# THE CHURCH IN SCOTLAND



## THE HIERARCHY OF SCOTLAND

### I

#### FROM THE EXTINCTION OF THE HIERARCHY IN 1603 TILL ITS RESTORATION IN 1878

The ancient hierarchy ended with the death of James Beaton, archbishop of Glasgow, at Paris on 24th April, 1603, aged 86.

Rome showed little interest in Scottish affairs in the years following the reformation. From 1598 to 1621 Scottish Catholics were nominally subject to the English archpriests but there is no evidence that they concerned themselves with their Scottish subjects. The appointment of the first English vicar apostolic, William Bishop (1623-1624), was of a different order since his jurisdiction was episcopal and included Scotland. In a petition to Gregory XV, the few Scottish secular priests still on the Continent appealed to the papal bull, *Cum universi*, dated 13th March 1592, which declared the Scottish Church subject only to the Roman see; and the point was conceded. Nevertheless, the brief in 1625 appointing the second English vicar apostolic, Richard Smith, again included Scotland but on this occasion the issue of jurisdiction does not appear to have been raised. Smith's stay in England, in the event, was short and he had left by 1631. The work of the Irish Franciscan mission in the Highlands and Islands was the main burden of the missionary effort in Scotland during these years; and it was not until 1650 that a group of Scottish seculars met in Paris under the leadership of William Ballantine to consider what should be done.

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*Dates of events which occurred in Scotland before 1752 are given in Old Style while those which took place in European countries before 1752 are expressed in New Style. Consecrations qualified by the phrase "in secret" are those for which extraordinary measures were taken to conceal both the event and the news that it had taken place.*

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*Their names should be recorded: William Ballantine, James Crichton, William Leslie, Thomas Lumsden, John Smith and John Walker. They reached two important conclusions: to send William Leslie to Rome as agent for the Scottish secular clergy; and to petition Propaganda for the incorporation of the clergy into a missionary body, adequately subsidised by Rome. This was done by a decree of the Congregation de propaganda fide, dated 13th October, 1653; and it is to Ballantine that the credit for this first step is due.*

### PREFECTS APOSTOLIC

1. *William Ballantine*: born 1618, son of Thomas Ballantine (or Bannatine), minister of North Berwick, and Margaret Cockburn; brought up as a Presbyterian in Douglas where his father was incumbent from June 1621; educated University of Edinburgh (matriculated 1635, but left without graduating, presumably in 1636); received into Catholic Church, probably at Paris, date unknown; entered Scots College, Rome, to study for priesthood, 1641, and took the oath, 1st November; "factus ob infirmitatem citius sacerdos," 3rd December 1645; left the College, 15th March 1646; prefect of studies at Scots College, Paris; arrived in Scotland, "immediately before the Hellish Murder of the Best of Kings" [30th January 1649]; returned to Paris, 1650, and arranged meeting of six Scottish priests at which it was agreed that he and John Walker should petition Propaganda for the appointment of a prefect and missionaries with subsidy and that William Leslie should go to Rome as agent for Scottish secular priests; appointed prefect, 13th October 1653; arrested at Rye, Sussex, England, September 1656, imprisoned until July 1658, released on personal order of the Protector, Oliver Cromwell, with a gift of £60 to take him to France; returned to Scotland, 18th May 1660; died at Elgin, 2nd September 1661, and is buried in the Huntly aisle, Elgin Cathedral, Moray; author of *A preparation for death or, The practice of dying well* (2nd edition, 1715).
2. *Alexander Winchester*: born at Garmouth, Moray, c. 1625 [parents' names unknown]; studied for four years at Rheims and for four further years under the Jesuits at Dijon; entered Scots College, Rome, to study for priesthood, 27th May 1651; ordained priest, 21st May 1656; left College, 1657 [at a meeting of Propaganda, 3rd September 1657, described as a member of Scots College in Rome who had just finished his studies]; appointed prefect 12th June 1662; school with 60 pupils established on Skye, c. 1663, by Ewen McAllister, schoolmaster, but subsequently driven out and re-established with 24 pupils in Glen Garry, 1665; absent in France, 1668-1672, during which period John Walker substituted as prefect but was not formally appointed as such by Propaganda; apostolic visitation of Scotland by Alexander Leslie, 1677-1680, with report submitted to Propaganda, January 1681; proposed by John Leyburne, vicar apostolic of England, to Propaganda as

bishop for Scotland, 19th February 1686; Dean of Chapel Royal, Holyrood, 1687; escaped north to Gordon Castle at the Revolution in 1688; resigned July 1697; died at Banff, 14th January 1708, and is buried in St. Ninian's churchyard, Tynet, Moray. [There is little prospect of discovering Winchester's real name. The parish register for Urquhart in the presbytery of Elgin, which includes Garmouth, has nothing earlier than 1647. During his life he was known under many aliases, especially that of Dunbar; there is a Nicholas Dunbar, a merchant of Moray, included in the list of Catholics in Prefect Ballantine's report to Propaganda in 1660. Clapperton, however, says that his father's name was John Gray and implies that he was born in 1629. "Winchester" is a north-east of Scotland name, pronounced "Winster", and it is in the latter form that his name appears in the Scots College register and in the ordination registers of the Roman vicariate.]

*In practice the prefecture apostolic covered only the Scots-speaking parts of the country. From 1612 to 1647 Gaelic-speaking Catholics in the Hebrides and Western Highlands of Scotland were ministered to by priests from the Irish Franciscan mission who were formally commissioned in this work by Urban VIII on 4th September 1623. At first they worked from the Irish Franciscan College of St. Anthony, Leuven, Belgium, but in 1626 they were granted as their headquarters the friary at Bonamargy, County Antrim, Ireland, traditional burial place of the MacDonnells of Antrim, descendants of the Lords of the Isles. The Irish spoken by these missionaries was understood by the people of the Highlands and Islands. The most effective period of their work was during the years 1624-1637. Although Patrick Hegarty worked from Bonamargy as prefect of this mission from 1631 to 1647, he did not visit Scotland during this period and the priest who spent the greatest number of years on the mission was Patrick Brady who laboured, chiefly in Sutherland, from 1619 to 1637. The last priest to leave was Cornelius Ward in the summer of 1637. Although the mission was formally re-established on 22nd January 1647 under Edmund McCann, no details of this new enterprise have come down to us and there is no evidence that any missionaries ever reached the Highlands and Islands.*

*Further attempts to carry on this mission were made by the Vincenians of whom the best known is Francis White, "a truly Apostolic man," who was sent to Scotland by St. Vincent de Paul in 1654 and who worked in the West Highlands until his death on 28th January 1679. On 20th April 1665 and 20th September 1666 Propaganda in Congregation considered requests from the prefect, Alexander Winchester, that Irish-speaking priests should again be sent to the Highlands. It was eventually decided by Propaganda that a separate prefect apostolic for the Highlands and Islands should be provided and, on 17th September 1669, St. Oliver Plunkett, nominated only two months earlier to the archbishopric of Armagh, Ireland, was appointed additionally to this office and continued in it until his martyrdom in 1681.*

## THE VICARS APOSTOLIC OF SCOTLAND

1: 1694-1727

*The report on the state of the Mission requested in 1677 by Propaganda, prepared by Alexander Leslie and presented by him to the Congregation in January 1681, recommended, inter alia, the appointment of a general superior for Scotland, with authority over both seculars and regulars. At their meeting on 4th March 1681, Propaganda accepted most of Leslie's proposals but took no action on the nomination of a bishop. However, the disarray in which the Church in Scotland found itself after the "Glorious Revolution" of November-December 1688 and the subsequent triumph, by the settlement of 7th June 1690, of presbyterianism over episcopalianism as the form of Church government in Scotland confirmed the need among Catholics for a single episcopal superior towards whom all could look for leadership and support.*

*On 16th March 1694 Innocent XII approved the establishment of a vicariate apostolic for Scotland under a titular bishop (APF Acta (1694) vol 64 fo 37v) and on 27th July 1694 Thomas Nicolson's name was proposed by Propaganda in Congregation for the appointment ["per tale Ministerio D. Tomaso Nicolson, sacerdote scozzese antico e benemerito Missionario il quale ha qualità, dottrina e costumi ecclesiastici com'è stato rappresentato più particolarmente all'Em. Prefetto"] (APF Acta (1694) vol 64 fo 130v/131r) and confirmed by decree of Propaganda, 17th August, 1694. On 5th September 1694 Innocent XII approved the appointment of Thomas Nicolson as first vicar apostolic.*

1. **Thomas Nicolson:** born at Birkenbog, Banffshire, c. 1645, son of Thomas Nicolson of Pitmedden, Aberdeenshire, and Elizabeth Abercromby of Birkenbog; brought up as an Episcopalian; educated University of Aberdeen (matriculated 1660); regent [i.e. professor], University of Glasgow, 1666-1681; after the Test Act passed by the Parliament of Scotland, 13th August 1681, he "demurred to take the Test appointed by act of Parliament", and was deprived of his regency, presumably in the autumn of 1681, (by inference from an entry in Register of the Privy Council); received into Catholic Church, 1682; visited Scots College, Douai, 3rd July 1682, when he was described in College diary as being 36 years old and formerly professor of Greek, mathematics and philosophy in University of Glasgow; appointed to staff of episcopal seminary at Padua, Italy, and later decided to enter the priesthood; prefect of studies, October 1685 to August 1687; ordained at Padua, 9th March, 1686; returned to Scotland as missionary, December 1687, and stationed at Glasgow where he stayed in the town house of the Baillie family of Castlecary; name proposed by James VII as bishop, July 1688; arrested at the Revolution and imprisoned in Stirling Castle, November, 1688; exiled to France on bond of his brother, Lord

Kemnay; chaplain to English Benedictine nuns at Dunkirk, 1689-1694; nominated titular bishop of Peristasis and first vicar apostolic of Scotland, 7th September 1694, and consecrated by Jules de Mascaron, Cong. Orat., bishop of Agen, France, assisted by Henri de Barillon, bishop of Luçon, France, and Martin de Ratabon, bishop of Ieper, Belgium, in secret at Paris, 27th February 1695; left Paris for Scotland, 8th April 1695, but for lack of a passport was unable to cross to England and was forced to spend the rest of that year and most of the next in Holland and Germany where, at Würzburg, he received in August 1696 from John Ambrose Cook, O.S.B., abbot of Würzburg, and Thomas Placid Fleming, O.S.B., abbot of Ratisbon, the promise of complete submission to his authority of Benedictine monks while on the mission; arrived in England, November 1696, arrested, and subsequently released, May 1697; arrived in Edinburgh, July 1697, but took up residence at Preshome, Banffshire, which thus became administrative centre of Church in Scotland; divided Scotland into fixed districts to which missionaries were attached and prepared rules for their direction, April 1700, which were approved by Propaganda in 1706 and remained in force until 1780 [*Statuta Missionis*—see under George Hay (6) below]; received from William Aloysius Leslie, S.J., submission of Jesuit missionaries to his authority at Aberdeen, 7th February 1701; undertook extensive visitations of Highlands and Lowlands; ordained Peter Fraser priest, 11th March 1704, probably at Preshome, the first ordination in Scotland [? British Isles] since the reformation; “a very great man, both in learning and piety, under whom the Mission was always free from intestine embroils”; imprisoned at Fochabers after failure of Jacobite rising in 1715 but obtained his release “by the judicious use of money”; died at Preshome, 12th October 1718, and is buried in St. Ninian’s churchyard, Tynet, Moray.

2. **James Gordon:** born at Glastirum, Enzie, Banffshire, 31st January 1665, son of Patrick Gordon of Glastirum and Margaret Seton; entered Scots College, Paris 1679, sent first to Louvain but returned to Paris, 1683; B.A. (Paris, 1692); ordained at Paris [date unknown]; missionary in the Enzie, 1692-1702; assistant to Scots agent in Rome, 1702-1706; English agent at Rome, 1703-1706; nominated titular bishop of Nicopolis and coadjutor vicar apostolic, 21st August 1705, and consecrated by Marc’Antonio Barbarigo, cardinal archbishop-bishop of Montefiascone, assisted by Giuseppe Cianti, bishop of Sutri, and Onofrio Elisei, bishop of Bagnoregio, in secret at Montefiascone, Italy, 11th April 1706; arrived in Scotland, July 1706; a great apostolic bishop who during the whole of his long episcopate made heroic visitations of Highlands and Lowlands; founded with seven boys [Hugh MacDonald (see (10) below) being one of them] seminary at Loch Morar, Inverness-shire, 1714; in hiding with rest of clergy during persecutions after failure of Jacobite rising in 1715; re-opened Loch Morar seminary and transferred it to Scalan,

- Banffshire, 1716; succeeded as vicar apostolic, 12th October 1718; translated on division of vicariate to Lowland District, 23rd July 1727.
3. *John Wallace*: born at Arbroath, baptised 8th April 1654 [Arbroath Parochial Register in New Register House, Edinburgh], son of Patrick Wallace, merchant [mother's name unknown]; [the Wallace family played a leading part in the affairs of Arbroath in the 17th and 18th centuries, and many with the name of Patrick Wallace were provost; they were, in religion, Episcopalian; politically, after 1688, Jacobites; in trade, tobacco and linen merchants with a taste for smuggling]; brought up as an Episcopalian and licensed to preach and baptise in Episcopalian ministry; tutor to children of Earl of Perth, 1681 "in Lent"; left Scotland for France, 1686, and probably received into Catholic Church there; after Revolution with Jacobite court at St. Germain-en-Laye; private almoner to James VII; retired to live at Scots College, Paris; was persuaded by Bishop James Gordon in July 1706 to return to Scotland and did so in October 1706; ordained at Preshome, 3rd April 1708; missionary at Arbroath; in February 1709 the Presbytery of Arbroath recorded that "popery was prevailing in Arbroath, by the industry of Mr. John Wallace, and by reason of his interest in the place and in the country about" and he was therefore summoned to the justiciary court at Perth, 1709, for apostasy and for trafficking and perverting but, for want of evidence, the diet was deserted; from 1709 lived mainly in Edinburgh where he was chaplain to Duchess of Gordon; nominated titular bishop of Cyrrhus and coadjutor vicar apostolic, 30th April 1720, and consecrated by James Gordon, titular bishop of Nicopolis and vicar apostolic of Scotland, assisted by Alexander Drummond, priest, and James Carnegie, priest, in secret at Edinburgh, 21st September 1720; arrested Edinburgh, 1722, and outlawed; died at Edinburgh, 30th June 1733 [place of burial unknown].

## II: 1727-1827

*On 23rd July 1727 Scotland was divided into two vicariates, the Lowland and Highland Districts. Alexander John Grant was nominated titular bishop of Sura 16th September 1727, and vicar apostolic, Highland District, 19th September 1727. He was born at Wester Boggs, Enzie, Banffshire, c. 1693, son of Peter Grant and Ann Reid, and elder brother of James Grant (see (5) below); entered Scots College, Rome, 2nd April 1711, aged 17; ordained priest [sub-deacon, 18th December 1717, but dates of diaconate and priesthood not traced]; left the College, 5th June 1719; at Scots College, Paris, July 1719 to July 1721; arrived in Scotland, August 1721; and was superior at Scaln, 1721-1726. In anticipation of his appointment he went to Paris, November 1726, and to Rome, March 1727. Although he was duly elected by Propaganda on 16th December, 1726, there was, for a number of reasons, a delay of some seven months before this was approved by Benedict XIII on 6th August 1727. In the meantime,*

*Grant left Rome in April 1727 for Loreto and eventually reached Genoa in August where he became ill. He was last heard from in a letter dated 28th December 1727, seriously ill and living in great poverty in Genoa. It is presumed that he died there since no further trace of him has been discovered.*

*A successor was not appointed until 12th February 1731 when Hugh MacDonald was provided to the Highland District. The brief issued by Clement XII approving this nomination contained a clause empowering Bishops Gordon and MacDonald to define the limits of their respective Districts. This was done at a bishops' meeting in Edinburgh in October 1731 following Bishop MacDonald's consecration and was formally ratified by Propaganda in Congregation on 7th January 1732. The division was made on a basic recognition of the linguistic and cultural differences which separated the two peoples of Scotland at that time. In general terms, the two Districts were divided along a line which may be thought of as running from Dumbarton to Nairn, with the Scots-speaking area to the south and east comprising the Lowland District and the Gaelic-speaking area to the north and west in the Highland District, but with a number of localities where each overlapped the other.*

### Lowland District

**James Gordon**, translated 23rd July 1727 but translation not effective until 18th October 1731; died at Thornhill, Perthshire, 18th February 1746, and is buried at Innerpeffrey, Perthshire.

4. **Alexander Smith**: born at Fochabers, Moray, "about Peter's Day", 1684, son of [Robert?] Smith, surgeon, and Catherine Wilson; entered Scots College, Paris, 1698; M.A. (Paris), 1703; returned from Paris, 1709, as deacon; ordained at Preshome, 19th April 1712; seriously ill after ordination, living in Aberdeen, but movements uncertain until return to Paris; procurator, Scots College, Paris, 1718-1730; returned to Scotland, July 1730; missionary in Angus, but illness [scrofula] continued and he was allowed to return to Paris, May 1733-August 1735; nominated titular bishop of Mosynopolis and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, 19th September 1735, and consecrated by James Gordon, titular bishop of Nicopolis and vicar apostolic, Lowland District, assisted by Hugh MacDonald, vicar apostolic, Highland District; and Peter Grant, priest, at Edinburgh, 2nd November 1735; succeeded, 18th February 1746; in exile in England, 1750-1751; published first Scottish Catholic catechism, 1757, reprinted 1760; died at Edinburgh, 21st August 1767 [place of burial unknown].
5. **James Grant**: born at Wester Boggs, Enzie, Banffshire, July 1706, son of Peter Grant and Ann Reid; at Scalán for two years before entering Scots College, Rome, 16th January 1726; ordained at Rome, 4th April 1733; at Sulpician seminary of St.

Nicolas du Chardonnet, Paris, 1734-1735; stationed at Lochaber, 1735-1736; missionary on Barra and South Uist, 1736-1746; imprisoned in common jail at Inverness, 1746-1747; missionary at Rathven, 1748-1755; nominated titular bishop of Sinitis and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, 21st February 1755, and consecrated by Alexander Smith, titular bishop of Mosynopolis and vicar apostolic, Lowland District, assisted by Hugh MacDonald, vicar apostolic, Highland District. [name of second co-consecrator unknown] in secret at Edinburgh, 13th November 1755; succeeded, 21st August 1767; died at Aberdeen, 3rd December 1778, and is buried in the Snow churchyard Old Aberdeen.

- 6 **George Hay**: born at Edinburgh, 24th August 1729, son of James Hay, writer, and Mary Morrison; brought up as an Episcopalian; apprenticed to George Lauder, surgeon, 1745; impressed with other Edinburgh doctors and medical students to treat wounded after battle of Prestonpans, 21st September 1745, and thereafter followed the Jacobite army to England and on the retreat to Scotland; according to tradition, subsequently imprisoned at Edinburgh and London before being released and returning to Edinburgh in June 1747, but his name is not included by Seton and Arnot in *The Prisoners of the '45* (Scottish History Society, 1928-1929, 3 vols.); received into Catholic Church, 21st December 1748; owed vocation to priesthood to Bishop Richard Challoner whom he met in 1750 in London; entered Scots College, Rome, 10th September 1751; ordained at Rome, 2nd April 1758; missionary at Preshome, 1759-1767; procurator of the vicariate, 1767-1779 and stationed at Edinburgh; nominated titular bishop of Daulia and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, 5th October 1768, and consecrated by James Grant, titular bishop of Sinitis and vicar apostolic, Lowland District, assisted by Hugh MacDonald, vicar apostolic, Highland District, and John MacDonald, coadjutor vicar apostolic, Highland District, in secret at Scalan, 21st May 1769; succeeded, 3rd December 1778; devotional writer, controversialist and administrator of great ability; during period of great stress for the Church in Scotland moved its centre away from Highlands to Aberdeen and Edinburgh; revised in conjunction with Bishops MacDonald and Geddes the *Statuta Missionis*, dated April 1700, of Bishop Nicolson and secured approval and publication of revised text by Propaganda: *Instructiones ad munera Apostolica rite obeunda per utiles missionibus S . . . [Scotiae] accommodatae* [Romae: Typis S. Cong. de Propaganda Fide, 1782]; founded seminary at Aquhorties, Aberdeenshire, to which students transferred from Scalan, 24th July 1799; resigned 24th August 1805; died at Aquhorties, 15th October 1811, and is buried in St. Ninian's churchyard, Fetternear, Aberdeenshire, but the exact site of his grave is unknown and no memorial marks the last resting place of the greatest of the Scottish vicars apostolic; collected edition of writings published as *Works . . . a new edition edited*

under the supervision of Bishop Strain (7 vols., 1871-1873, 2nd edition, 5 vols., 1872); centenary reprintings of *The sincere Christian* (1911) and *Bishop Hay on the priesthood* (1911).

