Iul a' Chriosdaidh." This book of devotions was first composed by Rev. Evan MacEachen at the beginning of the last century, and edited and first published by Rev. Ranaid Rankin. In the new edition Mgr. MacLean completely revised it, added such things as the epistles and gospels for each Sunday in the year, and brought it completely up to date. Alas, a prayer book or catechism does not remain up to date for long these days, but this book will serve Gaelic Catholics who still find a book helpful in their private devotions. In 1964 under his direction was produced the Gaelic translation of the Roman Ritual, and in 1965 he gave considerable assistance to the committee of priests and teachers who prepared the Gaelic missal. It is a tremendous task that the Gaelic church has

undertaken, to keep abreast with liturgical changes and still retain their native language as the language of divine worship.

Canon MacLean was rewarded for his services to the Church by the title of Domestic Prelate by His Holiness Pope John. His latter years were years of reasonably good health, and his final illness struck suddenly while he was visiting South Uist. He was taken to Glasgow and died after only a few weeks. His funeral was conducted by His Lordship Bishop MacPherson in St. Mun's, Dunoon. The Bishop preached a moving tribute to this good priest, and most of the diocesan clergy were present to accompany his remains to the grave in the local cemetery. As to his character, it is enough to say that he was a good priest. By nature he was quiet, amusing and easily amused. He was kindly, tolerant of the failings of others but always correct in his own behaviour. He was revered by his people, and perhaps the feelings of his fellow-priests are best displayed by the nickname they gave him with great respect and affection: "An Criosdaidh." *Gu'n robh fhois ann an sith.*

#### **Rev. Charles Bonnyman Redmond — 6th September, 1969**

Rev. Charles B. Redmond was born at Port Gordon, Banffshire, on the 17th August, 1918. He was of a family that had played its part in maintaining the traditional Catholicism of the Enzie of Banffshire for several generations: his two uncles were Canon Peter Bonnyman of Glasgow and Father James Bonnyman of Aberdeen. He went to Blairs in 1933 and, his classical studies completed, he went to the French colleges at Issy and Orleans. The fall of France in the Second World War interrupted his studies and he returned home to complete his course at St. Peter's College, Bearsden, and, finally, on 5th March, 1944, he was ordained by Bishop George Bennett at Aberdeen.

Father Redmond's early years as a priest included some months in hospital for, by the time of his ordination, he had fallen victim to one of the prevalent maladies of the 1940's, tuberculosis. Considering his poor health, it is remarkable how great an impact he made upon the ecclesiastical scene and this was largely due to his zest for life and for genuine friendship with all he met in with. Two years, 1946 to 1948, were spent as curate at St. Mary's, Inverness. From 1948 to 1952, he was in charge of the scattered Donside mission of Fetternear and acted as chaplain to the Catholic students at Aberdeen University, where his personality and novel approach to traditional questions had a deep and lasting effect on the students. In 1953, he was appointed to St. Mary's, Stonehaven, and apart from a couple of prolonged visits to Arizona in an effort to recuperate his health, he was to remain here as parish priest. It was at Stonehaven that his most characteristic work was achieved. The tiny congregation at Stonehaven grew accustomed to new departures in liturgical activity and to new relationships with other Christian congregations in the town. Father Redmond had a strong sense of the value of publicity and from time to time what happened in St. Mary's, Stonehaven, was duly described in the national press, gradually conditioning men's minds to the far-reaching changes of the 1960's. That of course was

only part of Father Redmond's activities. The Catholic parish of Stonehaven covered a wide countryside and included the large installations of Royal Air Force and American services personnel at Bervie and Edzell. Servicemen and their families who were attached to these places remember the unsparing efforts of Father Redmond to cater for their spiritual needs. But it was an unequal struggle and when he returned last year from a second spell in the milder climate of Arizona his health had become so precarious that he had to retire and live with his brother in Liverpool. It was there that he died on 6th September, 1969. His Lordship, Bishop Foylan of Aberdeen, accompanied by Canon Alexander MacWilliam of St. Peter's, Aberdeen, and several other priests of the diocese, celebrated Requiem Mass for Father Redmond in the Holy Name Church, Liverpool, on Thursday, 11th September: their long journey to be present at the Requiem being an eloquent tribute of affection for an esteemed colleague and an expression of admiration for a remarkably courageous life. May he rest in peace.

**Very Rev. Thomas Canon Davitt — 29th September, 1969**

The Very Rev. Thomas Canon Davitt, parish priest of St. Mary's, Bathgate, died on Monday, 29th September, 1969, at Drumkeerin, Co. Leitrim, where he had been on holiday. At the Requiem Mass, which was celebrated in St. Mary's Church, Bathgate, on Friday, 3rd October, the following panegyric was delivered by the Right Rev. Monsignor James Monaghan, Vicar General of the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh.

