THE HIERARCHY OF SCOTLAND

From the Extinction of the Hierarchy in 1603 till its Restoration in 1878.

1. The ancient Hierarchy ended with James Betoun, Abp. of Glasgow, who died at Paris on the 25th April, 1603, aged 79. After being subjected to the jurisdiction of the Archpriests and first Vicar-Apostolic of England till 1623, and afterwards to local Prefects of the Mission, the Clergy were incorporated into a missionary body by decree of Propaganda, 1653, and governed by the following Prefects-Apostolic: **William Ballantyne** (or **Bellenden**), 1653-61; **Alexander Dunbar** (or **Winster**), 1662-68, 1672-94; and **John Walker** (or **Ross**), 1668-71. In May, 1694, a Scottish Vicariate-Apostolic was established. This was divided into two Districts, the Lowland and the Highland, in February, 1731; and these two into three, the Eastern, Western and Northern, by Papal Rescript of 13th February, 1827. This last arrangement remained in force till the re-establishment of the Hierarchy by the Apostolic Letter, **Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice**, 4th March, 1878.

ARCHBISHOPS AND BISHOPS OF SCOTLAND

From the Restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878

The Apostolic Letter "Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice" of Leo XIII, 4th March, 1878, divided Scotland into the Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (with four Suffragan Sees) and the Archdiocese of Glasgow, which was directly subject to the Holy See. By the Apostolic Constitution "Maxime Interest" of Pius XII, 25th May, 1947, and the Apostolic Constitution "Dominici Gregis" of the same date, the Archdiocese of Glasgow was erected into a Province and divided into the Metropolitan See of Glasgow with the Suffragan Sees of Motherwell and Paisley.

THE PROVINCE OF ST. ANDREWS AND EDINBURGH

The Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh consists of the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh and the four Suffragan Sees of Aberdeen, Argyll and the Isles, Dunkeld, and Galloway.

ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. ANDREWS AND EDINBURGH

Comprising Counties of Edinburgh, Berwick and Fife (southern part to the right of the Eden), Haddington, Lothians, Peebles, Roxburgh, Selkirk and Stirling (except Baldernock).

The See of St. Andrews was founded before 900: erected into a Metropolitan See by Bull of Sixtus IV, 17th August, 1472: and was vacant for 307 years, from the execution at Stirling of John Hamilton, eighth Archbishop, on 7th April, 1571, till the restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878.

The See of Aberdeen was founded at Mortlach in 1063; transferred to Aberdeen in 1125, under its fourth bishop, Nectan; and was vacant for 301 years from the death of Bishop William Gordon, in 1577, till the restoration of the Hierarchy, in 1878.

DIOCESE OF ARGYLL AND THE ISLES

Comprising Counties of Argyll and Inverness (south of a line drawn from the northern extremity of Loch Luing to the junction of the Counties of Inverness, Aberdeen and Banff); the Islands of Bute and Arran and the Hebrides.

The See of Argyll was founded about 1200, being disjoined from the Diocese of Dunkeld; and was vacant for more than three centuries. James Hamilton was appointed to the See on 14th July, 1553, but was probably never consecrated.

The See of the Isles (Insularum or Sodorensis) is said to have been founded about 447 by St. Patrick, who consecrated Germanus, its first Bishop; it was united to Man till the end of the 14th century; and was vacant for 325 years, from the death of Roderick Maclean in 1553 till the restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878.

The See of Glasgow, comprising the City of Glasgow, the County of Dumbarton and the Baldernock district of Stirlingshire, was founded about 543 by St. Kentigern (or Mungo); erected into a Metropolitan See, with four Suffragan Sees, by Innocent VIII, 9th January, 1492, and was vacant for 275 years from the death of James Betoun, 4th Archbishop, at Paris, on 25th April, 1603, till the restoration of the Hierarchy in 1878.

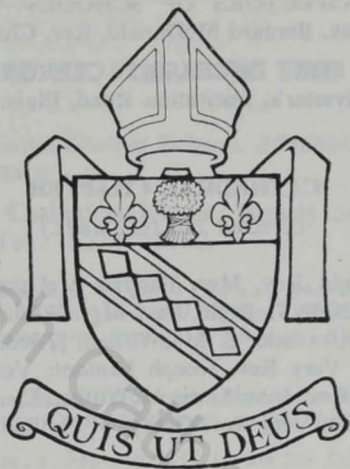

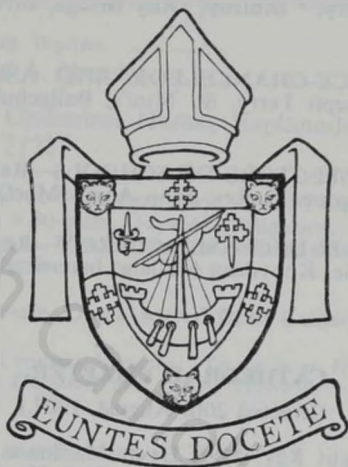

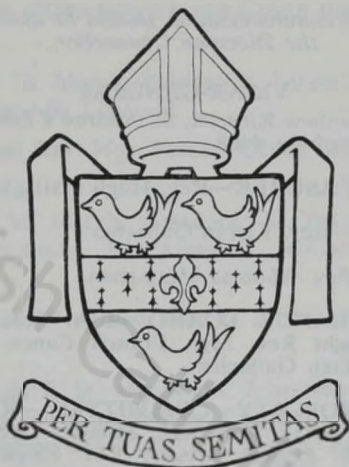

OBITUARIES — 1970

Right Rev. Mgr. Patrick Canon McGonagle, Prot. Apost.

20th January, 1970.

The Right Rev. Monsignor Patrick McGonagle was born in Rutherglen on the 11th November, 1882. His parents, Michael McGonagle and Mary Doherty, were highly respected citizens of the Royal Burgh, endowed with a deep-rooted ideal of the Christian faith. Young Patrick was educated at the local parish school and at St. Aloysius' College, Garnethill, and his desire to become a priest led him, in September, 1896, to further studies at St. Mary's College, Blairs, and, in 1900, to Issy and St. Sulpice, Paris, where he was ordained on the 30th June, 1906.

He spent the first six years of his priestly life as a curate at St. Alphonsus', Glasgow, under the well-known Canon T. P. O'Reilly, and, in 1912, he was appointed to the teaching staff of St. Mary's College, Blairs. The grey granite college, overlooking the River Dee, was to be Father McGonagle's home for thirty-five years. The college and its students, with their routine of classes, games and spiritual development were to become the all-absorbing interest of his life. He fitted into the college life admirably. The classroom he occupied was duller and more unattractive than such places usually were but to his students it was a place of pleasurable discovery, for "Pat" was a born teacher. There were no gimmicks or histrionics but, with our French grammar, we picked up a wide acquaintance with French life through our teacher's recollection of it: reading Horace or Virgil or Cicero, we became familiar with the scenes and situations of classical Italy: our study of the masterpieces of English literature were so many excursions "in the realms of gold": and always there were those unexpected asides which enriched the students' minds with the teacher's own experience and philosophy of life. Outside the classroom, he was an interested spectator at the boys' games and he was always ready to advise and assist with concerts and dramatic productions. His commanding figure and rich tenor voice added distinction to the magnificent liturgical ceremonial, which was so meticulously carried out throughout the year in the college chapel and which was perhaps the most impressive and memorable part of a boy's training in Blairs College—all so far removed from the "maimed rites" of today. For many years he was Master of Discipline, a tedious job in a college of young boys where it is so easy for a trivial incident to be blown up out of all proportion: his genial common sense and kindness kept firm control while, at the same time, ensuring that no one had cause for bitterness or resentment. He had a realistic admiration for the innate good sense of the Blairs Boy and they looked up to him with respect and affection. He had a wonderful memory for names and faces and so often delighted his former students by his ability to call them by their Christian names even after they had been years away from the college.

In 1934, Father McGonagle became Prefect of Studies and, in 1937, he was promoted to the rank of Privy Chamberlain to the Pope. When Monsignor Francis Cronin, rector of the college, died in 1939, Monsignor McGonagle was appointed to succeed him in the rectorship. He was no sooner installed as rector when the Second World War broke out. The difficulties in administration that this brought about were enormous: there was rationing for all the students, whose numbers were later swollen by the influx of the philosophy students from the major seminaries: black-out had to be maintained on the innumerable windows of the college, despite the thoughtlessness of the youthful inmates: there was constant interruption of sleep by nightly air-raid alerts, with the consequent re-arrangement of class programmes the following day and the recurring worry that these conditions might affect the health of the boys. It was a time of great strain for the rector, but Monsignor McGonagle managed to keep his good humour and sense of proportion and his wisdom and experience were a constant source of comfort and inspiration to students and staff alike.

On the initiative of the late Archbishop Macdonald of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, a re-organisation of the system of education was introduced at Blairs College in the 1940s. The great tragedy of Monsignor McGonagle's life was that, in spite of his vast experience and sterling qualities, it was decided that he was not the man to supervise the change-over and he was asked to retire from the rectorship of the college. This was a tremendously bitter blow both for himself and those who worked under him, but he accepted it and bowed to the will of his superiors. He left the college and never had the heart thereafter to return to the great love of his life, but the one thing that he enjoyed most in his later years was to talk over old times in Blairs with those who had shared them with him.

In 1947, Monsignor McGonagle was appointed parish priest of Our Lady and St. Anne's, Cadzow. In 1948, he was made an honorary canon of the Glasgow cathedral chapter and raised to the rank of Protonotary Apostolic. When the See of Motherwell came into being, he became a Diocesan Consultor of that diocese and, when its cathedral chapter was erected, in 1952, he became the first provost of that new cathedral chapter.

In 1948, Monsignor McGonagle started off a letter to the present writer with a phrase from the thirty-sixth psalm: "*Junior fui, etenim senui*"—I have been young and now I am old—he was then only sixty-six and had still many years of life. These years he devoted gladly to the people of St. Anne's parish. Cadzow witnessed in his person the ideal which he had for so many years laboured to instil in the hearts of his students; the ideal of the priest of God among his children, knowing them and known to all of them, the true shepherd of their souls. His gentle humility and his devoted love of the children of Our Lady and St. Anne's is perhaps the fondest memory of him. During the last six years of his life, he did not enjoy good health and it grieved him greatly that he could not be active among his people. He bore his cross patiently and endured his suffering without a

murmur and still retained a keen interest in the affairs of his parishioners. He died on the 20th January, 1970, at the venerable age of eighty-eight. His death left St. Anne's parish in mourning and grief. His flock had lost their beloved and revered pastor but he had left them a legacy of happy memories of a true, loving, gentle and holy priest. The news of his death also stirred grateful memories in the hearts of priests all over Scotland, who joined in the prayers for his eternal repose. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Michael Maher — 2nd February, 1970.

Father Michael Maher was born in Bellshill on 30th September, 1912. He received his early schooling in Holy Family Primary School, Mossend, St. Francis Xavier's, Carfin, and Motherwell Higher Grade (now Our Lady's High School), before beginning his studies for the priesthood at Blairs College, Aberdeen. In 1932 he entered the major seminary of St. Peter's College, Bearsden, but before long he felt that his vocation was to the contemplative life rather than the secular priesthood. Accordingly, in the summer of 1933, he entered the Cistercian Monastery at Mount Melleray, in Ireland, where he completed his studies for the priesthood and was ordained in December, 1939.

For several years it seemed that Father Michael had found his true vocation in the monastic life, and he entered wholeheartedly into the life of prayer, work and study at Mount Melleray. He found a special joy in the opportunities which monastic life offered for full participation in the liturgy, and during his years in the monastery his love of the liturgy increased immensely. This love remained with him to the end, and became a source of inspiration to many.