7. **John Geddes:** born at Mains of Corridoun, Enzie, Banffshire, 29th August 1735, son of John Geddes and Marjory Burgess; entered Scots College, Rome, 6th February 1750; ordained at Rome, 18th March 1759; missionary at Shenval, 1759-1762; superior, Scalán, 1762-1767; missionary at Preshome, 1767-1770; rector, Scots College, Madrid, 1770, which he transferred to Valladolid, 1771, and where he remained until 1780; nominated titular bishop of Marocco and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, 30th September 1779, and consecrated by Francisco Lorenzana, archbishop of Toledo [names of co-consecrators unknown], at Madrid, 30th November 1780; in charge of the mission at Edinburgh, 1781-1793, where he had outstandingly successful apostolate among non-Catholics; recipient from the poet, Robert Burns, of the copy of the first Edinburgh edition (1787) of his poems with additional poems in manuscript, known as the "Geddes Burns," now in the Huntington Library, San Marino, California, U.S.A.; wrote *Brief historical account of the seminary of Scalán* (1777.—published *Innes Review*, xiv (1963) 93-105, *Life of St. Margaret* (1794), *Account of the Scotch Mission in 1745-6-7* (1794—published in this *Directory*, 1838), contributed to 3rd edition of *Encyclopaedia Britannica* (1788-1797), *Watch and Pray* (1797), *Réflexions sur le Duel* [Paris, 1801], and a catalogue in MSS. of the secular missionaries; retired to Aberdeen, 26th October 1793, through ill-health; died at Aberdeen, 11th February 1799, and is buried in the Snow churchyard, Old Aberdeen.
8. **Alexander Cameron:** born Braemar, Aberdeenshire, 28th July 1747, son of James Cameron and Marjory Mackintosh; at Scalán, 1760-1764, before entering Scots College, Rome, 22nd December 1764; "optimae capacitatis et ingenii; prudentia, morum probitate superioribus charus, dignus propterea qui a sacra Congregne prae oculis haberetur"; ordained at Rome, 2nd February 1772; missionary in Strath Avon, 1772-1780; rector, Scots College, Valladolid, 1780-1798; nominated titular bishop of Maximianopolis in Palaestina and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, 19th September 1797, and consecrated by Antonio de Tavira, bishop of Salamanca [names of co-consecrators unknown], at Madrid, 28th October 1798; arrived in Scotland, 22nd August 1802; succeeded, 24th August 1805; resigned, 20th August 1825; died at Edinburgh, 7th February 1828, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh.
9. **Alexander Paterson:** born at Pathhead, Enzie, Banffshire, March 1766 [names of parents unknown]; at Scalán, 29th April 1780, and left for Scots College, Douai, 8th October 1780 [date of entry unknown]; ordained at Douai, date unknown [? 1791]; prefect of studies at Douai until closure of College in March 1793; missionary at Tombae, Glenlivet, 1793-1812, Paisley, 1812-1816; nominated

titular bishop of Cybistra and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, 14th May 1816, and consecrated by Alexander Cameron, titular bishop of Maximianopolis in Palaestina and vicar apostolic, Lowland District, assisted by Aeneas Chisholm, vicar apostolic, Highland District [name of second co-consecrator unknown], at Paisley, 15th August 1816; succeeded 20th August 1825; translated on division of vicariates to Eastern District, 13th February 1827.

### Highland District

10. **Hugh MacDonald:** born Morar, Inverness-shire, 2nd February 1699, son of Alexander MacDonald of Morar by his second wife, Mary MacDonald of Kinlochmoidart, and uncle of John MacDonald (11 below); one of the first students at Loch Morar, 1714, and at Scalán, 1716; one of first two priests ordained at Scalán, 18th September 1725; missionary at Morar, 1725-1730; at Scots College, Paris, July 1730 - September 1731, in preparation for episcopal appointment; nominated titular bishop of Diana and first vicar apostolic, Highland District, 12th February 1731, and consecrated by James Gordon, titular bishop of Nicopolis and vicar apostolic, Lowland District, assisted by John Wallace, coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, and Alexander Smith, priest, at Edinburgh, 18th October 1731; refounded Highland seminary at Loch Morar, 1732, transferred it to Guidale, near Arisaig, 1737, and disbanded it, 1746; among the party of MacDonalds who visited Prince Charles Edward Stuart after his arrival in Scotland, 25th July 1745, and advised him to return to France; nevertheless, blessed the Prince's Standard when raised at Glenfinnan, 19th August 1745; after failure at Culloden, 16th April 1746, escaped to France, 19th September 1746; returned to Scotland, August 1749, but lived mainly outside his District which he visited in 1752; betrayed by a namesake and arrested in Edinburgh, July 1755; sentenced to perpetual banishment, 1st March 1756, but sentence not enforced; lived quietly, mainly at Shenval in the Cabrach, Banffshire; refounded Highland seminary at Glenfinnan, 1767; one of the only two of those who played a leading part at Glenfinnan to die at peace in their native land; died in Glen Garry, 12th March 1773, and is buried at Kilfinnan, Invergarry, Inverness-shire.
11. **John MacDonald:** born at Ardnamurchan, Argyllshire, 1727, son of Donald MacDonald of Ardnamurchan and Catherine MacDonald of Morar, and nephew of Hugh MacDonald (10 above); entered Scots College, Rome, 21st March 1743; ordained at Rome, 1st April 1752; missionary in Lochaber, 1752-1754, and South Uist, 1754-1761; nominated titular bishop of Tiberiopolis and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Highland District, 25th February 1761, and consecrated by his uncle, Hugh MacDonald, titular bishop of Diana and vicar apostolic, Highland District, assisted by Alexander Smith, vicar apostolic, Lowland District, and James Grant, coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District, at Preshome,

27th September 1761; transferred Highland seminary to Buorblach, 1770, but it was again disbanded, 1779; succeeded, 12th March 1773; died at Knoydart, 9th May 1779, and is buried at Kilchoan, Knoydart, Inverness-shire.

12. **Alexander MacDonald:** born at Bornish, South Uist, 1736, son of Ranald MacDonald of Bornish [mother's name unknown]; entered Scots College, Rome, 20th January 1754; ordained at Rome, 10th August 1764; missionary on Barra, 1765-1780; nominated titular bishop of Polemonium and vicar apostolic, Highland District, 30th September 1779, and consecrated by George Hay, titular bishop of Daulia and vicar apostolic, Lowland District, assisted by Alexander Cameron, priest, and James McGillivray, priest, at Scalán, 12th March 1780; refounded Highland seminary at Samalaman, 1783; died at Samalaman, 9th September 1791 [place of burial unknown but probably on St. Finnan's Isle in Moidart, Inverness-shire].
13. **John Chisholm:** born in Strath Glass, Inverness-shire, September 1752, son of Valentine Chisholm and Janet MacDonell, and elder brother of Aeneas Chisholm (14 below); entered Scots College, Douai, 15th July 1766, aged 13, and subsequently the Jesuit novitiate at Tournai, but on suppression of the Society in 1773 returned to Douai; ordained at Douai, April 1777; missionary in Strath Glass, 1777-1791; nominated titular bishop of Oreus and vicar apostolic, Highland District, 8th November 1791, and consecrated by George Hay, titular bishop of Daulia and vicar apostolic, Lowland District [assisted by two priests, names unknown], at Edinburgh, 12th February 1792; transferred Highland seminary from Samalaman to Island of Lismore, 1803; died on Lismore, 8th July 1814, and is buried at Kilcheran, Lismore, Argyllshire.
14. **Aeneas Chisholm:** born in Strath Glass, Inverness-shire, 1759, son of Valentine Chisholm and Janet MacDonell, and younger brother of John Chisholm (13 above); entered Scots College, Valladolid, 28th October 1774; ordained [? at Valladolid], 1783; on staff at Valladolid, 1783-1786; prefect of studies, Scots College, Douai, 1786-1788; missionary in Strath Glass, 1788-1805; nominated titular bishop of Diocæsarea and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Highland District, 11th May 1804, and consecrated by Alexander Cameron, titular bishop of Maximianopolis in Palaestina and vicar apostolic, Lowland District [names of co-consecrators unknown], on Lismore, 15th September 1805; succeeded 8th July 1814; died on Lismore, 31st July 1818, and is buried at Kilcheran, Lismore, Argyllshire.
15. **Ranald MacDonald:** born at Edinburgh, 1756, son of Alasdair MacDonald of Fersit and Margaret MacDonald of Cranachan, both cadet families of the MacDonalds of Keppoch; entered Scots College, Douai [date unknown]; ordained at Douai, [?1780]; missionary in Glen Gairn, 1780-1782, Lochaber, 1782-[?1785], Glen Garry, 1785-1805, South Uist, 1805-1820; nominated titular

bishop of Arindela and vicar apostolic, Highland District, 27th August 1819, and consecrated by Alexander Paterson, titular bishop of Cybistra and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Lowland District [names of co-consecrators unknown], at Edinburgh, 25th February 1820; translated on division of vicariates to Western District, 13th February 1827.

### III: 1827-1878

*On 13th February 1827, Scotland was divided into three vicariates, the Eastern, Western and Northern Districts.*

*The Eastern District, centred on Edinburgh, comprised the Counties of Angus, Berwick, Clackmannan, Dumfries, Fife, Kincardine, Kinross, Kirkcudbright, East Lothian, Midlothian, West Lothian, Peebles, Perth, Roxburgh, Selkirk, and Stirling.*

*The Western District, centred on Glasgow, included the Counties of Argyll, Ayr, Bute, Dunbarton, Inverness (southern part), Lanark, Renfrew, Wigton, and the Western Isles.*

*The Northern District, with its centre at Aberdeen but in practice at Preshome, consisted of the Counties of Aberdeen, Banff, Caithness, Inverness (northern part), Moray, Nairn, Ross and Cromarty, Sutherland, and the Orkney and Shetland Isles.*

### Eastern District

**Alexander Paterson**, translated from Lowland District, 13th February 1827; united Aquhorties and Lismore seminaries into one college, St. Mary's College, established at Blairs, Kincardineshire, 2nd June 1829; died at Dundee, 30th October 1831, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh.

*Andrew Scott, coadjutor vicar apostolic, Western District, apostolic administrator, 24th December 1831.*

16. **Andrew Carruthers**: born at Drummillan Miln, New Abbey, Kirkcudbrightshire, baptised 8th February 1770, son of Andrew Carruthers and Lucy Rigg [Scottish Record Office copy of Kirkcudbright Register]; entered Scots College, Douai ["in his 16th year"—? 1785] but transferred to Scalan, October 1792; ordained at Aberdeen, 25th March 1795; missionary at Balloch, Crieff, Perthshire, 1795-1797, Traquair, Peebles-shire, 1797-1800, Munches, Kirkcudbrightshire, 1800-1814, and Dalbeattie, 1814-1832; nominated titular bishop of Ceramus and vicar apostolic, Eastern District, 28th September 1832, and consecrated by Thomas Penswick, titular bishop of Europus and vicar apostolic, Northern District of England, assisted by Andrew Scott, vicar apostolic, Western District, and James Kyle, vicar apostolic, Northern District, at Edinburgh, 13th January 1833; died at Dundee, 24th May 1852, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh.

17. **James Gillis:** born in the parish of Notre Dame, Montreal, Canada, 7th April 1802, son of Alexander Gillis, "maitre de pension en cette ville," and Elizabeth Langley [baptised 8th May 1802 and baptismal record in La Paroisse Notre-Dame de Montreal, P.Q., Canada]; at Aquhorties, 27th October 1817, before entering diocesan seminary of St. Nicholas, Paris, 17th December 1818, and subsequently the Sulpician seminary of Issy-les-Moulineaux, October 1823; returned to Scotland for health reasons (April 1826), continued studies privately under Fr. Andrew Scott in Glasgow; ordained at Aquhorties, 9th June 1827; stationed at Edinburgh, 1828-1838; introduced the first post-reformation religious order of women to Scotland, the Ursulines of Jesus, 1834; nominated titular bishop of Limyra and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Eastern District, 28th July 1837, and consecrated by Peter Augustine Baines, O.S.B., titular bishop of Sigus and vicar apostolic, Western District of England, assisted by Andrew Scott, vicar apostolic, Western District, and James Kyle, vicar apostolic, Northern District, at Edinburgh, 22nd July 1838; succeeded 24th May 1852; died at Edinburgh, 24th February 1864, and is buried in St. Margaret's convent, Whitehouse Loan, Edinburgh.
18. **John Menzies Strain:** born at Edinburgh, 8th December, 1810, son of Hugh Strain, jeweller, and Cecily Mackenzie [baptismal record, St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh]; at Aquhorties, 9th September 1820, before entering Scots College, Rome, 20th July 1826; transferred to Propaganda College, 10th January 1833, following death of rector of Scots College; ordained at Rome, 9th June 1833; stationed at Dumfries, 1833-1835; missionary at Dalbeattie, 1835-1857, Dumfries, 1857-1858; president, Blairs College, 1858-1864; *pro* vicar-general, Eastern District, 1862-1863; nominated titular bishop of Abila Lysaniae and vicar apostolic, Eastern District, 2nd September 1864, and consecrated by Pope Pius IX, assisted by Giuseppe Berardi, titular archbishop of Nicaea and substitute, Secretariat of State, and Francesco Marinelli, O.E.S.A., titular bishop of Porphyreon and papal sacrist, at Rome, 25th September 1864; named assistant at the pontifical throne, 17th June 1867; took part in Vatican Council, 1869-1870; translated on restoration of hierarchy to archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 15th March 1878.

- Ranald MacDonald,** translated from Highland District, 13th February 1827; died at Fort William, 20th September 1832, and is now buried in Cille Choireil cemetery, Lochaber, Inverness-shire.
19. **Andrew Scott:** born at Chapelford, Enzie, Banffshire, 15th February 1772, son of John Scott and Margaret Innes, and uncle of John Gray (22 below); at Scalán, 26th January 1785, before entering Scots College, Douai [date unknown] but on closure of College in March 1793 returned to Scalán; ordained at Aberdeen,

- 25th March 1795; missionary at Dee Castle, Aberdeenshire, 1795-1800, Huntly, 1800-1805, Glasgow, 1805-1827; nominated titular bishop of Erythrae and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Western District, 13th February 1827, and consecrated by Alexander Paterson, titular bishop of Cybistra and vicar apostolic, Eastern District, assisted by Ranald MacDonald, vicar apostolic, Western District, and Thomas Penswick, titular bishop of Europus and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Northern District, England, at Glasgow, 21st September 1828; succeeded 20th September 1832; apostolic administrator, Eastern District, 1831-1832; heroic work over forty years earned him the title of "modern apostle of the West of Scotland"; resigned 15th October 1845; died at Greenock, 4th December 1846, and is buried in St. Mary's church, Abercromby Street, Glasgow.
20. **John Murdoch:** born at Wellsheads, Enzie, Banffshire, baptised 9th October 1796, son of John Murdoch and Helen Simpson [baptismal record now at St. Mary, Fochabers]; at Aquhorties, 24th January 1809, before entering Scots College, Valladolid, 12th December 1816; ordained [? at Valladolid], 19th March 1821; missionary at Glasgow, 1821-1833; nominated titular bishop of Thabraca and coadjutor bishop of Kingston, Canada, 8th March 1833, but appointment opposed by Bishop Scott whose coadjutor he was subsequently elected by Propaganda, 20th May 1833; nominated titular bishop of Castabala and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Western District, 4th June 1833, and consecrated by James Kyle, titular bishop of Germanicia and vicar apostolic, Northern District, assisted by Andrew Scott, vicar apostolic, Western District, and Andrew Carruthers, vicar apostolic, Eastern District, at Glasgow, 20th October 1833; succeeded 15th October 1845; died at Glasgow, 15th December 1865, and is buried in St. Mary's church, Abercromby Street, Glasgow.
21. **Alexander Smith:** born at Newbigging, Clochan, Banffshire, baptised 26th January 1813, son of Peter Smith and Margaret Thomson [Preshome baptismal register now at St. Peter, Buckie]; at Aquhorties, 12th August 1826, transferred to Blairs, 2nd June 1829, and sent to Scots College, Rome, 7th August 1832, but, following death of rector on 3rd January, 1833, transferred on 10th January 1833 to Propaganda College; returned to Scotland in 1834 for health reasons and studied privately under Bishop Andrew Scott in Greenock; ordained at Glasgow, 2nd February 1836; missionary at Greenock, 1836-1842, Airdrie, 1842-1847; nominated titular bishop of Paros and coadjutor vicar apostolic Western District, 6th July 1847, and consecrated by John Murdoch, titular bishop of Castabala and vicar apostolic, Western District, assisted by James Kyle, vicar apostolic, Northern District and Andrew Carruthers, vicar apostolic, Eastern District, at Glasgow, 3rd October 1847; in United States of America, March 1848—January 1849; died at Glasgow, 15th June 1861, and is buried in St. Peter's Cemetery, Dalbeth, Glasgow.

22. **John Gray**: born Buckie, Banffshire, 16th June 1817, son of William Gray and Joan Scott, and nephew of Andrew Scott (19 above) [baptism not traced in Buckie, Preshome, Tynet and Tombae registers]; at Blairs, 27th July 1832, before entering Scots College, Rome, 30th September 1838; ordained at Rome, 1st May 1841; remained at Scots College to say Mass for Abbé Paul Macpherson; left for Scotland, 17th April 1843; stationed at St. Andrew, Glasgow, 1843-1846; missionary, St. John, Glasgow, 1846-1847; Airdrie, 1847-1848; in United States of America with Bishop Smith, March 1848-January 1849; St. John, Glasgow, 1849-1853; St. Andrew, Glasgow, 1853-1862; vicar-general Western District, 1860; nominated titular bishop of Ipsus and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Western District, 6th May 1862, and consecrated by David Moriarty, bishop of Kerry, Ireland, assisted by James Kyle, vicar apostolic. Northern District, and John Murdoch, vicar apostolic, Western District, at Glasgow, 19th October 1862; succeeded 15th December 1865; resigned 4th March 1869; died at Rothesay, 14th January 1872, and is buried in St. Peter's cemetery, Dalbeth, Glasgow.
23. **James Lynch, C.M.**: born at 163 Great Britain Street [now Parnell Street], Dublin, Ireland, [12th January 1807] baptised 23rd January 1807 [baptismal record in Pro-Cathedral, Dublin], son of Joseph Lynch, M.D. (University of Edinburgh, 1802) and Mary Ann Scurlog; educated Jesuit College, Clongowes Wood, County Kildare, Ireland, 1817; Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, 1822 [not confirmed by available College records]; entered St. Patrick's College, Maynooth, to study for priesthood, 25th August 1826; ordained at Maynooth, 18th June 1833; entered Vincentian novitiate at St. Vincent's College, Castleknock, Co. Dublin, 31st October, 1839, and was professed there, 1st November 1841; rector, Irish College, Paris, 1858-1866; nominated titular bishop of Arcadiopolis in Asia and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Western District, 31st August 1866, and consecrated by William Keane, bishop of Cloyne, Ireland, assisted by Laurence Gillooly, C.M., bishop of Elphin, Ireland, and Michael O'Hea, bishop of Ross, Ireland, at Paris, 4th November 1866; translated as coadjutor to Kildare and Leighlin, Ireland, 13th April 1869; succeeded 5th March 1888; died at Blackrock, Co. Dublin, 19th December 1896, and is buried in the Church of the Most Holy Rosary, Tullow, County Carlow, Ireland.
24. **Charles Petre Eyre**: born at York, England, 7th November 1817, third son of John Lewis Eyre by his first wife, Sarah Parker [original of baptismal entry now with Registrar-General but copy at St. Wilfrid, York]; at Ushaw College, Durham, 28th March 1826, [deacon, May 1838] before entering English College, Rome, 5th December 1839; ordained at Rome, 19th March 1842; privy chamberlain, 6th January 1843; stationed at St. Mary, Newcastle-on-Tyne, 1843-1849; published *History of St. Cuthbert* (1849, 3rd edition 1887); missionary at Wooler, 1849-1850, Haggerstone Castle,

near Berwick-on-Tweed, 1850-1856; rector, St. Mary, Newcastle-on-Tyne, 1856-1868; conventual chaplain, Order of Malta, 28th May 1861; domestic prelate 1867; vicar-general, Hexham and Newcastle, 1868; nominated delegate apostolic to Scottish mission and titular archbishop of Anazarbus, 11th December 1868, and consecrated by Charles Augustus de Reisach, cardinal bishop of Sabina, assisted by Henry Edward Manning, archbishop of Westminster, England, and Frédéric Ghislain de Mérode, titular archbishop of Mitylene and papal almoner, at Rome, 31st January 1869; apostolic administrator, Western District, 16th April 1869; took part in Vatican Council, 1869-1870; founded St. Peter's College, Partickhill [now at Newlands], 5th October 1874; translated on restoration of hierarchy to archdiocese of Glasgow, 15th March 1878.

### Northern District

25. **James Kyle:** born at Edinburgh, 22nd September 1788, son of James Kyle, commissioner of roads and bridges under the War Office, and Margaret Strachan; entered Aquhorties, 23rd October 1799, and appointed professor there, 1808; ordained at Aquhorties, 21st March 1812; prefect of studies, Aquhorties, 1812-1826, missionary at Glasgow, 1826-1828; nominated titular bishop of Germanicia and vicar apostolic, Northern District, 13th February 1827, and consecrated by Alexander Paterson, titular bishop of Cybistra and vicar apostolic, Eastern District, assisted by Randal MacDonald, vicar apostolic, Western District, and Thomas Penswick, titular bishop of Europus and coadjutor vicar apostolic, Northern District, England, at Aberdeen, 28th September 1828; to his industry and resourcefulness the Church in Scotland owes its post-reformation archives—he collected letters and documents, totalling some 75,000 at his death, covering the history of Catholicism in Scotland from about the year 1597 [now at Columba House, Edinburgh]; deciphered secret letter code of Mary Queen of Scots; died at Preshome, 23rd February 1869, and is buried in St. Gregory's church, Preshome, Banffshire.