"As we offer this Requiem for the repose of the soul of the late parish priest of Bathgate, the text of Scripture that comes most forcibly before my mind as the most suitable for Thomas Canon Davitt are the words used by Our Lord about his disciple, Nathaniel: 'Behold an Israelite, in whom there is no guile.'

"Throughout his forty-three years as a priest, Canon Davitt was never in any doubt as to what his priesthood *meant*. For him, it was very simply a matter of service of God and service of God's people. He had no pretensions, no high-blown theories, and yet he was without any doubt a specialist—a specialist in the priesthood who knew exactly what he was ordained for, and by his serene and happy nature proved to all who came his way, just how happy he was as a priest.

"Thomas Davitt was born in Edinburgh on May 28th, 1899. As a boy he attended the old St. Columba's Primary School and Holy Cross Academy, before going to Blairs to study for the priesthood. He was fifteen years of age when the First World War began, and when he came to the age for the call-up, he had no hesitation in offering his services for the defence of his country. He was wounded, and spent a long time in hospital. When he came out, with the war over, he continued his studies for the priesthood. The experience in the army and on the battlefield had not deflected him from his ambition, but rather confirmed him in his resolve. He went to the Scots College,

Rome, where he was ordained a priest on May 2nd, 1926. After a few months as curate in St. Patrick's, Edinburgh, he was appointed to St. Mary's, Bathgate, in October, 1927. Though he spent only two and a half years as curate here, that period of his life is well remembered by the older parishioners for the amount of work and the impression he made in that comparatively short time. He went then as parish priest to Bo'ness until his appointment as parish priest of Bathgate in November, 1939. Need we say that he received a warm welcome on his return. Practically all his priestly life therefore was spent in West Lothian and thirty-two and a half years of it in Bathgate. In June of 1958 he was appointed to the Metropolitan Cathedral Chapter of St. Andrews and Edinburgh.

"The large congregation that attended the ceremonies yesterday evening, when his remains were carried into the church from his beloved Lady Chapel, and the large numbers here today from so many walks in life, are an indication of the high regard in which the canon was held. He was a friend to all and delighted in being friendly. He was never overawed by authority and yet always showed the greatest deference and consideration for superiors. It is hard to believe that only a few short months ago he was proud and happy to be among those who made the journey to Rome to be present at the historic ceremonies when our archbishop was elevated to the College of Cardinals.

"That he was a friend to every priest, young or old, secular or religious, was something we all knew. One recalls his friendship and work for the White Fathers when they came to this diocese.

"If the people of Bathgate are known, as they are, for their reverence for the priesthood, shown in the way you support the diocesan seminary, and by your fostering of vocations and zeal for the missions, it is because the canon was so enthusiastic and so hard working for these causes himself.

"He considered it as amongst his first duties to encourage young lads to go on for the priesthood and was very proud of his students. We who were ordained from this parish, recall with gratitude his interest, before and after ordination.

"Those who will miss his calming influence most, are of course, you his parishioners. All can recall his many acts of kindness. It was not enough for him to fulfil his duty. He just loved to give that little extra thoughtful touch that makes all the difference between cold duty and warm human sympathy. None of us can ever forget his kindness, especially in times of sickness and trial when he was such a source of strength and comfort.

"Every home in this parish must feel that it has lost a spiritual father and friend who succeeded in attaining that ideal of the priesthood: he became a member of every family.

"To speak about Canon Davitt and not refer to his love of the children, his gift of communicating with them, and their ready response to him, would be to omit one of his quite remarkable qualities.

"In the public life of Bathgate and the County of West Lothian, he played a very active part, so that he earned the respect, not only of his parishioners, but of all the community. For over twenty years he carried the onerous responsibility of representing the Church on the Education Committee of West Lothian.

"When we think of Canon Davitt, we will always remember the marvellous example he gave us of the priestly life; of a boundless practical charity—did anyone ever hear him say a critical word about anybody?; of thoughtfulness and of an almost inexhaustible patience.

"As he lived so he died; to those gathered around his bed at the home of his friends in Ireland, he said: 'I know I am dying, I am quite happy to die.' Happy in life, he was happy to die when His Master called him. He looks to us now for the help that we can give by our Masses and prayers. May he rest in peace."

### **Rev. Joseph Sheary — 30th October, 1969**

The widespread regret felt throughout the West of Scotland at the tragic death in a car crash on the 30th October, 1969, of the Rev. Joseph Sheary, parish priest, St. Fergus', Paisley, was reflected in the services of his obsequies. His remains were received at St. Brigid's, Toryglen—a few hundred yards from the scene of the accident—by his brother, Rev. Patrick Sheary, who was the principal concelebrant of the Mass of All Saints which followed. Bishop Ward, Vicar General of Glasgow, presided.