"Man proposes, but God disposes." Some years after ordination, it became clear to Father Michael's superiors that the austerities of the Cistercian life were seriously affecting his health, and it was decided that it would be advisable for him to return to Scotland and take up parochial duties for a time. Accordingly, in 1950, he was appointed to a temporary curacy at St. Charles', Newton, and was later transferred to St. Brigid's, Newmains. In his new sphere of priestly activity his health gradually improved and, after consultation with his monastic superiors and the Bishop of Motherwell, it was decided that he should remain in parochial work in the diocese.

From 1951 until 1965 he served in St. Augustine's, Coatbridge. The zeal with which he threw himself into all parochial activities, the sympathy and interest he showed to all under his care, and the happiness he found in all his priestly duties made it clear that this indeed was the work for which God had been preparing him.

In St. Augustine's, and later in St. Ignatius', Wishaw, and St. Bride's, Cambuslang, his priestly enthusiasm, his cheerfulness, his patience and his sheer goodness won the admiration, respect and affection of all who knew him.

Through his devoted visitation of the schools and his lively interest in all school activities he became a well known and well loved figure to all the children, while his sympathetic care of the sick, and his readiness to help all in trouble, brought consolation and new hope to many.

His great love of music, both sacred and secular, led him to take particular interest in school and parish choirs. In this way, his own enthusiasm gradually spread, first to the choirs, and, through them, to the whole congregation in the various parishes in which he served. Choir practices were never looked on as a chore, but as something to be enjoyed when Father Michael was in charge. Barely a week before his death, he paid a surprise return visit to St. Bride's, Cambuslang, during the children's choir party. The children were thrilled to see him back among them and asked the choirmaster to allow them to celebrate the occasion by singing one of Father Michael's favourite pieces, "Panis Angelicus." Their request was granted, and their delight was increased when Father Michael agreed to act as conductor. In the words of the choirmaster, "They sang like angels."

In December, 1969, Father Maher was asked by the bishop to take charge of the joint mission of St. Catherine's, Harthill, and Sacred Heart, Salsburgh. On taking up his new appointment, he immediately threw himself wholeheartedly into his parochial tasks in his new surroundings. The duplication of all services and the travelling involved in looking after a parish of this type make heavy demands on the priest in charge, but Father Michael had no complaints. His zeal led him to increase rather than lessen the many calls on his time and energy. Unfortunately, in so doing, he overtaxed his strength. On Friday, 30th January, 1970, he suffered a severe heart attack and was removed to Bangour Hospital, where, after receiving the last rites, he died on the feast of the Purification of Our Lady, 2nd February. He had been less than two months in his new parish, but the grief of his parishioners on hearing of his death gave ample evidence of the impact he had made on them during his short stay among them.

Owing to the limited accommodation in St. Catherine's Church, the funeral Mass was celebrated in Father Michael's home parish, St. Teresa's, Newarthill, where the packed congregation included many representatives from the various parishes in which he had served. The burial took place in St. Patrick's, New Stevenston. He was a priest indeed "in whom there was no guile." May he rest in peace.

Right Rev. Mgr. Valentine John Canon Mackenzie — 2nd March, 1970

Requiem Mass was offered on Wednesday, 4th March, 1970, at St. Ninian's Church, Inverness, for the repose of the soul of the Right Rev. Mgr. Valentine J. Mackenzie, a former Vicar General of Aberdeen Diocese, who died at Culduthel Hospital, Inverness, on Monday, 2nd March, 1970. During the Requiem Mass the following panegyric was preached by the Very Rev. Alexander D. Canon Sullivan, parish priest of St. Mary's, Inverness:

"I address you, my Lord Bishop, clergy and people of Inverness, with a feeling of sorrow, and at the same time of thankfulness on this occasion—the Funeral Mass of Valentine John Mackenzie.

"Sorrow and sympathy, especially for his sisters and near members of his family, because they were so closely knit together as a family group, and for whom he lived and acted as guide, wise counsellor in their affairs. Sorrow and sympathy for our bishop and the clergy of the diocese, because of the various qualities which endeared him to them and the priestly services he rendered in his pastorate. The loss of a priest at any time is something to be regretted, but in the Highlands, which produce their own special type, because of their scarcity and the necessary isolation of their lives, there is formed a bond of unity that is strong and lasting.

"Sorrow and sympathy for the people among whom he spent so many of his years! Their quiet and undemonstrative loyalty did not lessen in any way the love and esteem they cherished for him.

"Behind this natural sense of sadness, there is at the same time one of thankfulness to God, who has given us a good priest to help, advise, counsel and console, during forty years of priesthood.

"Monsignor Valentine J. Canon Mackenzie was a true Highlander. Born in Glenaladale, Moidart, on 2nd November, 1891, one of the areas of surviving Catholicism from the days of repression and persecution, he lived the early days of his boyhood with his sisters and brothers at Glenfinnan, amid the beauties of the West Highlands. Two of his brothers were later in the First World War to give their lives for their country. As was the way with families living in the country, he came to a town centre, in this case Inverness, to seek his livelihood. For a year or more, he worked in a lawyer's office, but the call of God, his vocation to the priesthood prevailed, and he offered himself to the Bishop of Aberdeen as a candidate. His studies at Blairs College followed in 1906, and having successfully completed his preliminary studies, he went to the Scots College in Rome in 1913.

"In due course he received the various Orders, which lead to the priesthood, in St. John's Lateran, and, by happy coincidence, in the Church of St. Andrew delle Valle—our national patron. However, the happiest circumstance of his priestly promotion took place on the 21st September, 1919, when he was asked to receive the final and greatest seal of his priestly life, in his own country, in his old College Chapel of Blairs. He was ordained priest there by the bishop, whom we all loved and revered, Right Rev. George H. Bennett, Bishop of Aberdeen. I can well remember the occasion, the hope, expectancy and idealism, which this ceremony engendered in the hearts of us young boys, and future candidates for the priestly life.

"So Father Val began his priestly life, following in the tradition of a Catholic family, which gave many priests to the Church in Scotland: I mention in particular, Father William MacKenzie, priest in Barra for many years.

"As a young and newly ordained priest, he acted as assistant in St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen, for three years, thence to full pastoral responsibility in Fraserburgh for five years, to Banff for ten years, to Inverness for seventeen years and six months, and lastly to Beaulieu for seven years and six months. During these years his qualities were recognised, first in his appointment as canon of the chapter, and later on while in Beaulieu, as vicar general of the diocese. The only comment that one can make is that of a wonderful record of forty years' service to God and the Church, in our diocese of Aberdeen.

"It is principally to his pastorate in Inverness that I now make reference. He was quiet and unassuming in his ways, conscientious and meticulous in the performance of his duties. Perhaps a certain shyness seemed to make him not too easy to approach, but once the effort was made, priest and people found one whom they could trust implicitly. He was a good listener, and any confidence with which he was entrusted, was treated as something sacred. This quality drew people to him, his converts will bear witness to this, but there was more than this—his popularity which extended to a wide circle of friends.

"As secretary to the Blairs College Society of former priest students, he lived and moved in the friendly atmosphere of the former pupils of the college—and he loved his game of cricket at the annual college reunion, a game which he loved and followed up in his years at Banff. Strange pastime for one who came from the Highlands—in a natural course it should have been shinty! Perhaps to compensate for this falling off from this Highland ideal, his fondness and ability for fishing gave him happy and pleasurable contacts during his years in Inverness and Beaulieu.

"One aspect of his life, more important than these social and sporting instincts, was his interest in church affairs—the splendid school in St. Mary's, Inverness, whose building he supervised as parish priest, and we must not forget that he served well the interests of his church and people, in his term as Catholic Representative on the Education Authority.

"While it is well for us here to pay tribute to Monsignor Mackenzie as a member of the diocese and the communities in which he lived, it must not do for us to forget the character of the priesthood which gave colour and substance to all his activities.

"To speak well of a good priest, is to eulogise the priesthood. As confessor in his church, many came for spiritual advice and the consolation of his priestly absolution. His punctuality and the correctness of his Mass drew people to its recitation. We might ask how many times in the fifty years of his priestly life has our good Lord and Master placed Himself in the hands of this good priest in the Mass, morning after morning, and was by these same hands lifted up and carried to and fro, so that the souls entrusted to his care should be nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ.

“We might say of him what St. Paul wrote to his beloved Timothy: ‘Exercise thyself unto Godliness,’ and if ‘Godliness is profitable to all things,’ it is especially profitable to the right exercise of the priestly charge. His piety was a sense of duty and obedience to his church, not that shallow and superficial piety which attracts but does not nourish, is busy but does not sanctify. I mean something solid, not dependent upon changing mood or feeling.

“So we can say of Monsignor Mackenzie the words which a Saint of God spoke of himself, and St. Paul wrote to Timothy, his disciple, on his approaching death: ‘I have served a good Master for these seventy years; why should I be afraid to go and see Him.’ ‘I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the Faith. As to the rest, there is laid up for me a crown of Justice, which the Lord, the just Judge, will render to me in that day.’”

Rev. Eric Gordon — 7th April, 1970

Father Eric Gordon, who has been living in retirement since September, 1969, when, because of ill health, he withdrew from the pastoral charge of Currie, died in Edinburgh Royal Infirmary on Tuesday, 7th April, 1970. At the Requiem Mass offered in St. Peter's Church, Morningside, Edinburgh, the Vicar General of the Archdiocese, the Right Rev. Bishop James Monaghan, principal concelebrant of the Mass, preached the following panegyric:

“My dear friends, before paying our simple, but very genuine tribute to the memory of Father Eric Gordon, may I first of all read to you the telegram I received from His Eminence the Cardinal who had left for Rome earlier on the same day that Father Gordon died: ‘Please convey to the Clergy of the Archdiocese, and the relatives and friends of Father Eric, my deepest sympathy.’

“Though such a notable absence from our assembly, we can be sure that His Eminence is with us in the bond of prayer, for one who was his curate while he was parish priest of Hawick.

“Hawick was, in fact, Father Gordon's second curacy. Born on 1st June, 1914, in the days just preceding World War I, he was ordained on 11th June, 1940, in the darkest days of World War II, just in the wake of the deserting of Dunkirk. He had been a student at Blairs College, and had then gone on to the French college at Coutances, but at the beginning of his final year, with other British students, he had to flee the country when France collapsed. That final year was spent at St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny, before coming home to his ordination in the cathedral here in Edinburgh.

“His first appointment was to St. John's, Portobello, and it was from there he went to Hawick. He later served in Dunfermline, Addiewell, St. Cuthbert's, Pittenweem, and St. Mary's, Stirling, where he spent three years before his appointment as parish priest at

Balerno in 1957. While he was here, the developments at Currie indicated the need for a church. Through his efforts we are indebted to him for the beautiful church and suitable presbytery that has become the centre for this very scattered area that has to be served by one priest. His failing health in recent years led to his retirement in the autumn of last year. His sudden, though not altogether unexpected death on Tuesday evening came as a shock to the relatives with whom he was so happy to spend his retirement.

"It is natural to ask the question when anyone dies: 'What did he do?' For any priest who dies it requires little imagination to think of the many baptisms he performed, the countless confessions, the number of times he offered the Holy Mass, the railsful of communicants, the Christian unions he witnessed, the souls prepared by him for their last journey into eternity. If it were just a matter of statistics, the mind would boggle at the totals served by Father Gordon in the course of his almost thirty years in the priesthood. But of course the people he served and to whom he was the vehicle of God's sacramental grace, have not been just statistics—they are people with difficulties and problems to be solved, individuals who needed consolation or encouragement, and in all these ways we know that Father Eric served them devotedly as a priest. Whatever else may be accomplished in a lifetime, a priest is never more a priest than when he serves God's people in this way.