*On 17th November 1860 Pius IX approved the establishment of a prefecture apostolic of the Arctic Pole which included territories running from Hudson Bay in Canada to the Lapland regions of Scandinavia, with its headquarters at Wick, Caithness, but subsequently transferred on 10th April 1866 to Copenhagen, Denmark. To this prefecture were transferred from the Northern District the County of Caithness and the Orkney and Shetland Isles. By 1872 the prefecture had closed and the Scottish territories reverted to the Northern District.*

26. **John MacDonald:** born in Strath Glass, Inverness-shire, 2nd July 1818, son of William MacDonald and Harriet Fraser [baptism not traced]; at St. James' seminary, Ratisbon, Germany, 6th September 1830, before entering Scots College, Rome, 6th June 1836; returned to Scotland as sub-deacon, 11th June 1840,

and continued his studies at Blairs; ordained at Preshome, 4th November 1841; missionary in Glen Moriston, 1842-1844, Braemar, 1844-1845, Inverness, 1845-1848, Fasnakyle, 1848-1856, Eskadale, 1856-1868; nominated titular bishop of Nicopolis and vicar apostolic, Northern District, 11th December 1868, and consecrated by James Chadwick, bishop of Hexham and Newcastle, England, assisted by John Gray, vicar apostolic, Western District, and John Menzies Strain, vicar apostolic, Eastern District, at Aberdeen, 24th February 1869; took part in Vatican Council, 1869-1870; translated on restoration of hierarchy to diocese of Aberdeen, 15th March 1878.

## II

### FROM THE RESTORATION OF THE HIERARCHY IN 1878 TO THE PRESENT DAY

The Apostolic Letter "Ex Supremo Apostolatus Apice" of Leo XIII, 4th March 1878, divided Scotland into the Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (with four Suffragan Sees) and the Archdiocese of Glasgow, which was directly subject to the Holy See. By the Apostolic Constitution "Maxime Interest" of Pius XII, 25th May 1947, and the Apostolic Constitution "Dominici Gregis" of the same date, the Archdiocese of Glasgow was erected into a Province and divided into the Metropolitan See of Glasgow with the Suffragan Sees of Motherwell and Paisley.

A pamphlet entitled *Diocesan Map of Scotland*, showing maps of each of the dioceses of Scotland, was published by *The Mercat Cross* in 1953.

## THE PROVINCE OF ST. ANDREWS AND EDINBURGH

*The Province of St. Andrews and Edinburgh consists of the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh and the four Suffragan Sees of Aberdeen, Argyll and the Isles, Dunkeld, and Galloway.*

### ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. ANDREWS AND EDINBURGH \*

*Comprising the Metropolitan Cathedral City of Edinburgh; the entire Lothian and Borders Regions; in Fife Region, the districts of Dunfermline (except the parish of High Valleyfield), Kirkcaldy, and North-East Fife south of the River Eden; in Central Region, Falkirk District and those parts of Stirling District situated in the geographical county of Stirlingshire; and, in Strathclyde Region, the Banton, Kilsyth and Queenzieburn areas of Cumbernauld District, and the Lennoxtown, Milton of Campsie and Torrance areas of Strathkelvin District.*

\* The diocesan territories shown in this section have been redescribed to take account of the coming into operation of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1973. This Act, of course, in no way affects the diocesan boundaries, which consequently remain unaltered.

The bishops associated with Kinrimumd, St. Andrews, had assumed ecclesiastical primacy in Scotland from Dunkeld by the beginning of the tenth century. The last of the Celtic bishops died in 1093; the line of the medieval bishops began in 1109 but the Church and the bishopric were not securely established until 1144. The independence of the Scottish Church from the metropolitan claims of the archbishops of York was established by Celestine III with the Bull Cum universi, 13th March 1192. St. Andrews was erected a Metropolitan See by Sixtus IV, 14th August 1472. The See was vacant from the execution at Stirling on 6th April 1571 of John Hamilton (1547-1571) until the restoration of the hierarchy in 1878.

2. **William Smith:** born at Edinburgh, 3rd July 1819, son of James Smith, solicitor to the Supreme Court, [editor for two issues in 1836 of *Dublin Review*, founder, *Catholic Directory for England and Wales*, 1838] and Catherine Mackenzie [baptismal record, St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh]; at Blairs, July 1832, before entering Scots College, Rome, 24th October 1836; ordained at Rome, 15th April 1843; on staff of Blairs College, 1843-1852; rector, St. James' seminary, Ratisbon, Germany, 1852-1853; rector, St. Clement's Academy, Lochee, Dundee, 1853-1854; missionary, Lochee, 1853-1856; St. Mary, Edinburgh, 1856-1859; Dunfermline, 1859-1860, Oakley, 1860-1871, Perth, 1871-1877, Oakley, 1877-1878, St. Mary, Edinburgh, 1878-1885; European reputation as pioneer in modern Catholic biblical studies; published *The Book of Moses* (vol. I, 1868—work left uncompleted); honorary D.D. (Rome), 1870; vicar-general, St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 1878; privy chamberlain, 1882; nominated archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 2nd October 1885, and consecrated

by Charles Petre Eyre, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by John McLachlan, bishop of Galloway, and Angus MacDonald, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, at Edinburgh, 28th October 1885; erected chapter, 23rd December 1885; presided, first plenary episcopal council of Scotland, Fort Augustus, 17th-26th August 1886; apostolic administrator, Dunkeld, 1888-1890; died at Edinburgh, 16th March 1892, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh.

3. **Angus MacDonald:** born at Borrodale, Inverness-shire, 18th September 1844, son of Angus MacDonald of Glenaladale and Mary Watson, younger brother of Hugh MacDonald, C.S.S.R., bishop of Aberdeen, 1890-1898, first cousin of Aeneas Chisholm, bishop of Aberdeen, 1899-1918, and grand-nephew of James Kyle, vicar apostolic, Northern District, 1828-1869 [baptismal record, St. Mary, Arisaig]; entered Ushaw College, Durham, 22nd September 1857; B.A. (University of London, 1865); ordained at Ushaw, 7th July 1872; stationed at St. Patrick, Glasgow, 1872-1876; missionary at Arisaig, 1876-1878; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 22nd March 1878, and consecrated by Charles Petre Eyre, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by James Chadwick, bishop of Hexham and Newcastle, England, and John MacDonald, bishop of Aberdeen, at Glasgow, 23rd May 1878; translated to St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 15th July 1892; died at Edinburgh, 29th April 1900, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh.
4. **James Smith:** born at Edinburgh, 18th October 1841, son of Henry Smith and Susan Quigley [baptismal record, St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh]; at Wellburn Academy, Lochee, Dundee, 15th October 1853 until its closure, February 1854; Blairs College, 2nd August 1855; Scots College, Rome, 11th October 1858; ordained at Rome, 31st March 1866; stationed at St. Mary, Dundee, 1866-1867; on staff of Blairs College, 1867-1890; editor, *Catholic Directory for Scotland*, 1872-1890; canon of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 1885; nominated bishop of Dunkeld, 14th August 1890, and consecrated by William Smith, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by John McLachlan, bishop of Galloway, and Angus MacDonald, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, at Dundee, 28th October 1890; translated to St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 30th August 1900; died at Edinburgh, 25th November 1928, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh.
5. **Andrew Thomas (in religion Joseph) McDonald, O.S.B.:** born at Fort William, 12th February 1871, son of Donald Peter McDonald and Jessie Margaret Carmichael; entered Benedictine Order in the Fort Augustus novitiate, 23rd January 1889, and professed there, 3rd February 1890; ordained at Fort Augustus, 9th August 1896; elected abbot of the abbey of St. Benedict, Fort Augustus, 27th August 1919; nominated archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 19th July 1929, and consecrated by Donald Mackintosh, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by James William McCarthy, bishop of Galloway, and John Toner, bishop

of Dunkeld, at Edinburgh, 24th September 1929; died at Edinburgh, 22nd May 1950, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh.

6. **Gordon Gray**: born at Leith, 10th August 1910, son of Francis William Gray and Jane Oddy; at St. Joseph's College, Mark Cross, Sussex, 6th September 1927, before entering St. John's Seminary, Wonersh, Surrey, 16th September 1929; ordained at Edinburgh, 15th June 1935; assistant priest, St. Andrews, 1935-1941; University of St. Andrews (matriculated 1935; M.A. (Honours, English Language and Literature), 1939); parish priest, Hawick, 1941-1947; rector, Blairs College, 1947-1951; nominated archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 20th June, 1951, and consecrated by William Godfrey, titular archbishop of Cius and apostolic delegate to Great Britain, assisted by Edward Wilson Douglas, bishop of Motherwell, and James Donald Scanlan, bishop of Dunkeld, at Edinburgh, 21st September 1951; founded St. Andrew's College, Drygrange, 8th September 1953; took part in Second Vatican Council, 1962-1965; apostolic administrator, Aberdeen, 1963-1965; Chairman, International Committee on English in the Liturgy, 1965-71; honorary D.D. (University of St. Andrews), 1967; created cardinal priest of the title Santa Chiara a Vigna Clara, 28th April 1969; member, Sacred Congregation for the Evangelisation of Peoples, xJuly 1969; Pontifical Commission for Social Communication, xJuly 1969; Sacred Congregation for the Sacraments and Divine Worship, 30th September 1975; honorary Fellow of Educational Institute of Scotland, 11th June 1970; honorary D.Univ. (Heriot Watt University), 1981.

1. **Henry Grey Graham**: born at Maxton, Roxburghshire, 8th March 1874, son of Manners Hamilton Graham, minister of Maxton (matriculated Greek class, University of Glasgow, 1845, but no record exists of graduation) and Margaret Jane Ritchie; University of St. Andrews (matriculated, 1889; M.A., 1894, B.D., 1896); minister in the Church of Scotland, 9th March 1897; received into Catholic Church, 15th August 1903; entered Scots College, Rome, to study for priesthood, October, 1903; ordained at Rome, 22nd December 1906; assistant priest, Our Lady of Good Aid, Motherwell, 1907-1915; published *From the Kirk to the Catholic Church* (1911), *Where we got the Bible* (1911), *Prosperity, Catholic and Protestant* (1912), *Hindrances to conversion to the Catholic Church and their removal* (1913), *What the Faith really means* (1914), and many pamphlets; parish priest, Longriggend, Lanarkshire, 1915-1917; nominated titular bishop of Tipasa in Numidia (and bishop-auxiliary). 30th August 1917, and consecrated by John Maguire, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by James William McCarthy, bishop of Galloway, and John Toner, Bishop of Dunkeld, at Edinburgh, 16th November

1917; returned to Glasgow archdiocese as parish priest, Holy Cross, Glasgow. 1930-1959; died at Glasgow, 5th December 1959, and is buried in St. Peter's Cemetery, Dalbeth, Glasgow.

2. *James Monaghan*: born at Bathgate, West Lothian, 11th July 1914, son of Edward Monaghan and Elizabeth Reilly; at Blairs, August 1929, before entering Scots College, Valladolid, 8th September 1933, but left through ill-health, 5th June 1936, resumed studies for priesthood at St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny, Ireland, 7th September 1937; ordained at Edinburgh, 11th June 1940; assistant priest, St. Andrew, Edinburgh, 1940-1942; St. Margaret Mary, Edinburgh, 1942-1947; chaplain, Little Sisters of the Poor, Edinburgh, 1947-1959; parish priest, Holy Cross, Edinburgh, 1959; secretary, 1953, and vicar-general, 1958, St. Andrews and Edinburgh; privy chamberlain, 28th March 1958; domestic prelate, 20th March 1959; nominated titular bishop of Cell Ausaille (and bishop-auxiliary), 24th April 1970, and ordained by Gordon Gray, cardinal archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by Stephen McGill, bishop of Paisley, and Colin Aloysius Macpherson, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, at Edinburgh, 23rd May 1970.

## DIOCESE OF ABERDEEN

*Comprising the Cathedral City of Aberdeen; Orkney; Shetland; the entire Grampian Region; and, in the Highland Region, the districts of Caithness, Sutherland, Ross and Cromarty, Nairn, the mainland portion of the district of Skye and Lochalsh, and the areas of the districts of Lochaber, Inverness, and Badenoch and Strathspey lying north of a straight line drawn from the junction of the districts of Moray, Kincardine and Deeside, and Badenoch and Strathspey to the northern extremity of Loch Loyne.*

*The early twelfth century ecclesiastical centre at Mortlach, Banffshire, is traditionally the original site of the bishopric of Aberdeen. Certainly it did not originate at Aberdeen but was transferred there by David I under its fourth bishop, Nechtan, before 1131x1132. It became a suffragan of St. Andrews in 1472. It was vacant from the death of William Gordon (1546-1577) until the restoration of the hierarchy in 1878.*

1. *John MacDonald*: born in Strath Glass, Inverness-shire, 2nd July 1818, son of William MacDonald and Harriet Fraser [baptism not traced]; at St. James' seminary, Ratisbon, Germany, 6th September 1830, before entering Scots College, Rome, 6th June 1836; returned to Scotland as sub-deacon, 11th June 1840, and continued his studies at Blairs; ordained at Preshome, 4th November 1841; missionary in Glen Moriston, 1842-1844, Braemar, 1844-1845, Inverness, 1845-1848, Fasnakyle, 1848-1856, Eskdale,

1856-1868; nominated titular bishop of Nicopolis and vicar apostolic, Northern District, 11th December 1868, and consecrated by James Chadwick, bishop of Hexham and Newcastle, assisted by John Gray, vicar apostolic, Western District, and John Menzies Strain, vicar apostolic, Eastern District, at Aberdeen, 24th February 1869; took part in Vatican Council, 1869-1870; translated on restoration of hierarchy to diocese of Aberdeen, 15th March 1878; died at Aberdeen, 4th February 1889, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen.

2. **Colin Grant:** born in Glen Gairn, Aberdeenshire, 3rd February 1832, son of James Grant and Janet Cameron, and grand-nephew of Alexander Cameron, vicar apostolic, Lowland District, 1805-1825 [baptismal record now at St. Andrew, Braemar]; at Blairs, 30th July 1845, studies interrupted by two years' illness, before entering Propaganda College, Rome, 21st October 1850, where health again broke down, and returned to Scotland, 24th August 1851, re-entering Blairs, December 1851; ordained at Blairs, 22nd December 1855; missionary at Kintail, 1856-1858, Fasnakyle, 1858-1869, Eskadale, 1869-1889; published Gaelic New Testament [mainly work of Fr. Evan Maceachen (1769-1849)], 1875; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 16th July 1889, and consecrated by William Smith, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by John McLachlan, bishop of Galloway, and Angus MacDonald, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, at Aberdeen, 13th August 1889; died six weeks later at Aberdeen, 26th September 1889, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen.
3. **Hugh MacDonald, C.S.S.R.:** born at Borrodale, Inverness-shire, 7th November 1841, son of Angus MacDonald of Glenaladale and Mary Watson, elder brother of Angus MacDonald, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 1878-1892, and archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 1892-1900, first cousin of his successor, Aeneas Chisholm, 1899-1918, and grand-nephew of James Kyle, vicar apostolic, Northern District, 1828-1869 [baptismal record, St. Mary, Arisaig]; entered Ushaw College, 22nd September 1854; ordained at Ushaw, 21st September 1867; stationed at Glenfinnan, 1868-1869, and St. Mary, Greenock, 1869-1870; entered Redemptorist noviciate, 15th October 1870, and professed at Bishop Eton, Liverpool, 15th October 1871; rector, St. Mary, Kinnoull, 1880-1882; vice-provincial at St. Mary, Clapham, London (*pro* Robert Coffin, C.S.S.R., consecrated bishop of Southwark, 11th June 1882); provincial, 1884-1890; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 14th August 1890, and consecrated by William Smith, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by John McLachlan, bishop of Galloway, and Angus MacDonald, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, at Aberdeen, 23rd October 1890; erected chapter, 2nd July 1892; died at Edinburgh, 29th May 1898, and is buried in St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen.
4. **Aeneas Chisholm:** born at Inverness, 26th June 1836, son of Colin Chisholm and Margaret MacDonald, and first cousin of his

- predecessor Hugh MacDonald, 1890-1898 [baptismal record, St. Mary, Inverness]; at Blairs, 11th September 1848, before entering Scots College, Rome, 13th September 1853; ordained at Rome, 15th May 1859; stationed at Preshome, 1860; missionary at Beauly, 1861-1865, Aberdeen, 1865-1866, Glen Gairn, 1866-1872, Banff 1872-1890; rector, Blairs College, 1890-1898; canon of Aberdeen, 1892; honorary LL.D. (University of Aberdeen), 1895; domestic prelate, 24th January 1898; vicar capitular, June 1898; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 7th January 1899, and consecrated by his first cousin Angus MacDonald, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by James Smith, bishop of Dunkeld, and William Turner, bishop of Galloway, at Aberdeen, 24th February 1899; died at Edinburgh, 13th January 1918, and is buried in St. Mary's College cemetery, Blairs, Kincardineshire.
5. **George Henry Bennett:** born in the parish of St. John, in the island of Antigua, West Indies Associated States, 24th June 1875, son of George William Bennett, merchant and member of Executive Council, and Jemima Peary [baptised 8th July 1875 by René Poirier, bishop of Roseau, Dominica; baptismal record now in Church of St. Joseph and St. Patrick, St. John's, Antigua]; entered Scots College, Rome, 20th October 1892; Gregorian University, Rome (Ph.D., D.D., D.C.L.); "*primus inter alumnos hujus Collegii, quoad sciatur, qui triplici laurea Philosophiae Theologiae et Juris Canonici insignitus est*"; ordained at Rome, 9th April 1898; returned to Scotland, 1901; assistant priest, St. Patrick, Edinburgh, 1901-1910; parish priest, North Berwick, 1910-1912, Hawick, 1912-1918; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 18th June 1918, and consecrated by John Maguire, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by James William McCarthy, bishop of Galloway, and John Toner, bishop of Dunkeld, at Aberdeen, 1st August 1918; honorary LL.D. (University of Aberdeen), 1931; died at Aberdeen, 25th December 1946, and is buried in Allenvale cemetery, Aberdeen.
6. **John Alexander Matheson:** born at Tomintoul, Banffshire, 28th April 1901, son of John Matheson and Jane Smith; at Blairs, 24th August 1916, before entering Scots College, Rome, 10th January 1919; Gregorian University, Rome (D.D., 1925); ordained at Rome, 7th March 1925; assistant priest, St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen, 1925-1927; parish priest, Torry, 1927-1930, Ballater, 1930-1943, Dufftown, 1943-1947; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 2nd August 1947, and consecrated by Andrew Joseph McDonald, O.S.B., archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by Kenneth Grant, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, and James Donald Scanlan, coadjutor bishop of Dunkeld, at Aberdeen, 24th September 1947; died at Aberdeen, 5th July 1950, and is buried in the Catholic cemetery, Tomintoul, Banffshire.
7. **Frank Raymond Walsh, W.F.:** born at Cirencester, Gloucestershire, England, 15th September 1901, son of James Joseph Walsh, inland revenue officer, and Florence Tilley; at Blairs, 23rd August

1915, before entering Scots College, Rome, 10th January 1919; Gregorian University, Rome (D.D., 1925); ordained at Rome, 7th March 1925; assistant priest, St. Mary, Inverness, 1925-1929; entered White Fathers noviciate at Ste. Marie. Maison Carrée, Algeria, 7th October 1929, and professed there, 9th September 1931; founded St. Columba's College, Newtown St. Boswells, Roxburghshire, 28th May 1934, and stationed there, 1934-1948; at St. Andrews, Fife, 1948-1949; superior, White Fathers, Heston, Middlesex, 1949-1951; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 20th June 1951, and consecrated by Donald Campbell, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by James Black, bishop of Paisley, and James Donald Scanlan, bishop of Dunkeld, at Aberdeen, 12th September 1951; took part in first session of Second Vatican Council, 1962; resigned, 22nd July 1963, and translated to titular see of Birta, 12th September 1963; resigned from titular see of Birta, 7th December 1970; died at Grantham, England, 27th October 1974, and is buried in Grantham cemetery, Harrowby Road, Grantham, Lincolnshire, England.

*Gordon Gray, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, apostolic administrator, 12th September, 1963.*

8. **Michael Foylan:** born at Shettleston, Lanarkshire, 29th June 1907, son of James Foylan and Anne Murphy; at Blairs, 20th August 1920, before entering diocesan seminary of Coutances at St. Lô, Normandy, France, October 1925, and Sulpician seminary at Paris, October 1926; ordained at Kinnoull, 5th July 1931; assistant priest, St. Andrew's Cathedral, Dundee, 1931-1937; St. Joseph, Dundee, 1937-1946; parish priest, High Valleyfield, Fife, 1946-1949; canon of Dunkeld, 1948; administrator, St. Andrew's Cathedral, Dundee, 1949-1964; privy chamberlain, 5th September 1949; vicar-general, Dunkeld, 1952; domestic prelate, 20th January 1953; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 8th December 1964, and consecrated by Gordon Gray, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by Joseph Michael McGee, bishop of Galloway, and William Andrew Hart, bishop of Dunkeld, at Aberdeen, 25th March 1965; took part in final session of Second Vatican Council, 1965; died at Aberdeen, 28th May 1976, and is buried in St. Ninian's churchyard, Tynet, Moray.
9. **Mario Joseph Conti:** born at Elgin, Moray, 20th March 1934, son of Louis Joseph Conti and Josephine Quintilia Panicali; at Blairs, 21st August 1947, before entering Scots College, Rome, 30th September 1952; Gregorian University, Rome (Ph.L., 1955, S.T.L., 1959); ordained at Rome, 26th October 1958; assistant priest, St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen, 1959-1962; parish priest, Wick (with Thurso), 1962-1967; Thurso (with Wick), 1967-1977; nominated bishop of Aberdeen, 28th February 1977, and ordained by Gordon Gray, cardinal archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by Stephen McGill, bishop of Paisley, and Colin Aloysius Macpherson, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, at Aberdeen, 3rd May 1977.