The following evening, in exceptionally heavy rain, the remains were met at the boundary of his parish of St. Fergus by parishioners, who joined the cortege to the church. The dirge on the eve of the funeral and the funeral Mass had to be relayed to the overflow congregation in the nearby church hall. Bishop McGill offered a Pontifical Mass of Requiem, with eight concelebrants, who included his brother, Rev. Patrick Sheary, Toryglen, and his two nephews, Rev. John J. Sheary, Kinning Park, and Rev. John Sheary, Bishopbriggs. Archbishop Scanlan of Glasgow presided in the sanctuary, accompanied by Bishop Ward of Sita. Representatives of the Glasgow, Motherwell and Galloway cathedral chapters joined the Paisley chapter in the front pews, with nearly two hundred priests from all over Scotland.

Bailie Francis Carlin headed the civic representatives from the Ferguslie ward, with ex-Provost Hutchison of Barrhead.

On the way to the Paisley diocesan cemetery of St. Conval, Barrhead, the cortege passed through the Burgh of Barrhead, where Father Sheary spent sixteen of his twenty-seven years in the priesthood. Bishop McGill officiated at the graveside in the priests' plot.

In his panegyric on Father Sheary, Bishop McGill spoke of him as "a loyal and obedient priest, with a big heart that loved all, devoted to his people, beloved by the children of Ferguslie, a man of faith who received strength to live up to the high ideals of the priesthood

by his devotion to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. He was a familiar figure in the church, with Mary's rosary in his hands—that same rosary now entwined his fingers in death."

Bishop McGill paid tribute to the Sheary family which gave three sons to the priesthood.

Reminding the congregation of Father Sheary's devotion to the souls in Purgatory and how the last thing he did before leaving his presbytery, minutes before his death, was to prepare a list of his own deceased relatives and friends in readiness for All Souls Day. Bishop McGill asked the St. Fergus' parishioners to keep their late pastor ever in their prayers.

Father Joseph Sheary was born in Nenagh, Co. Tipperary, on the 21st March, 1913, and was ordained for the former Archdiocese of Glasgow, at St. Peter's College, Wexford, in June, 1942. His first appointment was to St. Thomas', Riddrie. After some months he was transferred to St. Luke's, Glasgow, where he served for five years. In 1947 he went to St. Laurence's, Greenock. Three years later he was appointed to St. John's, Barrhead, where he was to spend the greater part of his priesthood—sixteen years. The previous year—1941—saw the disastrous fire which deprived Barrhead of its grand old church of St. John within months of almost attaining its centenary. Post World War Two economic difficulties, government restrictions on building projects made the restoring of St. John's seem far away. It was into this situation that Father Sheary arrived in Barrhead. His great facility for making friends was soon effective in his relations with the people and priests with whom he lived. His broad shoulders carried the burdens of the parish and with the advancing years and infirmity of Canon James H. Troy he assumed the parochial responsibilities. His big task was to prepare for the day when the rebuilding of St. John's Church would commence. He set himself to that challenge with unflinching energy. With Canon Troy's successor, Father—now Canon—Michael Teehan he was prominently identified with restoring St. John's in its new commanding location.

In May, 1966, he received his first parish—Christ the King, Howwood. In his two short years there he carried out extensive renovations to the presbytery, and adjustments to the church.

November, 1968, saw his appointment to St. Fergus', Ferguslie, Paisley. He was entrusted with the task of building a new St. Fergus' Church and, weeks before his death, had the plans passed by the Paisley Dean of Guild Court. He was instrumental in bringing to Ferguslie the Salesian Sisters to teach in St. Fergus' School and conduct youth clubs. He had the satisfaction of offering Mass in their temporary convent in a council house within the scheme.

In his eleven months' stay in Ferguslie, he endeared himself to all, young and old, irrespective of creed. He found himself welcomed into the homes of as many non-Catholics as Catholics—he knocked on the doors of all. Less than an hour before his tragic death he had been hearing confessions and afterwards was chatting with the pupils

of St. Fergus' School. If one could describe Father Sheary in the fashionable word *simpatico*, it is only half the answer. He was able, as few can, to make religion a happy experience, not only for his parishioners but for the many friends he made in all walks of life. That spirit of joy which he radiated surely had its source in a profound faith in his Divine Master. A former Barrhead parishioner wrote to him:

" Ah, how we shall miss your Good Mornings,  
Your wizard finance and your wiles,  
The solemn and wise pulpit-warnings,  
The charm of your mischievous smiles . . ."