"Those of us who knew him well, will be grateful for the example he gave us in so many ways. I can think, with envy, of his tidiness. If a tidy room is an indication of a tidy mind, as I'm sure it is, he certainly had this. This virtue was nowhere more evident than in his care for the church, and everything in it, particularly the sanctuary. 'Where the heart lies'—there was no doubt as to what he considered important. This care was in evidence too in his bookkeeping, which is surely one of the considerations we owe to our superiors and successors.

"We admired too the way in which he kept his family ties. There was never any doubt about his having given himself to God in the priesthood, and to that extent cut himself off from home and family that he might give himself the more devotedly to God's family—but in his recreation and holidays, he was always happy to turn to the warmth of life in his family where he was so welcome. To these relatives and friends who will miss him so much, we offer our deep sympathy and assurance of prayer.

"Most of all, I think we will remember with admiration his uncomplaining acceptance of suffering. For a number of years now, it could not have been easy for him. When at last he decided to retire, again it must have been a hard decision to make, but with a realistic approach he made his decision without looking for sympathy.

"Though we all fervently hope for his quick entry into heaven, we would be poor friends if we did not remember to pray for him. May his soul rest in peace."

Very Rev. James P. Canon Fennessy — 24th April, 1970.

The Very Rev. James P. Canon Fennessy was born in Newcastle, South Tipperary, on the 27th February, 1899. He went through the ordinary curriculum of the local national school and later proceeded for further education to Mount Melleray Seminary, where the seeds of his vocation to the priesthood were sown. St. John's ecclesiastical college at Waterford next appeared on the horizon and after completing his studies there, he crossed the Irish Sea to become a student in St. Peter's College, Bearsden, where he was ordained priest on 2nd June, 1917.

Father Fennessy's first appointment was as curate at St. Roch's, Garngad. He spent eleven years at St. Roch's and a favourite topic of his conversation with other priests was the praise of the good people of Garngad, whom he reckoned to be second to none in the Archdiocese of Glasgow. Always zealous and hard-working in his visitation of his district and especially in his visitation of the sick, he overtaxed his strength and a breakdown in health caused his superiors to move him to the less onerous parish of St. Joseph's, Blantyre, where he assisted the ageing Canon Paterson in the administration of the parish. In 1936 he was given his first independent charge of a parish, the rural parish of St. Athanasius', Carluke. Father Fennessy loved the countryside and got to know everybody in the district: visitation of the sick in the Law Hospital, which was just being established, occupied much of his time.

Seven years passed in Carluke and, in 1943, he was asked to take charge of the parish of St. Agnes', Lambhill, on the north-western outskirts of Glasgow. When he first went there he always referred to: "the wee parish of St. Agnes," but, as district after district of the north-west was built up, the reference became more and more inappropriate and, during the twenty-seven years of his stay at St. Agnes', he saw dramatic changes taking place in north-western suburbs and the emergence of such thriving parishes as St. Augustine's and St. Monica's.

In December, 1954, Father Fennessy was elected to a canonry in the metropolitan cathedral chapter of Glasgow and in 1967 he celebrated the Golden Jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood. For that occasion the fine old church of St. Agnes' had been redecorated and adapted to suit the new liturgy. It was an occasion of general rejoicing in the parish and a numerous gathering of the canon's friends, clergy and laymen, led by Archbishop Scanlan and Bishop Ward, assembled to offer their felicitations. Three short years later, Canon Fennessy's health gave cause for deep concern: an operation was deemed imperative but, in spite of this, his condition grew worse and he died quietly and peacefully on the 24th April, 1970.

His Grace, Archbishop James Donald Scanlan, officiated at the Solemn Requiem Mass, the deacons of the Mass were Father Richard Fennessy, parish priest of St. James', Paisley, the canon's brother, who was to die four months later, and Father John Hickey, parish priest

of St. Margaret's, Kinning Park, the canon's cousin. The crowded congregation, which included three hundred priests from the West of Scotland, heard the Archbishop, in his panegyric, describe Canon Fennessy as: "A great priest, a hard-working priest, a most genial character, a man who was always youthful at heart, a man who was faithful to his Divine Master and found joy in serving Him." May he rest in peace.

Rev. William McDonald — 5th May, 1970.

The Rev. William McDonald was born at Dalmuir on 30th August, 1915. He came from a devout Catholic family and from his earliest years his outstanding intelligence marked him as a man apart; his ability to learn, assimilate and analyse was considerable and, in consequence, his academic career was one of exceptional brilliance. His first schooling was at St. Stephen's School, Dalmuir, and from there he moved on to St. Patrick's, Dumbarton, before going to St. Mary's College, Blairs. His higher philosophical and theological studies were completed at St. Peter's College, Bearsden. During his college days he excelled both in studies and sports. Towards the end of his course the war had broken out and, in addition to his studies, he undertook the duties of officer in the local auxiliary Fire Service.

His ordination to the priesthood took place in St. Andrew's Cathedral on the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, 1941. His first appointment was to Our Lady of Lourdes parish, Cardonald, under the pastorship of the famous George Canon Galbraith. Shortly afterwards he was transferred to St. Joseph's, Helensburgh, where, in addition to his normal priestly duties, he became deeply involved in the spiritual care of the large number of American military personnel who were stationed round the Gareloch area.

From Helensburgh he went to St. Teresa's, Possilpark, where he established a reputation as an understanding, sympathetic and popular confessor, a reputation which followed him till the day of his death.

It was during his time in St. Teresa's that his health began to show signs of deterioration and his powers were beginning to fail. From St. Teresa's he was appointed to St. Conval's, Pollok, but from this time he was finding it more and more difficult to cope with his duties although no complaint ever escaped his lips. He was then subjected to major surgery and a long-standing, debilitating condition was discovered in his chest. This complaint dated back to a minor accident in his youth. Yet in spite of this disability he soldiered on. He was sent to St. Kessog's, Balloch, and then to St. Michael's, Parkhead, but the strain of parochial work was proving much too great and as a last resort he accepted the chaplaincy to the Carmelite convent in Langside. But this too, proved too much for his failing health and he retired from active duty. His last few months were spent in the care of devoted friends, who nursed him with devotion and patience until midday, 5th May, 1970, when he died. He died alone as so many priests die.

He will be remembered by the many penitents he helped with kindness, understanding and sympathy: by the many converts who benefited from his clear and sure explanation of the facts of the faith: by the many children whom he instructed on his regular visits to the schools in the various parishes in which he worked: by the many sick he cared for so assiduously during his priestly life. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. William Canon McGoldrick — 10th May, 1970

The Very Rev. William Canon McGoldrick was born at Parkhead, Glasgow, on 17th February, 1892. At the age of fifteen he entered Blairs College, to study for the priesthood and, after five years in that college, he was sent to Spain, in August, 1912, to follow the courses of philosophy and theology at the Royal Scots College in Valladolid. In the *Real Colegio* he was one of a small group of eleven students and the rector was Monsignor James Humble, whom the townsfolk called *Don Santiago el bueno*, who was just beginning his long rectorship of the college and was making far-reaching changes. The students were matriculated in the Pontifical University of Valladolid, founded by Pope Leo XIII and, as part of the scheme of municipal improvement in Madrid, the rector was reconstructing the ancient college property in that city to make it a permanent source of income for the college. It was a time of great hopes and high endeavour among the Scots in Valladolid and, to the end of his life, William McGoldrick remained proud of his membership of the college, steadfast in his affection for his fellow students, and sincere in his admiration for the sterling qualities of the rector. *El Colegio* and its alumni became a lifelong study with him and his knowledge of its history was unsurpassed. At length, on 14th June, 1919, in the cathedral of Valladolid, he received the priesthood at the hands of the auxiliary-bishop of Valladolid, Monsignor Pedro Segura y Sáenz, the future cardinal primate of Spain.

Father McGoldrick returned to his native archdiocese in the summer of 1919 and was appointed curate at St. Patrick's, Dumbarton. Almost immediately he was struck down by serious illness and had to undergo a major surgical operation. For a time his life hung in the balance. The following year, when he was judged fit for pastoral work again, he was sent by the vicar-general, Monsignor John Ritchie, to St. Charles', Paisley. With wry humour, Father McGoldrick would often recall in later years that he was given this appointment "for the good of his health." It was a demanding assignment for a young man whose health was precarious. Like the other Paisley parishes, St. Charles' had a series of public institutions, among them an infirmary, a sanatorium, an asylum and a poorhouse, which made great demands on the time and the strength of the two resident priests. Father McGoldrick devoted much of his time to the sick and unfortunate in these institutions, and thereby acquired a wide and varied experience of human problems.

In 1928, he moved to the large city parish of St. Luke's, Ballater Street, as senior curate. It was a densely populated district with more than its share of intolerable housing conditions and, at that time, the people were suffering acutely from the effects of the inter-war depression of industry. Father McGoldrick worked devotedly in this parish for nine years and, in 1937, he was given his first independent parochial charge, the small rural parish of St. Patrick's at Strathaven, in Lanarkshire. It was a pleasant interlude but it was of brief duration and, after three years, he was called, in 1940, to establish the new parish of St. Philomena in the Provanmill district of Glasgow. At first alone, then for a time with one curate, and finally with two curates, he set about organising this whole area where, in the eight years of his pastoral charge, the Catholic population rose from five thousand to well over eight thousand souls. Day after day, he doggedly carried out a house to house visitation of the parishioners to ensure that all the newcomers into the district were brought into contact with the church. Nor did he neglect the large, overcrowded and busy Robroyton Hospital which, at that time, was one of the main centres in the West of Scotland in the struggle to control the epidemic of tuberculosis which had resulted from the privations and poor living conditions of the Second World War. In 1948, he moved to the important parish of Our Holy Redeemer's, in Clydebank, a key parish in the reconstruction of the Catholic life of a large district devastated in the years of war. He was proud of this fine church and added in no small measure to its beauty. He was even more proud of the exemplary parishioners of Our Holy Redeemer's and he was devoted to their welfare. In 1956 he was nominated to a canonry in the metropolitan cathedral chapter of Glasgow. More recently, the ill-health, which had dogged him all his life became more troublesome with advancing years. In 1968, he retired from pastoral work, taking up residence in Scotstoun. He became gravely ill in the late spring of this year and was nursed in St. Margaret's Hospice, Clydebank, where he died on Sunday, 10th May, 1970, aged 78 years.

Canon McGoldrick was an excessively shy man and to those who did not know him very well he could appear aloof and abrupt. To those who knew him more intimately, however, acquaintance with him was a rewarding experience. He had a richly stored mind; a keen, if somewhat sardonic, sense of humour; and his friendship was loyal and generous. His long years in poor and difficult parishes had inured him to a spartan style of living: the only luxury that he turned to was the cigarette and he smoked incessantly. He also read incessantly in his spare time, and it was quite astonishing how much valuable research into the history of the Catholic Church in Scotland that he managed to achieve in the odd moments of his busy life. Fortunately his natural diffidence was overcome by the insistence of his friends, and some of his work was published. In 1943 his pioneer research into the history of the short-lived Scots College at Rockwell in Co. Tipperary was published by Dr. McQuillan in *St. Peter's College Magazine*. To that same journal, under the pen-name of "Cathures," he contributed various articles, which included a valuable study of the Catholic schools in Glasgow in the last century and an original and

useful survey of Scottish Catholic literature in the nineteenth century. In 1953, the *Innes Review* published his important history of the Scots College in Madrid. In addition to his research into church history, Canon McGoldrick had an extraordinary fund of information on the lives of the great European composers and a profound understanding of their music. When he could be persuaded to address the local music lovers' society in Clydebank on some aspect of classical music, illustrated with examples from his collection of records, he could be assured of a capacity audience. He was a man of wide culture and of painstaking and accurate scholarship, but, above all else, he was a good priest, who was devoted to the material and the spiritual welfare of his people. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. John P. Canon Conway — 18th May, 1970.