## DIOCESE OF ARGYLL AND THE ISLES

*Comprising the Cathedral City of Oban; The Western Isles; in Strathclyde Region, the district of Argyll together with the Isle of Arran from Cunninghame District; in the Highland Region, the district of Skye and Lochalsh (except the mainland portion), and the areas of the districts of Lochaber, Inverness, and Badenoch and Strathspey lying south of a straight line drawn from the junction of the districts of Moray, Kincardine and Deeside, and Badenoch and Strathspey to the northern extremity of Loch Loyne.*

*Argyll was founded 1183x1189 by a division of the diocese of Dunkeld. It was located at Lismore c. 1225. It became a suffragan of St. Andrews in 1472 and of Glasgow in 1492. In 1553 James Hamilton was appointed bishop but he conformed to the reformed Church after 1560 and the See was vacant until the restoration of the hierarchy in 1878.*

*The See of The Isles was originally conjoined with Man (or Sodor). The mediæval bishops from x1079 recognised the metropolitan authority of York until 1153 when Rome made them subject to Trondheim, Norway, but this was only nominal after 1349. Man and The Isles were separated from 1387. The Isles became a suffragan of St. Andrews in 1472. It was vacant from the translation of Alexander Gordon (1553-1558) until the restoration of the hierarchy in 1878.*

1. **Angus MacDonald:** born at Borrodale, Inverness-shire, 18th September 1844, son of Angus MacDonald of Glenaladale and Mary Watson, younger brother of Hugh MacDonald, C.S.S.R., bishop of Aberdeen, 1890-1898, first cousin of Aeneas Chisholm, bishop of Aberdeen, 1899-1918, and grand-nephew of James Kyle, vicar apostolic, Northern District, 1828-1869 [baptismal record, St. Mary, Arisaig]; entered Ushaw College, Durham, 22nd September 1857; B.A. (University of London, 1865); ordained at Ushaw, 7th July 1872; stationed at St. Patrick, Glasgow, 1872-1876; missionary at Arisaig, 1876-1878; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 22nd March 1878, and consecrated by Charles Petre Eyre, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by James Chadwick, bishop of Hexham and Newcastle, England, and John MacDonald, bishop of Aberdeen, at Glasgow, 23rd May 1878; translated to St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 15th July 1892.
2. **George Smith:** born at Cuttlebrae, Enzie, Banffshire, 24th January 1840, son of Alexander Smith and Helen Bennet [Preshome baptismal register now at St. Peter, Buckie]; at Blairs, 17th August 1853, before entering St. Edmund's Benedictine School, Douai, 1857, and the Sulpician seminaries at Issy-les-Moulineaux, 1859, and Paris, 1861; ordained at Paris, 17th December 1864; stationed at St. Mungo, Glasgow, 1865; St. Vincent de Paul, Glasgow, 1865-1867; missionary at Kilmarnock, 1867-1869, Rothesay, 1869-1893; vicar-general, Argyll and the Isles, 1887; nominated

bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 31st December 1892, and consecrated by Angus MacDonald, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by Hugh MacDonald, C.S.S.R., bishop of Aberdeen, and James Smith, bishop of Dunkeld, at Oban, 25th April 1893; erected chapter, 20th August 1907; died at Oban 18th January 1918, and is buried in Pennyfuir cemetery, Oban.

*On 9th August 1917 Hugh Cameron was elected by the Consistorial Congregation coadjutor bishop of Argyll and the Isles, and on 13th November 1917 was nominated titular bishop of Usula. Father Cameron, who had not been consulted before publication of his appointment, was allowed in private audience with Benedict XV on 20th November 1917 to decline the promotion.*

*Ewen [Hugh] Cameron, born at Inver-roy, Roy Bridge, Inverness-shire, 20th April 1876, son of Ewen Cameron and Janet Campbell; ordained at Oban, 29th June 1900; at Benbecula, 1903-1908; Castlebay, Barra, 1908-1921; army chaplain, First World War, 3rd December 1914; served overseas, July 1915-December 1918: Gallipoli, Egypt, Salonika, and Palestine; released from military service, 29th March 1919; vicar-general, Argyll and the Isles, 1919-1926; at Rothesay, 1921-1928; domestic prelate, 9th December 1925; Kingussie, 1928-1931; died at Rome, 8th March 1931.*

3. **Donald Martin:** born at Salen, Aharacle, Argyllshire, 6th October 1873, son of Donald Martin and Ann Campbell, and third cousin of both his successors, Donald Campbell, 1939-1945, and Kenneth Grant, 1946-1959; left school at 14 to work in merchant's office in Liverpool; entered Scots College, Valladolid, to study for priesthood, 4th October 1899; recalled to Scotland, August 1905, and ordained at Oban, 23rd September 1905; parish priest, Castlebay, Barra, 1905-1907; assistant priest, Glencoe, 1908-1909; administrator, pro-Cathedral, Oban, 1909-1919; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 2nd April 1919, and consecrated by John Toner, bishop of Dunkeld, assisted by James William McCarthy, bishop of Galloway, and Henry Grey Graham, bishop-auxiliary of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, at Oban, 11th June 1919; died at Oban, 6th December 1938; and is buried in Pennyfuir cemetery, Oban.
4. **Donald Campbell:** born at Bohuntine, Inverness-shire, 8th December 1894, son of Donald Campbell and Mary Mackintosh, third cousin of his predecessor, Donald Martin, 1919-1938, second cousin of his successor, Kenneth Grant, 1946-1959, and nephew of Donald Mackintosh, coadjutor archbishop of Glasgow, 1912-1919; at Blairs, 6th September 1908, before entering Scots College, Rome, 3rd November 1914; Gregorian University, Rome (D.D.); ordained at Rome, 3rd April 1920; assistant priest, St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, 1921-1922; Rothesay, 1922-1923; St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen, 1923-1924; Roy

Bridge, 1924-1925; parish priest, Castlebay, Barra, 1925-1935, Daliburgh, South Uist, 1935-1939; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 5th October 1939, and consecrated by Andrew Joseph McDonald, O.S.B., archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by George Henry Bennett, bishop of Aberdeen, and William Henry Mellon, coadjutor-bishop of Galloway, at Oban, 14th December 1939; translated to Glasgow, 6th January 1945.

5. **Kenneth Grant:** born at Fort William, 18th March 1900, son of Angus Grant and Ann Kennedy, second cousin of his predecessor, Donald Campbell, 1939-1945, and third cousin of Donald Martin, 1919-1938 (see entry (3) above); left school at 14 but two years later went to Blairs as student for archdiocese of Glasgow; at Blairs, September 1916; enlisted, First World War, as private, 4th Bn Seaforth Highlanders, 18th July 1918, and discharged, 6th February 1919; re-entered Blairs before transferring to St. Peter's College, Bearsden, 3rd September 1921; ordained at Glasgow, 24th April 1927; assistant priest, Benbecula, 1927-1928; St. Mary Immaculate, Glasgow, 1928-1939; army chaplain, Second World War, 3rd November 1939; prisoner of war, Germany, 3rd July 1940 to 13th May 1945; released from military service, 6th November 1945; assistant priest, St. Joseph, Clarkston, 1945; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 15th December 1945, and consecrated by Donald Campbell, archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by George Henry Bennett, bishop of Aberdeen, and William Henry Mellon, bishop of Galloway, at Oban, 27th February 1946; honorary LL.D. (University of St. Francis Xavier, Antigonish, Nova Scotia, Canada), 1953; died at Glasgow, 7th September 1959, and is buried in Cille Choireil cemetery, Lochaber, Inverness-shire.
6. **Stephen McGill, P.S.S.:** born at Glasgow, 4th January 1912, son of Peter McGill and Charlotte Connolly; at Blairs, 11th August 1927, before entering Le Grand Seminaire, Coutances, Normandy, France, October 1931; ordained at Glasgow, 29th June 1936; La Solitude de St. Sulpice, Issy-les-Moulineaux, France, October 1936; priest of St. Sulpice, July 1937; Institut Catholique, (Faculty of Theology), Paris, October 1937 (S.T.L., 1939); on staff of Le Grand Seminaire, Bourdeaux, October 1939; Le Grand Seminaire, Aix-en-Provence, January 1940; on capitulation in Second World War of France in June 1940, escaped through Marseille; spiritual director, Blairs College, 1940-1951; rector, Blairs College, 1951-1960; honorary canon of Glasgow, 1952; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 4th April 1960, and consecrated by Gerald Patrick O'Hara, titular archbishop of Pessinus, and apostolic delegate to Great Britain, assisted by James Donald Scanlan, bishop of Motherwell, and Frank Raymond Walsh, bishop of Aberdeen, at Oban, 22nd June 1960; took part in Second Vatican Council 1962-1965; translated to Paisley, 25th July 1968.

7. Colin Aloysius Macpherson: born at Lochboisdale, South Uist, 5th August 1917, son of Malcolm Macpherson and Mary Macmillan; at Blairs, August 1931, before entering Propaganda College, Rome, 24th October 1934 (S.T.L., 1940); ordained at Rome, 23rd March 1940; chaplain, Carmelite Convent, Oban, 1940-1942; parish priest, Knoydart, 1942-1951, Eriskay, 1951-1956, Benbecula, 1956-1966, Fort William, 1966-1968; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 2nd December 1968, and ordained by Hyginus Eugene Cardinale, titular archbishop of Nepte and apostolic delegate to Great Britain, assisted by Gordon Gray, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, and Stephen McGill, bishop of Paisley, at Oban, 6th February 1969; honorary LL.D. (University of St. Francis Xavier, Antigonish, Nova Scotia, Canada), 1974.

### DIOCESE OF DUNKELD

*Comprising the Cathedral City of Dundee; the entire Tayside Region; in Fife Region, the district of North-East Fife north of the River Eden and the parish of High Valleyfield in the district of Dunfermline; and, in Central Region, Clackmannan District and those areas of Stirling District situated in the geographical county of Perthshire.*

*The See of Dunkeld existed before the ninth century and had become the administrative centre of the Scottish Church by 849. The See was revived by Alexander I and the line of medieval bishops runs from c1114xc1120. It became a suffragan of St. Andrews in 1472 and of Glasgow in 1492. The See became vacant during the episcopate of Robert Crichton (1547; deprived at the reformation but lived until 1585) and it remained so until the restoration of the hierarchy in 1878.*

Perth, 18th January 1887, and is buried in St. John's church, Perth.

*William Smith, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, apostolic administrator, 6th September 1888.*

(University of Aberdeen), 1906; nominated bishop of Dunkeld, 14th May 1913, and consecrated by Rafael Merry del Val, titular archbishop of Nicaea and cardinal secretary of state, assisted by Donald Mackintosh, coadjutor-archbishop of Glasgow, and Thomas Francis Kennedy, titular bishop of Hadrianopolis and rector, North American

College. Rome, at Rome, 25th May 1913; died ten months later at Dundee, 28th March 1914, and is buried in Balgay cemetery Dundee.

5. **John Toner:** born at Glasgow, 14th March 1857, son of William Toner and Elizabeth Nixon; at Blairs, 22nd July 1871, before entering Scots College, Valladolid, 15th September, 1875; ordained at Palencia, Spain, 25th March 1882; stationed at St. Lawrence, Greenock, 1882-1887; on staff of St. Peter's College, Partickhill, 1887-1890; missionary at St. Michael, Glasgow, 1890-1897, St. Patrick, Glasgow, 1897-1901, Rutherglen, 1901-1914: canon of Glasgow, 1902; nominated bishop of Dunkeld, 8th September 1914, and consecrated by James Smith, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by Donald Mackintosh, coadjutor-archbishop of Glasgow, and James William McCarthy, bishop of Galloway, at Dundee, 15th October 1914; played leading part in negotiations for Education (Scotland) Act, 1918; apostolic administrator, Glasgow, 1920-1922; died at Dundee, 31st May 1949, and is buried in Balgay cemetery, Dundee.
6. **James Donald Scanlan:** born at Glasgow, 24th January 1899, son of Joseph Scanlan, M.B., C.M. (with commendation) (University of Glasgow, 1885) and Sarah Walls; University of Glasgow (matriculated, Faculty of Medicine, 1915); gentleman cadet, Royal Military College, Sandhurst, Surrey, 3rd November 1916; commissioned as 2/Lt., 3rd Bn Highland Light Infantry, 12th September 1917; served overseas, 3rd May 1918 to 11th January 1919: Egypt; resigned commission, 16th July 1919; University of Glasgow (matriculated, 1920; B.L., 1923); entered St. Edmund's College, Ware, Hertfordshire, September 1924; ordained at Westminster, 29th June 1929; Institut Catholique (Faculty of Canon Law), Paris, 4th November 1929 (J.C.L., 1930); Apollinare, Rome [date unknown], (D.C.L., 1932); assistant priest, St. James, Spanish Place, London, 1932-1938; privy chamberlain, 30th December 1937; chaplain, Soeurs de Miséricorde, Hammersmith, 1938-1946; translator of *Judaism* by A. ## DIOCESE OF GALLOWAY

*Comprising the Cathedral City of Ayr; the entire Dumfries and Galloway Region; and, in Strathclyde Region, the districts of Cunninghamhame (except the Isle of Arran), Kilmarnock and Loudoun, Kyle and Carrick, and Cumnock and Doon Valley.*

*The See of Whithorn is associated from the late fourth century with St. Ninian but it is possible that a Christian community existed there before his arrival. There was a continuous succession of bishops in the eighth century. The See was revived c. 1128 and recognised the metropolitan authority of York until 1355. It became a suffragan of St. Andrews in 1472 and of Glasgow in 1492. The See was, in effect, vacant from the death of Andrew Durie (1541-1558) since his successor, Alexander Gordon, conformed at the reformation in 1560, and it remained vacant until the restoration of the hierarchy in 1878.*

2. **William Turner:** born at Aberdeen, 12th December 1844, son of Alexander Turner and Catherine Pirie ["baptizatus a Ministro Acatolico, postea baptizatus sub conditione"]; at Blairs, 24th July 1858, before entering Scots College, 20th October 1861; ordained at Rome, 26th April 1868; stationed at St. Patrick, Edinburgh, 1868-1877; missionary, Dumfries, 1877-1893; vicar-general, Galloway, 1892; nominated bishop of Galloway, 16th June 1893, and consecrated by Angus MacDonald, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by Hugh MacDonald, C.S.S.R., Bishop of Aberdeen, and James Smith, bishop of Dunkeld, at Dumfries, 25th July 1893; erected chapter, 23rd December 1901; died at Dumfries, 19th January 1914, and is buried in Holy Cross cemetery, Glebe Street, Dumfries.

3. **James William McCarthy:** born at Newcastle-on-Tyne, England, 30th January 1853, son of Jeremy McCarthy, porter, and Jane Smiles; at Blairs, 15th September 1869, before entering Scots College, Valladolid, 9th June 1872, recalled to Scotland, 25th July 1876, entered St. Peter's College, Partickhill, August 1876; ordained at Glasgow, 4th May 1879; stationed at St. Margaret, Kinning Park, Glasgow, 1879-1884; missionary at Port Glasgow, 1884-1899, St. Mary, Pollokshaws, 1899-1900; administrator, St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, 1900-1914; canon of Glasgow, 1902; nominated bishop of Galloway, 25th May 1914, and consecrated by Donald Mackintosh, titular archbishop of Chersona and coadjutor archbishop of Glasgow, assisted by George Smith, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, and John Kelly, bishop of Plymouth, England, at Dumfries, 9th June 1914; knight commander, Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, 1924; died at Dumfries, 24th December 1943, and is buried in St. Andrew's cemetery, Craigs Road, Dumfries.
4. **William Henry Mellon:** born at Edinburgh, 6th January 1877, son of Henry Mellon and Alice Jones; at Blairs, 8th December 1892, before entering Sulpician seminary in France of Issy-les-Moulineaux, October 1896, and Scots College, Rome, 16th October 1897; ordained at Rome, 29th March 1902; returned to Scotland, 1903; assistant priest, St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh, 1903-1904; parish priest, Balerno, 1904-1917, Dunfermline, 1917-1924, Lennoxton, 1924-1926, St. Columba, Edinburgh, 1926-1935; canon of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, 1934; nominated titular bishop of Daulia and coadjutor-bishop of Galloway, 21st August 1935, and consecrated by Andrew Joseph McDonald, O.S.B., archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by John Toner, bishop of Dunkeld, and George Henry Bennett, bishop of Aberdeen, at Edinburgh, 28th October 1935; succeeded to Galloway, 24th December 1943; died at Dumfries, 2nd February 1952, and is buried in St. Andrew's cemetery, Craigs Road, Dumfries.
5. **Joseph Michael McGee:** born in the parish of Monzievaird and Strowan, Perthshire, 13th December 1904, son of Denis McGee and Sarah McGlinchey; at Blairs, 23rd August 1917, before entering Scots College, Valladolid, 30th August 1922; ordained at Valladolid, 25th May 1929; assistant priest, SS. Peter and Paul, Dundee, 1929-1931; on staff of Blairs College, 1931-1940; parish priest, SS. Peter and Paul, Dundee, 1940-1948; canon of Dunkeld, 1948; St. Joseph, Dundee, 1948-1952; vicar-general, Dunkeld, 1949; domestic prelate, 15th September 1949; nominated bishop of Galloway, 19th July 1952, and consecrated by William Godfrey, titular archbishop of Cius and apostolic delegate to Great Britain, assisted by Edward Wilson Douglas, bishop of Motherwell, and James Donald Scanlan, bishop of Dunkeld, at Dumfries, 11th November 1952; took part in Second Vatican Council, 1962-1965; resigned, 4th April 1981.

6. **Maurice Taylor:** born at Hamilton, Lanarkshire, 5th May 1926, son of Maurice Taylor and Lucy McLaughlin; entered Blairs, philosophers' course, 27th August 1942; enlisted, Second World War, as private, General Service Corps, 17th August 1944, and transferred to Royal Army Medical Corps, 28th September 1944; served overseas, 2nd October 1945 to 31st July 1947: India, Egypt; released from military service, 6th August 1947; entered Scots College, Rome, 15th October 1947; Gregorian University, Rome (S.T.L., 1951); ordained at Rome, 2nd July 1950; returned to Scotland, June 1951; assistant priest, St. Bartholomew, Coat-bridge, 1951-52; re-entered Scots College, Rome, October 1952; Gregorian University (S.T.D. *bene probatus*, 1954); returned to Scotland, June 1954; assistant priest, St. Bernadette, Motherwell, 1954-55; on staff of St. Peter's College, Cardross, 1955-65; editor, *St. Peter's College Magazine*, 1959-65; author of "The conflicting doctrines of the Scottish reformation" in *Essays on the Scottish Reformation 1513-1625* (ed. ## THE PROVINCE OF GLASGOW

*The Province of Glasgow was erected in 1947 by the Apostolic Letters Dominici Gregis and consists of the Archdiocese of Glasgow and the two Suffragan Sees of Motherwell and Paisley.*

### ARCHDIOCESE OF GLASGOW

*Comprising the Metropolitan Cathedral City of Glasgow; in Strathclyde Region: the City of Glasgow District (except Garthamlock, Craigend, parts of Easterhouse; Baillieston, Cambuslang, Rutherglen and Burnside); Cumbernauld District (except Banton, Kilsyth and Queenzieburn); the Baldernock, Bishopbriggs and Kirkintilloch areas of Strathkelvin District; Bearsden and Milngavie, Clydebank, and Dumbarton Districts; and the Thornliebank area of Eastwood District.*

*The episcopal church associated with St. Kentigern in the sixth century was in the Kingdom of Strathclyde. He built a church at*

*Glasgow, and one at Hoddam, Dumfriesshire, where for a time he placed his See. The See of Glasgow was revived by Earl David (David I) c. 1114x1118. It was designated by Pope Alexander III "the special daughter of the Roman See", 30th April 1175, and confirmed in this honour, 30th July 1176. It became a suffragan of St. Andrews in 1472 but was itself erected a metropolitan See by Innocent VIII, 9th January 1492. It was vacant from the death in Paris on 24th April 1603 of James Beaton (1551-1603) until the restoration of the hierarchy in 1878.*

1. **Charles Petre Eyre:** born at York, England, 7th November 1817, third son of John Lewis Eyre [created count of the Lateran Hall and Apostolic Palace by Gregory XVI by brief *Gratum quidem*, 3rd March 1843; title made hereditary by Pius IX by brief *Virtutum ornamenta*, 29th January 1847] by his first wife Sarah Parker, and grand-nephew of Thomas Eyre, first president (1808) of St. Cuthbert's College, Ushaw, Durham [original of baptismal entry now with Registrar General but copy at St. Wilfrid, York]; at Ushaw College, Durham, 28th March 1826 [deacon, May 1838], before entering English College, Rome, 5th December 1839 [as convictor]; ordained at Rome, 19th March 1842; privy chamberlain, 6th January 1843; stationed at St. Mary, Newcastle-on-Tyne, 1843-1849; published *History of St. Cuthbert* (1849, 3rd edition, 1887); missionary at Wooler, 1849-1850, Haggerstone Castle, near Berwick-on-Tweed, 1850-1856; rector, St. Mary, Newcastle-on-Tyne, 1856-1868; conventual chaplain, Order of Malta, 28th May 1861; domestic prelate, 1867; vicar-general, Hexham and Newcastle, 1868; nominated delegate apostolic to Scottish mission and titular archbishop of Anazarbus, 11th December 1868, and consecrated by Charles Augustus de Reisach, cardinal bishop of Sabina, assisted by Henry Edward Manning, archbishop of Westminster, England, and Frédéric Ghislain de Mérode, titular archbishop of Mitylene and papal almoner, at Rome, 31st January 1869; apostolic administrator, Western District, 16th April 1869; took part in Vatican Council, 1869-1870; founded St. Peter's College, Partickhill [now at Newlands], 5th October 1874; translated on restoration of hierarchy to archdiocese of Glasgow, 15th March 1878; his two elder brothers having previously died, succeeded on death of his father, 11th November 1880, to title of count of Lateran Hall and Apostolic Palace; erected chapter, 13th January 1884; knight grand cross, Order of Isabel la Catolica, 3rd March 1887; transferred St. Peter's College to new building at Bearsden, 1892; honorary LL.D. (University of Glasgow), 1892; died at Glasgow, 27th March 1902, and is now buried in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow.
2. **John Maguire:** born at Glasgow, 8th September 1851, son of John Maguire, pawnbroker, and Helen Ward [baptismal record, St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow]; [left Stonyhurst College,

*Lancashire, 4th April 1867, and no further record of him has been found until October 1870*]; University of Glasgow (matriculated, Faculty of Arts, 1870); entered Propaganda College, Rome, 20th October 1871; ordained at Rome, 27th March 1875; stationed at St. Andrew, Glasgow, 1875-1879; secretary, Glasgow archdiocese, 1879-1883; missionary, St. Peter, Partick, 1883-1886; canon of Glasgow, 1884; vicar-general, Glasgow, 1885; provost of Glasgow Chapter, 1893; nominated titular bishop of Trocmades (and bishop-auxiliary), 6th April 1894, and consecrated by Angus MacDonald, archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by James Smith, bishop of Dunkeld, and William Turner, bishop of Galloway, at Glasgow. 11th June 1894; translated to Glasgow, 4th August 1902; rector, St. Peter's College, Bearsden, 1902-1914; died at Glasgow, 14th October 1920, and is buried in St. Peter's cemetery, Dalbeth, Glasgow.