Father Sheary's greatest pleasure was to be in the company of his brother priests. In any gathering he made his presence felt. Not only could he be seen in any company because of his tall stature, he could be heard by his infectious laughter. No company of priests was ever bored in the presence of "Big Father Joe"; he brought life and friendship to every clerical gathering. His humour and his exceptional physical strength will be remembered by all his priest friends.

His many friends, both clerical and lay, readily agree that Father Joseph Sheary exemplified in his own life the truth of the assertion: "A priest is the love of God in the world." May he rest in peace.

#### Rev. Peter J. Murphy — 31st October, 1969.

The Rev. Peter Joseph Murphy was born at Crosshill, Glasgow, on the 5th March, 1917, and was educated at the local parish school and at St. Aloysius' College, Glasgow. After completing his ecclesiastical training at St. Mary's College, Blairs, and St. Peter's College, Bearsden, he was ordained at Glasgow, on the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul, 1943, by the Right Rev. Donald A. Campbell, D.D., Bishop of Argyll and the Isles.

After ordination, Father Murphy was appointed curate at St. Margaret's, Airdrie, where for ten years he was deeply involved in all aspects of parochial activity, his special interest being shown in whatever affected the youth of the parish. This was followed by a five-year curacy at St. Francis Xavier's, Carfin, where he assisted the ageing parish priest, Monsignor Thomas N. Taylor, not only in the administration of a very lively parish but in the more specialised demands of Carfin Grotto with its numerous pilgrim-visitors. During these years he became widely known as a popular chaplain to the sick pilgrims in the annual Motherwell diocesan pilgrimages to Lourdes.

From 1958 to 1962, Father Murphy was parish priest successively at St. John's, Blackwood, and at Corpus Christi, Calderbank, and in addition he also held the post of national secretary of the Pontifical Society of St. Peter for Native Clergy.

In 1962, the Scottish Bishops set up a Catholic Child Care Office to co-ordinate the work of the various institutions and agencies which had come into existence to provide for the well-being of Catholic children in need of care. Father Murphy was appointed director of this work, with his office at first in Motherwell and latterly in the ex-presbytery of St. Michael's parish in Salamanca Street, Glasgow. His dedication to this social problem was noted beyond purely Catholic circles and, in 1963, he was invited to serve on the Scottish Advisory Council on Child Care.

There were many qualities in Father Murphy's nature which made him eminently suited to this work. Of a placid and happy disposition, he could listen with patience and kindness to the intricate social problems that came his way. His love of children and young people was unfeigned. He was not dismayed by the frustrations that sometimes beset activities which are organised through committees. And he had a capacity for administration which was above the ordinary. In addition he was motivated by a zeal for souls which was but a manifestation of his own deeply spiritual personal life.

Few people, except some intimate friends, knew that for some time Father Murphy was suffering from angina. He soldiered on, attending to his duties apparently as usual. On Friday, the 31st October, 1969, returning to Glasgow by train from a three-day conference on Child Care at Wetherby in Yorkshire, he collapsed on the journey. Father John Michael Turner, of the parish church of Our Lady and St. Joseph, met the train at Carlisle and administered the Last Rites and Father Murphy was taken by ambulance to the infirmary but was dead on arrival.

The Requiem Mass, which was celebrated on the 5th November, 1969, in Motherwell Cathedral, by Bishop Francis Thomson of Motherwell, was attended by the bishops of Glasgow, Paisley, Aberdeen and Galloway, together with about 200 of Father Murphy's fellow clergy of the Province of Glasgow, and there were present many representatives of Catholic and national Child Welfare organisations both from Scotland and England. May he rest in peace.

#### **Rev. Thomas P. McGregor — 2nd November, 1969**

The Rev. Thomas P. McGregor was born at Leith on the 27th April, 1901. He was educated at St. Mary's College, Blairs, the Royal Scots College, Valladolid, and St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny. He was ordained priest for the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh at the Cathedral, Ossory, on 30th May, 1926. He began work in his native Scotland as curate at St. Mary's, Longriggend. This parish was actually in the Archdiocese of Glasgow but, at that time, its pastoral charge extended to the isolated mission of Slamannan over the diocesan boundary and for this reason the young Edinburgh priest was seconded to this parish. The principal industry of the area was coal-mining and, at that time, "the Depression" had reached its most disastrous phase. The older inhabitants of the district still have vivid recollections of the efforts made by the parish priest. Father

Troy, and his young curate, Father McGregor, to keep this isolated rural community happy in the midst of the catastrophe. In 1929 Father McGregor spent several months as curate at St. Patrick's, Coatbridge, and after that he returned to his own archdiocese, acting as curate, for various periods of time, at St. Mary's, Haddington; St. Agatha's, Methil; St. Margaret's, Dunfermline. From 1937 to 1943 he acted as senior curate at St. Mary's Cathedral. This was followed by curacies at Falkirk and East Calder and in 1948 he went to Innerleithen as parish priest, where he remained until 1952. Two fairly brief appointments as parish priest of Whitburn and of Peebles were followed, in 1954, by his retirement from active pastoral work because of the ill-health that he had never quite succeeded in shaking off. For some months he had been a patient in the Victoria Infirmary in Glasgow and it was there that he died on Sunday, 2nd November, 1969. May he rest in peace.