The Very Rev. John P. Canon Conway was born in the Townhead district of Glasgow on 2nd August, 1888. After his early schooling at St. Mungo's Academy, Glasgow, his studies for the priesthood took him, in September, 1904, to St. Mary's College, Blairs; in 1908 to Issy-les-Moulineaux, Paris; and in 1911 to St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick. He was ordained priest on 28th June, 1914, in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, by Archbishop Donald A. Mackintosh of Chersona.

Just about the time John Conway went to St. Peter's College at New Kilpatrick the college had an unusual visitor: this was Father John Fraser, a Scots Canadian from Toronto who, at that time was labouring as a missionary in the town of Ning-po in China. Up to that time the Catholics of the English-speaking world had ignored the missionary claims of the vast Chinese Empire. Only two English-speaking missionaries had, so far, devoted themselves to work in China, the first of these was a Jesuit from Cork, named Father Kennedy and the second was Father Fraser himself. Father Fraser came at the invitation of Father Thomas N. Taylor and stayed a couple of days at the college and, on Friday, 7th July, 1911, he gave the students a lecture on the need for English-speaking missionaries in China. This lecture was a landmark in the attitude of Scots Catholics to the Foreign Missions. The almost incredible statistics that Father Fraser quoted and the speaker's enthusiasm made an enormous impression and this lecture became a talking point for several years among the students. One student volunteered at once for missionary work in China, Andrew McArdle. He went off to do two years' training at the Missionary College of All Hallows, Dublin, and returned for his ordination at Glasgow on the 29th June, 1913. Later that year, on 1st December, 1913, Father McArdle set off from the college on his long journey to China and at the end of January, 1914, he was installed as one of the missionaries at Hu-Chow in Che-Kiang province.

John Conway had been a friend of Andrew McArdle from the days when they were at St. Mungo's Academy together. He too felt the urge to preach the Gospel to the pagans of China but for the moment the needs of the archdiocese were urgent. For the first ten years of

his priestly life, from 1914 to 1924, Father Conway worked as a curate at St. Mary's, Hamilton, under the well-known Dean McAvoy. He is remembered as a gentle, conscientious and charming priest who was universally beloved. The call of the Chinese Mission became more and more insistent and he sought and obtained leave to go to the Far East. In 1925 he arrived at Hu-Chow and settled down to missionary work in the Che-Kiang province with Father McArdle. Hu-Chow lies to the south-west of Shanghai and Father Conway must have noted with some amusement that, in admiralty charts, the promontory immediately to the north of Shanghai was called Cape Conway.

Father Conway's quiet pastoral zeal was as acceptable to his new flock at Hu-Chow as it had been to the Catholics of Hamilton, and he was prepared to spend the rest of his life in China. The Japanese invasion in 1937, however, changed the political scene in East China dramatically. Father Conway's mission, which covered an area about one-eighth the size of Scotland, was split in two. One part became Japanese-occupied territory and Father Conway had to have a permit and an escort when he travelled from one part of his mission to the other. He happened to be in the Japanese-occupied section of his mission when, in 1941, the Japanese declared war on the Western allies and he was informed that he would now be treated as an enemy alien. However, arrangements were made between the British and Japanese governments for the repatriation of civilians, and Father Conway was able to return to Scotland. The voyage home took two full months during which one of the missionaries, an English priest, Father Ward, died. Father Conway celebrated a Solemn Requiem for him, the choir being made up of Goanese seamen of the ship's company. It was typical of Father Conway's charitable outlook that, when he arrived home in Glasgow on Monday, 12th October, 1942, he insisted to press reporters that he had received "a square deal" from the Japanese. During this enforced sojourn at home from 1943 to 1946 he acted as chaplain at the convent and home of the Little Sisters of the Poor in Greenock.

Japan's unconditional surrender to the Western powers took place on 15th August, 1945. Father Conway was anxious to return as soon as possible to his parishioners in China but a year was to elapse before arrangements could be made. Much had been happening in eastern China and, as always, the ordinary people had borne the brunt of it. We are told that when he left Portsmouth on Tuesday, 5th November, 1946, to begin his return journey he was very sad because he felt that he would now be going back to strangers. Nevertheless he went manfully and he fully expected to spend his remaining years in the Far East. But the war was not yet over in China. The Nationalists, under General Chiang Kai-shek, were fighting a bitter, but losing struggle against the Communists, under Mao Tse-tung. The Communists took over the country. Father Conway had now been given charge of the cathedral but his activities were seriously restricted by the new Communist overlords and latterly the sole activity permitted him was to dole out rice in the church porch to the starving population. In 1951 he was expelled by the Communists and returned home to Glasgow.

On 18th November, 1951, he was the principal speaker at the C.T.S. Rally in Hamilton Town Hall at which his theme was the Communist Regime in China.

There was now no likelihood of his ever being allowed to return to China so in that year, 1951, he took up work in the archdiocese of Glasgow. He was appointed parish priest of the newly opened parish of St. Mun's, Kilcreggan, a parish which ran the whole length of the Gareloch and Loch Long as far as Arrochar. In 1953 he supervised the building of the little church at Arrochar and, each Sunday, Father Conway, now well on in his sixties, would say Mass in his two "stations," twenty miles apart. He entered wholeheartedly into all the activities of the community and was a popular speaker at the local literary society's meetings. His neighbours, Protestant as well as Catholic, offered their congratulations, in October, 1961, when he was nominated an honorary canon of the metropolitan cathedral chapter of Glasgow.

The shadows were now beginning to lengthen. In 1963 his twin brother, Dr. James A. Conway, M.D., M.B., Ch.B., M.C., D.S.O., a distinguished Glasgow ophthalmic surgeon, died. The two brothers had been devoted to one another and Canon Conway felt the loss deeply. He became partially blind and other infirmities so increased that some five years ago he confided in a friend that he just lived from day to day and each morning he said Mass as if it were his last. His sight became so impaired that in 1968 he retired from pastoral work and lived quietly at Kilcreggan. He died at the Bon Secours Hospital in Glasgow on Monday, 18th May, 1970, at the venerable age of eighty-two. He was a man of deep faith and his charity was quite extraordinary. I doubt if anyone ever heard him utter an offensive remark. Gentleness and courtesy were the hallmarks of his life: throughout the years these characteristics never changed and they made him a most attractive personality. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. George Canon Conlon — 28th May, 1970.

The Very Rev. George Canon Conlon was born at Neilston, Renfrewshire, on 25th March, 1894. He began his studies for the priesthood at Blairs College in 1908. In 1913 he went on to begin the course of philosophy at the Grand Seminaire de Versailles and, a year later, because of the outbreak of war, he was sent to the Scots College in Rome. His studies were interrupted by military service during the First World War in which he attained the rank of lieutenant. The war over, he returned to Scotland and resumed his ecclesiastical studies at St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick and eventually, on 27th May, 1923, he was ordained priest in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, by Archbishop Donald Mackintosh.

After ordination, Father George Conlon was appointed curate at St. Anthony's, Govan. He was to remain in this parish until 1939. For most of this time it was a double parish, which included St. Constantine's, Ure Street, Govan, and as a result, it was not a very easy

parish to run, since most services, confraternities and parochial activities had to be duplicated. This double parish contained no fewer than four hospitals, one of which was the 2,000 bed Southern General Hospital. In 1937 Father George Conlon suffered a grievous blow in the death of his elder brother, Father John Conlon, the founder parish priest of St. Teresa's, Possilpark.

The declaration of war against Hitler's Germany, in 1939, interrupted the even course of everyone's life in Britain. In the archdiocese of Glasgow young men were being called up to serve in the armed forces and there was an appeal for suitable priests to volunteer as chaplains. Father George Conlon, with his earlier experience of war conditions, felt that he could be of service to the new generation of soldiers and, to the regret of the parishioners of St. Anthony's, he immediately volunteered.

From 1939 to 1945, Father George Conlon, C.F., served as chaplain with the 51st Highland Division. He was with this famous Division throughout the long cruel advance from the African desert to the Third Reich. When a notice, mentioning that he had been demobbed, appeared in the *Glasgow Observer* in August, 1945, it elicited an unusual tribute from the soldiers to whom he had ministered. Writing on behalf of his Catholic comrades of the 51st Division, who sign themselves "The Sons of Scotland," Signalman J. McG. stated: "While reading a recent edition of your paper we noticed a list of chaplains who were recently demobbed. In that list appears the name of Father George Conlon, formerly of St. Anthony's, Govan, who was our chaplain in this Scottish Division, and we, the Catholic men here, would be grateful if you would provide us with an opportunity to place on record our sincere gratitude for the many benefits that our beloved chaplain brought to us.

"How well we recall days below a blazing sun in the unfriendly desert when Father Conlon erected an altar and we gathered around him to hear Mass. We recall, too, that unforgettable day when we were present at the Victory Mass of Thanksgiving in the cathedral at Tripoli, and again the liberation of the land of the Little Flower, and even her own town of Lisieux. We remember it all and our hearts fill with gratitude and justifiable pride to God's servant, our chaplain, as they did when we witnessed his courage, devotion and example in the grim moments of actual combat.

"Many of our comrades were summoned from our midst to make the supreme sacrifice and, while we grieved their loss, yet we found consolation in the knowledge that at their side, in the last moment, had been a true Soldier of Christ, a priest in whose vocabulary there were no such words as 'fear' and 'self.'

"We deeply miss our priest, our comrade, our friend in need, and our model, but at the same time we thank God for his safe return. Our loss is Scotland's gain, but our main feeling must always be one of admiration and gratitude for all he did for us, and it is our wish that God will bestow his blessings on Father Conlon in his new sphere.

"May we address this message to him wherever he is today?

Father, let us remember each other in our daily prayers, and above all let us pray for another meeting. We have tried to express our gratitude to you and, in that very task, we have discovered how inadequate words can be.

“But we do ask you, in all humility, to accept this message as a sincere token of our affection and deep gratitude.

Father Conlon's new sphere of action was on the eastern outskirts of Glasgow, where the nineteenth-century mother church of St. Paul's, Shettleston, had since 1912, formed a joint parish with its daughter parish of St. Mark's, Carnynte. The post-war rehousing of the population of Glasgow made it necessary that the old parish of St. Paul's should be revived as an independent parish. Father Conlon was entrusted with the task of reorganising the parish and of providing the parishioners with a fine modern church to replace the old church built in 1857. There were the usual delays and frustrations of any building project in those post-war years and much improvisation had to be done to provide the necessary facilities for parochial life. Under Father Conlon's leadership the Catholics of the district were organised into a united and enthusiastic parochial unit. When the splendid new church was built and opened in 1959, it owed much to the good taste of Father Conlon and to his determination that only the best was good enough for the Catholics of Shettleston.