3. **Donald Mackintosh:** born at Glasnacardoch, Inverness-shire, 10th October 1877, son of Donald Mackintosh and Christine MacDonald; at Blairs, 11th August 1890, before entering Sulpician Seminary of Notre Dame des Champs, Paris, October 1894, and Scots College, Rome, 21st October 1895; Gregorian University, Rome (Ph.D., D.D., *cum laude*); ordained at Rome, 1st November 1900; vice-rector, 1901-1913, and rector, 1913-1922, Scots College, Rome; privy chamberlain, 12th January 1907; domestic prelate, 2nd December 1914; nominated archbishop of Glasgow, 24th February 1922, and consecrated by Cajetan de Lai, cardinal bishop of Sabina, assisted by Donald Martin, bishop of Argyll and the Isles, and Henry Grey Graham, bishop-auxiliary of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, at Rome, 21st May 1922; died at Bearsden, 8th December 1943, and is buried in St. Peter's cemetery, Dalbeth, Glasgow.
4. **Donald Campbell:** born at Bohuntine, Inverness-shire, 8th December 1894, son of Donald Campbell and Mary Mackintosh, and nephew of Donald Mackintosh, coadjutor-archbishop of Glasgow, 1912-1919; at Blairs, 6th September 1908, before entering Scots College, Rome, 3rd November 1914; Gregorian University, Rome (D.D.); ordained at Rome, 3rd April 1920; assistant priest, St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, 1921-1922; Rothesay, 1922-1923; St. Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen, 1923-1924; Roy Bridge, 1924-1925; parish priest, Castlebay, Barra, 1925-1935. Daliburgh, South Uist, 1935-1939; nominated bishop of Argyll and the Isles, 5th October 1939, and consecrated by Andrew Joseph McDonald, O.S.B., archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, assisted by George Henry Bennett, bishop of Aberdeen, and William Henry Mellon, coadjutor-bishop of Galloway, at Oban, 14th December 1939; translated to Glasgow, 6th January 1945; archdiocese of Glasgow erected into province and divided into the metropolitan see of Glasgow and the two suffragan sees

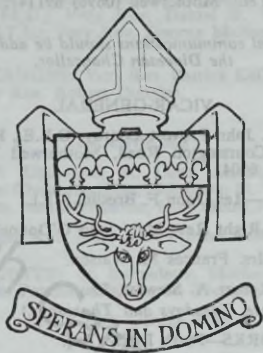

## OBITUARIES 1981

Very Rev. Gerard Canon Hart — 2nd December, 1980

If the obituary on 3rd December had read "peacefully, after a long and painful illness" few indeed even of his closest friends would have realised that this was Father Gerard: always considerate for the sickness and suffering of others he allowed very few to know the extent of his own. In mid-November he was at St. Francis' for confession as usual, he visited his brother and sister-in-law in Rutherglen, returned to St. Paul's Whiteinch and went into hospital next day. He died there two weeks later.

Father Gerard was born in Dumbarton in 1910, one of a family of nine, four of whom became priests, and the two who married each have a son a priest. All his schooling was in Dumbarton, St. Patrick's primary and then the new secondary, and after that to St. Peter's College, Bearsden, to be ordained in St. Andrew's Cathedral on 29th June, 1933. He was very much a priest of his own generation. He may have been more concerned than most about mixed marriages, but then he had known few to be happy. He was influenced certainly by Mgr. Kelly the parish priest of Dumbarton in his youth, whose Mass he served faithfully and daily for many years, and he had great regard for his mentors in the priesthood, Mgr. Forbes, Mgr. Daniel, Canon Lawton, Canon Boyle—these were all men uncompromising in their love of the truth, who combined this, as he did, with great sympathy and kindness to anyone in real need.

He talked often and with pride of the Children of Mary and the Boys' Guild in St. Roch's his first parish, with cheerfulness of his days in Carfin and the people he got to know so well in two short years. He was a valued colleague as a chaplain in the army and won the respect of all ranks. He returned to Glasgow in 1947 to St. Andrew's Cathedral and was Archdiocesan Master of Ceremonies for seven years, guiding Archbishop Campbell through many a church opening and consecration with dignity and a touch of humour. Then in 1954 his aspirations as a priest were fulfilled with his appointment to St. Catherine Labouré as parish priest. Here he served for eighteen years, building up an almost new parish in the north of the city, strict at times, but always with an energy and enthusiasm and sense of joy that inspired the parish to great prayer and a sense of community. In 1972 he was asked to move to St. Paul's, Whiteinch, where he went sensitive to the wishes of the Archbishop but sorry too to leave the parish in which he had spent half his priestly life. At St. Paul's, an older man now, he devoted himself particularly to the liturgy and the church, determined that St. Paul's, already a fine

building, would be a worthy house for the sacrifice of the Mass which he always so clearly saw as the heart of true living for every Catholic. The last few years were spent in great suffering and often physical weakness, but public and private prayer remained the key to his life—the Mass, the sacraments, the daily Rosary were never neglected.

Apart from the parish, which really was his life, he served the Church in other fields too: he had a lifelong devotion to Our Lady of Lourdes and was an annual pilgrim with Glasgow Archdiocese all his years as a priest, and served on the Lourdes Committee for twenty-five years. He was for many years confessor to the Little Sisters of the Poor, and Chairman of the Board of Governors of St. Mary's List "D" School, Bishopbriggs, until his death. In 1977 he was elected to the Cathedral Chapter: he was proud to be a canon, delighted that long and active service as a priest in the archdiocese was recognised, and he appreciated the appointment. He was very much alive to progress in the Church and the truths behind Vatican II, especially in respect of the liturgy—what he could not appreciate and would not accept was the need many seemed to have to wipe out past traditions just for the sake of new ideas: not a far cry from Pope Pius XII, Pope Paul VI or Pope John Paul II—but then an intense loyalty to the Holy Father was basic to his way of life. He had a particular personal concern for which he will be remembered—though many he helped had gone before him—and that was for priests who were lonely, in need of help, or without family. He was untiring too in his support for the many members of his own family and relations in their joys and in their sickness and in their bereavements.

Father Gerard enjoyed life, he enjoyed being a priest: as a young man he committed himself to the youth of Garngad, then to the soldiers in World War II, to the young parents in his first parish, and as the years went by what was always the heart of his life—the Mass, the Blessed Sacrament and devotion to Our Blessed Lady—became increasingly the hallmark of his leadership and inspiration.

The only thing he was or ever wanted to be was a priest: God called him he was ordained a priest, and that was his life. May he rest in peace.

#### **Right Rev. Mgr. John Dennehy — 17th December, 1980**

In the early morning hours of 17th December, 1980, an assistant priest in St. Robert's, Househillwood, answered a knock on his bedroom door and found his parish priest quietly saying to him—"a sick call, Father, I want you to come to my room and give the Last Sacraments"—which he did. About mid-day, Mgr. John Dennehy died, and a retired priest friend in Ireland, on hearing this story, commented—"that was typical of Jack—first things first!—we have lost a great priest and friend".

John Dennehy was born in the little town of Millstreet (Co. Cork) on 17th May, 1919 and began his primary education in the local convent school and the national school. He pursued his secondary education in St. Brendan's College, Killarney. A calling to the priesthood led him to St. John's College, Waterford, and while there he was accepted as a student for the Archdiocese of Glasgow. He was raised to the priesthood in the Cathedral, Waterford, on 6th June, 1943.

World War II was at its height when he arrived in Glasgow in July and was appointed to St. Roch's, Garngad, where he remained until 1947. After a year in St. Mary's, Duntocher ('47-'48), he was transferred to the Gorbals, a place ridden with slum buildings, very different from the modern housing area of today. Seventeen years of his priesthood ('48-'67) were given to working in this deprived area, where his cheerfulness and solid faith, brought consolation and hope to thousands of people of all denominations. Father John often said he graduated in the University of Life in the old Gorbals!

He was sent by the Archbishop to St. Teresa's, Possilpark, in 1967—to prepare for a new parish in Sighthill, an adjacent new housing scheme. A daunting challenge was presented to him—which he welcomed, and opened the parish of St. Stephen's in 1968. Through his endless zeal, energy and rare administrative ability, St. Stephen's became a compact and viable unit and after four years, in May 1972, the new church and presbytery were solemnly blessed and opened. Like other priests who had the privilege of founding a new parish, John was justly proud of the buildings and made them beautiful, worthy of his new parishioners. But their real significance, as he so often stressed, was their existence to provide an Eucharistic home for Our Saviour and for the spiritual wellbeing of his people. A man of prayer and true dedication to his vocation, he was completely detached from all that did not promote his priestly work.

"From my personal knowledge of him, which goes back to my youth" said Father Dan O'Leary in his homily at the Funeral Mass "one outstanding memory I have of him was his deep love and concern for people, and the loyalty he extended in a special way to his fellow priests. With words of kindness and true charity, he was willing, *not* to condone the faults of others, but to accept them in gentleness and with understanding sympathy. Another outstanding quality was his profound respect for his superiors—for those who had authority over him. 'The voice of the Lord comes through them' he would say."

Appointed a Prelate of Honour in April 1980, the new Mgr. John was almost embarrassed and wondered why he was selected. When the parishioners decided to make a presentation of his robes, he asked for a special concelebrated Mass of Thanksgiving to take place in St. Robert's magnificent church, where he had been parish priest since 1975, and had the robes brought up as part of the Presentation of the Gifts! The answer to his question of "why" was easily given

by his many priest-friends—it was a mark of respect and recognition of his dedication to the pastoral needs of so many people in the Archdiocese of Glasgow.

Archbishop Winning was principal concelebrant, assisted by Bishop Renfrew and Bishop Devine (Auxiliary Bishops), together with an estimated one hundred priests and parishioners from St. Robert's, Househillwood; St. Roch's, Garngad; St. Luke's, Ballater Street; St. Teresa's, Possilpark and St. Stephen's, Sighthill. It was noted that when Monsignor John Brendan Dennehy's coffin was transferred to the church for the Requiem Mass, the mortal remains of two of "his people" (parishioners of St. Robert's) lay before the sanctuary, one on the right and one on the left. John Dennehy, priest, would have liked that.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for him.

#### Rev. Francis J. McDermott — 30th January, 1981

Father McDermott was born in Jersey, Channel Islands, on 6th June, 1912, the eldest son of nine children. After completing his secondary education he took up journalism and worked with a Jersey newspaper for a few years. He then decided to enter religion and became a Cistercian monk in the monastery of Mount Melleray, Ireland. He was ordained in 1943 and continued his priestly work in the Cistercian community until 1949, when the rigours of monastic life finally told on his health. He applied and was accepted for the Diocese of Dunkeld, beginning his parish work as assistant priest in St. Mungo's, Alloa and soon after in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Dundee. He was appointed chaplain to the Little Sisters of the Poor in Wellburn Home, Lochee, where he devoted himself to the care of the old and the sick from 1952 to 1956 and was remembered with affection and gratitude for his care. He then served as curate in St. John's, Perth, then in St. Patrick's, Dundee, until, in 1961, he was appointed administrator of the Holy Family Parish, Dunblane, remaining there until 1971. From Dunblane, Father McDermott moved to take charge of the parish of St. Serf's, Highvalleyfield, until, in 1976, he was appointed parish priest of St. James', Kinross. In autumn, 1979 he was appointed parish priest of St. Joseph's, Dundee, where he was to enjoy a mere twelve months in charge. Only his closest friends realised that his health was failing and when he returned to his native Jersey to visit his dying mother last January, he suffered a severe heart attack and died one week after his mother, on 30th January, 1981. He was interred in Jersey.

Father McDermott's strict Trappist training remained with him all through his life: shy and retiring by nature, a trait no doubt reinforced by his early years of silence in the monastic life, he was nevertheless loved in every parish in which he served: loved and respected as a man of God by both priests and people. May he rest in peace.

**Right Rev. Mgr. Joseph Francis Provost Daniel — 31st January, 1981**

On 15th September, 1897, in the village of Shotts, Lanarkshire, there was born to John and Annie Daniel (née McGrory) a son, who was baptised in St. Patrick's Church on 19th September of that year, given the baptismal names of Joseph Francis.

His brother, John, was born two years later and was ordained a priest in St. Andrew's Cathedral in the year 1924. In later life he became Provost of the Cathedral Chapter of Paisley Diocese. He died on 27th January, 1973. His sister, Annie, married Patrick Byrne and one of their sons is Father Patrick Joseph Byrne, now assistant priest in St. Andrew's Cathedral.

Joseph Daniel commenced his education in the infant department of St. Patrick's School, Shotts. On the appointment of his father as headmaster of St. Paul's, Whiteinch, the family moved to Glasgow and he continued his primary education in the parochial school from 1905-1910. He attended St. Aloysius' College from 1910-1913 and at the age of fifteen entered the junior seminary, St. Mary's College, Blairs, Aberdeen. In 1915 he went to the Scots College, Valladolid, and was ordained priest on 10th June, 1922.

On returning to Scotland he was appointed to St. Andrew's Cathedral, Clyde Street, for two years. From 1924 until 1938 he served on the staff of St. Peter's College, Bearsden, where he was appointed a Professor of Sacred Scripture and Natural Philosophy. On the staff at that time were the distinguished priests, Dr. John McQuillan; Dr. Charles Treanor; Rev. Alex. Hamilton and Rev. William Eric Brown.

Father Joseph Daniel is remembered by the former *Petrini* for his interest in the Literary Society and his efforts to teach students to declaim; to speak out with clarity. In 1938, only sixteen years after his ordination (!!!) he was appointed parish priest of St. Thomas', Riddrie, where he remained for nine years. From 1947 until 1965 he was Administrator of St. Andrew's Cathedral. In the year 1948 he became a Canon of the Cathedral Chapter and in 1967 he became the Provost of the Chapter, a post he held until he died.

Provost Daniel would agree—regrettably—with the comments of Monsignor Hugh G. McEwan in the November, 1981, edition of *Flourish*: "Bishops have had Chapters of Canons, which at one time were a powerful force, with a right to draw up a leet for a vacant diocese. Gradually over the years the Chapter of Canons became more and more ORNAMENTAL!!! Canons still exist as Church Dignitaries, but their consultative work has largely been transferred to the Council of Priests."

In 1932, while still a Professor in St. Peter's College, Bearsden, he became Chaplain to the Glasgow Archdiocesan Council of the Catholic Young Men's Society, a post he held until 1947 when he became Scottish National Chaplain until 1967.

Canon Daniel, at the height of his power from 1930 until 1950, inspired and directed the work of the Catholic Young Men's Society (now C.M.S.); succeeded in forming what had been a loose-knit association of men, with a vague sense of direction, into a powerful instrument of Catholic Action as the apostolate of the laity was then known. With such aids as Bob Maguire and Frank Glennie, he stamped the country, and there was hardly a parish that was unaffected by their combined eloquence, enthusiasm and clear sighted programme of the Lay Apostolate. Father Daniel planned and propagated a programme of lay formation—The Annual Plan; "SEE-JUDGE-ACT" made famous by the Young Christian Workers. Rallies, Retreats and Conferences played a big part in the Society's work. One great occasion was the British National Conference held in Glasgow with a huge closing meeting in Green's Playhouse. The C.Y.M.S. held some glorious processions at Carfin, but their great highlight was the open air Mass at Celtic Park, an event remembered with enthusiasm by the elderly members of the Catholic community today. One layman speaks: "No one in my time has had such a huge impact for good on the young men of Scotland as Canon Joseph Daniel." Another says: "He made the Church, and particularly the role of the lay people in the Church, his life's work. The Church is poorer for his loss and better for his example."

In 1945 St. Aloysius' Springburn C.Y.M.S. celebrated their Silver Jubilee and in their message to their National Chaplain wrote: "We remember today your great devotion to the high ideals of our beloved founder and the patience which you have always shown to those who struggled, sometimes not too successfully, to live up to your magnificent lead. How often have your words been spoken and your ideals stressed at our branch meetings—it is as though you were always present in our midst, encouraging us, in your inimitable way, bidding us to hold on through our many difficulties, never fearing but that clouds would break, if only we would have recourse to Our Lady of Good Success."

Canon Daniel was Chaplain to the Union of Catholic Mothers from its foundation in 1947 until 1975. The present Glasgow Diocesan President says: "In all his talks to the U.C.M. his great love of Our Lady shone through. His constant message to mothers was always to be aware of the importance of their role in life. To be a faithful wife and devoted mother took precedence above all else. He was always advising mothers to be well informed, especially in the teachings of the Church, as a mother was the first teacher to her children. His 'SEE-JUDGE-ACT' guides at meetings are well remembered."

Having said all this, his great love was for the Mother of God, who appeared in 1858 to Bernadette at Lourdes. I do not know when he made his first visit to Lourdes, but I think it was while he was a student at San Ambrosio, Valladolid. After his ordination, his annual pilgrimage was to her shrine. He lived for his annual visit. His glorious stance on the steps of the Rosary Basilica, invoking with the finest voice in Lourdes—"Lord, we adore thee; Lord, we believe in thee; Lord, we hope in thee; Lord, we love thee; he whom thou lovest

is sick"; to hear these acclamations coming from Canon Daniel stirred love in the hearts of all Scots pilgrims. On the death of Canon George Stewart of St. Peter's, Partick, in 1959 he became Chairman of the Lourdes Pilgrimage Committee and on the death of Canon George Galbraith, M.C. in 1960, he became Chaplain to the Glasgow Hospitalité. In the year 1955 he compiled a Lourdes Manual from which I take two excerpts, the first of which the Canon does not write to us but in his own glorious voice, proclaims the following:

"Lovely, glorious Lourdes! What a host of holy and thrilling thoughts are evoked by the mere mention of the name of this little town in the south of France! Lourdes, the 'Capital of Prayer'; Lourdes, the scene of many miracles; the earthly paradise of the Holy Rosary; the centre of world pilgrimage; Lourdes of the glorious processions of the Blessed Sacrament, of the fervent invocations, of the torchlight rivers of gentle fire and loud *Aves*; Lourdes, the sanctuary of myriad petitions, of countless conversions, of unnumbered acts of resignation to the Holy Will of God; Lourdes; the sweet haven of peace and rest for the troubled, the weak, the sick and the suffering; Lourdes, the New Jerusalem where all nations join in the one *Credo*, and in the *Salve Regina*; Lourdes, the foretaste of heaven itself."

"Do not allow yourself to be distracted, much less annoyed by the prayers of other nations. Rather rejoice constantly with Our Blessed Lady as she listens to the great symphony of praise and petition ascending to her from all her children in so many languages. One of the greatest lessons of Lourdes is to get away from all selfish individualism; to realise that we are members of a truly great community, the universal Church, embracing all nations; and that, in spite of all our differences in outlook, country, colour and language, WE ARE ALL ONE IN CHRIST, WITH THE ONE AND THE SAME IMMACULATE MOTHER.

On the occasion of his golden jubilee as a priest in the year 1972 he was made a Chaplain of the Grotto and in 1980 a Domestic Prelate. These two honours came rather late in the life of such a great priest. As His Grace, the Archbishop said on one occasion when he was bestowing a Papal Medal: "Honour should be bestowed not at the end of one's life but when one can appreciate it." The Canon, in all humility, was proud of both honours. In the year 1965 the Canon was transferred to St. Mary's, Pollokshaws; he must have felt this change, after so many years in the Cathedral, but his only comment was: "What an honour to be in charge of a church dedicated to St. Mary Immaculate."

In 1969 he underwent an operation and remained well until 1972. On the 12th February, 1972, he underwent major surgery. The Canon had a very stormy passage and after some improvement his condition worsened and by May, 1972, was still in hospital and so debilitated that it was felt if he were to be subjected to further surgery that he would not survive. He was at death's door. Some time after this he

began to improve a little, for reasons that could not be explained, certainly not by his doctor or the surgeons; although he was a mere ghost of himself and very weak, he was anxious to go to Lourdes and was discharged from Bon Secours on the 14th July to be taken direct to Lourdes as a sick priest. We were all very anxious about him for the week in Lourdes, but he came back a little better and continued to make slow but steady progress for the next few months. After this the Canon had continuous good health for about four years, but his old troubles recurred and with remarkable fortitude and patience he carried on his diocesan duties. His strong physique sustained him until the 31st January, 1981, when he died peacefully.