#### **Very Rev. Philip Canon Murphy — 6th November, 1969**

The Very Rev. Philip Canon Murphy was born at East Calder on the 6th September, 1895. His studies for the priesthood were conducted at St. Mary's College, Blairs, and at the Propaganda Fide College, in Rome, and it was in Rome, at the Lateran Basilica, that he was ordained priest on the 3rd April, 1920.

Father Murphy's first appointment, when he returned home to Scotland, was as curate to the well-known Father John Gray at St. Peter's, Falcon Avenue, Edinburgh. Here he remained until 1923, when he was transferred to the busier city parish of St. Patrick's, where he spent several months before his appointment to the Sacred Heart, Penicuik, to assist Father John D. Wood. In 1926, he received his first independent charge at Polmont, transferring in 1929 to Camelon and finally, in 1936, he moved to St. Martin's, Tranent, where he was to spend the last thirty-three years of his life. All of these parishes were small, struggling places, at that time, with very limited resources and Canon Murphy's life, humanly speaking, was never easy. He was, however, a dedicated man, well prepared by the ascetic training of the college at Blairs and the missionary college in Rome to labour for his people with no thought of personal comfort.

From the beginning of his pastoral charge of St. Martin's, Canon Murphy and his congregation set their hearts upon the building of a new church which would be adequate for their needs and worthy of the town. It was a project which had to be postponed time and again and when it did begin to take shape the Canon was already a sick man. He accepted without a murmur the inconvenience of living in accommodation, improvised out of the old Drill Hall, while building operations were under way, and when the new church was finally opened on 2nd October, 1969, by Cardinal Gray, Canon Murphy was by now a very ill man, but he left his sick-bed to take part in the solemn opening of the new church and his gratitude to God was sincere and humble. This was to be the Canon's *Nunc Dimittis*. A month later, on the 6th November, 1969, he was dead and the

crowded congregation of priests and people that thronged St. Martin's church for the Requiem Mass on Saturday, 8th November—the first Requiem in the new church—showed how sincerely the Canon was mourned by the clergy of the archdiocese, by his parishioners and by the townsfolk of Tranent in general. May he rest in peace.

**Very Rev. Thomas Patrick Canon Kelly — 7th December, 1969**

Canon Thomas Patrick Kelly was a Carlow man. He was born on 26th November, 1897, at Ballyine, Borris, Co. Carlow. He was educated at St. Patrick's College, Carlow, and was ordained to the priesthood, in 1925, in Carlow Cathedral.

In 1925 he came to serve in the Archdiocese of Glasgow and was appointed to St. Peter's, Partick. He spent twenty years in that parish, under three parish priests, Canon Michael McNairney, Father James Clarke and Monsignor Mullin. These were strenuous years. It was a parish which gave an unusual variety of experience and made a variety of demands on the clergy. It was a populous parish covering a wide section of the city of Glasgow between Great Western Road and the River Clyde: it embraced the whole range of social conditions, from the wealthy mansions of Dowanhill and Hyndland through street upon street of solid, reliable, honest-to-God working class families, down to a congested fringe along the shipyards and docks of the river, which in some parts, was slum property of appalling character.

The large Catholic population—over 10,000 souls—in this extensive and varied parish were provided with parish societies and confraternities of many kinds; there were two large parochial schools and, within the boundaries of the parish, there was the immense Hospital for Sick Children and there was also the Western Infirmary, one of the largest and busiest hospitals in the country. It was an exacting parish where all the staff of six priests had to pull their weight. Father Kelly never shirked his duty and was ever conscientious in the visitation of his large district and in the supervision of the societies of which he had charge. The times were not very cheerful. The bulk of the parishioners were dependent on the shipbuilding industry and on the docks and, during the inter-war depression, these had almost ceased providing employment. When the depression passed, it was only to make way for the Second World War, when the ever-recurring loss of ships by the navy and the merchant fleet invariably brought bereavement to many homes in the parish. Father Kelly's work lay mainly with the Boys' School and the young lads of the parish, the Squires, the Boy Scouts and especially the Boys' Guild, and it was in this section of the population that the casualties were most frequent and heart-breaking. Father Kelly went about his duties with courage and cheerfulness and humility. He embarked on many schemes to combat the soul-destroying effects of unemployment and, later, the bleakness of civilian life during the war. His Boys' Guild Camps were a much appreciated event each summer and the Sunday Night Concerts that he organised during the winter months, in the

parochial hall, were a constant drain on his time and energy but, for many people in the parish, these gatherings offered one period of brightness and relaxation in the drabness of each week. But always Father Kelly continued to be a man of the countryside. The noise and stir of city life were alien to him and, once a week, whenever it was possible, he would go off for a few hours into the quietness of the country. This "day-off," one remembers, consisted of taking a tramcar to the outskirts of the city, walking out by the country roads, which were free of traffic in those days, as far as Carbeth, where he would have a simple meal in a tea-room and then walk back to Hyndland Street.