In the year following the opening of the new church, Father Conlon was elected to a canonry in the metropolitan cathedral chapter of Glasgow. In their address to him on this occasion, the parishioners assured him that he had “won their undying admiration.” That admiration and affection of his parishioners was never more apparent than at his death, which took place on Thursday, 28th May, 1970. A great throng of parishioners filed past the catafalque to pay their last respects as he lay in state in the church on the evening of Sunday, 31st May and, at the Solemn Requiem Mass, celebrated on the following morning by His Grace the Archbishop of Glasgow, they crowded the church and watched sadly as the funeral procession set out for St. Peter's Cemetery, Dalbeth, where the interment took place. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. Patrick Aloysius Canon Sheridan — 11th June, 1970.

The death of Canon Sheridan took place in the early hours of Thursday, June 11th, 1970. Though unexpected, his death was not without preparation, as only the day before he had celebrated the forty-second anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood. It was when he failed to appear to offer his daily Mass that the sad discovery of his death was made. There was a further coincidence too—his death occurred almost on his birthday.

Canon Sheridan was born in Co. Cavan and his parents were both teachers who prepared him well for his secondary studies at St. Patrick's College, Cavan. In due time, Canon Sheridan went to St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny, and completed his ecclesiastical studies there in 1928. This was the year he came to Scotland as a young priest to forge yet another ecclesiastical link in the ancient chain between Ireland and Scotland. At first he came under the influence of an outstanding parish priest—the late Very Rev. Dr. Laydon of St. Michael's, Parkhead. His next parish was Holy Cross, Crosshill, where the late Canon O'Brien was founder of the parish and responsible for the splendid edifice of Holy Cross Church. Twenty years later, Father Sheridan was to have the same exhilarating experience. However, most of his curate days were spent under the direction of Bishop Grey Graham, regarded as one of the most saintly priests of our time. The example and influence of those three outstanding priests was clearly to be seen in the character of Father Sheridan. The modern notion of a "part-time" priest was not current in their life, nor can such a notion ever be true of the priest.

The Christian priesthood has always been associated with administration of the Sacraments, attending the sick and dying, preaching the word of God, caring for the poor and instructing the young. The people of Holy Cross parish to this day can testify how well Father Sheridan carried out all these duties. Patients in Victoria Infirmary could always rely on this kindly attention. He was, in St. Paul's admonition to Timothy, "a workman that need not be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth."

It was no surprise that Father Sheridan in 1948, was given the mighty task of founding a new parish and providing it with church, house and school. The people of St. Eunan's, Clydebank, know best of his arduous labours and saw them crowned with success in the short period of three years.

Added to all this, other duties fell to his lot. He was a member of the group of Religious Inspectors of Schools, and a representative of the Archdiocese of Glasgow on the Dunbartonshire Education Committee for many years. The last day of his life was devoted to this important work. He had also the duty of caring for the last resting places of our departed dear ones in the various cemeteries.

It is well said: *laborare est orare*—to work is to pray—but over and above this, Father Sheridan was a man of prayer and of a simple faith, that he imbibed from early childhood. His good works were the result of his love of God and his fellow men. From his earliest days he was noted for serenity of manner, capable in the classroom, in the playing field, in the pulpit; always courteous and considerate towards those with whom he came in contact. Consideration for his fellow priests was a notable characteristic and for many years he showed his loyalty to his Alma Mater by acting as secretary of the College Reunion, a gesture that was manifestly appreciated by his fellow students. Yet he was always a man of principle, not easily swayed, and a man of mature judgment and real discrimination. He

was possessed also of an ever-present sense of humour and of a quick wit, which made him always a good companion.

In 1967, His Grace Archbishop Scanlan appointed Father Sheridan a canon of the cathedral chapter to set the seal of approval and appreciation on his priestly work and zealous life. This mark of approval was received with great joy by his parishioners and friends; these now grieve at his untimely passing from them and yet rejoice in the knowledge that his reward will be one hundred fold. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Joseph Duffy — 28th June, 1970

The Rev. Joseph Duffy was born at Drumcaw, Newbliss, Co. Monaghan, on 30th September, 1902. His ecclesiastical studies took him in turn to St. Macartan's Seminary, Monaghan, St. Patrick's College, Maynooth, and the Irish College in Rome. Having completed his studies in Rome, he was raised to the priesthood on the 12th March, 1927, by His Eminence Cardinal Pompili, in the chapel of the Pontificio Seminario Romano.

Father Duffy came to the Archdiocese of Glasgow in 1927 and was appointed to a curacy at St. Columba's, Cameron Street, in the north-west district of Glasgow. He was to remain in this parish for fully twenty years and older parishioners still recall his cheery, friendly manner as he carried out the visitation of his district, as he gave instruction in the schools and as he conducted meetings of sodalities and confraternities. With Father Denis Flynn as parish priest and Father Patrick Wycherley as his fellow curate, he made up that memorable team of energetic and much-loved priests who, just as the storm of war was breaking over the country, by their zeal and drive, carried out so successfully the project of providing St. Columba's parish with its grand new church, which was solemnly opened on Low Sunday, 1941. Much of the burden of this work fell on the broad shoulders of Father Duffy and the parishioners of St. Columba's have reason to be grateful to him. On Father Duffy too fell much of the worry of keeping parochial life functioning under wartime conditions. All of this took its toll of his health and, towards the end of his years in St. Columba's parish, Father Duffy was working under considerable strain; disorders of blood pressure and heart and a diabetic condition had been diagnosed.

In 1947 he was offered and accepted the charge of the rural parish of St. Palladius' at Dalry in Ayrshire, even though he knew that within a short time this parish would cease to be part of the archdiocese of Glasgow and would be annexed to the diocese of Galloway under the reorganisation of the territory of the Province of Glasgow. He threw himself into the work of his new parish and the people responded to his enthusiasm: the parish sodalities flourished and to their number was added the Junior Legion of Mary, a form of Catholic Action for which Father Duffy had unbounded admiration. For the meetings of confraternities and for the general social welfare of the parish he

purchased a parochial hall. However, it was a losing struggle with poor health and, by the winter of 1953, he had lost all energy and was reduced to a mere shadow of his former physique. To the regret of his parishioners, he felt it was his duty to ask permission to retire from active parochial work. He went off to Ireland where, for about a year he stayed with his relatives. His condition growing worse, he went to live at the home for invalid priests at Clonakilty, Co. Cork, where he died at the age of sixty-eight, on 28th June, 1970. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Martin Hughes — 6th July, 1970.

Father Martin Hughes was born in Birkenhead, Cheshire, on 27th January, 1909. At an early age he lost his parents and came to Glasgow. There he was taken care of by the Galbraith family. Very Rev. Canon George Galbraith sent him to Blairs in 1924. For further studies in philosophy and theology he was sent to the Scots College, Valladolid where, in 1936, he was ordained to the priesthood.

After his ordination, Father Hughes was sent as a curate to St. Roch's parish, Garngad, where he remained for seven years. The people in that parish found in him a priest who was most sympathetic and understanding; a priest most zealous for their spiritual welfare. He is still remembered—a fact which was shown at his funeral by the attendance of so many of his former parishioners.

In 1943, he was sent as senior curate to Our Holy Redeemer's, Clydebank. Here he was to spend fourteen years of his priestly life. The people of Clydebank had suffered the effects of a most terrible war. Death and destruction had been their fate. Entire families had been wiped out. Many others were suffering the loss of parent, brother or sister. In all truth, Father Hughes restored peace, calm, happiness and contentment. Once again his deep sympathetic understanding and words of encouragement were more than comfort to his people. Our Holy Redeemer's parishioners knew that in him God had indeed sent a good priest.

Glasgow was then an expanding city. In the new housing schemes many Catholic families were without priest or church. Churches had to be built. Father Hughes was sent as parish priest to Castlemilk, to found a new parish under the patronage of St. Margaret Mary. It was a gigantic task. Yet, long before he died, he had moulded more than 6,000 people into one family of God with their church and their schools. For thirteen years, he toiled and laboured. Loved and respected, he was known as the quiet, unassuming priest, yet most zealous for the spiritual welfare of his people. The magnificent church of St. Margaret Mary stands as a monument to his memory. In that church he had administered to his people—baptising them, uniting them in marriage, restoring them to God's friendship in the confessional, offering Mass for the living and the dead, and refreshing their souls

with the Bread of Heaven. In the same church he assisted at the obsequies of his parishioners. Their remains lay in front of his high altar. He had offered Mass for their souls and had performed the consoling ceremonies of the church, before consigning their bodies to the grave. Now his own mortal remains were lying in his church. Sudden indeed was the announcement of his death—on July 6th, 1970. His parishioners were stunned. Men and women wept openly. Those tears were not a sign of weakness, they were a proof of the deep loss of parishioners for their spiritual father and founder of their parish. On the day of the funeral, Bishop Ward offered Pontifical Mass of Requiem; and Mgr. Kilpatrick officiated at the graveside in St. Peter's Cemetery, Dalbeth.

Father Hughes was a man of deep faith. He realised that this earth was not a permanent city but that heaven was our goal. His name has been inscribed in the church of St. Margaret Mary—"Inscribed with iron chisel and engraving tool, cut into the rock forever." To us who still have to pass through the gates of death, may we remember the example of this good priest—and of all good priests who have gone before him. Rev. Martin Hughes died on 6th July, 1970. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Gerald Dorrian — 14th July, 1970

The Rev. Gerald Dorrian died on the morning of Tuesday, 14th July, 1970, at St. Anne's Convent, Musselburgh, where he had been living in retirement for some years. Born sixty-six years ago in Edinburgh, Father Dorrian studied for the priesthood at St. Mary's College, Blairs, and at the Grand Séminaire de Coutances. His studies completed, he was ordained in 1930 at St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh. His first appointment after ordination was as assistant priest at St. Machan's, Lennoxton, where he spent two years, 1930-1932. This was followed by another brief curacy at St. Cuthbert's, Edinburgh, 1932-1933, and in 1933 he was given charge of the Sacred Heart parish at Armadale in West Lothian. He remained at Armadale for four years, 1933-1937, and in 1937 he was transferred to the parish of St. Agatha at Methil. Father Dorrian was to spend twenty-eight years—the greater part of his active priestly life—at Methil. These were years of devoted work for the Catholics of this Fifeshire parish. Father Dorrian's energies were not restricted, however, to his immediate flock. Shortly after taking charge of Methil parish, he was sent by the late Archbishop Macdonald to Lille University to study the Young Christian Workers' movement so that these ideas could be used for the benefit of the young people of the archdiocese. He was prominent also on archdiocesan pilgrimages to Lourdes, acting as assistant chaplain to the sick. In 1956 he succeeded the late Monsignor John Breen as archdiocesan pilgrimage director: and, until illness forced him to resign, he was chairman of the archdiocesan Adoption Society. His parish was not neglected and the extensive renovations he carried out at St. Agatha's church more than eight years ago still bear eloquent material witness to that fact. Concern for the Catholics

who lived in the Kennoway district of his parish led him to undertake the arduous task of building St. Giles' church in that area and forming a new parish there. Ill health forced him to withdraw from active pastoral work in 1965 and for the past five years he has lived in retirement at St. Anne's, Musselburgh. He died at St. Anne's on the morning of Tuesday, 14th July, 1970, at the age of sixty-six. The Requiem Mass was celebrated by Bishop James Monaghan, vicar general of the archdiocese, in St. Peter's church, Falcon Avenue, the church of Father Dorrian's native parish, on the morning of Thursday, 16th July, and the interment took place at Mount Vernon Cemetery. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. Aeneas Valentine Canon Macrae — 19th July, 1970

Pray for the soul of Canon Aeneas Valentine Macrae, who died suddenly at Eskadale, Strathglass, Inverness-shire, on 19th July, 1970.