I am sorry that I cannot do justice to such a great priest but one thing I am sure of is that Canon Joseph Francis Daniel was a priest of God; a lover of God in all his works and in all his deeds. He, like the rest of us, had his faults and failings, but his daily prayer to the Immaculate Mother of God must have sanctified his soul. Above the high altar in the Rosary Basilica are the words: "A JESUS PAR MARIE"—"THROUGH MARY TO JESUS".

May Mary, the Immaculate Mother of God, present the soul of Monsignor Joseph Francis Daniel to her Divine Son.

**Right Rev. Mgr. Sean O'Kelly, S.T.L., Ph.L., M.Sc. —**  
17th February, 1981

Mgr. Sean O'Kelly, Rector of the Pontifical Scots College, Rorç, died instantly in the evening of Tuesday, 17th February, 1981, on being struck by a motor car while crossing the road outside the College. He was in the 50th year of his age and the 19th of his priesthood. On the following Friday, Cardinal Gray was the principal celebrant at a Requiem Mass in his titular church in Rome, Santa Chiara, attended by Cardinals, Bishops and members of the Diplomatic Corps together with a large congregation. The Funeral Mass itself was celebrated on Monday, 23rd February, in Limerick Cathedral. The principal celebrant was Mgr. O'Kelly's brother, Father Colm O'Kelly, of the Diocese of Sacramento, California, U.S.A., while the Bishop of Limerick presided. Present and concelebrating were Bishops from Ireland and Scotland, including Archbishop Winning of Glasgow and Bishop Monaghan, Auxiliary Bishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (who gave the panegyric), as well as a great number of priests who had travelled from many parts of Ireland and Scotland, including Mgr. Philip Flanagan and Canon Daniel Boyle, Mgr. O'Kelly's immediate predecessors as Rector, Mgr. Thomas Murray, former Spiritual Director of the Scots College, and the three Scots priests who had been the late Monsignor's contemporaries as students. Present, too, were representatives of the staff and students of the College. The final commendation was carried out by Dr. Jeremiah Newman, Bishop of Limerick, and the grave-side prayers in Mount St. Laurence Cemetery, Limerick, were led by the Archbishop of Glasgow.

At a Month's Mind Mass on 18th March in St. Cuthbert's, Slateford, where Mgr. O'Kelly had been an assistant before returning to Rome in 1965 as Vice-Rector of the Scots College, the following panegyric was delivered by Bishop Monaghan:

Time is said to a great healer. As the days and weeks pass we generally can adjust ourselves and become more reconciled to whatever has come to us as a severe blow. Though a month has passed since the tragic news was flashed to us from Rome of the sudden death of the Rector of our Scots College there in a road accident just outside his own College, it is still hard for many of us to realise the stark reality of that news. For so many years now, bishops and priests on their visits to Rome were always assured of his warm and practical welcome, and so many Scottish pilgrims to the Eternal City have reason to be grateful to him for his never-failing kindness and help. Gradually we are coming to realise that indeed we mourn not only a good and faithful priest whom many of us claimed as a friend, but also that the Church in Scotland has lost a valued Rector of a Seminary, with such an important role to play in the training of our future priests, as well as an unofficial ambassador of the Church in Scotland at the Vatican. While we mourn, we do not mourn as those who have no hope. We accept that God in his own mysterious way of showing his love for us, chose that time and place and way of calling Monsignor O'Kelly to himself. We have to accept, hard though it may be, that it was God's will that he should be taken from us, when, in the ordinary way, we should have been able to look forward to many more years of his genial priestly service.

In Scotland we have reason to be grateful to the many Irish priests and religious who have come to serve and build up the Church in Scotland. Even against such a splendid background of service, Monsignor Sean O'Kelly stands out in quite a pre-eminent way. He was the kind of man, and his talents were such, that he would have made his mark in any sphere of life. We are thankful that, after obtaining his master's degree in science at University College, Galway, he should have come to Edinburgh, and that it was here in Edinburgh that he answered God's call to the priesthood, offering himself to the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh.

He studied in the Scots College, Rome, a college to which he was later to devote so much of his priestly life. Ordained on 8th July, 1962, he spent the first few years of his life as a priest here at St. Cuthbert's, Edinburgh. His talents were many, and so he was quickly entrusted in 1965 with what must be one of the most responsible posts in the Church namely, to the staff of a seminary—in this case to the staff of our national seminary in Rome, playing such an important and responsible part in the training of our future priests. Later, he followed Canon Boyle as Rector. Those were particularly difficult years in a situation that never was easy or simple, but made the more difficult by the era of change that followed on Vatican II.

Changes there had to be, but what changes and how best to make the new adaptations? As a true and loyal son of the Church, his aim and object was to carry out the new regulations and recommendations in as smooth and painless way as possible.

A rector in Rome is not only running a college, but is also a very special servant of the bishops of his country by acting as intermediary, messenger and go-between in the many business matters arising with the Sacred Roman Congregations. To say that he was very much "persona grata" with the officials of these Roman offices sums up his relationship with them.

More perhaps than anyone else, the students and priests who passed through the College during his years on the staff, remember with gratitude all that they owe to him, not only as a kindly but firm superior, but even more because of his example of what the priesthood meant to him.

Though his service here at St. Cuthbert's was comparatively short—two years only—he is still remembered by many of you for his dedicated service among you. I have heard personal testimonies of this. In the first few days after his death, I met several present and former parishioners of St. Cuthbert's who recalled personal examples of his sincere interest and attentive care of those who were ill or in trouble of any kind.

In the Gospel reading of today, we heard Our Lord's own words "a grain of wheat remains no more than a single grain, unless it is dropped into the earth and dies. If it dies, then it produces many grains." Monsignor O'Kelly devoted sixteen of his nineteen years as a priest to the training of our future priests, first as Vice-Rector and finally as Rector of our Scots College in Rome.

Our Lord's death came forth to the Resurrection and to the building up of his Church through the apostles and their successors. We hope and pray that Monsignor O'Kelly's death will bring forth a harvest of vocations to the priesthood who will serve the Archdiocese which he loved and the Church in Scotland to which he brought great credit. We are grateful to God for the gifts he gave him, and the service he gave to the Church. We are grateful to his parents who provided a Christian home for him and his sisters and brothers, and who must have fostered his vocation.

As at the Requiem in Rome, presided over by His Eminence the cardinal in his own Roman Church of Santa Chiara, and as at the Requiem in Limerick Cathedral, we offer to his mother, sisters and brothers, our sincere sympathy and the assurance of our prayers. Monsignor O'Kelly had many friends, in Scotland, Ireland and Rome. He had a way of making friends, of keeping them and of finding time for them. May we, who claim to have been his friends, prove our friendship in the best possible way by remembering him now in our prayers.

**Rev. Henry Curran — 28th February, 1981**

Father Henry Curran, former parish priest of Sacred Heart, Cowie, died on 28th February, 1981, in his native town of Haddington while on sick leave, in the 60th year of his age and the 36th of his priesthood. Mgr. Patrick Grady, V.G., was the principal celebrant at the Funeral Mass in St. Mary's, Haddington, prior to interment at Haddington. During the Mass, the following panegyric was delivered by Father James Rae, parish priest of St. John's, Portobello:

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The solemn words of Our Lord in the Gospel emphasise how very tenuous is our hold on life, and they hit us all the more forcibly on an occasion like this when we mourn the loss of a beloved friend and priestly colleague, whose call to judgement could not have come more suddenly.

Our instinctive response is of that fear and trembling which has prompted us all our lives to pray against a sudden and unprovided death, but our response of faith is one that recognises the loving care of our heavenly Father for his every creature, and the providence which furnishes us through life with the enabling wisdom and grace to meet successfully the end he has in mind for us.

Such a response is essentially a joyous one.

It may seem callous to say that we celebrate death, but in the true sense of that word, that is what we Christians do, for we have something specific and unique to say about death, and even as we mourn we want to say it for all the world to hear.

Our message is that death is no longer the finality that we had once thought it to be, for Christ Our Lord has taken hold of our death and made it one with his own.

The road that he has driven through death and resurrection to his Father was not for himself alone, but for us to travel along with him.

Through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ death has lost its sting and is swallowed up in victory.

As a lasting memorial of this fact, Our Lord has left us that very death and resurrection enshrined within a simple sacramental rite using the appearances of everyday bread and wine, so that, until he comes again, every time we eat this bread and drink this cup, we are proclaiming his death and with it his resurrection. "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again," we say, the very minute bread and wine have been changed into his saving Body and Blood. "If any man eats my flesh and drinks my blood, I will raise him up on the last day. I am the Resurrection and the life," said Our Lord.

The recognition of these mysteries warms the hearts of every believing man and woman—a recognition that was particularly acute in Father Henry Curran who as a priest, was the daily minister and dispenser of the mysteries he believed in so ardently. Not many people, I think, shared the inner thoughts and motivations of Father Curran, for his innate spirit of courage forbade him wear his heart on his sleeve. But I consider it my good fortune that in the first days of my priesthood I was entrusted to his care to be initiated into the practices of pastoral ministration. During these few short weeks I glimpsed a man of depth, of few words, and of strongly held convictions, whose priestly zeal touched his every enterprise. One recalls the ardour of the Holy Hours he preached, his devotion to the confessional, both as priest and penitent, his loving care for the sick and the aged, and his energetic devotion to the youth in the Scout and Guide movement and to children generally amongst whom he was such a constant favourite. Remembering how readily he answered the many calls of his superiors to move to pastures new, one recognises the complete man of God, the valiant soldier of Christ, ever ready to do his master's bidding. That very quality gives us every reason to believe that he was particularly well disposed to meet the sudden death which providence had decreed for him.

As the result of two critical accidents, the latter years of his life were never really free of pain and anxiety which he bore with his customary stoicism and courage. His indisposition served surely as a premonition of the untimely death that awaited him some five days before his sixtieth birthday.

To his devoted brother, his relatives and to his many friends from many parishes we, all of us here, and I'm sure, the Cardinal in Rome, extend our deepest and heartfelt sympathy. May he rest in peace. Amen.

#### **Rev. John McFaul — 4th March, 1981**

Some years ago they used to say in St. Teresa's parish, Glasgow, in reference to some of the curates—"McFaul, Mackinnon and McLeod, a good sounding half-back line for a Scottish team". In fact, John McFaul was no mean performer on a football field, but it would have been recognised from his play that he was really an inside-forward. He was alert, quick in his movements, defence-splitting in his passes, individual, yet a great team man; and that was him on and off the field. John McFaul could have qualified for selection to a Scottish team on the score of his birthplace, Dennistoun in Glasgow, on 14th October, 1915. By coincidence, the other "wing-half" was a boyhood neighbour.

John's vocation to the priestly life was nurtured against a "Donegal" background in the family home. From St. Anne's Primary School he went to Blairs, with a short detour via St. Mungo's Academy.

In Blairs he grew up in a college community rich in characters among staff and students and he always appreciated the fact that so many of those students graduated with him to the seniority of St. Peter's College, Bearsden. It was obvious that he was a conscientious student and enthusiastic about soccer. A strong influence on him in those days was Father Willie Brown, of whom he spoke with the utmost respect.

The brand-new Father McFaul was appointed on 29th June, 1941, as curate to St. Mary's, Saltcoats, where he served until the division of the dioceses in 1947. One of his endearing qualities was that he never got round to growing-up; perhaps for that very reason he had a very successful youth club—the girls in netball, the boys in soccer. But he scored longer lasting successes in the number of young people he directed to follow their religious vocation in active or contemplative communities.

Besides the master/apprentice system training programmes for their priests in the pastoral care of the parishioners, Canon Michael O'Connor in Saltcoats offered his curates a training in local politics and Canon Michael McCarthy in Possilpark offered his curates a training in matters financial. Father John McFaul passed through both schools and unashamedly failed both courses. He was not a political person nor was he fond of financial figures. He certainly was a family man who appreciated throughout his life the closeness of his own family of three sisters and two brothers, nieces and nephews; for that reason he was at his best when visiting families in the parish. There was ample scope for that work in St. Teresa's parish, described at that time as "a semi-diocese" by Father John J. Murphy, of very happy memory, successor to Canon McCarthy as pastor. He created a very conducive family atmosphere in the parochial house that brought out the best in Father McFaul and his fellow "half-backs". The fourteen years John served there were surely the happiest of his life, when the richness of his character developed, the profound deepening of his prayer-life and his inimitable art of storytelling so brightly coloured with a sense of humour which was sometimes somewhat satirical but mostly infectiously impish. Consequently he was in great demand as a sympathetic confidant, a respected spiritual director and a faithful, entertaining friend. His childlike devotion to the Motherhood of the Blessed Virgin Mary he made practical in his careful attention of the aged, the lonely and the sick. This care he shared with others in the apostolic training he gave to so many members of the Legion of Mary so that they too would respect and serve all members of the community. One particular area where his care was most selfless and generous was his work in the Legion's Wilton Street hostel for women and girls.

Not all, of course, but very many in St. Teresa's parish listened appreciatively to his sermons with their wealth of quotations and illustrations. These were most appreciated in the "allocutio" given at meetings of the Catholic Young Men's Society, Young Christian Workers and Legion of Mary. Never a cinema-goer or a possessor

of a radio, John devoured print in "posh" newspapers, serious magazines and books of every kind. His voluminous library was catholic in taste and "McFaul" in building. He had "a thing" about "bargains" and the lower the purchase price the richer the relish added to his reading. A high proportion of his library he bought from the "withdrawn from circulation" shelves of Boots Circulation Library at prices ranging from  $\frac{1}{2}$ d to  $4\frac{1}{2}$ d. He might have been prepared on an exceptional occasion, to pay as much as 2/6d, but for that he would have expected to get "a first edition" or a slightly soiled set of encyclopaedias. The annoying thing about browsing around the many and varied books that dominated his room was John had read them all, except the latest acquisitions. Yesterday you could have found him reading a "Commentary on the Cartoons for the Jerusalem Windows of Marc Chagall", today a biography of an obscure provincial Chinese mandarin. Consequently, although the "normal" conversation in St. Teresa's was conducted in a peculiar Possil "patois", John could climb to Olympian heights when engaged seriously in conversation. It was once said of him, not unkindly, that he was cultured without at any time looking or sounding cultured. When involved in discussion or argument he could be both exasperating and amusing—exasperating, because he could be so honest and penetrating in his counterpoint, amusing, because when he outstretched his otherwise valid reasoning he raced "*ad absurdum*": but never did discussion or argument finish in rancour but invariably in laughter.

In 1960 Father McFaul sustained a shock—he was appointed by the Scottish hierarchy to be the spiritual director to the seminarians in the Scots College, Valladolid. He was a good choice: a spiritually sound priest who could lead aspirants to the priesthood to a closer union with the High Priest, Jesus Christ; a priest of wide pastoral experience who could give them excellent practical advice; a priest who kept himself abreast of current theological thinking and so could inform young enquiring minds; a well-read priest who could open books for them and reveal a treasury. His enthusiasm for the apostolate was infectious for those young "fishermen" eager to cast their nets in Scottish "waters". Those who were seminarians in Valladolid between 1960-63 speak of him affectionately and with gratitude for his eminently practical advice. Little wonder his advising was so described considering he often threatened to write a slim volume on moral theology entitled "In Praxi Autem"—However, In Practice—(cf Noldin).

One happy by-product of his appointment to Spain was that during vacations he could do the research for another possible book—"The Cheapest Way to 100 Beautiful and Remote Places in Spain". Already, from his holiday travels, he could have written a companion volume relevant to the British Isles. He was an authority on "wee trains and buses" and part of their fascination for him was the frugal financial outlay and the friendliness of his fellow-travellers. Many formerly Young Christian Workers can and do look back on very happy holidays they enjoyed together with Father McFaul very much in

charge. For example, in Italy, when they were confronted with a menu written in an elegant but indecipherable longhand, John would lead a deputation of diners from his party into the kitchen to order, by digital indication, the dishes that appealed to them. Such an exercise was carried out in such McFaul fashion that no objection or offence was taken but usually, because so unusual, with a great deal of laughter in both languages.

Back in Glasgow in 1963, John resumed parochial work, first as a curate in St. Conval's, then as parish priest of St. Leo's and latterly of St. Luke's. In the Gorbals he felt very much at home because he had come full cycle, again he was in a strongly "Donegal" atmosphere. The suddenness of his dying and his death on Ash Wednesday would have appealed to him, in that it did not give anyone any bother. His living certainly appealed to those of us who were happy to live and work so amicably with him. The several references to "wee" in this appreciation would be misleading if it were construed that John was in any way "small", a mean, penny-pinching eccentric; he was a generous, warm-hearted human being who was not the least bit materialistic. He was not eccentric, but unfortunately he was unique; unfortunately, because the world in any age would be the richer for the life and work of such a priest. R.I.P.

#### Very Rev. Hugh Canon Bogan — 6th March, 1981

Canon Hugh Bogan, who retired as parish priest of St. Patrick's, Dumbarton, in 1975, died on 6th March, 1981, in Dumbarton, in the eighty-third year of his age and the fifty-fourth of his priesthood. The Funeral Mass in St. Patrick's was concelebrated on 9th March by a great number of priests, the Archbishop of Glasgow being the principal celebrant. The interment followed in Dumbarton cemetery, being performed by the Archbishop assisted by Canon Bogan's successor in St. Patrick's, Mgr. Thomas Murray who led some of the prayers. At the Mass, the following panegyric was delivered by Father John Gowans, long an assistant of Canon Bogan's in St. Patrick's:

Thou art a priest forever according to the order of Melchisedech.  
(Ps. 109).

The priesthood which we recognise and know in the Catholic Church today arises from and is a sharing in the priesthood of Jesus Christ himself. The priest is, as he is so often reminded in his preparation for the sublime office of priesthood, another Christ.

So to understand the priesthood we look at Jesus Christ himself. He came to earth in obedience to the will of his heavenly Father to offer sacrifice, to forgive sins and to preach the revealed word of God—he came to earth to lead souls to the heaven he had temporarily vacated and no effort, no task was too great to undertake, even to the point of exhaustion; no person was too little to be overlooked or despised: he had compassion on the multitude.

The priesthood of Jesus Christ—culminating in the perfect and complete sacrifice on the cross—was a caring priesthood towards all without fear or favour. He went about doing good—he cared for the sick and the weak—he consoled those who were in mourning, he wept with them—he scorned public acclaim—they wanted to make him king but he knew his throne was to be the cross and his crown was to be made of thorns.

That is the priesthood which is put before the priest before he accepts the awesome dignity of ordination.

That is the priesthood which the people of God have a right to expect and even demand from the priests who serve them.

That is the priesthood that is as unchanging as Jesus Christ himself, a loving, caring, sacrificing priesthood aimed at nothing less than filling the kingdom of heaven with the souls God made for eternal happiness. And to ensure that his followers in his footsteps in the priesthood would lack nothing—he gave them the power to change ordinary bread and wine into the nourishing and strengthening food of life—his own body and blood soul and divinity—for the spiritual well-being of the people under the care of the priest and for the priest himself.

That long term care was accompanied by the power to forgive sins—an unlimited love offered to all who accepted him as God, true love for the spiritual well-being of those who would try to love him in return.

So, when he died, his priesthood would endure.

And endure it did and does in the priests of the Church.

We try to follow his example and use wisely, sincerely and devoutly the precious powers and helps he gives us.

Some of us are more successful than others, more truly loving, more truly caring, more truly other Christs.

And when a good priest dies there is a great sadness. That is why we are sad—at the loss of a good priest, let's say it, a great priest, one of nature's gentlemen, Canon Hugh Bogan. His birthday is the day sandwiched between St. Patrick's day and St. Joseph's day—the 18th March—he would have been eighty-four then. It was a fitting day for him—for he proudly wore the shamrock, the emblem of his parish patron, and he cared deeply for the universal Church. And when he came here, he had to walk between these two statues as he made his way to say Mass. He was in the middle.

It was seventy years ago that he entered Blairs College to study for the priesthood and hear from the lips of his heroes—the spiritual guidelines that ruled his entire life.

His studies were interrupted by the First World War—and his experiences in the muddy front line trenches in a mud-caked kilt were no doubt part of the training and suffering his divine master had decreed for him.

He was ordained priest in 1923 and was to give fifty-eight years of his life as a priest for Almighty God. Six months in Coatdyke, then eighteen years as a curate in Barrhead, before going to Longriggend as parish priest for four years—where his Sunday collections took ten minutes to count, where the pennies and halfpennies were put aside for the childrens' bus fares to school, and there were very occasional visits to the bank with the silver threepennys and sixpences methodically rolled up in newspaper.

Then to Newton in 1945 before reaching Dumbarton to open up the new parish of St. Michael's in 1946.

Monsignor Kelly died and Father Bogan came to St. Patrick's in 1950 to follow in the great man's footsteps.

From 1900 to 1975 St. Patrick's Dumbarton, had only two parish priests: Mgr. Hugh Kelly and Canon Hugh Bogan.

The Canon celebrated his silver jubilee in St. Michael's and his golden jubilee in St. Patrick's. The whole of Dumbarton was under his care at one time or another, for St. Peter's too, was part of his parish for many years, before becoming independent; he was a son of the rock, by appointment firstly and later by choice and by sincere conviction of the true worth of the people.

How did he measure up as another Christ?

He offered the sacrifice of the Mass with special care and devotion. He spent half an hour on his knees after Mass, daily, before coming in for breakfast. He treated the holy things of the house of God in a holy manner. He never missed "confessions". He never left it to others—he was always there to bestow the love and mercy of God, no matter how he personally felt. He tended the sick—doing the sick calls in the middle of the night because he didn't have the heart to waken his snoring curates. A seventy-year-old man telling us that so and so was sick—he had given him the sacraments during the night.

He visited the old, he comforted those who mourned. He loved the children and was so happy to carry out the arduous task of religious examiner for the diocese for many years. He liked taking a class—and the care and trouble he took over the stories he told them were mirrored in the vast number of wee notes and books I was privileged to see.