In 1945 he was appointed parish priest at St. Mary's, Longriggend. Here, he was in the countryside and he loved it, but the problems had not been left behind in the city. The small village of Longriggend was by that time a dying community. The coal mines were closing down: families were drifting away to other employment in other areas: new houses were being built for the remaining population in Caldercruix, some four miles away. Plans had to be made for the eventual transfer of the church and presbytery to the new centre and, in the meantime, Father Kelly with his usual geniality and energy tried to keep parochial life running with vigour and enthusiasm; the parishioners, especially the older generation, upset and bewildered by the impending changes, were grateful for his understanding and leadership in those trying days.

In 1950 the Old Monkland district of Coatbridge was the scene of an extensive housing development. Father Kelly was asked to go there and undertake the formation of the new parish of St. Monica. A temporary presbytery was secured in a council house at 5 Peel Place. It was no easy matter organising the new parish, which started off with 1,600 parishioners in 1950: within a year it had 3,400 and by 1952 the Catholic population was over the 5,000 mark. In spite of this rapid increase of the Catholic population in the area of Old Monkland, Father Kelly made it his business to visit each newly-arrived family, welcome them to the district and discuss with them his hopes and plans for the development of the new parish. In 1952 he had to get the help of two curates. The accommodation at Peel Place was strained beyond endurance; it had to be used for many purposes, for committee meetings, interviewing parishioners who came with their problems and, with the addition of two curates, the situation became a nightmare for the parish priest and for his patient house-keeper. There was not a spare inch in the place and visitors will remember that, for sick calls, the Blessed Sacrament was reserved, for want of better accommodation, in a makeshift tabernacle at the top of the stairs.

It was a frustrating time for church builders and the worries of the enterprise made serious inroads into Father Kelly's once robust health. The outcome of all the planning was the erection of the parochial complex whose main feature is the large and beautiful church of St. Monica, opened in 1957, and the well integrated Catholic community which together make St. Monica's one of the foremost parishes in the

Diocese of Motherwell. Canon Kelly (he had been appointed a Canon in 1963) was proud of his parish and, in spite of failing health, he was happy to serve its people literally right to the end of his life. On Sunday evening, 7th December, 1969, he was invited to take part in a function to honour a neighbouring parish priest, who had been his first curate in the pioneering days at St. Monica's. Possibly he felt unwell but, rather than disappoint the parishioners and his fellow clergy, Canon Kelly made it his duty to be present and address the gathering and, in making the effort to do so, he collapsed and died. Holy Writ has its own praise for the man who is "simple and upright and God-fearing": such was Canon Thomas Patrick Kelly. May he rest in peace.

### **Rev. Thomas Edward Gallagher — 21st December, 1969**

Sadness filled the hearts of the congregation at St. John's, Fauldhouse, on Sunday, 21st December, 1969, when Canon Roger Gallagher announced that he had just received, by phone, news of the sudden death, at Bournemouth, of his predecessor, the retired parish priest of Fauldhouse, Father Thomas E. Gallagher.

The Rev. Thomas Edward Gallagher, was born at Derrygonnelly, Co. Fermanagh, on the 29th September, 1911. Educated at St. Macartan's, Monaghan, and at St. Kieran's, Kilkenny, he was ordained at St. Mary's Cathedral, Kilkenny, on the 9th June, 1935. He came to Scotland in that year and took up pastoral duties in the archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, first at St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh, where, for eight years, from 1935 to 1943, he served as curate under the kindly and experienced administrator, Monsignor Patrick McGettigan, V.G.

In 1943, Father Gallagher was transferred as parish priest to Our Lady, Star of the Sea at North Berwick and, after five years in that appointment, he was given charge of the congregation of St. John the Baptist's, Fauldhouse. For the best part of two decades, Father Gallagher devoted himself to the welfare of the Catholics of Fauldhouse. In 1960, the celebration of his sacerdotal Silver Jubilee was a great family occasion for the congregation and, in that same year, the consecration of the parish church of St. John the Baptist underlined the unity of the parish and the mutual regard of priest and people.