Canon Macrae was born at Eskadale, near Beauly, on 11th July, 1904. He studied at Blairs College, Aberdeen, from 1918 to 1923 and in the latter year he entered the seminary at Coutances, Normandy, where he was to acquire an abiding love of France. On 2nd July, 1928, he was ordained to the priesthood in the chapel of Blairs College by the Bishop of Aberdeen, the Right Rev. George H. Bennett.

In those days there was no scarcity of priests in this northern diocese, which, before the Faith came back from the West, had been its mainstay in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries; and so Father Macrae was loaned for a few years first to Our Holy Redeemer's, Clydebank, and then to St. Patrick's, Dundee. His first appointment in his native diocese was to Fraserburgh in 1937, where he settled down unconcernedly after the crowded days in the south. His whole life as a priest was spent in small parishes—Fraserburgh in 1937, Inverurie in 1953, Ballater in 1956, Eskadale in 1966—which was as he would have wished, since he never sought the limelight and since these circumscribed limits gave more scope for his genius for friendship. He loved meeting people, and in all those parishes he left the impress of his kindly disposition. It is a token of the affection in which he was held that a representation from Fraserburgh came to his obsequies.

Aeneas Macrae was, like Nathanael, "without guile." All those who met him responded to the simplicity of his character and found in him one whose charity was "always patient and kind, never boastful or conceited, never rude or selfish, always ready to excuse." The allowances he made for others *le bon Dieu* will make for him.

With the dwindling of the congregation at Ballater, symptomatic of so many country districts, it was decided to supply Ballater from Braemar, and in November, 1966, Canon Macrae, as he then was, returned to his native Strathglass to spend the evening of his life ministering to his own folk. These were quiet days, enlivened only, as they always had been, by a chapter meeting in Aberdeen and a

holiday in his beloved France, where he had been planning to return in the September of the year of his death. But on Sunday, 19th July, when the congregation had assembled for the 11 o'clock Mass and the Canon had not appeared, a search was made for him and he was found dead in the nearby presbytery. In solitude, loneliness and helplessness, his heart had ceased to beat. But there was a Friend within that solitude, a Friend he might sometimes have grieved but on whom he had never turned his back. At Mass that morning, if God had not called him to himself, he would have recited the twenty-second psalm, the responsorial psalm for the Sunday: "If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff." These words are an abiding comfort.

Another priest has gone of that long line which stretched back to the heroic Jesuit missionaries of the seventeenth century in Strathglass, which had survived the bitter sequel of the '45 when the embers of the Faith were kept alive by their successors of the secular clergy, whose shelter was, as the Jesuits' had been, the caves of the hillside. It was a line which bore witness to a Catholicism which had never been stamped out, but which had seen a once flourishing Catholic population dwindle away, not through leakage or apostasies, but, in the early nineteenth century, through the Clearances in that Chisholm country, which, in God's providence, helped to build up the sturdy Gaelic Catholicism of Nova Scotia, and, in later years, through the drift from the countryside, to the towns.

The Requiem Mass was said by the Bishop of Aberdeen, the Right Rev. Michael Foylan, assisted by Father Bernard McDonald of Dingwall, on Wednesday, 22nd July, in the crowded church of St. Mary, Eskadale, and in the presence of a concourse of priests from all over the far-flung diocese of Aberdeen, from Peterhead in the east to Dornie in the west, from Braemar to Thurso. The panegyric, the burden of which was "he was all things to all men," was preached by Canon Macrae's neighbour at Marydale, Father James Bede O'Donnell. Then, in the shadow of the firs, with the wild slopes of the heather fringing the horizon, and just behind the sanctuary of the church where he had been baptised and confirmed and in which he had first received the Bread of Life, his body was committed to the grave. *Gu'n robh fhois ann an sith.*

Right Rev. Mgr. John Canon McQuillan, D.D. — 31st July, 1970

The Right Rev. Mgr. John McQuillan, D.D., was born at Mossend, Lanarkshire, on the 13th October, 1889. He began his studies for the priesthood at St. Mary's College, Blairs, in 1904, and, in 1908, he proceeded to the Scots College in Rome for the courses in philosophy and theology. He was ordained priest in the Lateran Basilica on Holy Saturday, 3rd April, 1915.

After ordination, he completed his final year of theology in Rome and, during that time, he made a somewhat unconventional start to his pastoral career. A few days after his ordination, while staying at the college villa at Marino, he was suddenly called upon to give

absolution to an unfortunate man, murdered just a few yards from the window of his room. During the *villeggiatura* of 1915, he undertook the pastoral care of a community of destitute peasants, who lived in wattle huts in the Campagna, some miles to the south of Monte Cavo. The circumstances in which he had to say Mass during those summer and autumn months would probably shock the progressive neophytes of today, who strive to impress us with their modernity, by advocating house Masses. Dr. McQuillan published an account of his mission to these nomads, in the *St. Peter's College Magazine*, which gives a startling picture of the complete lack of education and of spiritual care which a rural community could suffer as late as 1915 within a few miles of the city of Rome because of an intransigent papacy and an anti-clerical government.

Dr. McQuillan returned to Scotland in the summer of 1916 and was appointed to St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, as assistant to Canon George Ritchie. He threw himself energetically into the work of the parish and played his part in the grand ceremonial of this mother-church of Catholic Glasgow: he was, for example, subdeacon at the Pontifical High Mass, celebrated on the 22nd October, 1916, to mark the centenary of the building of St. Andrew's. He remained at the cathedral for seven years, until 1923, when he was appointed to teach philosophy at St. Peter's College, Bearsden. Possibly it was not altogether a happy appointment because Dr. McQuillan's interests lay in active work: he preferred dealing directly with real people: he chafed at the tedium and lack of physical activity in academic life. He found many interests outwith the college and one of these was as chaplain to the Archdiocesan Council of the Catholic Young Men's Society: later, in 1931, he was elected as first chaplain to the National Council of this Society. In this capacity he felt directly involved in the appalling plight of the many thousands of Catholic young men in the west of Scotland whose lives were being destroyed by the widespread unemployment resulting from the economic depression of the time. Catholic economic and social thinking in the west of Scotland at that time was largely influenced by the writings of Hilaire Belloc and G. K. Chesterton, and their system of Distributism was the popular theory of the day. To Dr. McQuillan it seemed the right opportunity for putting this theory into practice. The result was a bold step, taken with full knowledge of the worries and hardships it would entail, and taken with the full approbation and blessing of Archbishop Mackintosh. He resigned from the college staff at the end of the summer term of 1931 and took up residence at Broadfield Farm, Symington, Lanarkshire, to begin what was known as the Catholic Land Colony Scheme. Young men were to be trained in practical farming with the intention that they would, in time, become the small independent farmers of the Distributist vision. Neighbouring farmers may not have been very impressed by the doctrinaire Chesterbelloc Distributism of Broadfield Farm, but for the Catholics of Glasgow and Lanarkshire, looking for any gleam of hope in the drab days of the depression, it seemed a glimpse of a new and better world. Dr. McQuillan kept the public informed of the progress of the experiment by editing a monthly journal called *Land for the People*.

The Land Colony caught the imagination of the Catholics of the archdiocese and, even in their poverty, they gave what they could: one particularly welcome gift was a horse and cart, presented by the Celtic Football Club. The venture struggled on for four and a half years: as Dr. McQuillan and his committee succeeded in surmounting one problem, another difficulty would crop up. The physical effort and the worry of the Land Colony steadily undermined its Director's health and, early in 1936, Dr. McQuillan was seriously ill. Acting on medical advice, Archbishop Mackintosh relieved Dr. McQuillan of his duties as Director of the Land Colony and a younger man, Father John Crerand, was appointed in his place. This appointment ended in tragedy because, during his first winter at Symington, a neglected chill, which led to pneumonia, brought thirty-four year old Father Crerand to a premature grave. The effect of these setbacks on the Land Colony was disastrous and the archdiocese finally wound up its affairs. Though several young men were successfully launched on a career in farming, the scheme did not fulfil its early promise. Still, it was a brave venture which those who lived through the depression will always recall with gratitude to a gallant priest. One side effect of the venture was the foundation of a new Catholic parish in the Upper Ward of Lanarkshire, dedicated to St. Isidore, the patron of farmers: the centre of this parish was originally located at Broadfield Farm in 1931 and, in 1938, it was transferred to the town of Biggar.

After a short period of recuperation, Dr. McQuillan took up a temporary appointment at Fort Augustus Abbey on 30th September, 1936, instructing the junior monks in philosophy and theology. He also had the duty of teaching Religious Knowledge in the Abbey School. Pupils of that time recall the near riot conditions which sometimes prevailed in the class as the high-spirited boys realised how utterly kind-hearted their new teacher was. He left Fort Augustus on the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul, 1938, "his health being restored," to return to St. Peter's College, Bearsden, to lecture to the students in Sacred Scripture.

During his second sojourn at St. Peter's College, Dr. McQuillan again found himself caught up in a series of external commitments. As a consequence of his earlier work with the short-lived Catholic Evidence Guild, he acted as the Catholic spokesman in newspaper controversies and, when war-time conditions prevailed, he acted as chaplain at military installations in east Dunbartonshire and, every week-end he would say Mass for evacuees at Aberfoyle. In the college, in addition to Scripture and Sermon classes, he edited the *St. Peter's College Magazine* from 1938 to 1943.

In 1943, Dr. McQuillan began the final phase of his career. He left St. Peter's College for an appointment as parish priest at St. John's, Stevenston, Ayrshire. Here, as elsewhere, his sociable nature found full expression and he endeared himself to the whole community, Protestant as well as Catholic. It was during his pastoral charge of Stevenston that the reorganisation of ecclesiastical territory took place in the west of Scotland and Dr. McQuillan now became incorporated in the diocese of Galloway. In 1950, he was transferred to St.

Meddan's, Troon, in succession to the late Monsignor Hayes. In that same year he was elected to a canonry in the cathedral chapter of Galloway. In 1951, he was appointed vice-postulator of the cause of the saintly Margaret Sinclair, in succession to the late Monsignor Thomas Doyle of St. Saviour's, Glasgow. On the 1st December, 1956, he was raised to the rank of Domestic Prelate to His Holiness the Pope. He acted as diocesan representative on the Ayrshire Education Committee and he was a trustee of Marr College. Both at Stevenston and at Troon he took a lively interest in the affairs of the whole community of the town, anticipating the ecumenical ideas of the Second Vatican Council. In liturgical matters also, he anticipated future developments: for several years he celebrated Mass each First Friday facing the people, when such a thing was unheard of elsewhere. In more traditional ways he added to the splendour of St. Meddan's Church by installing a peal of bells and by having the church consecrated

Forced by old age and failing health to retire in 1964, he took up residence at Saltcoats. Further deterioration in health necessitated hospital care and, in 1966, he went to St. Vincent's Home at Kingussie. It was there that he died on the 31st July, 1970, at the age of eighty-one years. At his own request, the Requiem Mass was celebrated in St. Meddan's Church, and he was buried in Troon Cemetery.

Throughout his long and busy life, Monsignor McQuillan's zealous work for the church led him into many forms of activity, education and social work and controversy, lecturing and writing; activities which could easily have become ends in themselves, making him impersonal and aloof, but that was not his temperament and his friends remember him as a very human person, quick-witted and unconventional, genial and companionable and, above all, a priest of deep faith and abounding charity. May he rest in peace.