He was vitally interested in the young people, in everything they did, and how they did it—for he knew their mammys and daddys and grannies as well—and he was so wonderfully pleased, too, when they did him proud as so many of them did and still do.

He cared.

He cared for the deserving poor, everywhere he went. In the great depression of the 'thirties and the mass unemployment then, he walked with the young men of Barrhead in the hills to help them overcome the great fright that seized them—in the days when they lay long in bed to save an extra meal.

He looked lovely, they said, as he lay in state, as they filed past the coffin in his church. He was lovely.

Have you ever stood at the bottom of a fifteen foot ladder in the drenching rain as a wiry seventy year old climbed on to a confessional roof to investigate the source of a leak that was letting in the rain?

Or have you stood by attentive to his requests, admiring the perfection of flower arranging at 2.30 on an Easter Sunday morning—your eyes half shut—when the same revered priest says: "Away to bed boys I'll say the first Mass."

Or have you scanned the moonlit sky at one o'clock on a frosty morning tracing the movement of satellites with binoculars—being instructed about the Plough, Jupiter, the Dog Star, The Warrior and other such mysteries?

You haven't—then you really didn't know the Canon.

It was a great mercy the Open University was not in vogue then for I'm sure we'd have been together at 6.30 a.m. in the morning studying the elements of nuclear fission or something similarly intricate.

I remember the late Canon John Boyle of Dumbarton fame, told me "you're going to a great priest and a great man".

A great priest.

Another Christ, that's what a great priest is, that's why he loved everyone and everyone loved him. And those who didn't love him didn't know him, just as those who didn't love Christ didn't really know or understand either.

Christ was gentle—so was Canon Hugh. Christ was firm—so was he when necessary. Christ preached the Word of God—and so did the Canon in his quietly spoken sermons that showed forth his deep theological and scriptural knowledge.

Christ did not seek public acclaim—he scorned it.

Canon Bogan did not seek public acclaim—he refused it, quietly, firmly—whether from people, priest or town. He gave and did not think of taking back.

He gave his all for his people. The church he loved, the dwelling-place of God he cherished and tended with loving care and taste. He appreciated that the people of Dumbarton had built this church with their money, and he never asked for money.

Carmel had a very special place in his heart and Clerkhill had happy memories for him too. The parish ministers revered him and he was the first to join with them and the people of the town in common prayer.

He loved everyone and his personal charm bore no ill will or grudge. He was sincere and always the same. He loved work and finally he couldn't manage the perfection he always sought. That was a disappointment to him.

But his special love was for his fellow priests, other Christs like himself sharing the same burdens in the same heat. There was never a word of criticism—always a reason or an excuse to be made when others found it hard.

His delight was to be in the company of priests. His hospitality was a by-word. His house was always a happy house. That's why retirement hit him hard. He was out of the swim of things. A retired priest needs more and more visits from his fellow priests who came to him in the charity of Christ. We must not neglect them. We must make time for those who have given so much time for God.

God knows all things about us even our most secret thoughts. How consoling that is because God sees the inner good and worth that the onlooker fails to appreciate. We loved Canon Bogan we saw and knew. I'm sure that God loves him more because he knows a lot more and saw a lot more than we do.

He leaves behind many sad people and priests who are consoled only by their faith in God that assures us that this is only a temporary parting.

He was special. His words were carefully chosen. I wouldn't be surprised if at this very moment he is having some urgent words with the Holy Spirit about other matters too. The Holy Spirit will be listening.

It's a sad day. It's the end of an era in Dumbarton. Many people have lost a true, trusted and sincere friend. But our sadness will be lightened when we realise the tremendous love we had for Canon Hugh, a love that the Canon returned many times over.

#### **Rev. Thomas McKeown — 23rd March, 1981**

Father Thomas McKeown was born in Kelvinside, Glasgow, on 22nd April, 1915. He was the youngest of a large family which included six sisters, four of whom are still alive.

As a boy he attended St. Charles' Primary School and St. Aloysius' College, Garnethill. In 1932 he began his studies for the priesthood at Blairs College, Aberdeen—studies which he completed in St. Peter's College, Bearsden.

Tom was ordained priest in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, by Archbishop Donald Mackintosh on 29th June, 1942. His first appointment was to St. Mary's, Pollokshaws, which at that time stretched as far as Thornliebank, Sunday Mass being celebrated there in the hall which had been acquired by the late Canon Edward Lawton. There was ample scope for the zeal and energy of this powerfully built young man. He is still remembered with affection by parishioners of St. Mary's and St. Vincent de Paul's, Thornliebank.

In February, 1943 he was transferred to St. Mary's, Greenock, now part of the Diocese of Paisley. His next appointment was to St. Philomena's, Provanmill, where he served from 1947 to 1956. His last years as an assistant priest from 1956 to 1967, were spent in the parish of the Sacred Heart, Bridgeton.

These were not the most congenial of parishes, but throughout the years he remained the same boyish, cheerful, pastoral priest. Young people in particular responded to his enthusiasm and dedication.

It was only after such a long and varied apprenticeship that Tom was appointed parish priest of St. Brendan's, Yoker, in July 1967.

The people of St. Brendan's are well aware of his qualities: he had gifts of leadership of which perhaps he was unaware. For him liturgy was a celebration, a joyful act of worship of God. And Tom had his own brand of liturgy. Endowed with an excellent speaking and singing voice, he led his people in songs of praise. Active participation was *de rigueur*. For him the church was his Father's house where he felt very much at home. He was convinced that God must have a sense of humour, that Christians must never be sad. The Gospel after all is good news—and Tom believed in preaching the message with joy.

He had a good rapport with the staff and pupils of St. Brendan's Primary School. We hear a great deal nowadays about religious education programmes, catechetics and all sorts of visual aids. Tom had his own teaching technique and his own visual aid in the shape of a four-legged Alsatian dog.

Always on the look-out for vocations. Tom did not shun the direct individual approach. He greatly admired those who served the Church in the foreign missions. Missionary priests were invited to join him on holiday at his expense.

Basically Tom was a humble priest in whom there was no guile. He was a generous man who never spared himself. And he exemplified that rarest of virtues—the virtue of gratitude—for any kindness done to him particularly during his long illness.

He radiated his own love of God and love of Mary. Novena devotions are not so popular nowadays, but for Tom the Monday night novena was one of the highlights of his week.

During his last years at St. Brendan's Tom suffered much, with courage and cheerfulness.

Pilgrimages to the Holy Land are common enough today. Tom was one of the priests who participated in the first Scottish pilgrimage in 1961. It was fitting that the week before he died another group of pilgrims including his nephew Father George Bradburn, should offer Mass for Tom in the Holy Land and pray that soon his long period of suffering and exile would be over and that he would be at peace in the true promised land when every tear would be wiped away.

Archbishop Winning was the principal concelebrant at the Requiem Mass on 24th March, 1981, in St. Brendan's, the church which Tom had renovated and beautified. The packed congregation paid their final tribute to a well loved priest.

**Rev. Stanislaus J. Smith, S.T.L., Ph.L. — 26th May, 1981**

Father Stanislaus Smith, parish priest of St. Ninian's, Bowhill, died on 26th May, 1981, in the sixty-eighth year of his age and the twenty-eighth of his priesthood. Bishop James Monaghan, auxiliary Bishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh was the principal celebrant at the Funeral Mass in St. Ninian's on 29th May prior to the interment at Bowhill Cemetery. During the Mass, Father James Thomson, chaplain to Catholics at the University of St. Andrews, delivered the following panegyric:

There would seem to be no obvious connection between St. Joseph and St. Philip Neri, but in fact there is—indeed, that is what has brought us together this morning. They are in fact the ecclesiastical alpha and omega points in the earthly life of Father Stanislaus Joseph Smith, born as he was on the Feast of St. Joseph and dying sixty-seven years later on the feastday of that delightful Roman saint, Philip Neri. And in between, a full life embracing the industrial, the political and the sacerdotal. He was born on 19th March, 1914, in Newtongrange, Midlothian, of Lithuanian stock, one of two children, the other being a sister who has predeceased him by many years. He was educated at Holy Cross Academy, then did a course in mining surveying, after which he moved into the coalmining industry for some ten years, during which time he also served the community as a councillor in Dalkeith.

About the age of thirty, he felt he might be called to serve God in the priesthood, and to this end he entered Campion House at Osterley and then went on to the Scots College in Rome. On 6th July, 1952, now aged thirty-eight, he became Father Stan Smith and returned to Scotland to begin his work in the Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh. He received an appointment to St. Bride's, Cowdenbeath, remaining there for the first two years of his ministry; many will well remember his assiduous visitation of the two schools in the parish, St. Bride's and St. Columba's, a dedication he shared with the two parish priests he served with; his next appointment took him to Musselburgh, this time for three years, then in October, 1958, he was transferred to St. Cuthbert's, Edinburgh, where he worked until the autumn of 1961.

The large parish of Bathgate was the scene of his ministry thereafter; then in September 1969 His Eminence asked him to succeed Father Hodgson in this parish of Bowhill, Cardenden; for twelve years this mining village became his vineyard, or perhaps we should say his coalface, and its concerns became his. To say that Father Stan Smith was a well-known and respected figure here is to state but the obvious. He was a "character", a "worthy", and his openness and ready humour endeared him to this community, to those of whatever creed; indeed, he was a true ecumenist, as his colleagues in the reformed churches will surely testify, and as they are testifying by their presence here now. Father Stan had a zest for life and

people responded to his obvious enjoyment of God's gifts, for they could see that his was a child-like joy and innocent delight, intent on sharing every pleasure with others.

To many, especially among his fellow clergy, he was Big Stan or just Stan, to others again he was known as Stanley, and there will be some in this congregation who will recognise him as GM4DNM—his fellow radio hams, who shared his membership of the Radio Society of Great Britain, and who would recognise his call-sign. If radio was the hobby which absorbed his undoubted talent in the field of wireless operation and electronics, he used to great benefit his other major talent for other forms of communication, for creating and sharing friendships. That he was well-read and wide in interests undoubtedly contributed to his ability for such friendly association.

In all this, he was supremely proud of his priesthood, meticulous in the exercise of his duties, a truth aptly verified over the recent weeks when his ill-health became more and more acute; indeed, on the day he died he insisted on celebrating morning Mass as usual, ill though he was, because, as he said himself "the people have made the effort to come, so I'll have to make the effort as well"; he died just before seven o'clock in the evening, and his Breviary shows that he had completed his Divine Office for the day, including Compline, with its *Nunc Dimittis*: "At last, all-powerful master, you give leave to your servant to go." It is rightly said that in his response to suffering a man shows his true mettle. For it is here that he is truly tested as the Book of Job surely shows. That being the case, Father Stan Smith showed his great qualities—of patient and uncomplaining suffering, of cheerfulness and determination to carry on; to those who saw and knew him these last few years, his spiritual stature seemed to grow as his physical stature shrank.

To his close friends, to Mrs. Ward his former housekeeper and Mrs. Tobin his present housekeeper, and particularly to his parishioners of Cardenden, I offer on behalf of His Eminence and his clergy our condolences. Father Stan's parishioners have shown over the past day or two the extent of their deep affection for their shepherd of the flock. They should feel proud today for their love and spiritual concern.

Perhaps a fitting tribute to Father Stan is best left to the words of an old lady (not a Catholic) who asked, like so many others, to be allowed to say a last farewell as his mortal remains lay in the house. She hobbled in, looked for a moment, and said simply, with considerable emotion, "He was such a guid man." Not too far removed from the words of a non-Jew who looked at the dead Christ, and simply proclaimed his goodness. There was no one more conscious of his faults and failings than Father Stan Smith—that is why we celebrate a Requiem Mass for him—but all the same, isn't it inspiring to hear such a sentiment expressed towards one who was alter Christus (another Christ), sharing the Master's priesthood? May his soul rest in peace. Amen.

**Very Rev. Peter Canon Cullerton — 7th July, 1981**

On Thursday evening, 7th July, 1981 one of the best known and best loved priests of the Diocese of Dunkeld, Canon Peter Cullerton died very peacefully after a long illness and much suffering.

Born in Birkhill, near Dundee, on 29th November, 1912, son of Peter Cullerton and Catherine Hobin, he received his early schooling at Lawside, Dundee, before going to St. Mary's College, Blairs in 1926. From there he proceeded to St. Lô, Coutances, Issy and St. Sulpice, Paris. He was ordained priest for Dunkeld diocese in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Dundee, in 1937 by Bishop Toner.

He spent the first three years on loan to Galloway diocese in both St. Joseph's, Kilmarnock (1937-38) and St. Mary's, Irvine (1938-40). On recall to his native diocese he was appointed assistant at St. Andrew's Cathedral for eight years. He was then sent to St. John Vianney's, Alva, where in the course of his pastoral work he was largely responsible for a new parish opening at Kinross which during his time came within the bounds of Alva parish. In 1955 he returned to Dundee and was entrusted with establishing a new parish in Douglas, dedicated to St. Pius X. This church was opened and dedicated in 1961 and it was here that he was to spend the rest of his priestly life.

A man of gentle character with his own quiet humour, he was always available for people; listening, advising, helping. His involvement with people was recognised by civil authorities when in 1967 he was asked to become a Justice of the Peace. But Canon Cullerton was a priest's priest and it was with his fellow priests he loved to be; making sure that for them his door was always open and a warm welcome awaited. This was borne out when so many priests con-celebrated his Requiem Mass during which his life-long friend Mgr. Kinsella spoke so highly of the man and the priest—a fitting tribute to one loved by all. Staff of Roxburghe House attended so impressed by his gentleness in suffering and the example he gave to the other patients. We thank them for their care of him!

Priests from the diocese, people from St. Pius' parish and from the city again showed their love and respect for Canon when at the month's mind Mass—a liturgy beautifully prepared and carried out—Bishop Logan led the community in thanking God for the life and work of God's priest, our friend. May he rest in peace.

**Very Rev. George Canon Aylward — 20th July, 1981**

The demise of Canon George Aylward late parish priest of St. Philomena's, Provanmill, in Belmont House, Waterford, brought to an end—as it were—an era. Born at the end of the last century on the 4th August 1898, at Acres, Mullinavat, Co. Kilkenny, among the scenic beauty of the Suir Valley, he came from farming stock. On the completion of his national school education at Mullinavat

National School in 1915, he entered the lay side of St. Kieran's College, Kilkenny, to begin his secondary studies on 5th September 1915, and left four years later in 1919 to start his studies for the priesthood at the ecclesiastical side of that college. On 11th June 1925 the fruit of his studies ripened when he was ordained priest.

His future of course lay in Scotland, and on his arrival here, was appointed curate in St. Margaret's, Johnstone, under the direction of the very well known Canon Reifenrath—parish priest of St. Margaret's. He had an astonishingly long run in St. Margaret's, starting, and completing his role as assistant priest from 1925 to 1945.

The war years were often recalled, and spoken about by Canon Aylward, chiefly because his parish priest was a German. While not in any sense a declared Nazi, Canon Reifenrath nevertheless took a deep interest in the outcome of the conflict, and he never lost a deeply rooted nationalism which water-coloured at least his whole outlook, and attitude. Canon Aylward, a nationalist himself, often mentioned the comings and goings of strange visitors who spoke with a foreign tongue, and who were very well received at St. Margaret's. There was the organ tuner who arrived in the very near pre-war years. He was so precise in his work that it took him many months, before the final satisfied rubbing of the hands indicated that he had found what he was looking for—shades of the lost chord. Then there was the choir master—who tho' he could not sing himself, was nevertheless perfect at the art of conducting. There were other visitors too whom the Canon declared were "very forward" to say the least, and who had what he called "very little likeable qualities". Canon Aylward liked to tell the story of the ringing of the church bell. The older clergy will recall that it was an offence to ring a church bell during the war years except and only, in the case of invasion by the enemy. This was a very strict rule. To the consternation of the Johnstonites, the bells of St. Margaret's were heard pealing out furiously one evening evidently conveying some message or other. However they were only intended to convey one. Houses and shops were emptied. People looked up into the sky expecting paratroopers at any moment, and then towards Paisley in case it had received the doubtful honour first. The calm figure of Canon Reifenrath gave the message of the bells, in a statement that his housekeeper had just passed to her reward, and that it was the custom in his country to ring the church bells when a member of the family died. This was not enough for the local council who reported the unexpected peals to the powers who dealt with bell pealing. For a considerable time afterwards Johnstone sea-sawed with arguments for and against. Canon Reifenrath himself had to pay several visits to Westminster to explain his actions. It ended happily as the Canon finally returned from London—having been exonerated of all blame—because his intentions were good.

In 1945 Canon Aylward was appointed parish priest of St. Palladius, Dalry. He loved to reminisce about that part of Scotland—the beauty of the locality, and the friendliness of the people. He still came back

on a day off to Johnstone, to play the course there. In those days he was a golfer of quality, and indeed could boast of being one of the few players in the club who could always play—wind allowing—across the gully-like lake at the famous 15th—which now no longer exists—avoiding the dog-leg, and ensuring, after a happy landing an under-par return. His stay was short. In 1947 he was appointed to St. Simon's, Partick; again his stay in this antique and beautiful church was of short duration. A new appointment—to St. Philomena's, Provanmill, came in December 1950. He was often heard to say "Pray that your flight be not in the winter".

During his time in St. Philomena's, he was appointed as an Assistant Religious Inspector in the schools, confessor to the Little Sisters of the Poor in Roystonhill, which post he held for six years. He was created Canon of the Cathedral Chapter in 1967, and retired as Honorary Canon to Ballycarron House, Co. Tipperary in November 1973.

What indeed is one to say about Canon Aylward? How can one sum him up adequately? This would be impossible. A fine priest—certainly he was this, with a proper sense of values. He did not look for any honours, but only wanted to give what he had to give with sincerity and honesty. In any estimation of him—one must say—that in a life dedicated to the priesthood he did not spare himself, and he had a certain impact—which Cardinal Newman declares is the hallmark of greatness. In a personal estimation of him—I would say that he added a third dimension to the priestly way, in that he showed an interest in people—not only in the Church, but in their homes, and in their work as well. He did not sell integrity only to the people—he had it himself. He was not always the easiest of men to live with, because of his intensity, and steel-like approach. He was nevertheless sincere, a fine host, and a father-like-figure, qualities which will long be remembered. Monsignor Francis Coyle and Monsignor John Gillespie represented the Archbishop, and people of St. Philomena's at his funeral in Waterford. May he have eternal happiness.

#### **Rev. Bernard Magauran — 11th August, 1981**

The death of Father Bernard Magauran in the Vale of Leven Hospital on 11th August, 1981, brought to an end one of those wonderful families in the West of Scotland whose whole life was dedicated to the service of God, either in this Archdiocese of Glasgow or in the Diocese of Paisley. As a result of their sacrifice they leave no one behind them, save us, to remember the good works they performed and to give them remembrance in our prayers.

Mr. and Mrs. Magauran had two sons, Francis and Bernard, and one daughter Mary. To their great joy their two boys became priests and Mary became a Sister of Notre Dame. I had the privilege of knowing the wonderful widowed mother who brought them into this

world and of close connection with all three members of her family. As a student in the Scots College, Rome, I met Dr. Francis Magauran for the first time. He was a genial and helpful Vice-Rector with an engaging sense of humour which endeared him to the students. The friendship begun then lasted until his death as Vicar General of Paisley Diocese. As assistant priest in St. Patrick's Dumbarton, which served Notre Dame Convent and secondary school, Clerkhill, I knew Sister Mary Bernard as a member of that community and as a dedicated teacher in the secondary school. She eventually became headmistress of the school and died in Clerkhill Convent. The pupils who knew her have fond memories of the attention and help she gave them.

My closest connection was with Father Bernard. One might be inclined to consider him the least distinguished of the three, but working with him I realised that his talents were on the same plane as theirs and very similar, but used in a sphere which attracted less attention. This was the way he preferred it for like St. Paul, it was not the esteem of men he wanted, but esteem in the sight of God.

He was born on 26th January, 1906, in Glasgow. As a boy he was educated at St. Aloysius' College. The atmosphere there and the example of his brother directed his thoughts towards the priesthood and in 1924 he entered the seminary at Mount Melleray in Ireland. At the end of two preparatory years there he entered St. Peter's College, Bearsden, to complete his studies. On 14th June, 1930, he was ordained priest in St. Andrew's Cathedral.

His first appointment was to St. Joseph's, North Woodside Road, an old established parish and, in those days, a large and flourishing parish; an excellent place for initiation into the varied duties of the priesthood. His work there must have given him great satisfaction for in 1932 he was chosen to assist in the establishment of a new parish in Possilpark, dedicated to St. Teresa of Lisieux. She was an appropriate patroness for him, for his success was always based on attention to the "little things".

In St. Teresa's he joined Father John Conlon, the first parish priest, and Father John Wilson, a fellow student of his days in St. Peter's College. The presbytery was a rented house in Saracen Street, with very little accommodation. Those were the difficult days of the depression in the early 'thirties, not an easy time to set up a new parish. Unemployment was high and money in very short supply but the parish managed to survive. He often spoke of those days with real admiration and affection for the good people who made the necessary sacrifices. The people took him to their hearts for his kindness and understanding, and their affection for him was made manifest when he had to leave St. Teresa's to take up his appointment as assistant priest to the Right Rev. Mgr. Hugh Provost Kelly in St. Patrick's Dumbarton. For many years the parishioners of St. Teresa's kept in touch with him in Dumbarton.

His appointment to St. Patrick's Dumbarton brought me into contact with him for the first time. We both arrived there on the same day, a Thursday in January 1939. The contrast in heights gave rise to some humorous comments from the parishioners, who despite common belief, did have a warm sense of humour. The fact that I had known his brother, Francis, was a happy introduction and a close friendship began which lasted until his death in hospital. He came with nine years experience of work in busy city parishes behind him. This proved invaluable not only to himself, but even more to me and I have never ceased being grateful to him for the guidance he gave me in those early days in St. Patrick's.