More recently, Father Gallagher succumbed to ill health and, in 1967, much against his personal inclinations, he decided that, for the good of the people, he must retire from active service. The two years of his retirement were spent at St. Joseph's Convent, Bournemouth, where he continued by correspondence and by visits from parishioners to maintain a keen interest in the welfare of his friends at Fauldhouse. He was called to his reward suddenly on Sunday, 21st December, 1969. May he rest in peace.

# APPENDIX I

## ECCLESIASTICAL LAWS AND OBSERVANCES

### 1. EASTER DUTIES

The Faithful of Scotland are authorised to satisfy the obligation of the Paschal Communion on any day from Ash Wednesday to Trinity Sunday. (S.C.C.: 11th Oct., 1946.)

### 2. FAST AND ABSTINENCE DAYS

By the Papal constitution "Paenitemini," binding from Ash Wednesday, 23rd February, 1966, the ecclesiastical law on fasting and abstinence was completely re-stated.

All the faithful are bound by the divine law of penance.

Lent still has its penitential character. The obligatory days of penance are all Fridays and Ash Wednesday. Their substantial observance is a matter of grave obligation.

Abstinence binds on all Fridays which are not holidays of obligation.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence.

Meat is prohibited by the abstinence law, but not eggs, milk foods and condiments from the fat of animals.

On a fast day only one full meal may be taken, but some food is allowed morning and evening in the quantity and quality determined by approved local custom.

The law of abstinence binds all who have completed their fourteenth year; the law of fasting binds all who have completed their twenty-first year and not yet entered their sixtieth year. Pastors and parents should see that those who are under age are trained in a true sense of penance.

Episcopal Conferences may, for a just cause, transfer a day of penance, taking account of the period of Lent. They may substitute other forms of penance, especially works of charity and exercises of piety, for fast and abstinence. Decisions of Episcopal Conferences in the matter should be reported to the Holy See.

A Bishop can dispense from these laws by the power he has from the conciliar decree on the Pastoral Duty of Bishops. A parish priest, for a just cause and within the regulations of Ordinaries, can dispense from fast and abstinence or commute the obligation into another pious work for individuals or families. A superior of a clerical religious society or institute can do likewise for his subjects.

Bishops and pastors should diligently promote more frequent use of the sacrament of penance and also extraordinary works of penance

for expiation or impetration, especially during Lent. The faithful are urged to fill their minds with the Christian penitential outlook so that they may be more ready to practise works of penance and charity.

### 3. NEW REGULATIONS ABOUT THE EUCCHARISTIC FAST

The law of eucharistic fast was changed by the Apostolic Constitution "Christus Dominus," 6th January, 1953, and further modified by the *Motu Proprio* "Sacram Communionem," 19th March, 1957.

On 21st November, 1964, a new law was made: "Having considered the difficulties of many regions about the eucharistic fast, the Supreme Pontiff, graciously acceding to the request of bishops, grants that the fast from solid food for priests and faithful shall be reduced to one hour before the reception of Holy Communion. This concession refers also to the moderate use of alcoholic liquids."

From the *Motu Proprio* of 1957, the sick, even though not confined to bed, may take non-alcoholic liquids or genuine medicine, liquid or solid, at any time before celebrating Mass or receiving Holy Communion.

### 4. MARRIAGES

Before a marriage is celebrated, it must be certain that nothing stands in the way of its valid and licit celebration. (Code of Canon Law, Canon 1019, par. 1.)

The parish priest whose right it is to assist at the marriage must, at a suitable time beforehand, carefully investigate whether there is any obstacle to the celebration of the marriage. (Canon 1020, par. 1.)

The rules to be followed by the parish priest in making this investigation, given in an instruction of the Sacred Congregation of the Sacraments, 29th June, 1941, and modified for Scotland by a rescript of the same Congregation, 24th November, 1947, must be carefully observed in every case.

**Celebration of Marriage with Mass.** The marriage is celebrated after the homily which follows the gospel. This homily is obligatory. As a homily the address on pp. 19-21 of Messrs. Gill's pamphlet may be read. The nuptial blessing is always to be given, even in the closed seasons, and even if either or both spouses has received it in a previous marriage. The Nuptial Mass is to be said in English, using the Burns Oates altar missal, but according to circumstances, the nuptial blessing may be read in Latin.

**Celebration of Marriage of Catholics without Mass.** The order for this is now: A brief admonition or explanation, epistle, hymn if desired, gospel, homily (for which the address mentioned above may be used), prayer of the faithful, if desired, celebration of marriage, nuptial blessing.

## APPENDIX II

### INDULGENCES

The Papal Constitution "Indulgentiarum Doctrina," in force since 30th April, 1967, restates the Church's teaching on indulgences. The first four sections of the document affirm the Church's power to grant indulgences and explain indulgences doctrinally and historically.