His Eminence Cardinal Giuseppe Pizzardo, Bishop of the Suburbicarian See of Albano, Sub-Dean of the Sacred College, Protector of the Scots College in Rome — 1st August, 1970

The office of Cardinal Protector of the Scottish Nation originated in the year 1505 when King James IV of Scotland obtained from Pope Julius II the appointment of the Venetian cardinal, Cardinal Domenico Grimani, as protector of the interests of the Kingdom of Scotland at the Roman Curia. From that date onwards a regular succession of cardinals looked after the interests of Scotland in the central government of the Church. Even the acts of the so-called Reformation Parliament which, in 1560, sought to abolish the jurisdiction of the Pope in Scottish affairs, did not succeed in breaking the series of Scottish Cardinal Protectors and when Pope Clement VIII founded the Scots College in Rome, on 5th December, 1600, he appointed the Cardinal Protector of Scotland, Cardinal Camillo Borghese, as Cardinal Protector also of the new Scots College in the city. Notwithstanding the now predominant Protestantism of the Scottish nation and in spite of the fact that the Kingdom of Scotland had been incorporated in the new United Kingdom of Great Britain, the

Stuart kings continued to nominate, and the papacy to approve, a succession of Cardinal Protectors of the Scots College and Nation. In the days of King James VII, the last Catholic monarch of Great Britain, the portrait of the Cardinal Protector of Scotland, Cardinal Philip Thomas Howard, O.P., was placed in the Palace of Holyroodhouse and hung there down to our own day.

After the "Glorious Revolution," the Stuart kings in exile jealously maintained their right to nominate the Cardinal Protectors of Scotland and these cardinals played an important part in fostering the interests of the Scottish Mission during the Penal era. Some of the eighteenth-century Protectors were notable benefactors of the Scottish Mission such as Cardinal Giuseppe Spinelli, who in 1759 bequeathed "ten thousand Roman scudi" and other large sums of money for the benefit of the Mission, or the generous Cardinal Giuseppe Sacripanti who, when adding his signature to documents relating to Scotland, described himself as "Joseph Cardinalis Sacripantes, Collegii ac Nationis Scotorum apud Sanctam Sedem Protector"—Joseph Cardinal Sacripanti, Protector of the College and Nation of the Scots at the Holy See.

When the central administration of the Church was badly disrupted during the occupation of Rome by the French revolutionary armies, as the eighteenth century gave place to the nineteenth century, many national protectorships lapsed, but the Scottish protectorship again survived and in the 1816 issue of the official periodical of the Roman Curia, the *Notizie di Roma*, we find only seven national protectorships officially listed: the Church and Nation of the Lucchesi; the Armenian Nation; the Republic of Ragusa; the Church and Nation of the Genoese; the Church and Nation of the Sienese; the Kingdom of the Two Sicilies; and the Kingdom of Scotland. The Protector at that date was the prominent diplomat, Cardinal Bartolomeo Pacca, who had recently succeeded the Scots cardinal, Cardinal Charles Erskine, as Cardinal Protector of the Scots College and Nation.

During the nineteenth century, because of the importance of the Congregation of Propaganda in the affairs of Scottish Catholics, it became the practice for a time to nominate the Cardinal Prefect of Propaganda as Cardinal Protector of the Scots College and Nation, but the separate identity of the Scottish protectorship was not lost sight of and when Cardinal Giovanni Simeoni succumbed to the great influenza epidemic of the winter of 1891-92, a Solemn Pontifical Requiem Mass was sung by Archbishop William Smith of St. Andrews and Edinburgh in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh, on Tuesday, 26th January, 1892, for the cardinal because he "was Protector of the Scots College in Rome and also of the Church in Scotland." The cathedral was heavily draped in black for the occasion and the catafalque bore the insignia of the deceased cardinal.

Great changes were effected in the status and powers of the Cardinal Protectors by the reorganisation of the Roman Curia by St. Pius X in 1908 and by the new constitution of the Scots College in Rome, promulgated by the Congregation of Seminaries in 1928. While, as a

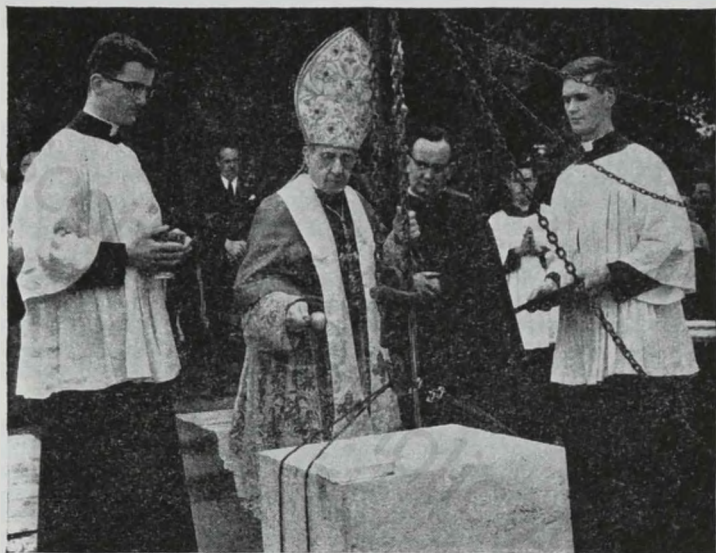
result of these changes, the protectorship became largely a titular dignity, it was still of considerable benefit to the college and for the Catholics of Scotland it is an office of great historical and sentimental value because it is the sole ecclesiastical office and dignity in Scottish Catholic life which can be traced back in uninterrupted succession to the pre-Reformation Scottish Church.

The most recent holder of this ancient title was Cardinal Giuseppe Pizzardo, Cardinal Bishop of the Suburbicarian See of Albano and Sub-Dean of the Sacred College of Cardinals, who died on Saturday, 1st August, 1970, at the age of ninety-three.

Cardinal Giuseppe Pizzardo was born at Savona on the 13th July, 1877. Answering a call to the priestly life, he began his ecclesiastical studies at the Diocesan Seminary of Savona and continued these studies at the Lombard College, the Ateneo dell' Apollinare and the Gregorian University in Rome. He was ordained priest on the 19th September, 1903, and embarked on a career in the diplomatic service of the Holy See. Successively he held various posts in the papal Secretariate of State and, in 1930, he received episcopal consecration with the titular archiepiscopal See of Nicea. During the pontificate of Pope Pius XI, he played a leading role in the all-important Catholic Action movement by which the Vatican sought to counter the Fascist indoctrination of Italian youth. In 1922 he represented the Holy See at the Rapallo Conference, during which he held a discussion with Litvinov, the Soviet foreign minister, in an effort to secure some toleration for religion in the U.S.S.R. He was the first Vatican diplomat to attempt any overture towards the recently established Communist regime in Russia. He took part in the preparatory negotiations with the new Fascist government of Italy, which resulted in the settlement of the Roman Question by the Lateran Treaty of 1929. In the consistory of the 13th December, 1937, Pope Pius XI created him Cardinal Priest of the title of Sancta Maria in Via Lata. In 1939, he was named Prefect of the Congregation of Studies and he supervised the affairs of that important Congregation for over a quarter of a century. In 1948, he became Cardinal Bishop of Albano. He was Sub-Dean of the College of Cardinals and was involved in a multitude of commissions and *opere*, concerned with the central administration of the Church.

As Prefect of the Congregation of Studies, as Grand Chancellor of the Pontifical Gregorian University and as a long-standing personal friend of the late Monsignor Clapperton, Cardinal Pizzardo had been interested for many years in the welfare of the Scots College in Rome. He showed his interest in a number of ways: for example, he presided at the celebrations on St. Andrew's Day, 1950, to mark the 350th anniversary of the foundation of the college by Pope Clement VIII. Accordingly, when the college was left without a Cardinal Protector by the death of Cardinal Francesco Marchetti-Selvaggiani in 1951, he readily agreed to the invitation to become the new Cardinal Protector. He took possession of the college on the 10th May, 1951, the last ceremony of the kind to take place in the old college building in the Via Quattro Fontane. After the reading of the Apostolic Brief,

appointing the cardinal to "this important and honourable office" and the presentation of all the members of the college to the new Protector. Cardinal Pizzardo replied in English, expressing his joy at entering into this new association with the 350-year-old college and, as "one of a long line of Protectors," he exhorted the students to prepare themselves for the tasks that lay ahead of them in "that dear country of yours, Bonnie Scotland."

Cardinal Pizzardo's protectorship was beneficial to the college in many ways and on many occasions, particularly in the protracted and complicated negotiations for the transfer of the college from the Via Quattro Fontane to the Via Cassia. Indeed it was largely because of his intervention that the Scottish bishops chose the site on the Via Cassia. The cardinal took a keen interest in the progress of the new college and, on the 9th June, 1962, he blessed the foundation stone of the new building. It was with great joy and pride that, on St. Margaret's Day, 16th November, 1964, he welcomed the Holy Father at Via Cassia for the inauguration of the new college.

Pope Paul always regarded Cardinal Pizzardo with filial affection, for it was he who persuaded the young Giovanni Battista Montini to remain in Rome after his ordination and—when most people had

written Montini off because of his constant ill-health—brought him into the Secretariate of State. This filial affection was shown when news was brought to Pope Paul at Castelgandolfo that Cardinal Pizzardo had died at his residence, in the Via della Conciliazione, in Rome, on the evening of Saturday, 1st August, 1970, the Holy Father came that same evening into Rome to spend some time in prayer beside his deceased friend. The obsequies of Cardinal Pizzardo were celebrated in the Vatican Basilica on Tuesday, 4th August, 1970. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. Alfred Joseph Canon Gallaucher — 11th August, 1970.

Canon Gallaucher was born in Gourrock, Renfrewshire, on 1st October, 1884. He was educated at St. Ninian's School in his native town, and then at the age of fifteen entered St. Mary's College, Blairs, to study for the priesthood. In 1904 he was sent to complete his studies at Issy and St. Sulpice in Paris, where he was ordained by Archbishop Amette on 3rd July, 1909.

On his return to Scotland, Father Gallaucher was appointed curate at St. Augustine's, Langloan. Two years later he was transferred to St. Mary's, Saltcoats, where he remained till 1924. During the First World War his knowledge of French proved invaluable in dealing with the problems of refugees; Father Gallaucher also served on the Soldiers' and Sailors' Committee.

In 1929, after five years as chaplain to the Good Shepherd Sisters at Dalbeth, he was appointed parish priest of St. Mary's, Larkhall. Two years later he was transferred to St. James', Renfrew. It was here that he celebrated the Silver Jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood. In 1938 he returned to Langloan where he had already served as a curate. In 1940 he became parish priest of St. Charles', Newton and, in April, 1945, he took up his appointment as parish priest of St. Joseph's, Tollcross, where he celebrated his Golden and Diamond Jubilees as a priest.

A simple enumeration of the various appointments held over the years by Canon Gallaucher tells us nothing of the priestly and human qualities which endeared him to all with whom he came into contact. The solid spiritual formation he received in the Sulpician tradition from the French seminaries clearly had a great influence on his life as a priest, and was the motivating factor behind the faithful discharge of his personal exercises of piety. He was proud to be a priest, and apostolic zeal, genuine piety, and personal concern for all his flock were characteristic of his priestly life. He had a deep understanding of human nature, and was always ready to show patient tolerance and fatherly understanding of human frailty. He was always deeply concerned about the welfare of others, and this concern was not confined to his parishioners, as was clearly shown by the great work he did in his younger days with the establishing of immigration chaplains in Canada, and improving working conditions for Irish immigrants in Ayrshire.