St. Patrick's was an exacting appointment. The parish priest was the renowned Mgr. Hugh Provost Kelly, one of the outstanding priests of his time and he was very proud of his parish. He had spent thirty-nine years making it the pride of the archdiocese. His standards were high and he expected the same high standard from all who worked with him. It was an extensive parish in size, stretching from Cardross to Bowling and due to his efforts, it could boast of two religious communities, the Carmelite Monastery, Kirktonhill, and the Convent of Notre Dame, Clerkhill; of two primary schools and two secondary schools. He had also established flourishing Sodalities, Third Order of St. Francis, League of the Cross, Children of Mary and Boys' Guild. To Father Bernard it offered a challenge and gave ample scope for his talents.

The older religious in the two communities in Dumbarton remember with gratitude his careful attention to all their needs. As chaplain to Notre Dame Secondary School he is remembered best by the pupils for his well-prepared instructions and for his availability outside of school hours. The large number of vocations to the priesthood, to the religious life and to the missions during those years, owed much to him. He inherited a healthy Boys' Guild. This he maintained, and even increased in numbers. More than one hundred boys regularly attended their weekly meetings with their chaplain at 6.30 p.m. and remained for the ordinary Sunday evening devotions. In addition, he established a well attended Workers' Guild, which later produced three local councillors.

Within nine months of his arrival in Dumbarton the Second World War began. This made life more difficult; the blackout meant earlier services and made travelling in the early hours of the morning to the convent and monastery more difficult. As an air-raid warden he helped to organise groups of firewatchers within the parish to help in the protection of the town. The first air raids did not take place until 1941 and during these he was on patrol in his district, visiting air-raid shelters to sustain the morale of his people. There were few fatal casualties and comparatively little damage. This was surely due to divine providence. One complete stick of bombs dropped across the presbytery garden; five did not explode and the sixth hit the pinnacle of the church tower before exploding across the road. Apart from the few stones dislodged from the pinnacle, no damage was done to the church.

Despite these many activities he is best remembered for his faithful attendance of the sick and for his regular and popular visitations in the parish. As the war progressed, the need for army chaplains increased and Father Magauran volunteered and was accepted. His duties as chaplain took him first to Norway and for a short time to Poland.

On his return from active service, he was appointed as assistant to Rev. Dr. Clune in the parish of Our Lady and St. Mark's, Alexandria. This brought him back to the Dumbarton area where he was to spend the rest of his life. As assistant priest in Alexandria he was allocated the Balloch district of the parish, which was then growing rapidly in numbers. As the numbers grew, it was decided that a new parish might be established there and it is likely that he suggested this.

In 1952 he was given the task of establishing the new parish to be dedicated to St. Kessog, the name chosen by His Grace Archbishop Campbell.

Initially there was one very great obstacle to overcome, the difficulty of obtaining a suitable site for a Catholic church. He had the good fortune to find an influential friend in the area, Mr. Caulfield, and through him he was able to acquire the site he wanted. He had already gathered an enthusiastic band around him and within two years a temporary church was erected; it still serves as the parochial hall.

For him this was just the first step; a permanent church, which would fit in with its tourist surroundings, was his ambition. This he achieved in 1958 just six years after his appointment as parish priest. This was quite an achievement and for one who did not allow emotion to overcome him, the dedication of the church was a joyful and excusable exception. Despite his labours as a church builder he was also an active member of the Vale of Leven Education Committee and was able to cope with a dual role in St. Peter's College as confessor and as a member of the Oral Examination Board.

He did not enjoy the fruits of his labour for very long. In 1959 he was appointed to St. Michael's Dumbarton on the death of Father Jeremiah O'Leary. This news caused dismay among the parishioners of St. Kessog's, whose affection and esteem he had worthily earned. This loyalty and affection lasted till his death and was made manifest by visits during his retirement and illness and by the great number who attended the funeral rites in St. Michael's twenty-two years later.

Once again he was given the task of establishing on a sound basis a parish comparatively recently opened. St. Michael's was officially erected in 1946 but post-war difficulties prevented the erection of even a temporary church; the oratory in the presbytery and the secondary school had to serve all parochial needs. The site and the plans were prepared by Father Hugh Bogan, but before these could be put into operation he was transferred to St. Patrick's and Father Jeremiah O'Leary was entrusted with the task of building the new church. This was opened in 1954. Unfortunately, ill health prevented Father O'Leary from doing much that he intended to do and on the Feast of St. Joseph, 19th March, 1959, he died. Father Bernard

Magauran took over from him in coping with the burden of debt and with many defects in the church which had caused his predecessor so much worry. The church had to be completely re-roofed. This and other faults were tackled quickly and successfully. Because of the burden of debt he had to be careful in spending parochial money and he had the unenviable task of increasing the parish income to meet its many needs.

However, the parish was growing. It was already spreading far beyond Castlehill and many new parishioners were arriving. This eased the financial position considerably but raised another problem. The need for accommodation for parish activities. He was given permission to build a parochial hall beside the church, but with the proviso that it be within reasonable cost. In the mid-'sixties a magnificent hall was built at an incredibly small outlay and proved invaluable in bringing all the parishioners together.

It was now his responsibility to make the changes in the church required by Vatican Council II. These were done quickly and tastefully, but his main concern was to inspire the spiritual revival which the Council required. Father Bernard, like his patron saint, had a deep devotion to the Mother of God and decided to ask her help in this and instituted novena devotions in honour of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour and decided that an evening weekday Mass would give more opportunity to many of attending weekday Mass. As in St. Kessog's, his devotion to their service and his care for them won the appreciation and affection of the people of St. Michael's. They realised that his task had not been an easy one but he had tackled it successfully for them.

In the early 'seventies he began to feel the strain of his efforts during the previous twenty years. Although he was physically big in stature, he had never had the strength to match it. It became difficult for him to walk any great distance and this irked him because it meant cutting down on visitation and began to make him feel that he was inadequate. As his infirmity grew, he felt that there was little more he could do for St. Michael's and he had now given the archdiocese more than forty years good service. He sought permission to retire and this was granted in 1974.

Thanks to the Sisters of Notre Dame he was able to remain in the district he loved, taking up residence in their house at Craighend within the grounds of Clerkhill Convent. For a little more than a year he managed to get down to the convent chapel to say Mass and pay an odd visit to friends, especially Canon Hugh Bogan who had also retired in the same area. Even this became too difficult and he was confined to the house and the little piece of ground attached to it.

These must have been very trying years for him but there was never any complaint. He spent his time reading and enjoying the visits of many friends. He was specially blessed in that the Kane family adopted him as a member of the family and attended devotedly to all his needs. They were his greatest comfort during these years and especially during the last months and weeks of his life.

From 1939 until his death in 1981, with the exception of the few years he served as army chaplain, his priestly life was spent either in the Vale of Leven or in Dumbarton and his love for this area and its people was very deep and sincere manifested throughout his life by devoted service and, at the end, by his expressed wish to be buried among them.

Even in this he gave an inspired lead which might easily have been overlooked but for the vigilance of Mgr. Hugh McEwan, who had succeeded him in St. Michael's. Thanks to him it was not overlooked. Once he became aware of this wish, he realised what a magnificent idea this was, that there should be a place of burial within the area for priests who had worked there. He was given permission to proceed and providentially at this moment the perfect situation for a lair in Dumbarton Cemetery became available. It is situated at the entrance to the cemetery. This lair was officially opened to receive the body of Father Magauran on 14th August 1981. Those who visit the cemetery in Dumbarton (and this is still a pious custom observed there), will be reminded of his priestly work in this district over many years. This will surely gain for him, his brother and sister, the prayers and remembrance they sacrificed by devoting their lives to the service of God. They leave themselves to the love and care of those they served so faithfully. R.I.P.

#### **Very Rev. Clement Canon McGowan — 26th August, 1981**

Clement McGowan was born at Glasgow on 16th April, 1901. He entered Blairs College, Aberdeen, in August, 1916, and St. Peter's College, New Kilpatrick, in September, 1919. He was ordained priest by the Most Rev. Donald Mackintosh, Archbishop of Glasgow, in St. Andrew's Cathedral, Glasgow, on 6th June, 1925.

As a young curate, Father McGowan served for a short time at St. Bridget's, Kilbirnie, before being moved to St. Aloysius', Chapelhall. He served the remainder of his time as a curate in this parish where he made many friends. He left there in 1944 but even after he retired some thirty-three years later, often some of the people from Chapelhall used to drop in to the presbytery in Largs to enquire after his health and to exchange old memories.

Early in 1944, Father McGowan was sent to take charge of the parish of St. Mary, Star of the Sea, Largs.

When he first arrived there, he went round the town on a push-bike! It was a long time before he reached the motor car. The parish of St. Mary's at that time was more extensive, stretching from Fairlie to Inverkip. It was the end of the war and Largs' population was greatly increased with a large contingent of the Forces and many people who had come down from the city of Glasgow. The small church in School Street was always packed to capacity and many extra Masses had to be arranged to cater for the large number of the faithful. Church services had also to be arranged for the Church of St. Joseph and St. Patrick, Wemyss Bay.

In 1948, the parish of Largs was transferred with the rest of north Ayrshire to the Diocese of Galloway. Two years later Father McGowan celebrated his 25th anniversary in the priesthood, and this was a happy and joyful celebration for all the parish. When the Cathedral Chapter welcomed him in 1957, again the congregation marked the occasion with a presentation of robes at a public function. The highlight of the Canon's work in Largs was the building of the new St. Mary's Church on the seafront and its opening in June, 1962. Although a previous site had been acquired many years previous for the building of a new church in School Street, Canon McGowan had been making inquiries about a site on the seafront and was delighted when he was successful in purchasing it. During the building of the church, almost daily the Canon would be seen walking from the old presbytery in School Street along the seafront to observe how the work was progressing. His generosity with God and the church could be seen here, perhaps summed up in a frequent saying of his at the time—"It's not worth spoiling the ship for ha'penny worth of tar!"

Everyone who knew Canon McGowan held him in the highest regard, not only in Largs, for he was known far and wide, and always with deep affection from his earliest days in the priesthood right to the end. He had a kindly nature and always a friendly word for everyone. Not the least of his attributes was a pawky and even whimsical sense of humour, which was always gentle. It could truly be said that he lived up to his name, Clement, mild, showing mercy. He had two quite disparate gifts; in his early years he was a skilful footballer and he was a gifted musician. He was also a scholar, as anyone who heard his talks at deanery meetings would well remember. On many other occasions he usually had something worthwhile to say, and was worth listening to. In daily life, Canon McGowan was always a good companion, quite happy to have a cigarette and a cup of tea and pleasant conversation.

At his Golden Jubilee in 1975, he was entertained at a dinner at Seamill Hydro at which a presentation was made to him from his own congregation and many of the townspeople of Largs. Many people will remember Canon McGowan with deep gratitude for his inspiration and the example of his life, a life of humility, evangelical simplicity and a firm confidence in God, together with a life-long devotion to Mary, the Mother of God.

About two years after his Golden Jubilee, Canon McGowan realised that he was no longer able to carry out his duties as parish priest of Largs and he allowed himself to be persuaded to retire. However he expressed his wish to be allowed to continue living in the presbytery in Largs and during the months from September, 1977, when he retired, until May, 1980, when he was taken into hospital, he stayed in the presbytery, giving what help he could to his successor and what service he could to his former parishioners. His long standing affection for Glasgow never diminished, and his love for his older brother often took him up the road to what was both his family home and the archdiocese in which he had been ordained priest.

Eventually he became much weaker and required full-time nursing. This was given to him by the good sisters of Bon Secours. The Canon was taken to Bon Secours in May, 1980, and was very weak and feeble on the journey up to Glasgow. However, with the dedicated nursing care from the sisters and staff of Bon Secours, he quite quickly regained some of his strength, and was able to join in celebrating the morning Mass in the convent oratory. In August, 1981, he weakened very considerably, and after a short illness he passed away very peacefully on Tuesday, 26th August, 1981. His body was brought to Largs and received into the church of St. Mary, Star of the Sea, which he had built and which was his pride and joy. On the Friday morning, Mass was celebrated by Bishop Maurice Taylor, and the concelebrants included Bishop Joseph McGee, former Bishop of Galloway, and Bishop Charles Renfrew, Auxiliary Bishop of Glasgow, as well as a large number of the Canon's friends from within the Galloway diocese and from the Province of Glasgow.

Also present at the Mass were members of the clergy from the other Christian Churches of Largs and civic dignitaries as well as a large congregation from the members of St. Mary's parish. One of the readings at the Mass was proclaimed in a loud and very clear voice by the Canon's older brother, John. Following the Mass, the Canon's body was escorted by a large congregation to the local cemetery. He was laid to rest among the people whom he had served for almost forty years. R.I.P.

#### **Rev. George Leitchman — 11th October, 1981**

George Leitchman was born in 1912 in Dundee and was educated at St. Mary's, Forebank, primary school, Lawside Academy (or "the Convent," as it was then known) whence he proceeded to Blairs College and finally to the seminaries of St. Lô and then St. Sulpice, at Issy, Paris.

Ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Toner, in the Cathedral, Dundee, in 1938, George served as curate in the Cathedral, under Mgr. Turner, for three years before being appointed to SS. Peter and Paul, Dundee, where he served for seven years. Bishop McGee was parish priest of SS. Peter and Paul's during the period of George's curacy. The loss of George's brother at sea during the war was a particularly grievous blow for Father Leitchman. After a period as curate in St. John's, Perth, then in St. Mungo's, Alloa, under Canon Matthews, he returned, in 1960, to Dundee before ill-health brought about his retirement from active duties.

He retired to Belmont Park Hospital, Waterford, where he died peacefully on Sunday, 11th October, 1981.

Preaching at the Requiem Mass in the Cathedral for the repose of Father George, Bishop Logan comforted his relatives and friends "pledging ourselves, we, the members of the Christian community in the Diocese of Dunkeld, to comfort them and ease their sorrow

in every way we can. Through our presence today, through our faith and our prayers we offer them firm ground for hope—and we base our hope on the fact that God did indeed raise Jesus from the dead. We are consoled that God can do the same for us, "For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." So, as we go to bury Father George's body with his parents in the Eastern cemetery, in respect of his wishes, let us comfort one another in our faith in Jesus Christ." May the soul of Father George rest in peace.

#### **Rev. James Ward — 14th October, 1981**

Father James Ward, parish priest of St. Teresa of Avila, Dundee, died suddenly in his sleep on the night of 14th October, 1981.

Although he had not been in the best of health for some considerable time, in recent weeks he had experienced a better health and vigour than for a long time previously. His death came as a great blow in its suddenness to his mother and sister, his devoted house-keeper and all his people.

James Ward was born in the parish of Our Lady of Victories, Forebank, Dundee, on 2nd April, 1920, the son of Peter Ward and Alexina Clark. His father died when he was only three years of age, leaving himself and his sister to be brought up in very difficult circumstances by their widowed mother. After primary education in the local parish school, and brief periods of secondary education in St. John's School and Lawside Academy, he went to Blairs in 1934. On completion of his studies he was sent to the College of Propaganda Fide in Rome where he was to remain for only two brief years leaving as a result of the outbreak of the Second World War. The contacts he made at Propaganda however, were never to be broken, and one of the driving forces of his priestly life was the aid he gave and encouraged others to give to the missions. Until the time of his death he was still assisting contemporaries of his student days in India and mainland China with that remarkable generosity which marked all he did.

On returning to Britain he studied briefly at Mill Hill and Oscott, being ordained in the chapel of Blairs College by Bishop Bennett of Aberdeen on 24th June, 1945, for service in the Diocese of Northampton. Here he served in Bedford, Lowestoft and Northampton Cathedral, making friendships in the course of his work which were to endure throughout the rest of his priestly life. In 1950 he came to work in his home Diocese of Dunkeld, serving as an assistant priest at St. Joseph's, Dundee, Alloa, Lochee, St. Pius X, Dundee, and finally St. Leonard's, Dundee, before becoming successively parish priest of Auchterarder, the new parish of St. Matthew's, Whitfield, Arbroath and St. Teresa's.

Alongside his deep love of the missionary work of the Church, one of the great driving forces of Father James' life was his devotion to Our Blessed Lady, and in particular to the work of the Church in

Lourdes. Rare was the year that he did not make a pilgrimage to Lourdes and equally his loyalty to the Holy Father took him back frequently to Rome and his *Alma Mater*.

Father Ward's final return to his parish church on the Saturday after his death brought together a vast number of his people and friends to recite with his Bishop the Office of the Dead, and the following day a similar number assisted at his Requiem Mass offered by Bishop Logan with a large number of concelebrants who had travelled from far and near to pray for a good priest and a good friend. Every aspect of his varied life was represented in the congregation, and this prayerful people provided a great consolation to his sorrowing family. May he rest in peace.

### Rev. Gerard McGarry — 19th October, 1981

Father Gerard McGarry, first parish priest of St. Peter's, Leven, died on 19th October, 1981, in the sixty-ninth year of his age and the forty-fourth of his priesthood. At the Funeral Mass on 22nd October in St. Peter's, prior to interment in Leven Cemetery, Cardinal Gordon Gray, Archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, delivered the following panegyric:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On Monday evening I returned from Rome—joy in my heart. A week of long and arduous meetings had been crowned two days before when the Holy Father received Cardinal Hume and myself in a private audience. Joy in my heart that turned to grief when I was told the news of Father McGarry's sudden and totally unexpected death. A grief that each one of you so deeply shared. To you all I offer my heartfelt sympathy and particularly to you, Mrs. McLinden, and your husband, on the loss of a brother, and to you Moira Richmond, who served Father McGarry's needs for well nigh twenty-five years and who, but minutes after leaving him—to all appearances relaxed and cheerful—returned to find that God had called him to himself. We pray that God may give you strength in these days of searing sorrow. A ray of divine light to glimpse his purpose, grace to accept his will.

The call from God on Monday morning was not the first call that came to Gerard McGarry. As a young boy, he had heard a divine whisper "Come follow me", and—with the blessing and prayers of his loving Irish parents—had set out on the long road of seminary training that joyfully reached its destination on 19th June, 1938, when he was raised to the priesthood at All Hallows' College in Dublin. And throughout the forty-three years of his priesthood the joy of that day and his gratitude to God for his vocation never dimmed. He had offered himself to serve in the archdiocese and, like many another zealous Irish priest, he found himself first in the populous parish of St. Patrick in Edinburgh. But not for long. Two years later, he was appointed priest-in-charge of the then tiny parish

of the Sacred Heart in Penicuik and some fourteen years later to the parish of Cowie in Stirlingshire that shared the same title as its dedication. In 1965, he was transferred to Methil and, as you will know, gave you unstinting, generous and devoted service. Father McGarry had one great ambition. It was to establish a parish here in Leven. He searched for suitable sites and premises. At last the time came and through the generous co-operation of the Church of Scotland, he was able to acquire both this splendid church and a nearby house to serve as a presbytery. He was overjoyed and asked that he might be appointed here as St. Peter's first parish priest. I gladly agreed and four years ago in March, his wish was fulfilled; and you good people of Leven have witnessed the enthusiasm with which he laboured with his own skills to adapt this building to suit the needs of our liturgy and to serve your spiritual needs.

During these past two days, I seem to have lived with Father McGarry—memories of him crowding into my mind. Memories that go back to the first days when I came to know him in Penicuik, happy and content to give his all to his little flock. A quietly but deeply spiritual priest, unobtrusive in his devotions, who loved and cherished his priesthood above all else. Traditional in his spirituality yet ever open to change provided it was prompted by the authority and teaching of the Church. A man of deep faith and strong convictions, impatient of doctrinal innovation. Well read in the sacred sciences, endowed with a keen and alert mind, that grasped the essentials and could communicate them in conversation and in preaching in his simple, direct and clear style for all to understand. Above all a man of prayer in his devotion to the Holy Mass, to the Blessed Sacrament and to the Mother of Jesus.

A zealous pastor, who knew each member of his flock and lived and laboured for them.

Yes—a host of memories—of the priest and of the man—this man of many parts. The keen sportsman, who loved the open-air whether in the river tramping the hills and the fields, or working in his garden. And the skilled craftsman who could turn his hand to many tasks. I recall how, when parish priest in Cowie, he purchased a disused clubhouse, originally an ex-Army hut, and transformed it into a chapel for the Catholics of the neighbouring village of Fallin. And I remember the delightful parish hall he built for the Catholics of Cowie largely with his own hands from bricks salvaged from derelict cottages and timber from the scrapyards of Inverkeithing. And how, benefiting from the experience gained, he went on to design and help build your splendid parish hall at St. Agatha's. Here in Leven you watched him re-design with splendid taste, the sanctuary of the building to satisfy the needs of the revised liturgy; and, that work complete, set his hand to modernise the present presbytery. He was so proud of you, his people and of your church. Father McGarry—above all a happy enthusiast in everything in which he was involved, in his spiritual life, in his pastoral apostolate, in his craftsmanship. A joyful enthusiast who remained ever young in heart.

You his parishioners, and you his brother priests, together with his relatives and many friends, will miss him sorely. As I shall. For he was one whose advice I valued and whose active co-operation in delicate areas of my work unknown to any but myself, he generously gave.

Goodbye, Father Gerry. I'm sure you are very close to heaven even now. And smiling perhaps as you watch me searching in vain for words to enshrine your memory. And not minding their inadequacy because the only words you want to hear are prayerful words to Almighty God. Words of intercession that will speed your steps on the last stage of your journey and bring you to hear from the one you so loyally and lovingly served in life, the words that matter most:

“ Well done, good and faithful servant,  
You have been faithful over a little;  
I will set you over much.  
Enter into the joy of your Master ”.