A summary is appended of the fifth section in which the law on indulgences is completely revised.

An indulgence is a remission in the sight of God of temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven as far as their guilt is concerned. An indulgence is gained on certain conditions by the properly disposed Christian with the help of the Church which, as minister of the redemption, authoritatively dispenses and applies the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

Indulgences are plenary or partial; both can be applied to the dead. Henceforth partial indulgences will be described as such without any reference to terms of days or years. The Christian, at least sorry for his sins, who does some work to which a partial indulgence is attached, gains, with the help of the Church, a remission of temporal punishment equal to that which he had already merited by his good action.

A plenary indulgence may be obtained only once each day, apart from the case of a person at the moment of death who had already gained a plenary indulgence that day; partial indulgences may be obtained several times a day unless otherwise stated.

To gain a plenary indulgence the "work" to which the indulgence is attached must be performed; in addition, three conditions, sacramental confession, reception of Holy Communion and prayer for the Pope's intention must be fulfilled. The gainer must also be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin. If this disposition is lacking or any of the conditions is not fulfilled, a partial indulgence only will be obtained.

The conditions may be fulfilled days before or after the "work" is performed, but it is fitting that Communion should be received and the prayer for the Pope's intention said on the day of the "work." Several plenary indulgences may be gained after one sacramental confession, but reception of Holy Communion and prayer for the Pope's intention must be repeated for each individual indulgence. One Our Father and one Hail Mary always suffice for prayer for the Pope's intention; other prayers, dictated by the recipient's piety and devotion to the Holy Father, may be substituted.

As in canon 935, confessors may commute the "work" required for those legitimately prevented from its fulfilment. Local Ordinaries may permit their subjects to gain plenary indulgences without actual confession and Communion in places where that is difficult, provided they are heartily sorry for their sins and intend to receive those sacraments as soon as possible.

The terms "local" and "real" indulgences are abolished to make it clear that indulgences attach to works of the faithful, even though these works may be connected with a place or object of piety. Members of pious associations may gain indulgences attached to membership, even if they do not wear the insignia of membership.

Lists of indulgences are to be revised as soon as possible. Only the principal prayers and works of charity, piety and penance will be indulgenced.

A plenary indulgence for the dead may be obtained in all churches, public oratories and semi-public oratories, by those entitled to use them, on 2nd November. In parish churches a plenary indulgence may be obtained on two days, the feast of the titular and on 2nd August, the date of the Portiuncula indulgence. These indulgences may all be obtained on the exact date or, with the Ordinary's consent, on the Sunday before or after the exact date or on some other date which the Ordinary thinks more fitting. All other indulgences attached to visiting churches are to be revised.

A visit to a church, prescribed as the "work" for gaining an indulgence, is fulfilled by a pious recital there of the Our Father and the Creed.

If an object of piety is blessed by a priest and used by the faithful in a spirit of piety, a partial indulgence is gained. If the pious object (crucifix, cross, rosary beads, scapular, medal) is blessed by the Pope or a bishop, a plenary indulgence may be gained by its pious use on the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, provided that a profession of faith, in any legitimate form, is made.

The apostolic blessing by a priest at the hour of death still brings with it a plenary indulgence. If no priest is available, a Christian at the hour of death may gain the plenary indulgence provided that he is in the proper dispositions and was accustomed to saying some prayers during his life. It is recommended that a cross or crucifix be used in that case.

All privileges in regard to altars at which Mass is said are suppressed; in future a plenary indulgence for the dead can be obtained for every celebration of Mass.

The law as here detailed is in full force, but it does not revoke the law of the Code or of decrees of the Holy See if they are in conformity with these new laws.

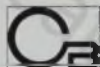
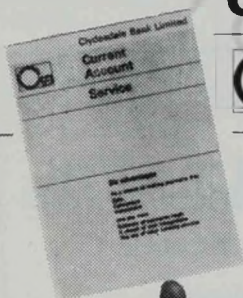

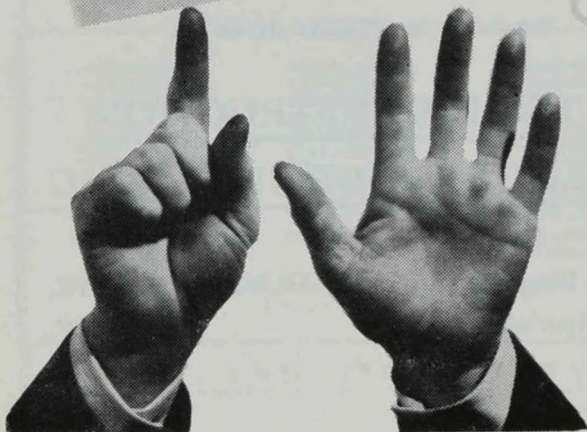