In November, 1967, despite his advanced age, he was appointed canon of the metropolitan cathedral chapter of Glasgow. His health, however, was deteriorating, and, sustained by a deep faith and the kindness of his friends, he died peacefully at Gourrock on 11th August, 1970. Requiem Mass was celebrated by His Grace, the Archbishop of Glasgow, in St. Joseph's, Tollcross, in the presence of a very large representation of clergy and parishioners. He was afterwards laid to rest beside his fellow priests in St. Peter's Cemetery, Dalbeth. May he rest in peace.

Rev. Richard Fennessy — 25th August, 1970.

Provost William Divertie and representatives of Paisley Town Council were in the capacity congregation for the Pontifical Concelebrated Mass of Requiem for Father Richard Fennessy, parish priest, St. James's, Paisley, who died 25th August, 1970. Close on a hundred priests and representatives of the western cathedral chapters and religious congregations were present.

Concelebrants with Bishop McGill were Father J. J. Fennessy, nephew, Savannah, Atlanta, and Father John Hickey, cousin, Our Lady and St. Margaret's, Kinning Park, Glasgow. Pupils of St. James's School formed a guard of honour as the cortege left for St. Conval's Cemetery, Barrhead. Bishop McGill officiated at the graveside in the priests' plot.

Father Richard Fennessy was born 11th June, 1901, in Newcastle, Co. Tipperary; was educated at Mount Melleray Seminary, Co. Waterford, and St. John's College, Waterford. He completed his studies for the priesthood at St. Peter's College, Bearsden, and was ordained for the Archdiocese of Glasgow on 24th April, 1927.

He held curacy appointments at St. Mary's, Glasgow, for eleven years (1927-38), St. Michael's, Parkhead, two years (1938-40) and St. Mary's, Cleland, Lanarkshire, six years (1940-46). He was chaplain to the Little Sisters of the Poor, Greenock, five years (1946-51). His first charge was at St. Thomas', Neilston, where he remained for eight years until October, 1951, when he succeeded the late Father Michael McNicholas as parish priest of St. James's, Paisley.

In his panegyric Bishop McGill spoke of Father Fennessy as a priest of simple but great faith, a man of prayer with a great devotion to the Mother of God and the Passion of her Son. He made the Way of the Cross daily after Mass throughout his life, including the day he was stricken with the illness that was to prove terminal.

Of indifferent health for some time, he bore it silently and patiently. Retiring by nature, he was always considerate for others. He was a very charitable man with a ready excuse for the failings of others. His intense love of his native Ireland did not lessen his great love for the country of his adoption. He prepared for his last hour in a spirit of faith that characterised his entire life.

He was predeceased four months previously by his brother, Canon James Fennessy, St. Agnes', Lambhill. May he rest in peace.

Very Rev. Roger Canon Gallagher — 27th October, 1970

The Very Rev. Canon Roger Gallagher, parish priest of St. John the Baptist's, Fauldhouse, collapsed and died on the morning of Tuesday, 27th October, 1970, not long after he had celebrated morning Mass. At the Requiem Mass, offered in St. John the Baptist's Church on Friday, 30th October, His Eminence, the Cardinal Archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, the principal concelebrant, preached the following panegyric:

"For me this morning, memory crowds on memory and the words I seek elude me. Canon Gallagher's death has been a crushing blow. He was shy, unobtrusive, retiring. He shunned publicity. But he was always there, strong in faith and loyalty, secure and steadfast like a rock, set firm in deep spiritual foundations, a priest single-minded in his dedication to his priesthood. Like so many other priests, he died alone. But, I'm sure, not lonely. Just a few minutes before God called him, he had called God to this altar, in what he did not know would be his final Mass.

"To prepare for that final Mass and for the Masses of close on forty years that preceded it, Roger Gallagher left his native Falkirk in September, 1925, first for St. Kieran's College in Kilkenny and two years later for the Scots College in Rome. There he was ordained in 1933 on the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, and on his return to Scotland was appointed to the cathedral in Edinburgh. After two years in the cathedral, he was transferred to the then tiny parish of Penicuik, as parish priest, and in 1938 for a year to Selkirk. In November, 1939, he was again moved, this time to the important parish of Cowdenbeath, where he remained happy and contented for fourteen years. He loved Cowdenbeath and its people, whose joys and sorrows he shared during the hard days of war. He never tired of speaking of this parish, whose parishioners still remember him with affection and gratitude.

"Then, in May of 1953, the quiet routine of his priestly apostolate was shattered. I visited him and asked him to accept the appointment as first rector of St. Andrew's College at Drygrange, which was to open in the coming September. I well remember his shocked surprise and bewilderment that he should be chosen for an office so vital and important. Nevertheless, with characteristic humility and obedience, he complied with my request and energetically set to the task of organising both the house for its function and the spiritual and academic curricula for the formation of our priests. In the seven years of his rectorship he enjoyed the satisfaction of seeing his first students ordained to the priesthood and during those years he was responsible both for the building of the chapel and of the first major extension. I said that today memories are crowding into my mind. Here is one of many. I recall his asking me, before the first session at Drygrange opened in 1953, if I had any special word of advice for him. And my reply—'Just remember that a seminary is a place where our future priests learn priestly virtue from the example of priests,' advice that had been given to me years before, when I was appointed rector of

Blairs College. The staff who worked with Roger Gallagher and the students who trained during his rectorship will know how literally he followed that advice.

"In 1960, the Canon asked if he might be allowed to relinquish his rectorship and return to his first love—parish work. I could not refuse the request of one who had given so generously of his talents and carried out so successfully the pioneer work that had been entrusted to him. So, in September of 1960, he was appointed parish priest of St. Patrick's in Edinburgh and, seven years later, for reasons of health, to this parish of Fauldhouse with its great Catholic traditions. He was happy here, a priest among the people he knew and loved and understood. He never spared himself. Whether or not he had felt unwell in recent months we shall never know. Certainly, he would not have complained. God called him suddenly, to us at least, unexpectedly. But he was not unprepared. In life, he walked and lived with Christ. In death Our Lord was surely with him—and Mary whose Rosary he loved.

"'I must decrease and he must increase,' St. John the Baptist, patron of this parish, said, and Canon Gallagher most surely made those words his own. He had no ambition save to show forth Jesus Christ and proclaim His message. I need say no more. The Canon was a man of character and moral strength, and he was a man of God. We shall miss him sorely, this good, kind, friendly, self-effacing priest who shunned publicity and only sought to blend unobtrusively into the background of the diocesan priesthood he loved, a background that now no longer seems complete.

"To you, good people of Fauldhouse, Canon Gallagher was a spiritual father and a well-loved friend: utterly dependable, mature in judgment, wise in counsel. He never lacked time to listen to your problems: he never appeared hurried despite his many duties. He could be firm when firmness was required. But always understanding, sympathetic, kind. Some of you have had experience of his unobtrusive charity. He liked to do good by stealth. He was embarrassed when the good he did was known and he was thanked. You were his first love after God and his Mother. He treasured your affection and your loyalty. And he was loyal to you.

"Together we sorrow deeply in his death, snatched from our midst when we could sorely spare him. But, if our sorrow is great, there are others whose grief is deeper still. To his brothers and sisters we can only offer our sympathy and the promise of our prayers. Words cannot express the sorrow we share with them. We mourn with them in silent grief.

"I have just one final word to say. Canon Roger Gallagher looked for no praise in life. He desires no human praise in death. Only one thing he wishes now—our prayers, that 'whatever sins he may have committed in life through human frailty, God in his great mercy may forgive.' To the priest great grace is given: but 'unto whomsoever much is given, of him much shall be required.' Let us pray for him in death who prayed for us in life that speedily he may enter into the joy of the Lord. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord. Amen."

NOTES ON THE STATISTICS

Baptisms

1. The number of Catholic baptisms in 1969 was lower than in the previous year—the decrease between 1968 and 1969 was 1,200. This was almost exactly in proportion with a similar decrease between these two years in the number of live births in Scotland. In 1968 Catholic baptisms were 23.7 per cent of live births and, in 1969 were 23.6 per cent.

2. In numbers, the highest figure for baptisms was recorded in the year 1962 at 26,015 (24.9 per cent of live births in Scotland); but, proportionately, the highest figure was in 1961 when Catholic baptisms (25,825) accounted for 25.5 per cent of live births in Scotland. There has been a steady decrease in the number of baptisms recorded in recent years but, since the number of live births in Scotland has also been decreasing each year since 1964, the proportion of Catholic baptisms to total live births in Scotland has remained reasonably stable.

4. For technical reasons, the return on the number of Catholic marriages published each year in the *Directory* is of significance only to the Church and does not rank as a reliable population index.

5. A series of Catholic marriage statistics is published by the Registrar-General for Scotland in his Annual Report. The latest figure available is for 1968. This shows the number of Catholic marriages in 1968 at 6,949 (15.9 per cent of all marriages in Scotland). The three important forms of marriage in Scotland in 1968 were:

6. In two burghs in Scotland in 1968 the largest number of marriages performed were Catholic: Coatbridge, where 47.0 per cent of all marriages were Catholic, and Dumbarton, with 38.4 per cent

of all marriages. In four areas, civil marriages were the most numerous: Dumfries County (53.1 per cent of all marriages), Dunfermline (49.4 per cent), Edinburgh (43.3 per cent), and Falkirk (42.3 per cent).

Population

8. The estimated Catholic population of Scotland decreased in 1970 by some 1,500 to a total of 818,500. Because of the continuing difficulty of collecting Catholic population figures in the Glasgow area, this small decrease is not in itself important except that it confirms the downward trend which has appeared in these estimates since 1966 when a highest-ever estimate was returned of 827,410 (15.9 per cent of the Scottish population in that year). Since an estimate of Scottish population in 1970 has not yet been published, it is not possible to provide any calculation of the percentage the estimated Catholic population was of the whole in 1970, but it may be either 15.8 or 15.7 per cent if recent trends continue.

No direct calculation is readily available of the effects of the transfer of population to other new housing areas in Dunbartonshire and Renfrewshire.

Conclusion

11. It is possible to formulate the tentative conclusion that the Catholic population in Scotland, in quantitative terms, reached its highest level in the years between 1961 and 1966: baptisms were highest, in numbers and in proportion to the country as a whole, in the years 1961 and 1962, while marriages were highest, proportionately, in 1961. The estimated population reached its peak in 1966. The present position is not one of dramatic decline but rather of a slow, and almost imperceptible, downward movement in all the indices of baptisms, marriages and estimated population.

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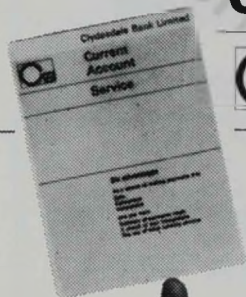
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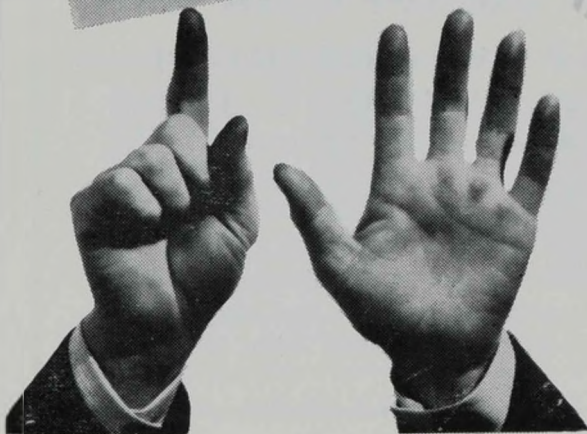
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
